THE GAME: Moravian looks to bounce back from its first loss of the 2007 season as the Greyhounds host Gettysburg College in a Centennial Conference game, the first time the two schools have met on the football field since 1982. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Rocco Calvo Field in Bethlehem.

THE COACHES: Scot Dapp (West Chester '73) is in his 21st season at Moravian, with a career record of 125-85-1 (.595) and passed Rocco Calvo as the school's winningest football coach on September 8th with a 43-14 win versus McDaniel College. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. Dapp, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004 & 2005, winning the title in 2005.

Gettysburg coach **Barry Streeter (Lebanon Valley '71)** has a record of 144-139-5 (.509) in his 29th year at the school.

THE SERIES: Saturday's meeting will be the sixth in the series with Gettysburg owning a 4-1 advantage. Moravian's only win in the series was the first in the series, a 17-7 win in 1978. The schools have not met since 1982 when the Bullets earned a 34-17 victory in Gettysburg.

CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE HONORS: Junior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** (**Branchburg, NJ/Somerville HS**) of Moravian earned a spot on the Centennial Conference Weekly Honor Roll for his performance in the Greyhounds' 24-23 loss to Dickinson College last Saturday. **Reckenbeil** tied a pair of school record and broke another in Moravian's loss to Dickinson. **Reckenbeil** tied the school marks for field goals in a game for the second time in his career with three and for points in a game with 11 for the fourth time in his career and second time in 2007. **Reckenbeil** also became the school's all-time leader in kick scoring with 133 points in just 23 ½ games as the starting place kicker. He also owns the school career mark with 25 career field goals and is 16 extra-points away from breaking that career mark. **Reckenbeil** made field goals of 28, 33 and 30 yards in the loss to Dickinson.

GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE: Moravian has joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football beginning in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fourth with two first-place votes in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors' poll while Gettysburg was selected sixth with one first-place vote.

ON THE AIRWAVES: For the 11th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAN 1470 AM The Fox for the fourth straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance and color commentary from **John Elliott**.

ON TELEVISION: Saturday's game is scheduled to be broadcast live on television by Service-Electric TV-2 Sports. This is the first of two Moravian games that will be aired this season.

40s ARE WILD: When Moravian and Johns Hopkins University each scored over 40 points in the Greyhounds 44-41 win on September 22nd, it marked the first time in school history for both schools that they had participated in a game in which both teams scored more than 40 points. The closest Moravian had been before was a 45-39 loss to Albright College in 2004.

BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS: Of the 97 players on the Moravian roster, 45 are freshmen, 16 are sophomores and 22 are juniors. There are 14 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 50 letterwinners and 18 starters.

THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS: The Greyhounds are third in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 329.6 yards per game. The squad is fifth in passing defense at 198.6 yards per game, and the defense is fifth in rushing yards allowed at 31.0. The Greyhounds are sixth in points allowed at 24.8 per game, and the squad is first in the conference in points scored per game at 32.6. Offensively, Moravian ranks second in the Centennial Conference at 373.0 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked fourth in rushing offense at 167.8 yards per game and third in passing offense at 205.2 yards per game. Moravian is third in turnover margin with a +0.60 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed 12 turnovers while forcing 15 turnovers this season. Moravian also leads the Centennial Conference pass efficiency at 161.2 and tied in point-after touchdown kicking percentage at 1.000 (17-of-17). Individually, junior quarterback Marc Braxmeier (Center Valley, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS) leads the Centennial Conference in pass efficiency at 168.6, is third in passing yards per game at 205.2 and sixth in total offense at 196.2 yards per game. Junior running back Tyler McCambridge (Northampton, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS) is fourth in the Centennial Conference in all-purpose yardage at 139.5 yards per contest and is fifth in rushing offense at 86.2 yards per game. Junior kicker Brian Reckenbeil is first in kick scoring at 8.2 points per game, first in field goals per game at 1.60, second in field goal percentage at 72.7 percent (eight-for-11), tied for first in PAT percentage at 1.000 (17-of-17) and fourth in overall scoring at 8.2 points per game. Senior wide receiver Sean Hill (West Reading, PA/Wyomissing HS) is tied for sixth in overall and tied for fifth in touchdown scoring at 6.0 points per game, and Hill is sixth in receiving yards per game in the Centennial Conference at 58.2 yards per contest. Junior punter Michael Voskian (Brielle, NJ/Manasquan HS) is sixth in punting with an average of 37.3 yards per punt. Junior linebacker Andrew Morrissey (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) is first in forced fumbles with 0.80 per game, and he is tied for fifth in tackles with 9.6 per contest while junior linebacker Kevin McGorry (Whitehall, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS) is second in the conference in forced fumbles per game at 0.60, and tied for 14th in tackles per game at 7.8. Sophomore linebacker **Jayson Williams** (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) is tied for 27th in the Centennial Conference at 6.0 tackles per game and tied for third in forced fumbles with 0.50 per contest while junior defensive back Carl Robinson (Boothwyn, PA/Garnet Valley HS) is 27th at 6.0 tackles per game. Junior defensive back Eric Brinkerhoff (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) is tied for 44th in tackles per game with an average of 5.2 and tied for seventh in sacks per game at 0.50 while senior linebacker Zach Santiago (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) is tied for 38th at 5.6 tackles per contest. Freshman defensive back Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS) is tied for 46th in tackles with 5.0 per game while sophomore defensive back Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) is tied for second in passes defended at 1.40 per game. Junior defensive end Douglas Bocchino (Madison, NJ/Madison HS) is tied for eighth in the conference at 0.22 interceptions per game.

SCOUTING GETTYSBURG COLLEGE: The Bullets come to Bethlehem an overall record of 3-2 and a 2-1 slate in Centennial Conference action after a 21-7win against Ursinus College last weekend. Sophomore quarterback Matt Flynn leads Gettysburg on the field. He has completed 62 of 124 passes for 825 yards, seven touchdowns and four interceptions, and Flynn has run for 212 yards and two touchdowns on 25 carries. Sophomore tailback Ricky Manigat has caught a team high 17 passes for 229 yards and three touchdowns while senior wide receiver Matt Welsh has ten catches for 166 yards and two scores. Senior tailback Tom Sturges leads the Bullet running attack with 699 yards and six touchdowns on 143 carries, and he has added ten receptions for 52 yards and a score. Manigat run for 116 yards and a touchdown in 23 carries while junior tailback Nick McConnell has 78 yards on 17 rushing attempts. Freshman running back Charles Curcio has nine receptions for 105 yards and 17 carries for 54 yards and a touchdown while junior wide receiver Alex Penta has caught nine passes for 147 yards and one touchdown. Freshman wide receiver Stephen Gass is averaging 4.4 yards on eight punt returns and 16.1 yards on nine kickoff returns while Curcio has an average of 13.0 yards in four punt returns. Freshman tailback Jamel Mutunga has returned four kickoffs with an average of 17.0 yards per return. Junior kicker Josh Huson is four-for-nine on field goal attempts this season for Gettysburg with a long of 42 yards, and he has made 15 of 16 extra-points. Sophomore wide receiver/kicker Andrew Weingart is averaging 38.1 yards per punt with six inside the 20-ayrd line, two touchbacks and one fair caught, and he is averaging 59.3 yards per kickoff. Senior linebacker Harold Barton leads the Bullets defense with 47 tackles including six and a half tackles for loss, three sacks, an interception and a fumble recovery. Junior defensive lineman Conor Quinn has added 41 tackles with nine tackles for loss and one and a half sacks while junior defensive end Josh Jerrold has 29 tackles with seven tackles for loss, a team high five sacks and one pass break-up. Sophomore linebacker Tim Widdoes has 26 tackles, three tackles for loss and two sacks while senior defensive back Kyle Luciano has 23 tackles, a team high two interceptions, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and a pass break-up.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have three players closing in on milestones for their careers. Junior running back **Tyler McCambridge** became the 19th Greyhound to reach 1,000 career yards rushing on September 8th. **McCambridge** has 1,182 yards on 258 carries with eight touchdowns. Junior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** became just the third kicker in Moravian history to reach 100 career points on September 8th and set the all-time school record for scoring by a kicker on September 29th. **Reckenbeil** is first all-time with 131 career points on 58 extra-points (tied for third all-time) and 25 field goals (first all-time). **Reckenbeil** needs 11 extra-points to move into second all-time and 16 extra-points to set the school record. Junior quarterback **Marc Braxmeier** moved passed the 1,000 career passing yardage mark on September 15th and has now thrown for 1,605 yards including 1,026 this season.

THE QUARTERBACKS: Junior **Marc Braxmeier** has completed 66 of 109 passes for 1,026 yards with 12 touchdowns and four interceptions in five games. **Braxmeier's** four touchdown passes in the 34-27 season opening win at Susquehanna University and in a 44-41 win at Johns Hopkins University tied the school record for touchdown passes in a game, last done by **Rob Petrosky** during the 1996 season. **Braxmeier** also has two rushing touchdowns this season but has been sacked 11 times for a net rushing total of minus 45 yards in 24 carries. Sophomore quarterback **Ryan Rempe** (**Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS**) has attempted two passes this season, both incompletions.

IN THE BACKFIELD: In the backfield, junior tailback **Tyler McCambridge**, who missed last week's game against Dickinson College with an injury, has gained 345 yards on 74 carries this season with one touchdown and a long run of 27 yards. Junior fullback **Morgan deRouen (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS)**, who has missed the last two games with an injury, has added 132 yards and a score on 35 carries with a long run of 17 yards. Freshman running back **Ricky Allen (Pocono Summit, PA/Pocono Mountain West HS)** has contributed 96 yards on 13 carries with a long of 32 yards while sophomore running back **Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS)** has 87 yards on 30 rushing attempts with a long of eight yards. Junior fullback **Michael Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS)** has six yards on three carries while freshman running back **Wesley Germain (Rumson, NJ/Rumson-Fair Haven HS)** has four yards on two carries.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: The Greyhounds have had ten different players catch a pass this season led by senior wide receiver Sean Hill, who has 16 receptions for 291 yards with five touchdowns. Senior tight end Kris Bisci (Easton, PA/Easton HS) has added 14 catches for 228 yards and two touchdowns while freshman wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS) has ten catches for 193 yards and two scores. Junior wide receiver Tyler Williams (Coplay, PA/Whitehall HS) has nine receptions for 82 yards while junior fullback Morgan deRouen has five catches for 65 yards with one touchdown. Junior running back Tyler McCambridge has four catches for 28 yards while freshman wide receiver Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) has contributed three receptions for 39 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore tight end Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) has two receptions for 34 yards while junior tight end Nick Johnson (Keyport, NJ/Keyport HS) made his first career catch against Susquehanna University for 41 yard. Junior wide receiver Tyler Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS), who missed the first three game of the season with an injury, has two catches for 25 yards.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Leading the way for the backfield is a solid offensive line led by returning starters seniors Dave Kircher (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS), Eric Adams (Dover, NJ/Dover HS) and Jeff Kocsis (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) and junior Timothy McBride (Egg Harbor Township, NJ/Egg Harbor Township HS). Sophomore Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS) has earned the other starting position to help the Greyhounds average 6-2, 275 on the front line. Freshman Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has seen action in the last three games due to an injury by Kocsis, who was a member of the All-Middle Atlantic Conference Second Team a year ago.

DEFENSIVE FRONT: Junior defensive end **Don Maxwell (Berkeley Heights, NJ/Governor Livingston HS)** leads the Moravian defensive front with 18 tackles including a tackle for loss and half a sack while Junior defensive lineman **Douglas Bocchino** has added 18 tackles, one and a half tackles for loss, a sack, an interception returned 45 yards for a touchdown versus Lebanon Valley College and a fumble recovery in the end zone for a touchdown against Johns Hopkins University. Senior defensive lineman **Matt Adams (Dover, NJ/Dover HS)** has contributed 11 stops with a tackle for loss. Freshman defensive lineman **Sean Rimmer (Kintnersville, PA/Palisades HS)** has made six tackles while junior defensive tackle **Robert Kadel (Blairstown, NJ/North Warren HS)** has two tackles. Freshman defensive end **Matthew Leiggi (Princeton, NJ/West Windsor-Plainsboro HS)** has added one tackle while junior defensive tackle **Mike Nagle (Marlton, NJ/Bishop Eustace HS)** blocked and extra-point at Susquehanna University and recovered the block for the Greyhounds.

THE LINEBACKER CORPS: Junior linebacker Andrew Morrissey currently leads the Greyhound defense with a team high 48 tackles to go along with three and a half tackles for loss, a fumble recovery and four forced fumbles while junior linebacker Kevin McGorry has added 39 tackles, five and a half tackles for loss, a sack, two pass break-ups, a fumble recovery and three forced fumbles. Sophomore linebacker Jayson Williams has contributed 24 tackles with two and a half tackles for loss, a half a sack and two forced fumbles while senior linebacker Zach Santiago has 28 tackles, four and a half tackles for loss, one and a half sacks, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a pass break-up. Sophomore Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS) has made 20 tackles with one for loss and a fumble return of five yards while senior linebacker Dan Edleman (Pottstown, PA/The Hill School) has nine tackles. Freshman linebacker Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has made eight tackles this season and blocked a punt at Susquehanna University while sophomore linebacker Michael Bishop (Nazareth, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has two tackles for the Greyhounds.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD: In the defensive backfield, junior strong safety **Carl Robinson** has contributed 30 tackles, one interception and a forced fumble while junior defensive back **Eric Brinkerhoff** has 26 tackles with four and a half tackles for loss, two and a half sacks, a fumble return of 72 yards for a touchdown, one interception and two pass break-ups. Freshman cornerback **Daniel Burley** has 25 tackles to go along with an interception and a pass break-up while sophomore cornerback **Brad Bodine** has made 23 tackles with one for loss, seven pass break-ups, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Freshman defensive back **Thomas Dailey (Easton, PA/Notre Dame HS)** has contributed nine tackles for Moravian while freshman defensive back **Jason Lauver (Winfield, PA/Selinsgrove HS)** has an interception, a fumble recovery and two tackles.

KICKING GAME: Junior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** is 17-for-17 on extra-point attempts this season, and he eight-for-11 on field goal attempts with a long of 37 yards against McDaniel. **Reckenbeil** is averaging 51.0 yards per kickoff as well, making opponents receive the kickoff at their own 19-yard line. Junior punter **Michael Voskian** is averaging 37.3 yards per punt on 20 attempts with a career long of 51 yards at Johns Hopkins University. **Voskian** has had five punts inside the 20-yard line, three fair caught, one blocked and three touchbacks.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Junior running back **Tyler McCambridge** has six kickoff returns for 124 yards while senior wide receiver **Sean Hill** has returned four kickoffs for 75 yards. **McCambridge** also has five punt returns for 61 yards while freshman wide receiver **Alex Hersch** has added nine kickoff returns for 206 yards. Freshman defensive back **Eric Woodruff (Brodheadsville, AP/Pius X HS)** has returned three kickoffs for 65 yards while freshman linebacker **Anthony Carney** was credited with a 25-yard punt return after blocking a punt at Susquehanna. Freshman wide receiver **Shawn Sylvainus** has made five tackles on special teams this fall while junior fullback **Michael Cancelliere** and junior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** each have added two tackles.

STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME: As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAN The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-Game Show. Last week, junior fullback Morgan deRouen, junior linebacker Andrew Morrissey and junior Brian Reckenbeil were named Tri-Players of the Game. deRouen ran for 60 yards on 143 carries while Morrissey had a game high 16 tackles. Reckenbeil tied the school record for the fourth time in his career with 11 points on three field goals and a pair of extra-points. Reckenbeil's three field goals also tied the school record and his third field goal gave him 133 career points, a new school record. Starters Riverport and Starters Pub, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street and Route 378 South of Bethlehem.

WINNING WAYS: Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 15 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 20 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

OVERTIME 'HOUNDS: Moravian has played a total of seven overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 5-2 all-time in the extra-session. Last year was the sixth time since 1996 that the Greyhounds did not play at least one overtime game.
