**THE GAME:** Moravian looks to snap a two-game losing streak at Franklin & Marshall College in a Centennial Conference game, the first time the two schools have met in the regular season since 1992. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Sponaugle-Williamson Field in Lancaster.

THE COACHES: Scot Dapp (West Chester '73) is in his 21st season at Moravian, with a career record of 125-86-1 (.592) and passed Rocco Calvo as the school's winningest football coach on September 8<sup>th</sup> with a 43-14 win versus McDaniel College. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. Dapp, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002 and the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004 & 2005, winning the title in 2005.

Franklin & Marshall coach **John Troxell (Lafayette '94)** has a record of 4-11 (.267) in his second year at the school.

**THE SERIES:** Saturday's meeting will be the 20<sup>th</sup> in the series with Franklin & Marshall owning a 16-3 advantage. The Diplomats won the last meeting, a 37-20 triumph in the 2004 Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Division III Southwest Bowl game in Lancaster, while the Greyhounds won the last time the two schools met in the regular season with a 14-7 win in Bethlehem.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: Moravian suffered a 37-20 loss to Franklin & Marshall College in the 2004 ECAC Southwest Championship game at Sponaugle-Williamson Field in Lancaster. The Diplomats scored first with 3:18 remaining in the first quarter on a 23-yard touchdown pass. Moravian answered right back with a 52-yard scoring strike from quarterback Jerry Venturino to wide receiver Jed Warsager. Kicker Ken Macaulay added the extra-point to tie the game at 7-7. F&M scored on the first play of the second quarter on a 33-yard scoring pass. The extra-point attempt was blocked by defensive lineman Nick Feo, setting the score at 13-7. Moravian would drive right back down the field and looked as if it had tied the game on a 21-yard pass from Venturino to running back Chris Jacoubs but Diplomat defensive back Tim Barry hit Jacoubs and dislodged the ball before Jacoubs could get his feet on the ground. F&M would drive back down the field and extend its lead to 16-7 on a 21-yard field goal. F&M then scored on a 16-yard screen pass and the extra-point gave the Diplomats a 23-7 halftime lead. Moravian would take the opening kickoff and scored with Venturino hitting wide receiver Ben Hawkins with a 14-yard touchdown pass. The Greyhounds went for two but Venturino's pass was intercepted setting the score at 23-13. Venturino completed 19 of 33 passes for 290 yards with two touchdowns and an interception. F&M scored on a 30-yard run and the extra-point gave the Diplomats a 30-13 lead. Moravian came right back and score on a four-yard touchdown run by Jacoubs. Macaulay's extra-point pulled the Greyhounds within 30-20. F&M would score again on a seven-yard scoring strike for a 37-20 Diplomat lead. Linebacker **Cliff Garr** led the Moravian defense with 15 tackles.

**ON THE AIRWAVES:** For the 11th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAN 1470 AM The Fox for the fourth straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance and color commentary from **John Elliott**.

**GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE:** Moravian has joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football beginning in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fourth with two first-place votes in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors' poll while Franklin & Marshall was selected seventh with one first-place vote.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have three players closing in on milestones for their careers. Junior running back Tyler McCambridge (Northampton, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS) became the 19<sup>th</sup> Greyhound to reach 1,000 career yards rushing on September 8<sup>th</sup>. McCambridge has 1,182 yards on 258 carries with eight touchdowns. Junior kicker Brian Reckenbeil (Branchburg, NJ/Somerville HS) became just the third kicker in Moravian history to reach 100 career points on September 8<sup>th</sup> and set the all-time school record for scoring by a kicker on September 29<sup>th</sup>. Reckenbeil is first all-time with 141 career points on 60 extra-points (third all-time) and 27 field goals (first all-time). Reckenbeil needs nine extra-points to move into second all-time and 14 extra-points to set the school record. Junior quarterback Marc Braxmeier (Center Valley, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS) moved passed the 1,000 career passing yardage mark on September 15<sup>th</sup> and needs just 166 yards to reach 2,000 career yards. Braxmeier has now thrown for 1,834 yards including 1,255 this season.

**40s ARE WILD:** When Moravian and Johns Hopkins University each scored over 40 points in the Greyhounds 44-41 win on September 22<sup>nd</sup>, it marked the first time in school history for both schools that they had participated in a game in which both teams scored more than 40 points. The closest Moravian had been before was a 45-39 loss to Albright College in 2004.

**BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS:** Of the 97 players on the Moravian roster, 45 are freshmen, 16 are sophomores and 22 are juniors. There are 14 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 50 letterwinners and 18 starters.

THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS: The Greyhounds are third in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 329.0 yards per game. The squad is fifth in passing defense at 182.8 yards per game, and the defense is fifth in rushing yards allowed at 146.2. The Greyhounds are sixth in points allowed at 25.2 per game, and the squad is first in the conference in points scored per game at 30.6. Offensively, Moravian ranks second in the Centennial Conference at 365.0 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked fifth in rushing offense at 155.8 yards per game and third in passing offense at 209.2 yards per game. Moravian is third in turnover margin with a +0.67 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed 14 turnovers while forcing 18 turnovers this season. Moravian also leads the Centennial Conference pass efficiency at 154.4, third down conversions 42.0 percent (34 of 81) and tied in point-after touchdown kicking percentage at 1.000 (19-of-19). Individually, junior quarterback Marc Braxmeier leads the Centennial Conference in pass efficiency at 159.9, is third in passing yards per game at 209.2 and fourth in total offense at 199.0 yards per game. Junior running back Tyler McCambridge is third in the Centennial Conference in all-purpose yardage at 139.5 yards per contest and is fifth in rushing yards at 86.2 yards per game while junior fullback Morgan deRouen (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS) is tenth in conference in rushing yards at 49.3 per game. Junior kicker Brian Reckenbeil is first in kick scoring at 8.2 points per game, first in field goals per game at 1.67, second in field goal percentage at 71.4 percent (ten-for-14), tied for first in PAT percentage at 1.000 (19-of-19) and third in overall scoring at 8.2 points per game. Senior wide receiver Sean Hill (West Reading, PA/Wyomissing HS) is tied for seventh in overall and sixth in touchdown scoring at 6.0 points per game, and Hill is sixth in receiving vards per game in the Centennial Conference at 57.2 yards per contest. Freshman wide receiver Shawn Sylvanius (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS) is ninth in the Centennial Conference in receiving yards per game at 46.3 while junior punter Michael Voskian (Brielle, NJ/Manasquan HS) is sixth in punting with an average of 37.5 yards per punt. Junior linebacker Andrew Morrissey (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) is first in forced fumbles with 0.67 per game, and he is fourth in tackles with 9.7 per contest while junior linebacker Kevin McGorry (Whitehall, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS) is second in the conference in forced fumbles per game at 0.50, and 16th in tackles per game at 7.3. Sophomore linebacker Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) is tied for 45<sup>th</sup> in the Centennial Conference at 5.0 tackles per game and tied for third in forced fumbles with 0.40 per contest while junior defensive back Carl Robinson (Boothwyn, PA/Garnet Valley HS) is tied for 38th at 5.5 tackles per game and tied for third in interceptions with 0.50 per contest. Junior defensive back Eric Brinkerhoff (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) is tied for 45<sup>th</sup> in tackles per game with an average of 5.0 and sixth in sacks per game at 0.58 while senior linebacker Zach Santiago (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) is tied for 24<sup>th</sup> at 6.2 tackles per contest. Sophomore defensive back Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) is sixth in passes defended at 1.17 per game while junior defensive end Douglas **Bocchino (Madison, NJ/Madison HS)** is tied for 45<sup>th</sup> in the conference with 5.0 tackles per game.

SCOUTING FRANKLIN & MARSHALL COLLEGE: The Diplomats enter the game at 1-4 overall and 1-2 in Centennial Conference action after a 31-10 loss at Ursinus College last Saturday. Senior quarterback Kyle Turner leads Franklin & Marshall on the field, having completed 99 of 189 passes for 1,105 yards with ten touchdowns and 11 interceptions. **Turner** has also run for 84 yards and the Diplomats only rushing touchdown in 49 attempts. Sophomore wide receiver George Eager has been the top target with 367 yards and six touchdowns on 40 receptions while freshman wide receiver Jay Ridinger has 14 catches for 215 yards and a touchdown. Junior wide receiver Paul Sousa has pulled down 13 passes for 188 yards while freshman tailback Lorenzo Daughtry-Chambers has ten catches for 53 yards. Sophomore tailback Ryan Murray leads the Diplomat rushing attack with 197 yards on 52 carries, and he has caught seven passes for 125 yards and two touchdowns. Daughtry-Chambers has picked up 132 yards on 46 carries while freshman running back Lipton Thompson has 63 yards on 15 attempts. Eager is averaging 10.9 yards per punt return on seven returns while Thompson has an average of 16.2 yards on eight kickoff returns. Ridinger has averaged 18.0 yards per kickoff return with seven returns while Eager has an average of 24.8 vards per kickoff return on five returns. Sousa has connected on a 20-yard field goal attempts and is eight-for-nine on extra-points while junior Chris Minck is two-for-three on extra-points this season. Minck has also averaged 31.5 yards per punt on 17 attempts with five fair caught and one blocked while freshman **Jeff Hogan** is also averaging 31.5 yards per punt on 21 punts with four fair caught, four inside the 20-yard line and one touchback. Sophomore safety Jeff Kellar leads Franklin & Marshall with two interceptions including one returned 25 yards for a touchdown while junior linebacker Zach Romash tops the squad with 46 tackles including four and a half tackles for loss, two sacks, two pass break-ups, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. Junior linebacker James Gregory has 41 tackles with five and a half for loss, one sack, three pass break-ups and one forced fumble while senior safety John Weber has 35 tackles with two for loss, one save, a pass break-up and a fumble recovery. Junior defensive end Andrew Rocks has contributed 32 tackles with six and a half tackles for loss, two sacks, and interception and a pass break-up.

**THE QUARTERBACKS:** Junior **Marc Braxmeier** has completed 86 of 139 passes for 1,255 yards with 13 touchdowns and six interceptions in six games. **Braxmeier's** four touchdown passes in the 34-27 season opening win at Susquehanna University and in a 44-41 win at Johns Hopkins University tied the school record for touchdown passes in a game, last done by **Rob Petrosky** during the 1996 season. **Braxmeier** also has two rushing touchdowns this season but has been sacked 16 times for a net rushing total of minus 61 yards in 36 carries. Sophomore quarterback **Ryan Rempe** (**Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS**) has attempted two passes this season, both incompletions.

IN THE BACKFIELD: In the backfield, junior tailback Tyler McCambridge, who has missed the last two games with an injury, has gained 345 yards on 74 carries this season with one touchdown and a long run of 27 yards. Junior fullback Morgan deRouen has 296 yards and a touchdown on 45 attempts with a long of 26 while junior yards tailback Tyler deRouen (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS), who has missed the last three games with an injury, has added 132 yards and a score on 35 carries with a long run of 17 yards. Freshman running back Ricky Allen (Pocono Summit, PA/Pocono Mountain West HS) has contributed 121 yards on 26 carries with a long of 32 yards while sophomore running back Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has 94 yards on 36 rushing attempts with a long of eight yards. Junior fullback Michael Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has six yards on three carries while freshman running back Wesley Germain (Rumson, NJ/Rumson-Fair Haven HS) has four yards on two carries.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: The Greyhounds have had ten different players catch a pass this season led by senior wide receiver Sean Hill, who has 20 receptions for 343 yards with six touchdowns. Senior tight end Kris Bisci (Easton, PA/Easton HS) has added 18 catches for 251 yards and two touchdowns while freshman wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus has 17 catches for 278 yards and two scores. Junior wide receiver Tyler Williams (Coplay, PA/Whitehall HS) has nine receptions for 82 yards while junior wide receiver Tyler Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS), who missed the first three game of the season with an injury, has seven catches for 94 yards. Junior fullback Morgan deRouen has five catches for 65 yards with one touchdown. Junior running back Tyler McCambridge has four catches for 28 yards while freshman wide receiver Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) has contributed three receptions for 39 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore tight end Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) has two receptions for 34 yards while junior tight end Nick Johnson (Keyport, NJ/Keyport HS) made his first career catch against Susquehanna University for 41 yard.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Leading the way for the backfield is a solid offensive line led by returning starters seniors Dave Kircher (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS), Eric Adams (Dover, NJ/Dover HS) and Jeff Kocsis (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) and junior Timothy McBride (Egg Harbor Township, NJ/Egg Harbor Township HS). Sophomore Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS) has earned the other starting position to help the Greyhounds average 6-2, 275 on the front line. Freshman Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has seen action in the last four games due to an injury by Kocsis, who was a member of the All-Middle Atlantic Conference Second Team a year ago.

**DEFENSIVE FRONT:** Junior defensive end **Don Maxwell (Berkeley Heights, NJ/Governor Livingston HS)** leads the Moravian defensive front with 26 tackles including one and a half tackles for loss and half a sack while junior defensive lineman **Douglas Bocchino** has added 25 tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack, an interception returned 45 yards for a touchdown versus Lebanon Valley College and a fumble recovery in the end zone for a touchdown against Johns Hopkins University. Senior defensive lineman **Matt Adams (Dover, NJ/Dover HS)** has contributed 13 stops with two tackles for loss. Freshman defensive lineman **Sean Rimmer (Kintnersville, PA/Palisades HS)** has made six tackles while junior defensive tackle **Robert Kadel (Blairstown, NJ/North Warren HS)** has eight tackles. Freshman defensive end **Matthew Leiggi (Princeton, NJ/West Windsor-Plainsboro HS)** has added one tackle while junior defensive tackle **Mike Nagle (Marlton, NJ/Bishop Eustace HS)** blocked and extra-point at Susquehanna University and recovered the block for the Greyhounds.

THE LINEBACKER CORPS: Junior linebacker Andrew Morrissey currently leads the Greyhound defense with a team high 58 tackles to go along with five tackles for loss, a fumble recovery and four forced fumbles while junior linebacker Kevin McGorry has added 44 tackles, five and a half tackles for loss, a sack, two pass break-ups, a fumble recovery and three forced fumbles. Senior linebacker Zach Santiago has 37 tackles, five and a half tackles for loss, one and a half sacks, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a pass break-up while sophomore linebacker Jayson Williams has contributed 25 tackles with two and a half tackles for loss, a half a sack and two forced fumbles. Sophomore Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS) has made 27 tackles with two for loss and a fumble return of five yards while senior linebacker Dan Edleman (Pottstown, PA/The Hill School) has ten tackles. Freshman linebacker Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has made 12 tackles this season and blocked a punt at Susquehanna University while sophomore linebacker Michael Bishop (Nazareth, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has two tackles for the Greyhounds.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD: In the defensive backfield, junior strong safety Carl Robinson has contributed 33 tackles, three interceptions and a forced fumble while junior defensive back Eric Brinkerhoff has 30 tackles with six tackles for loss, three and a half sacks, a fumble return of 72 yards for a touchdown, one interception, a forced fumble and two pass break-ups. Sophomore cornerback Brad Bodine has made 27 tackles with one for loss, seven pass break-ups, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery while freshman cornerback Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS) has 25 tackles to go along with an interception and a pass break-up. Freshman defensive back Thomas Dailey (Easton, PA/Notre Dame HS) has contributed 15 tackles and two pass break-ups for Moravian while freshman defensive back Jason Lauver (Winfield, PA/Selinsgrove HS) has an interception, a fumble recovery and three tackles. Freshman defensive back Dominic Rafetto (Allentown, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS) has ten tackles this fall.

**KICKING GAME:** Junior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** is 19-for-19 on extra-point attempts this season, and he 10-for-11 on field goal attempts with a long of 37 yards against McDaniel. **Reckenbeil** is averaging 51.9 yards per kickoff as well, making opponents receive the kickoff at their own 18-yard line. Junior punter **Michael Voskian** is averaging 37.5 yards per punt on 22 attempts with a career long of 51 yards at Johns Hopkins University. **Voskian** has had six punts inside the 20-yard line, three fair caught, one blocked and three touchbacks.

**SPECIAL TEAMS:** Junior running back **Tyler McCambridge** has six kickoff returns for 124 yards while senior wide receiver **Sean Hill** has returned four kickoffs for 75 yards. **McCambridge** also has five punt returns for 61 yards while freshman wide receiver **Alex Hersch** has added nine kickoff returns for 206 yards and three special teams tackles. Freshman defensive back **Eric Woodruff (Brodheadsville, AP/Pius X HS)** has returned four kickoffs for 79 yards while junior wide receiver **Tyler Hersch** has run back five kickoffs for 126 yards. Freshman linebacker **Anthony Carney** was credited with a 25-yard punt return after blocking a punt at Susquehanna. Freshman wide receiver **Shawn Sylvainus** has made eight tackles on special teams this fall while junior fullback **Michael Cancelliere** and junior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** each have added two tackles.

**STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME:** As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAN The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-Game Show. Last week, junior fullback **Morgan deRouen** and junior defensive back **Carl Robinson** were named Co-Players of the Game. **deRouen** ran for 80 yards and a touchdown on ten carries while **Robinson** intercepted two passes to go with three tackles. Starters Riverport and Starters Pub, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street and Route 378 South of Bethlehem.

**WINNING WAYS:** Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 15 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 20 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

**OVERTIME 'HOUNDS:** Moravian has played a total of seven overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 5-2 all-time in the extra-session. Last year was the sixth time since 1996 that the Greyhounds did not play at least one overtime game.
