MORAVIAN COLLEGE GREYHOUNDS 5-2 (3-2 Centennial Conference)

Juniata College Eagles 0-6 (0-5 Centennial Conference)

1:00 p.m.; Saturday, October 20, 2007 Rocco Calvo Field (c. 2,000); Bethlehem, PA

THE GAME: Moravian looks to win its final home game of the 2007 season in a Centennial Conference game versus Juniata College. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Rocco Calvo Field.

THE COACHES: Scot Dapp (West Chester '73) is in his 21st season at Moravian, with a career record of 126-86-1 (.594) and passed Rocco Calvo as the school's winningest football coach on September 8th with a 43-14 win versus McDaniel College. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. **Dapp**, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002 and the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004 & 2005, winning the title in 2005.

Juniata coach **Darrell Alt (Frostburg State '96)** has a record of 3-33 (.083) in his fourth year at the school.

THE SERIES: Saturday's meeting will be the 53^{rd} in the series with the series tied at 25-25-2 lead. The Greyhounds won last season's contest, 33-14 in Huntingdon, and Moravian has owned the series recently with an 11-5-1 record in the last 17 games. The series has had a history of close games with a streak of five straight years in which the game ended in a regulation tie from 1995 until 1999. Four of those games went to overtime and three won by Moravian.

CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE HONORS: Junior fullback Morgan deRouen (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS), junior linebacker Andrew Morrissey (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) and junior kicker Brian Reckenbeil (Branchburg, NJ/Somerville HS) of the Moravian College football team have earned spots on the Centennial Conference Weekly Honor Roll for their performance in the Greyhounds' 38-24 victory at Franklin & Marshall College Saturday. deRouen ran for a career high 103 yards and a touchdown on just 18 carries before being knocked out of the game with an injury in Moravian's victory at Franklin & Marshall. deRouen, who also lined up at tailback due to injuries to the Greyhounds' top two tailbacks, had 79 of his 103 yards in the first half on 15 carries including a career long run of 34 yards as well as a seven-yard touchdown run. deRouen had added 24 more yards on just three carries in the second half before a leg injury sidelined him for the rest of the game. Morrissey led the Greyhound defense with seven tackles with one tackle for loss. Morrissey made five of his tackles in the first half. Reckenbeil continued his torrid scoring streak with eight more points including five extra-points and a field goal at Franklin & Marshall. Reckenbeil now has 57 points this season, breaking his own single-season record of 55 set back in 2005. Reckenbeil's only missed kick of the game was a 52-yard field goal attempt on the final play of the first half. The kick had the distance but sailed just wide left. He did make a 32-yard field goal later in the game. Reckenbeil had made all 24 extra-point attempts this season and has connected on 33 straight extra-point kicks. He has school records of 11 field goals and 57 points this season. Reckenbeil also averaged 51.0 yards per kickoff with seven kickoffs in the game.

ON THE AIRWAVES: For the 11th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAN 1470 AM The Fox for the fourth straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance and color commentary from **John Elliott**.

GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE: Moravian has joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football beginning in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fourth with two first-place votes in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors' poll while Juniata was selected ninth.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have three players closing in on milestones for their careers. Junior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** became just the third kicker in Moravian history to reach 100 career points on September 8th and set the all-time school record for scoring by a kicker on September 29th. **Reckenbeil** is first all-time with 149 career points on 65 extra-points (third all-time) and 28 field goals (first all-time). **Reckenbeil** needs four extra-points to move into second all-time and nine extra-points to set the school record. His 57 points in 2007 are a school record. Junior quarterback **Marc Braxmeier** (**Center Valley, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS**) moved passed the 1,000 career passing yardage mark on September 15th and the 2,000 yard mark on October 13th. **Braxmeier** has now thrown for 2,097 yards including 1,518 this season. Junior running back **Tyler McCambridge (Northampton, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** became the 19th Greyhound to reach 1,000 career yards rushing on September 8th. **McCambridge** has 1,182 yards on 258 carries with eight touchdowns.

40s ARE WILD: When Moravian and Johns Hopkins University each scored over 40 points in the Greyhounds 44-41 win on September 22^{nd} , it marked the first time in school history for both schools that they had participated in a game in which both teams scored more than 40 points. The closest Moravian had been before was a 45-39 loss to Albright College in 2004.

THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS: The Greyhounds are third in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 333.9 yards per game. The squad is seventh in passing defense at 201.3 yards per game, and the defense is fifth in rushing yards allowed at 132.6. The Greyhounds are fifth in points allowed at 25.2 per game, and the squad is first in the conference in points scored per game at 31.6. Offensively, Moravian ranks second in the Centennial Conference at 378.9 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked fifth in rushing offense at 162.0 yards per game and third in passing offense at 216.9 yards per game. Moravian is third in turnover margin with a +0.71 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed 15 turnovers while forcing 20 turnovers this season. Moravian also leads the Centennial Conference pass efficiency at 154.1, tied in third down conversions 41.8 percent (41 of 98) and tied in point-after touchdown kicking percentage at 1.000 (24-of-24). Individually, junior quarterback Marc Braxmeier leads the Centennial Conference in pass efficiency at 158.7, is third in passing yards per game at 216.9 and fourth in total offense at 205.7 yards per game. Junior running back Tyler McCambridge is third in the Centennial Conference in all-purpose yardage at 139.5 yards per contest and is fourth in rushing yards at 86.2 yards per game while junior fullback Morgan deRouen is seventh in conference in rushing yards at 57.0 per game. Junior kicker Brian Reckenbeil is first in kick scoring at 8.1 points per game, first in field goals per game at 1.57, second in field goal percentage at 68.8 percent (11-for-16), tied for first in PAT percentage at 1.000 (24-of-24) and third in overall scoring at 8.1 points per game. Senior wide receiver Sean Hill (West Reading, PA/Wyomissing HS) is tied for seventh in overall and sixth in touchdown scoring at 6.0 points per game, and Hill is fifth in receiving yards per game in the Centennial Conference at 63.6 yards per contest and ninth in receptions per game at 3.43. Junior punter Michael Voskian (Brielle, NJ/Manasquan HS) is sixth in punting with an average of 37.3 yards per punt. Junior linebacker Andrew Morrissey is first in forced fumbles with 0.57 per game, and he is tied for fourth in tackles with 9.3 per contest while junior linebacker Kevin McGorry (Whitehall, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS) is second in the conference in forced fumbles per game at 0.43, and 21st in tackles per game at 6.7. Sophomore linebacker Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/ **Collingswood HS**) is tied for 44th in the Centennial Conference at 5.0 tackles per game and tied for third in forced fumbles with 0.40 per contest while junior defensive back Carl Robinson (Boothwyn, PA/Garnet Valley HS) is tied for 42nd at 5.3 tackles per game and first in interceptions with 0.57 per contest. Junior defensive back Eric Brinkerhoff (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) is 6th in tackles per game with an average of 4.9 and sixth in sacks per game at 0.50 while senior linebacker Zach Santiago (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) is tied for 27th at 6.1 tackles per contest. Sophomore defensive back Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) is fifth in passes defended at 1.14 per game and 50th in the conference with 4.7 tackles per game.

BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS: Of the 97 players on the Moravian roster, 45 are freshmen, 16 are sophomores and 22 are juniors. There are 14 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 50 letterwinners and 18 starters.

SCOUTING JUNIATA COLLEGE: The Eagles come to Bethlehem with an overall record of 0-6 and an 0-5 mark in Centennial Conference action after a 42-12 loss at Gettysburg College last Saturday. Junior quarterback **Jay Leonard** leads Juniata on the field and has completed 130 of 251 passes for 1,352 yards with eight touchdowns and five interceptions. **Leonard's** top targets have been senior wide receivers **Lance Tippett**, who has 40 catches for 619 yards and five touchdowns, **Chad Steiner**, who has caught 27 passes for 217 yards and a score, and **David Nicklaus**, who has grabbed 15 passes for 172 yards and two scores. The Eagles have just 360 rushing yards for the season with freshmen running backs **Kyle McKechnie**, who has 246 yards and four touchdowns on 86 carries, and **Derek Kramer**, who has 90 yards on 25 attempts, leading the ground attack. Sophomore defensive back **Andy Miller** is averaging 24.4 yards per kickoff return with 15 returns, and **Miller** has returned four punts for 19 yards. Freshman **Davis Smith** has made eight of ten extra-point attempts and three of six field goals with a long of 33 yards. Senior **Tyler Templeton** is averaging 37.4 yards per punt with a long of 55 yards, one blocked and six inside the 20-yard line. Junior linebacker **Josh Roy** leads the Juniata defense with 67 tackles including three tackles for loss, a sack, a pass break-up and a forced fumble. Sophomore defensive back **Brandon Spayd** has 52 tackles, three tackles for loss, two forced fumbles and a pass break-up while sophomore linebacker **Tyler Hall** has 46 tackles, four tackles for loss, a sack, two forced fumbles, a fumble recovery and a pass break-up. **Hall** has returned three punts for 32 yards while senior defensive back **Matt Schmidt** has the Eagles' only interception this season to go with 44 tackles, one tackle for loss and three pass break-ups.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: Junior quarterback Marc Braxmeier was 13 of 24 for 184 yards and three touchdowns in his first collegiate start to lead Moravian to a 33-14 victory over Juniata College. The Greyhounds took the opening kickoff and began its first possession at its own 42-yard line. Junior running back Tyler McCambridge capped a five-play drive with a 21-yard touchdown run. Junior Brian Reckenbeil added the extra-point for a 7-0 Moravian lead with 12:45 remaining in the first quarter. McCambridge finished the contest with 49 yards on seven carries. Moravian would score on its first possession of the second quarter to extend its lead. Braxmeier threw his first collegiate touchdown pass, a 13-yard score to senior tight end Kris Bisci (Easton, PA/Easton HS) to cap the six-play, 44-yard drive. Reckenbeil's extra-point went wide to the left, leaving the score at 13-0 with 12:35 remaining in the first half. The Eagles took the ensuing kickoff and drove 85 yards to score their first points of the game to pull Juniata within 13-7 with 8:08 left in the second quarter. The Greyhounds would get a 43-yard kickoff return from running back Edward Savoth to start the Moravian drive at the Juniata 27-yard line. Three plays later, junior running back Tyler de Rouen (West Milford, NJ/West Milford HS) ran off the right side for a 16-yard touchdown. Moravian went for the two-point conversion with McCambridge running off the left side for the conversion, giving the Greyhounds a 21-7 lead with 6:38 remaining in the half. Tyler de Rouen finished the game with 112 yards on 22 carries. Juniata responded with an 11-play, 72-yard drive to cut Moravian's lead to 21-14 with 2:25 remaining in the second quarter. Moravian would have one more drive in the first half. The Greyhounds would score with 1:12 left on the clock on a 20-yard touchdown pass from Braxmeier to wide receiver Shawn Martell. Reckenbeil missed the extra-point again to the left, giving the Greyhounds a 27-14 halftime lead. The Greyhounds would force Juniata to punt for the third time in the second half when Moravian defensive back Justin Klement came off the left side of the line to block the punt. Sophomore defensive back Brad Bodine picked up the ball at the Juniata 31-yard line and returned it six yards to the Juniata 25-yard line, setting up Moravian's next possession. Braxmeier would cap off the four-play drive with an 11-yard touchdown pass to junior fullback Morgan de Rouen on the first play of the fourth quarter. The Greyhounds would go for the two point conversion again but Braxmeier's pass was broken up, leaving the Moravian lead at 33-14 with 14:49 remaining in the game. Bodine led the Moravian defense with ten tackles while junior linebacker Andrew Morrissey added nine tackles with a sack, one of four by Moravian in the game. Junior defensive back Carl Robinson and senior linebacker Zach Santiago each had seven tackles with Robinson breaking up two passes and Santiago adding a sack.

THE QUARTERBACKS: Junior Marc Braxmeier has completed 102 of 167 passes for 1,518 yards with 15 touchdowns and seven interceptions in seven games. Braxmeier's four touchdown passes in the 34-27 season opening win at Susquehanna University and in a 44-41 win at Johns Hopkins University tied the school record for touchdown passes in a game, last done by **Rob Petrosky** during the 1996 season. Braxmeier also has three rushing touchdowns this season but has been sacked 20 times for a net rushing total of minus 78 yards in 43 carries. Sophomore quarterback **Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS)** has attempted two passes this season, both incompletions. **Rempe** has one carry for four yards while freshman quarterback **Steven Zander (Newton, NJ/Newton HS)** had one rushing attempt for a yard in his first action at Franklin & Marshall College.

IN THE BACKFIELD: In the backfield, junior fullback Morgan deRouen, who was injured against Franklin & Marshall College, has 399 yards and two touchdowns on 63 attempts with a long of 34. Junior tailback Tyler McCambridge, who has missed the last three games with an injury, has gained 345 yards on 74 carries this season with one touchdown and a long run of 27 yards while junior yards tailback Tyler deRouen, who has missed the last four games with an injury, has added 132 yards and a score on 35 carries with a long run of 17 yards. Freshman running back Ricky Allen (Pocono Summit, PA/Pocono Mountain West HS) has contributed 190 yards and a touchdown on 38 carries with a long of 32 yards while sophomore running back Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has 114 yards on 47 rushing attempts with a long of ten yards. Junior fullback Michael Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has 21 yards on six carries while freshman running back Wesley Germain (Rumson, NJ/Rumson-Fair Haven HS) has eight yards on three carries.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: The Greyhounds have had ten different players catch a pass this season led by senior wide receiver Sean Hill, who has 24 receptions for 445 yards with seven touchdowns. Freshman wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS) has 20 catches for 306 yards and two scores while senior tight end Kris Bisci, who missed the Franklin & Marshall game with an injury, has added 18 catches for 251 yards and two touchdowns. Junior wide receiver Tyler Williams (Coplay, PA/Whitehall HS) has ten receptions for 114 yards and a touchdown while junior wide receiver Tyler Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS), who missed the first three game of the season with an injury, has nine catches for 117 yards. Sophomore tight end Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) has eight receptions for 112 yards while junior fullback Morgan deRouen has five catches for 55 yards with one touchdown. Junior running back Tyler McCambridge has four catches for 28 yards while freshman wide receiver Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) has contributed three receptions for 39 yards and two touchdowns. Junior tight end Nick Johnson (Keyport, NJ/Keyport HS) made his first career catch against Susquehanna University for 41 yard.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Leading the way for the backfield is a solid offensive line led by returning starters seniors **Dave Kircher (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS)**, **Eric Adams (Dover, NJ/Dover HS)** and **Jeff Kocsis (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** and junior **Timothy McBride (Egg Harbor Township, NJ/Egg Harbor Township HS)**. Sophomore **Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS)** has earned the other starting position to help the Greyhounds average 6-2, 275 on the front line. Freshman **Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS)** has seen action in four games due to an injury by **Kocsis**, who was a member of the All-Middle Atlantic Conference Second Team a year ago, while junior **Wes Harpel (East Greenville, PA/Upper Perkiomen HS)** started at Franklin & Marshall College for **McBride**, who missed the game with an injury.

DEFENSIVE FRONT: Junior defensive end **Don Maxwell (Berkeley Heights, NJ/Governor Livingston HS)** leads the Moravian defensive front with 29 tackles including one and a half tackles for loss and half a sack while junior defensive lineman **Douglas Bocchino (Madison, NJ/Madison HS)** has added 25 tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack, an interception returned 45 yards for a touchdown versus Lebanon Valley College and a fumble recovery in the end zone for a touchdown against Johns Hopkins University. Senior defensive lineman **Matt Adams (Dover, NJ/Dover HS)** has contributed 14 stops with two tackles for loss. Freshman defensive lineman **Sean Rimmer (Kintnersville, PA/Palisades HS)** has made eight tackles while junior defensive tackle **Robert Kadel (Blairstown, NJ/North Warren HS)** has three tackles. Freshman defensive end **Matthew Leiggi (Princeton, NJ/West Windsor-Plainsboro HS)** has added one tackle while junior defensive tackle **Mike Nagle (Marlton, NJ/Bishop Eustace HS)** blocked and extra-point at Susquehanna University and recovered the block for the Greyhounds.

THE LINEBACKER CORPS: Junior linebacker Andrew Morrissey currently leads the Greyhound defense with a team high 65 tackles to go along with six tackles for loss, a fumble recovery and four forced fumbles while junior linebacker Kevin McGorry has added 47 tackles, five and a half tackles for loss, a sack, two pass break-ups, a fumble recovery and three forced fumbles. Senior linebacker Zach Santiago has 43 tackles, five and a half tackles for loss, one and a half sacks, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a pass break-up while sophomore linebacker Jayson Williams has contributed 25 tackles with two and a half tackles for loss, a half a sack and two forced fumbles. Sophomore Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS) has made 27 tackles with two for loss and a fumble return of five yards while senior linebacker Dan Edleman (Pottstown, PA/The Hill School) has 11 tackles. Freshman linebacker Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has made 15 tackles for the Greyhounds. Bishop has been moved to fullback due to injuries in the Moravian offensive backfield.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD: In the defensive backfield, junior strong safety Carl Robinson has contributed 37 tackles, four interceptions and a forced fumble while junior defensive back Eric Brinkerhoff has 34 tackles with seven tackles for loss, three and a half sacks, a fumble return of 72 yards for a touchdown, one interception, a forced fumble and two pass break-ups. Sophomore cornerback Brad Bodine has made 33 tackles with one for loss, eight pass break-ups, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery while freshman cornerback Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS) has 25 tackles to go along with an interception and two pass break-ups. Freshman defensive back Thomas Dailey (Easton, PA/Notre Dame HS) has contributed 17 tackles, one tackle for loss, and interception with a nine-yard return and two pass break-ups for Moravian while freshman defensive back/linebacker Jason Lauver (Winfield, PA/Selinsgrove HS) has an interception, a fumble recovery and three tackles. Freshman defensive back Dominic Rafetto (Allentown, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS) has 11 tackles this fall with a majority coming on special teams play.

KICKING GAME: Junior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** is 24-for-24 on extra-point attempts this season, and he 11-for-16 on field goal attempts with a long of 37 yards against McDaniel. **Reckenbeil** is averaging 51.8 yards per kickoff as well, making opponents receive the kickoff at their own 18-yard line. Junior punter **Michael Voskian** is averaging 37.3 yards per punt on 27 attempts with a career long of 51 yards at Johns Hopkins University. **Voskian** has had six punts inside the 20-yard line, four fair caught, one blocked and four touchbacks.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Junior running back **Tyler McCambridge** has six kickoff returns for 124 yards while senior wide receiver **Sean Hill** has returned four kickoffs for 75 yards. **McCambridge** also has five punt returns for 61 yards while freshman wide receiver **Alex Hersch** has added nine kickoff returns for 206 yards and three special teams tackles. Freshman defensive back **Eric Woodruff (Brodheadsville, PA/Pius X HS)**, who has two tackles and three pass break-ups, has returned five kickoffs for 87 yards while junior wide receiver **Tyler Hersch** has run back six kickoffs for 159 yards. Freshman linebacker **Anthony Carney** was credited with a 25-yard punt return after blocking a punt at Susquehanna. Freshman wide receiver **Shawn Sylvainus** has made ten tackles on special teams this fall while junior fullback **Michael Cancelliere** and junior kicker **Brian Reckenbeil** each have added two tackles.

STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME: As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAN The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-Game Show. Last week, junior fullback **Morgan deRouen** was named the Player of the Game. **deRouen** ran for a career high 103 yards and a touchdown on just 18 carries before being knocked out of the game with an injury in Moravian's victory at Franklin & Marshall. **deRouen**, who also lined up at tailback due to injuries to the Greyhounds' top two tailbacks, had 79 of his 103 yards in the first half on 15 carries including a career long run of 34 yards as well as a seven-yard touchdown run. **deRouen** had added 24 more yards on just three carries in the second half before a leg injury sidelined him for the rest of the game. Starters Riverport and Starters Pub, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street and Route 378 South of Bethlehem.

STARTING THE SEASON 4-0: Moravian's 4-0 start to the 2007 season was just the fifth time the Greyhounds had won their first four games of the season, and the second time in the last four years. Moravian's other 4-0 starts were in 1940 (6-0), 1941 (4-0), 1988 (4-0) and 2004 (7-0).

WINNING WAYS: Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach Scot Dapp, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 15 winning seasons in Dapp's 20 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. Dapp ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

OVERTIME 'HOUNDS: Moravian has played a total of seven overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 5-2 all-time in the extra-session. Last year was the sixth time since 1996 that the Greyhounds did not play at least one overtime game.
