THE GAME: Moravian looks to win its second straight contest in a non-conference game versus Lebanon Valley College. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Rocco Calvo Field in Bethlehem.

THE COACHES: Scot Dapp (West Chester '73) is in his 23rd season at Moravian, with a career record of 136-92-1 (.597), the winningest football coach in Moravian history. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. **Dapp**, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004, 2005 and 2008, winning the title in 2005.

Lebanon Valley coach **Jim Monos** (**Shippensburg '72**) returned to Lebanon Valley in 2004. He has a 66-93-2 (.416) record in 16 seasons in Annville with a 44-65-2 record in his first 11 seasons from 1986 to 1996.

THE SERIES: Saturday's meeting will be the 67th in the series with Moravian holding a 34-31-1 lead. The Greyhounds earned a 23-16 win in Annville last year, and Moravian posted a 19-18 victory in Bethlehem in 2007 as the teams met for the first time since the 1940s as non-conference opponents. The Flying Dutchmen snapped a six-game losing streak in the series in 2006 with a 55-21 win in Annville.

CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE HONORS: Junior defensive back Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS) and junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS) of the Moravian College football team have been named to the Centennial Conference Weekly Honor Roll for their performances in the Greyhounds' 21-16 conference victory over McDaniel College Saturday afternoon to open the 2009 Centennial Conference season. Burley helped the Moravian defense hold McDaniel to just a second half field goal in the victory. Burley scooped up a key fumble recovery with just 50 seconds remaining and returned it eight yards as the Greyhounds stopped the Green Terror's final drive. Burley had a total of seven tackles including one for loss of three yards. Sylvainus led the Greyhounds' offense with four receptions for 74 yards including touchdown catches of 38 and 30 yards on Moravian's first two possessions.

GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE: Moravian joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fourth in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors poll.

WEEKLY CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE COACHES WEB CHAT: Head Football Coach Scot Dapp will be participating in the weekly Centennial Conference football chats every Tuesday beginning at 10:00 a.m. Coach Dapp is scheduled to be on-line beginning at 10:42 a.m. each week as all nine Centennial Conference head coaches will be available.

ON THE AIRWAVES: For the 13th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAN 1470 AM The Fox for the fifth straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance from **John Elliott**. The broadcast kicks off at 12:30 p.m. with a one-hour pregame show.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have one player closing in on milestones for his career. Senior running back Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS) needs just 1108 yards to become the 20th player in school history to rush for 1,000 career yards. Rempe, who came to Moravian as a quarterback, has 892 career yards on just 232 carries with seven touchdowns in 28 games. Rempe, who tied the school record with 51 attempts at Juniata College last season, had 727 of those yards on 178 carries last season with 165 carries in the last four games of the year.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: In Annyille last fall, tailback Tyler McCambridge ran for 119 yards and two touchdowns on 19 carries to lead Moravian to a 23-16 victory. The Flying Dutchmen received the opening kickoff and punted after three plays. Moravian would also attempt a punt on its first drive after three plays. However, the snap when over punter Michael Voskian's head and through the back of the end zone for a safety, giving Lebanon Valley a 2-0 lead with 12:44 to go in the first quarter. Lebanon Valley would move into the red zone on its next possession. However, tailback Charlie Parker was unable to control a handoff from quarterback Caleb Fick, putting the ball on the turf. Greyhound defensive back Erik Brinkerhoff jumped on the loose ball to give Moravian possession on its own 18yard line. Moravian would respond by taking the ball the full 82-yards to the end zone in 12 plays with McCambridge diving in from one-yard to finish off the drive. Kicker Brian Reckenbeil made his 48th straight extra-point to give the Greyhounds a 7-2 with 3:46 to play in the first quarter. During the drive, quarterback Marc Braxmeier hit wide receiver Tyler Williams with a 26-yard pass to move inside the Lebanon Valley 30-yard line. **Braxmeier** was just six of 17 in the game with 86 yards. The Flying Dutchmen were driving again with Fick completing a pass to Matt Donley when Moravian linebacker Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS) hit Donley and forced a fumble that was recovered by Greyhound defensive lineman Don Maxwell at the Moravian 24-yard line to give the ball back to the Greyhound offense. The Greyhounds would move into Lebanon Valley territory before a Moravian penalty and a sack would for Moravian punt early in the second quarter. Lebanon Valley moved the ball down the field and inside the Moravian 30-yard line but a sack by Greyhound defensive lineman Doug Bocchino sacked Fick on a third down play at the Greyhound 36-yard line, forcing the Flying Dutchmen to punt. Moravian was only able to run three plays for punting as well. Lebanon Valley needed just two plays to take the lead with Fick hitting wide Joe Brennan with a 65-yard touchdown pass between double coverage. Brittney Ryan made the extra-point to put the Flying Dutchmen ahead, 9-7, with 7:32 to go in the second quarter. Fick was 17 of 28 in the game for 228 yards but was sacked four times. The teams would trade punts for the remainder of the first half until Lebanon Valley's final possession ended at the half after back to back sacks by **Bocchino** and defensive lineman Allen Petros (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS). Moravian received the opening kickoff of the second half but was unable to move the ball, punting after three plays. The Flying Dutchmen punted after three plays as well with Moravian linebacker Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) picking up a sack of Fick on third down. The Greyhounds would take possession after the Lebanon Valley punt at the Flying-Dutchmen 48-yard line. Four plays later, McCambridge, who carried the ball on all four plays, ran in from 31 yards for his second touchdown of the game. Braxmeier then hit tight end Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) with the two-point conversion pass to give Moravian a 15-9 lead with 10:03 remaining in the third quarter. McCambridge went over 100 yards rushing for the second straight game on his touchdown run. The Flying Dutchmen moved the ball down to the Moravian 30yard line after a 24-yard shuffle pass from Fick to Parker. However, a Lebanon Valley penalty and three incomplete passes for the Flying Dutchmen forced a punt. Moravian would move the ball out near midfield with a trio of first downs but the Greyhounds' drive stalled forcing a punt. Lebanon Valley then went on its longest drive of the game, covering 82 yards in 14 plays. Parker finished the drive with an eight-yard touchdown run. Ryan's kick pushed the Flying Dutchmen ahead 16-15 with 10:02 remaining in the game. A key play on the drive was a fourth-and-four completion for five yards from Fick to Donley. Parker ran for 84 yards on 24 carries. The Greyhounds responded by going straight down the field and retaking the lead with a ten-play, 75-yard drive capped off with an 18-yard touchdown run by tailback **Tyler deRouen**. Moravian would go for the two-point conversion again with **Braxmeier** hitting Dencker again to give the Greyhounds a 23-16 lead with 5:08 to play. The key play on the drive for Moravian was a fourth-and-one dive by Braxmeier that there was a personal foul on the Lebanon Valley defense as well to move the ball just past midfield. The Greyhounds ran the ball on eight of the ten plays on the drive. The Flying Dutchmen would run just three plays with the Greyhound defense stepping up and making a tackle for a five-yard loss on a reverse by Lebanon Valley on second down. After the punt, Moravian took over on its own 33-yard line. The Greyhounds would run out the clock by moving the ball down to the Lebanon Valley ten-yard line. Tyler deRouen finished with 74 yards on 11 carries while fullback Morgan deRouen had 71 yards on 11 attempts as the Greyhound offense ran the ball 50 times for 264 yards, the second straight game Moravian has run for more than 260 yards. Braxmeier had 13 yards on six carries despite being sacked once. Williams caught two passes for 42 yards while McCambridge had one catch for 15 yards which set up his second touchdown run. Donley led Lebanon Valley with eight receptions for 74 yards while Brennan had six catches for 109 yards and his touchdown. Brennan also carried the ball twice for 12 yards while Parker caught two passes for 29 yards. Linebacker Kevin McGorry led the Moravian defense with eight tackles including one and a half tackles for loss while Protasiewicz had seven tackles to go with his forced fumble. Linebacker Andrew Morrissey also added seven tackles while Carney had six tackles with his sack, one of four by the Greyhounds. Bocchino had just four tackles but two were sacks, and he added two and a half tackles for loss and a pass break-up at the line. Defensive back Dane Eichelberger led the Lebanon Valley defense with 13 tackles while linebacker Will Keylor and defensive back Andrew Shambach each had 12 tackles. Keylor and defensive lineman Zach Bleiler combined for the Flying Dutchmen's only sack.

THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS:

The Greyhounds are fifth in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 357.5 yards per game. The squad is first in passing defense at 171.0 yards per game, and the defense is ninth in rushing yards allowed at 186.5 per game. The Greyhounds are second in points allowed at 20.0 per game, and the squad is eighth in points scored per game at 10.5. Offensively, Moravian is eighth in the Centennial Conference at 224.5 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked sixth in rushing offense at 94.5 vards per game and eighth in passing offense at 130.0 yards per game. Moravian is eighth in turnover margin with a -1.0 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed six turnovers while forcing four turnovers. Moravian also leads the Centennial Conference in red zone defense at 75.0 percent, allowing opponents to score on six of eight chances in the red zone. Individually, senior running back **Ryan Rempe** is seventh in the conference in rushing at 56.5 yards per game. Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk (Yorktown, VA/New Egypt HS) is sixth in the conference in pass efficiency with a 133.2 rating, and he is eighth in passing yardage at 175.0 yards per game and eighth in total offense at 151.0 yards per contest. Senior quarterback Patrick Weiss (Gilbertsville, PA/St. Pius X HS) is tenth in passing yards per game at 54.0 and tenth in pass efficiency with a 39.5 rating. Junior defensive back **Daniel Burley** and senior defensive back Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) are tied for fifth in interceptions with 0.5 per game with **Burley** also tied for second in fumbles recovered at 0.5 per contest. Freshman defensive back Travis King (Wilmington, DE/Concord HS) is fifth in kickoff returns with an average of 20.7 yards per return while junior punter Eric Dziengelski (Coatesville, PA/Chestnut Hill Academy) is sixth in punting with an average of 34.4 yards per punt. Junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus is tenth in scoring and tied for eighth in touchdown scoring at 6.0 points per contest while sophomore kicker Ian Heck (Easton, PA/Easton HS) is ninth in kick scoring at 0.5 points per game. Senior linebacker Derek Prostasiewicz is tied for 11th in the Centennial Conference in tackles with an average of 7.5 per game while junior linebacker Philip Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland **HS**) is tied for 18th at 6.5 tackles per contest. Junior defensive lineman Allen Petros is tied for 24th in tackles with 6.0 per game, and he is tied for second in tackles for loss with 1.5 per game and tied for fourth in sacks at 0.5 per contest. Sophomores defensive back David Wacker (Parkton, MD/Hereford HS) and linebacker Evan Bauer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty **HS**) are also tied for 24th in tackles at 6.0 per game while **Bauer** is tied for fourth in sacks at 0.50 per contest and tied for fourth in forced fumbles with 0.5 per contest. Junior linebacker **Anthony Carney** is also tied for fourth in forced fumbles with 0.5 per game while junior defensive lineman Jacob Millen (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) is tied for second in fumbles recovered at 0.50 per contest. Sophomore defensive lineman Seth Payne (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) and senior defensive back Kyle Krupa (Ashley, PA/Hanover HS) are both tied for fourth in the conference in passes defended at 1.50 per contest.

SCOUTING LEBANON VALLEY COLLEGE: The Flying Dutchmen enter the game with a 2-0 record after a 27-20 win at Ursinus College last Saturday. Junior quarterback Caleb Fick leads the Lebanon Valley offense on the field having completed 28 of 41 passes for 364 yards with four touchdowns and three interceptions. Fick's top targets have been senior wide receiver **Sean Donovan**, who has 11 catches for 130 yards, and senior wide receiver Joe Brennan, who has nine receptions for 183 yards and four touchdowns including a 70-yard reception. Senior wide receiver Matt Donley has added six catches for 77 yards. Sophomore quarterback Colt Zarilla has completed five of eight passes this season for 70 yards. Senior running back Charlie Parker leads the Flying Dutchmen rushing attack with 193 yards and two touchdowns on 38 carries while sophomore running back **Ben Guiles** has added 15 carries for 131 yards and two scores. Senior fullback Bryan Lynch has added eight rushing attempts for 36 yards while Zarilla has 26 yards and a touchdown on four carries. Donovan has five kickoff returns on the season for Lebanon Valley for 112 yards while Guiles has two kickoff returns for 109 yards including a 95-yard touchdown return. Junior defensive back Nic Shirley has returned three punts for 18 yards while **Donovan** has two punt returns for 20 yards. Junior kicker Brittany Ryan has made eight of ten extra-points this season and missed her only field goal attempt while sophomore Matt Nawracai has missed one field goal attempt and senior **Dan DiBona** has missed one extra-point. Freshman Nick Fehr is handling the kickoff duties for the Flying

Dutchmen, averaging 57.3 yards per kickoff. **Zarilla** is also the punter for Lebanon Valley, and has an average of 43.2 yards per punt with a long of 55 yards, four inside the 20-yard line, one fair caught and one touchback. Senior linebacker **Will Keylor** leads the Flying Dutchmen defense with 30 tackles including three and a half tackles for loss, two sacks, two passes defended and a fumble recovery with a return of five yards. Senior linebacker **Bruno Iozzo** has contributed 15 tackles with a half tackle for loss while junior defensive back **Dane Eichelberber** has 12 tackles and a team high six passes defended. Senior defensive back **Matt Lillis** also has 12 tackles and is one of three Flying Dutchmen with an interception this season to go with a total of three passes defended. Sophomore defensive lineman **Nick Bowne** has 11 tackles with one for loss and a sack while junior linebacker **Jason Gigous** has 11 stops with a half a tackle for loss. Junior defensive lineman **Zach Bleiler** leads Lebanon Valley with four and a half tackles for loss and three and a half sacks among his nine tackles.

THE QUARTERBACKS: Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk (Yorktown, VA/New Eygpt HS) has completed 12 of 22 passes for 175 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. He has also been sacked four times this season. Sophomore Andy Polony (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) started for the Greyhounds in the game at Susquehanna University and completed just four-of-eight passes for 31 yards with two interceptions in the first half. Senior Patrick Weiss played the other half of the game at Susquehanna and was just three-for-14 for 54 yards with one interception. Weiss did gain 32 yards on three carries in the contest.

IN THE BACKFIELD: In the backfield, senior running back Ryan Rempe leads the Greyhounds with 113 yards on 20 attempts. Sophomore fullback Phillip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) has added 68 yards on 25 carries for Moravian while senior running back Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has five yards on seven attempts with one touchdown. Freshman running back Langston Ross (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) has a yard on two carries while freshman linebacker Stephen Kircher (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS) has 14 yards on a fake punt against McDaniel.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: The Greyhounds have had four different players catch a pass this season led by junior wide receiver **Shawn Sylvainus**, who has caught six passes for 89 yards and two touchdowns. Junior wide receiver **Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS)** has added five catches for 73 yards while senior tight end **Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS)** has five receptions for 51 yards. **Dencker** also has a two-point conversion reception Sophomore running back **Phillip Redline** has three catches for 47 yards.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Senior Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS) and junior Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) are back on the offensive line with Grando as the only returning All-Conference player for the Greyhounds. Sophomore Nicholas Marzuoli (Easton, PA/Easton HS) and junior Matthew Washer (Ogdensburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) saw plenty of playing time last season while senior Kyle Passarelli (Princeton, NJ/Montgomery HS) gives Moravian five experienced players on the line that will average 6-3, 275. Freshman Frank Costantini (Middletown, NJ/Middletown HS) starts at center.

DEFENSIVE FRONT: Junior defensive lineman **Allen Petros** leads the Moravian defensive line with 12 tackles including ten solo stops, three tackles for loss and one sack. Junior defensive lineman **Michael McClarin** (**Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS**) has added eight tackles with one for loss while junior defensive lineman **Jacob Millen** has five tackles, a fumble recovery and a blocked extra-point versus McDaniel College. Sophomore defensive lineman **Seth Payne** has three tackles and three pass break-ups.

THE LINEBACKER CORPS: Senior linebacker Derek Protasiewicz leads the linebackers and the Moravian defense with 15 tackles including one for loss. Junior linebacker Philip Bortz has contributed 13 tackles and two pass break-ups while sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer has made 12 stops with one tackle for loss, one sack and a forced fumble. Freshman linebacker Jake Hildebrand (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) has nine tackles this season while senior linebacker Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) and junior linebacker Anthony Carney each have six tackles. Carney also has a pass break-up and a forced fumble which sealed the team's victory over McDaniel College.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD: In the defensive backfield, sophomore defensive back David Wacker has 12 tackles while senior defensive back Brad Bodine has six stops, an interception and a total of two passes defended. Junior defensive back Daniel Burley has seven tackles, a tackle for loss, an interception returned 18 yards and a fumble recovery for eight yards. Senior defensive back Kyle Krupa has contributed six tackles and three pass break-ups while freshmen defensive backs Travis King and Marc Olivo (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) each have four tackles on the season.

KICKING GAME: Sophomore kicker **Ian Heck** has five kickoffs this season with an average of 52 yards per kickoff. **Heck** is also one-for-two on extra-point attempts. Junior punter **Eric Dziengelski** has punted ten times for an average of 34.4 yards per punt with a long of 47 yards versus McDaniel College, one inside the 20-yard line and one touchback.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Freshman defensive back **Travis King** has returned seven kickoffs for 145 yards with a long return of 31 yards, and **King** also has one punt return for eight yards before an injury against McDaniel College. Freshman running back **Langston Ross** has a kickoff return of 52 yards while junior wide receiver **Eric Woodruff (Brodheadsville, PA/Pius X HS)** has one kickoff return for 28 yards. **Woodruff** also has two tackles on special teams. Junior wide receiver **Alex Hersch** has returned one punt this fall for a yard.

STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME: As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAN The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-

Game Show. Last week, sophomore quarterback **Steve Panasuk** was selected as the Starters Player of the Game for his performance. **Panasuk** completed 12 of 22 passes for 175 yards and two touchdowns, along with two interceptions in his first start for Moravian. Starters Riverport, Starters Pub and Starter Clubhouse Grille, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street, Route 378 South of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Municipal Golf Course.

BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS: Of the 90 players on the Moravian roster, 30 are freshmen, 19 are sophomores and 25 are juniors. There are 16 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 54 letterwinners including five from the 2007 season and 13 starters.

WINNING WAYS: Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 16 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 21 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

OVERTIME 'HOUNDS: Moravian has played a total of seven overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 5-2 all-time in the extra-session. Last year was the seventh time since 1996 that the Greyhounds did not play at least one overtime game.
