

#### **About Johns Hopkins**



THE GAME: Moravian looks to remain undefeated in Centennial Conference action in a conference game at Johns Hopkins University. Kickoff is slated for 2:00 p.m. at Homewood Field in Baltimore, Maryland.

THE COACHES: Scot Dapp (West Chester '73) is in his 23rd season at Moravian, with a career record of 136-93-1 (.593), the winningest football coach in Moravian history. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. Dapp, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004, 2005 and 2008, winning the title in 2005.

Johns Hopkins coach Jim Margraff (Johns Hopkins '82) has a record of 121-73-3 (.622) in his 20<sup>th</sup> year at the school. Coach Margraff was the Blue Jays starting quarterback in the school's only three wins against Moravian.

**THE SERIES:** Saturday's meeting will be the 11th in the series with Moravian holding a 7-3 lead. The Greyhounds won last year's contest, 33-10, in Bethlehem, and Moravian captured the 2007 game, 44-41 in Baltimore. The Greyhounds won the previous meeting in the series with a 17-7 victory in Bethlehem back in 1982. The Blue Jays last win was a 15-10 victory in Baltimore in 1981. The teams played eight straight seasons from 1975 to 1982.

40s ARE WILD: When Moravian and Johns Hopkins University each scored over 40 points in the Greyhounds 44-41 win in 2007, it marked the first time in school history for both schools that they had participated in a game in which both teams scored more than 40 points. The closest Moravian had been before was a 45-39 loss to Albright College in 2004. The Greyhounds did it again last season in a 48-41 loss at Gettysburg College.

GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE: Moravian joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fourth in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors poll while Johns Hopkins was selected first with ten first-place votes.

WEEKLY CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE COACHES WEB CHAT: Head Football Coach Scot Dapp will be participating in the weekly Centennial Conference football chats every Tuesday beginning at 10:00 a.m. Coach Dapp is scheduled to be on-line beginning at 10:42 a.m. each week as all nine Centennial Conference head coaches will be available.

BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS: Of the 90 players on the Moravian roster, 30 are freshmen, 19 are sophomores and 25 are juniors. There are 16 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 54 letterwinners including five from the 2007 season and 13 starters.

ON THE AIRWAVES: For the 13th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAN 1470 AM The Fox for the fifth straight year. Phil May calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from Craig Barnes and technical assistance from John **Elliott**. The broadcast kicks off at 1:00 p.m. with a one-hour pregame show.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have one player closing in on milestones for his career. Senior running back Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS) needs just 108 yards to become the 20<sup>th</sup> player in school history to rush for 1,000 career yards. Rempe, who came to Moravian as a quarterback, has 892 career yards on just 232 carries with seven touchdowns in 28 games. Rempe, who tied the school record with 51 attempts at Juniata College last season, had 727 of those yards on 178 carries last season with 165 carries in the last four games of the year. Rempe did not play last week in Moravian's loss to versus Lebanon Valley College.

**THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS:** The Greyhounds are eighth in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 404.3 yards per game. The squad is fifth in passing defense at 206.3 yards per game, and the defense is ninth in rushing yards allowed at 198.0 per game. The Greyhounds are third in points allowed at 24.0 per game, and the squad is eighth in points scored per game at 8.0. Offensively, Moravian is eighth in the Centennial Conference at 193.7 yards per game. The

Greyhounds are ranked eighth in rushing offense at 67.7 yards per game and eighth in passing offense at 126.0 yards per game. Moravian is seventh in turnover margin with a -0.67 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed seven turnovers while forcing five turnovers. Moravian leads the Centennial Conference in penalties, being flagged just ten times for 75 yards, an average of 25.0 yards per game. Individually, senior running back Ryan Rempe is seventh in the conference in rushing at 56.5 yards per game. Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk (Yorktown, VA/New **Egypt HS**) is sixth in the conference in pass efficiency with a 116.0 rating, and he is seventh in passing vardage at 146.5 yards per game and ninth in total offense at 121.5 yards per contest. Freshman defensive back Travis King (Wilmington, DE/Concord HS) is fifth in kickoff returns with an average of 20.7 yards per return while junior punter Eric Dziengelski (Coatesville, PA/Chestnut Hill Academy) is seventh in punting with an average of 35.2 yards per punt. Sophomore kicker Ian Heck (Easton, PA/Easton HS) is ninth in kick scoring at 1.3 points per game, and he is tied for seventh in field goals per game at 0.33. Sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is tied for 17<sup>th</sup> in the Centennial Conference in tackles with an average of 7.0 per game while sophomore defensive back David Wacker (Parkton, MD/Hereford HS) is tied for 22<sup>nd</sup> at 6.0 tackles per contest. Junior linebacker **Philip Bortz** (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS) is tied for 29<sup>th</sup> at 5.7 tackles per contest while junior defensive lineman Allen Petros (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) and senior defensive back Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) are tied for 36th in tackles with 5.3 per game. Petros is tied for second in tackles for loss with 1.5 per game and tied for fourth in sacks at 0.67 per contest. Senior linebacker Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS) is tied for 40<sup>th</sup> in tackles with an average of 5.0 stops per game. **Bauer** is tied for seventh in forced fumbles at 0.33 per game while junior defensive lineman Jacob Millen (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) and junior defensive back Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS) are tied for fourth in fumble recoveries at 0.33 per contest.

SCOUTING JOHNS HOPKINS UNIVERSITY: The Blue Jays enter Saturday's game with an overall record of 2-1 and a 1-0 slate in Centennial Conference action after defeating Gettysburg College, 41-23, last Friday night. Sophomore quarterback Hewitt Tomlin leads Johns Hopkins on the field, having completed 62 of 90 passes for 612 yards with four touchdowns and an interception. Junior wide receiver Tucker Michels has been the top target, catching 14 passes for 88 yards and a touchdown while junior wide receiver Dan Crowley has 11 receptions for 194 yards and a score. Sophomore wideout Sam Wernick also has 11 catches for 112 yards and a score. Senior running back Andrew Kase leads the Blue Jays rushing attack with 357 yards and five touchdowns on 72 carries, and he has caught seven passes for 80 yards with a score. Michels has seven kickoff returns for 123 yards and two punt returns for nine yards while junior wide receiver **D.J. Hartigan** has six kickoff returns for 135 yards. Junior punter **Max** Islinger is averaging 30.9 yards per punt on 14 punts with three fair caught and one inside the 20-yard line. Junior placekicker Alex Lachman has made all 11 of his extra-points and two of three field goal attempts. Sophomore defensive back Sam Eagleson has two of the Blue Jays' four interceptions. Sophomore defensive back Mike Milano leads Johns Hopkins with 27 tackles including one for loss and two pass break-ups. Sophomore linebacker Tyler Brown has made 26 stops with a pass breakup and a half a tackle loss while sophomore linebacker Kale Sweeney has 20 tackles. Senior rover Glenn Rocca has made 18 tackles with an interception and a forced fumble while **Eagleson** has added 18 stops.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: In Bethlehem last fall, kicker Brian **Reckenbeil** kicked school records of four field goals and 15 total points to lead Moravian to a 33-10 victory over Johns Hopkins University in Centennial Conference action at Rocco Calvo Field. The Greyhounds improved to 4-0 overall for the second straight season and the sixth time in school history. Moravian didn't take long to score in the contest. The Greyhounds won the coin toss for the fourth straight game but deferred to the second half. **Reckenbeil's** opening kickoff hit Johns Hopkins running back **Nick Fazio** in the hands at the JHU 14 yard line and bounced away. Greyhound defensive back David Wacker fell on the ball at the 22-yard line. Moravian tailback Tyler McCambridge needed just six seconds to cover the 22-yards to the end zone for his seventh rushing touchdown of the season. Reckenbeil added the extra-point for a 7-0 Greyhound lead just 12 seconds into the game. Johns Hopkins would take the ensuing kickoff and move into Moravian territory before the Blue Jay drive stalled at the 47yard line, forcing a punt. After a five-yard run by McCambridge and a one yard run by fullback Morgan deRouen, Greyhound quarterback Marc Braxmeier hit McCambridge with an 81-yard catch and run for a touchdown, the second longest scoring pass in Moravian history. Reckenbeil connected on his 50th straight extra-point to give the Greyhounds a 14-0 lead with 9:49 to play in the first quarter. The Blue Jays, who entered the game leading the Centennial Conference in scoring at 40.7 points per game, would score on their next drive. Johns Hopkins had a short field after a pair of Moravian penalties on the kickoff set the Blue Jay offense up at the Moravian 45-yard line. Nine plays later, Johns Hopkins quarterback Hewitt Tomlin connected on a 14-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver **D.J. Hartigan**. Kicker **Alex Lachman** connected on his 38<sup>th</sup> straight extra-point to pull the Blue Jays within 14-7 with 6:29 remaining on the clock in the first quarter. Moravian would run just three plays before punting for the first time in the game. However, the Greyhounds would get the ball back after just one play when defensive lineman Doug Bocchino forced Tomlin to fumble. Moravian linebacker Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS), who returned to the line-up after being injured in the season opener, covered the ball at the JHU 25-yard line. The Greyhounds would pick up a first down to move into the red zone before the drive stalled at the five-yard line. Reckenbeil came on to his a 22-yard field goal with 2:46 to play in the first quarter, giving Moravian a 17-7 lead. On the fourth play of the next Johns Hopkins drive, Greyhound defensive back Carl Robinson intercepted a Tomlin pass at the Moravian 42-yard line. However, the Greyhounds were unable to move the ball and punted after three plays. The Blue Jays would embark on 11-play drive after the punt that Lachman capped with a 34-yard field goal to pull Johns Hopkins within 17-10 with ten minutes to go until halftime. Neither team would score in the remainder of the first half. Moravian's two drives would end in Reckenbeil just missing a 41-yard field goal wide right and a punt while Johns Hopkins drives ending with Greyhound defensive back Erik Brinkerhoff intercepting a Tomlin pass at the Moravian-ten yard line and returning it 16 yards, and the clock running out on the Blue Jays in the red zone before they could call a timeout after a 17-yard completion from Tomlin to running back Andrew Kase. Johns Hopkins, which came into the game leading the Centennial Conference in turnover margin at a pluseight, had four turnovers in the first half but still had gained 279 yards of offense, including 127 yards on the ground both higher than Moravian's defensive game averages for the season. Moravian received the opening kickoff of the second half but would punt after three plays. The Blue Jays picked up a pair of first downs on their first drive after the half but would

eventually punt as well. Moravian would punt again after three plays. However, the Greyhounds would get the ball back two plays later when Kase lost handle of the ball and fumbled. Moravian defensive lineman Michael McClarin (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) would cover the ball at the JHU 48-yard line. Braxmeier hit wide receiver Tyler Williams with a 33-yard pass to move the ball into the red zone to eventually set up a 28vard field goal by **Reckenbeil** to extend the Greyhounds' lead to 20-10 with 5:21 to go in the third quarter. The next three drives would end in punts, two by Johns Hopkins and one by the Greyhounds. Moravian would took over its first possession of the fourth quarter on the JHU 31 yard line after a 17-yard punt return by McCambridge. Six plays later Reckenbeil tied the school record with his third field goal of the game, a 30-yard kick with 11:52 to play, giving Moravian a 23-10 lead. Johns Hopkins would get one first down on its next drive before turning the ball over on downs at the Moravian 40-yard line. The Greyhounds would begin to run out the clock and picked up three first downs while moving the ball to the JHU nine-yard line. Reckenbeil came on to break both the school records for field goals in a game and total kicking points in a contest when he made a 26-yard boot with 4:48 remaining in the contest. The Blue Jays three four straight passes but gained just two yards before turning the ball back over to the Greyhounds on the JHU 32-yard line. Moravian would run seven plays with tailback Tyler deRouen finishing off the scoring on a 12-yard touchdown runs with 1:15 left in the contest. Reckenbeil made his final extra-point of the game, his 51st straight extra-point, not having missed a point-after attempt in two years, to set the final score at 33-10. Reckenbeil also moved into third in school history in overall scoring with 185 points in his career, the most by a kicker. The Blue Jays would have one more drive that ended at the Moravian 38-yard line when the clock expired. The Greyhounds, who entered the game as the top rushing team in the Centennial Conference at 295.7 yards per game, ran for 164 yards on 45 carries with Tyler deRouen having 70 yards on 21 attempts, McCambridge running for 64 yards on 13 carries and Morgan deRouen contributing 27 yards on ten attempts. In the air, **Braxmeier** completed ten of 21 passes for 182 yards, and he was not sacked in the game. McCambridge caught three passes for 90 yards while tight end Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) had three receptions for 22 yards. Morgan deRouen caught two passes for 24 yards for the Greyhounds. Johns Hopkins, which had just 114 yards in the second half including 65 yards on the ground with the Moravian offense controlled the ball for 19:28 of the second half, was led by Kase, who had 117 yards on 23 carries. Running back Lyndon O'Connor added 49 yards on seven carries. Tomlin added 24 yards on three carries and was sacked once. Tomlin completed 24 of 42 passes for 201 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions with wide receiver Tucker Michels catching seven passes for 58 yards. Hartigan added six catches for 54 yards while wide receiver Sam Wernick had four receptions for 13 yards. Linebackers Kevin McGorry and Andrew Morrissey led the Moravian defense with 11 tackles with McGorry adding one tackle for loss. Robinson had eight tackles to go with his interception and a pass break-up while defensive back Daniel Burley and linebacker Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/ Bethlehem Catholic HS) also had eight tackles. Carney had a pair of pass break-ups while Brinkerhoff had seven tackles with one for loss to go with his interception. The Greyhounds picked up five turnovers in the game to give Moravian 16 turnovers recovered and a plus-12 turnover margin for the season. Linebacker Colin Wixted led the Johns Hopkins defense with ten tackles, a half a tackle for loss and a pass break-up while defensive back Chris Baldwin had nine tackles. Linebacker A.J. Albert added eight tackles, one and a half tackles for loss and a pass break-up for the Blue Jays.

THE QUARTERBACKS: Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk has completed 25 of 45 passes for 293 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. He has also been sacked seven times this season. Sophomore Andy Polony (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) started for the Greyhounds in the game at Susquehanna University and completed just four-of-eight passes for 31 yards with two interceptions in the first half. Senior Patrick Weiss (Gilbertsville, PA/St. Pius X HS) played the other half of the game at Susquehanna and was just three-for-14 for 54 yards with one interception. Weiss did gain 32 yards on three carries in the contest.

IN THE BACKFIELD: In the backfield, senior running back Ryan Rempe leads the Greyhounds with 113 yards on 20 attempts. Sophomore fullback Phillip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) has added 75 yards on a team high 27 carries for Moravian while senior running back Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has six yards on ten attempts with one touchdown. Freshman running back Langston Ross (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) has 11 yards on ten carries while freshman running back Rocco Del Priore (Center Valley, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) has 22 yards on nine attempts. Freshman linebacker Stephen Kircher (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS) has 14 yards on a fake punt against McDaniel College.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: The Greyhounds have had eight different players catch a pass this season led by junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus, who has caught 11 passes for 122 yards and two touchdowns. Junior wide receiver Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS), who missed the game versus Lebanon Valley College, has added five catches for 73 yards while senior tight end Brian Dencker has six receptions for 73 yards. Dencker also has a two-point conversion reception. Sophomore running back Phillip Redline has four catches for 52 yards while sophomore tight end Mike Zanoni (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) has two receptions for 29 yards. Senior running back Anthony Falco has added two catches for 23 yards while junior wide receiver Ray Olivo (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) has one reception for ten yards.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Senior Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS) and junior Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) are back on the offensive line with Grando as the only returning All-Conference player for the Greyhounds. Sophomore Nicholas Marzuoli (Easton, PA/Easton HS) and junior Matthew Washer (Ogdensburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) saw plenty of playing time last season while senior Kyle Passarelli (Princeton, NJ/Montgomery HS) gives Moravian five experienced players on the line that will average 6-3, 275. Freshman Frank Costantini (Middletown, NJ/Middletown HS) starts at center while sophomore Ed Matta (Exton, PA/Downingtown East HS) has also seen action this season.

**DEFENSIVE FRONT:** Junior defensive lineman **Allen Petros** leads the Moravian defensive line with 16 tackles including 12 solo stops, four and a half tackles for loss and two sacks. Junior defensive lineman **Michael McClarin** has added 11 tackles with two for loss while junior defensive lineman **Jacob Millen** has nine tackles, a fumble recovery and a blocked extra-point versus McDaniel College. Sophomore defensive lineman **Seth Payne** (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) has six tackles and three pass break-ups while junior defensive lineman **Ryan Ulk** (**Temple, PA/Muhlenberg HS**) has three tackles. Sophomore defensive lineman **Patrick Gordon** (**Bethlehem, PA/Notre Dame HS**) has contributed two stops.

THE LINEBACKER CORPS: Sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer leads the linebackers and the Moravian defense 21 tackles with one and a half tackles for loss, one sack, a forced fumble, an interception returned 15 yards and a total of two passes defended. Junior linebacker Philip Bortz has contributed 17 tackles and two pass break-ups while senior linebacker Derek Protasiewicz with 15 tackles including one for loss. Freshman linebacker Jake Hildebrand (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) has 12 tackles this season while senior linebacker Jayson Williams has ten tackles with one for loss. Junior linebacker Anthony Carney has made eight stops with a pass break-up and a forced fumble, which sealed the team's victory over McDaniel College.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD: In the defensive backfield, sophomore defensive back David Wacker has 18 tackles while senior defensive back Brad Bodine has 16 stops, an interception and a total of two passes defended. Junior defensive back Daniel Burley has ten tackles, a tackle for loss, an interception returned 18 yards and a fumble recovery for eight yards. Senior defensive back Kyle Krupa (Ashley, PA/Hanover HS) has contributed 12 tackles and three pass break-ups while freshman defensive back Marc Olivo (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) has eight tackles on the season. Freshman defensive back Travis King has made five stops.

**KICKING GAME:** Sophomore kicker **Ian Heck** has seven kickoffs this season with an average of 54.1 yards per kickoff. **Heck** is also one-for-two on extra-point attempts, and made his first career field goal attempt of 30 yards versus Lebanon Valley College. Junior punter **Eric Dziengelski** has punted 19 times for an average of 35.2 yards per punt with a long of 53 yards versus Lebanon Valley College, four inside the 20-yard line, three fair caught and one touchback.

**SPECIAL TEAMS:** Freshman defensive back **Travis King** has returned ten kickoffs for 207 yards with a long return of 31 yards, and **King** also has two punt returns for four yards. Freshman running back **Langston Ross** has four kickoff returns for 122 yards with a long return of 52 yards while junior wide receiver **Eric Woodruff (Brodheadsville, PA/Pius X HS)** has one kickoff return for 28 yards. **Woodruff** also has two tackles on special teams. Junior wide receiver **Alex Hersch** has returned one punt this fall for a yard.

**STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME:** As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAN The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-Game Show. Last week, sophomore kicker **Ian Heck** and junior punter **Eric Dzingelski** were selected as the Starters Players of the Game for his performance. **Heck** connected on his first career field goal attempt of 30

yards and had two kickoffs for 104 yards. **Dzingelski** was called on nine times to punt in the game versus Lebanon Valley. He averaged 36.0 yards per punt with a career long of 53 yards and three punts inside the 20-yard line. Starters Riverport, Starters Pub and Starter Clubhouse Grille, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street, Route 378 South of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Municipal Golf Course.

**WINNING WAYS:** Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 16 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 21 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

**OVERTIME 'HOUNDS:** Moravian has played a total of seven overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 5-2 all-time in the extra-session. Last year was the seventh time since 1996 that the Greyhounds did not play at least one overtime game.
