**THE GAME:** Moravian looks to snap a two-game losing streak in a Centennial Conference game versus Dickinson College. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Rocco Calvo Field in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania.

**THE COACHES: Scot Dapp (West Chester '73)** is in his 23rd season at Moravian, with a career record of 136-94-1 (.591), the winningest football coach in Moravian history. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. **Dapp**, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004, 2005 and 2008, winning the title in 2005.

Dickinson coach **Darwin Breaux** (West Chester '77) has a record of 106-62-1 (.630) in his 17<sup>th</sup> year at the school.

**THE SERIES:** Saturday's meeting will be the 13<sup>th</sup> in the series with Dickinson holding a 6-4-2 lead. The Red Devils earned a 16-7 win in Carlisle last fall and left Bethlehem with a 24-23 victory in 2007. The schools had not met since 1980 when the Greyhounds earned a 33-12 victory, also in Bethlehem. Moravian has only won once in six trips to Carlisle, a 13-7 win back on September 26, 1936.

**GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE:** Moravian joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fourth in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors poll while Dickinson College was tied for second with two first-place votes.

**WEEKLY CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE COACHES WEB CHAT:** Head Football Coach **Scot Dapp** will be participating in the weekly Centennial Conference football chats every Tuesday beginning at 10:00 a.m. Coach **Dapp** is scheduled to be on-line beginning at 10:42 a.m. each week as all nine Centennial Conference head coaches will be available.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have one player closing in on milestones for his career. Senior running back Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS) needs just 69 yards to become the 20<sup>th</sup> player in school history to rush for 1,000 career yards. Rempe, who came to Moravian as a quarterback, has 931 career yards on just 252 carries with seven touchdowns in 289 games. Rempe, who tied the school record with 51 attempts at Juniata College last season, had 727 of those yards on 178 carries last season with 165 carries in the last four games of the year. Rempe did not play in Moravian's loss versus Lebanon Valley College, and he only played on play in the victory over McDaniel College.

**ON THE AIRWAVES:** For the 13th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAN 1470 AM The Fox for the fifth straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance from **John Elliott**. The broadcast kicks off at 12:30 p.m. with a half hour pregame show.

THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS: The Greyhounds are eighth in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 406.0 yards per game. The squad is fourth in passing defense at 213.8 yards per game, and the defense is ninth in rushing yards allowed at 192.2 per game. The Greyhounds are fourth in points allowed at 24.8 per game, and the squad is eighth in points scored per game at 6.0. Offensively, Moravian is ninth in the Centennial Conference at 169.0 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked ninth in rushing offense at 54.8 yards per game and ninth in passing offense at 114.2 yards per game. Moravian is seventh in turnover margin with a -0.75 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed ten turnovers while forcing seven turnovers. Moravian leads the Centennial Conference in penalties, being flagged just 11 times for 80 yards, an average of 20.0 yards per game, and the squad is tied for first in field goal percentage at 100 percent (one-for-one). Individually, senior running back Ryan Rempe is eighth in the conference in rushing at 50.7 yards per game. Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk (Yorktown, VA/New Egypt HS) is seventh in the conference in pass efficiency with a 95.5 rating, and he is eighth in passing yardage at 110.0 yards per game. Senior quarterback Patrick Weiss (Gilbertsville, PA/St. Pius X HS) is tenth in passing yardage at 48.0 yards per game. Freshman defensive back Travis King (Wilmington, DE/Concord HS) is fourth in kickoff returns

with an average of 21.5 yards per return while junior punter Eric Dziengelski (Coatesville, PA/Chestnut Hill Academy) is seventh in punting with an average of 35.1 yards per punt. Sophomore kicker Ian Heck (Easton, PA/Easton HS) is ninth in kick scoring at 1.0 points per game, and he is tied for eighth in field goals per game at 0.25. Sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is tied for fourth in the Centennial Conference in tackles with an average of 8.2 per game while junior linebacker Philip Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS) is tied for ninth at 7.2 tackles per contest. Sophomore defensive back David Wacker (Parkton, MD/Hereford HS) is tied for 20th at 6.2 tackles per contest while junior defensive lineman Allen Petros (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is tied for 31<sup>st</sup> in tackles with 5.3 per game. **Petros** is tied for second in tackles for loss with 1.5 per game and third in sacks at 0.67 per contest. Senior defensive back Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) leads the Centennial Conference in interceptions at 0.75 per game, and he is tied for sixth in passes defended with 1.00 per contest and tied for 37<sup>th</sup> in tackles at 5.0 per game. Junior defensive back Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton **HS**) is tied for 33<sup>rd</sup> in tackles per game with an average of 5.2 while senior defensive back Kyle Krupa (Ashley, PA/Hanover HS) is tied for 44<sup>th</sup> at 4.8 tackles per contest.

SCOUTING DICKINSON COLLEGE: The Red Devils enter Saturday's game with an overall record of 4-0 and a 2-0 mark in Centennial Conference action after a 35-7 win over McDaniel College. Senior quarterback Ian Mitchell leads Dickinson on the field, having completed 55 of 85 passes for 626 yards with six touchdowns and just two interceptions. Mitchell's top targets have been senior Pat O'Connor, who was 27 receptions for 339 yards and three scores, senior wide receiver Joe Sandoe, who has caught seven passes for 104 yards and a score, and senior running back **Tim Wells**, who has six receptions for 24 yards. **Mitchell** also leads the Red Devils' rushing attack with 520 yards and nine touchdowns on 58 carries. Wells has added 225 yards and three touchdowns on 38 attempts while junior running back Tim Smith has 223 yard and two touchdowns on 42 carries. Junior running back Greg Lord has contributed 199 yards and a score on 38 attempts while O'Connor has 18 yards on two carries. O'Connor also leads Dickinson with five punt returns for 70 yards and four kickoff returns for 57 yards while junior wide receiver Craig Heller has returned nine kickoffs for 206 yards. Junior kicker/punter Gordon Craig is 20-for-22 on extra-points this season and two-for-two on field goal attempts with a long of 39 yards, and Craig is averaging 32.1 yards per punt on 15 punts with three inside the 20-yard line and three fair caught. Sophomore defensive back Andrew Fink leads the Red Devils defense with 33 tackles, an interception and a fumble recovery while senior defensive back Michael Maxwell has 30 tackles, a team high two interceptions and a total of 11 passes defended. Junior linebacker **Kevin Wood** has contributed 29 tackles with one pass break-up while junior defensive back Pat McNeal has 28 tackles with two for loss, one sack and an interception. Junior linebacker **Pete Hamill** has added 27 tackles with two for loss, one and a half sacks, and interception and one of Dickinson's three blocked kicks this season while junior linebacker Jack Connolly has 25 tackles with one and a half for loss, one sack and one pass break-up. Senior defensive lineman Gray Gish leads the Red Devils with three tackles for loss, all of which are sacks, among his 13tackles this season.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: In Carlisle last fall, quarterback Ian Mitchell completed eight of 19 passes for 132 yards and threw a pair of touchdown passes to wide receiver Pat O'Conner to lead the Dickinson College football team to a 16-7 victory over Moravian in Centennial Conference action at Biddle Field in a game that took just two hours and 12 minutes to play. Dickinson received the opening kickoff, and the Red Devils moved into the red zone at the Moravian 16-yard line but a 33-yard field goal by kicker Gordan Craig was wide left. The Greyhounds moved the ball 16 yards on their first drive before quarterback Marc Braxmeier fumbled an exchange from the center, giving Dickinson the ball at the Moravian 36-yard line. However, Dickinson would run just three placed before Mitchell threw a pass that was intercepted by defensive back Erik Brinkerhoff and returned to the Moravian 20-yard line. Moravian would be able to run just three plays against the Red Devil defense before punting the ball away. The Red Devils would pick up one first down on their next drive to Moravian territory before punting the ball. The punt by Dickinson punter Matt Stark pinned the Greyhounds inside their own one-yard line. Moravian would get one first down before Michael Voskian punted for the second time in the game. Dickinson was called for a penalty on the punt return forcing the Red Devils to begin at their own 25-yard line. After just three plays, Dickinson would punt the ball back to Moravian. The Greyhounds would begin with their own 41-yard line, and Moravian would take 12 plays to cover the 59 yards the end zone. The drive nearly stalled at midfield but Braxmeier pushed forward for a first down on a fourth-andone from midfield. Two plays later facing a second-and-15, tailback Tyler deRouen ran for 26 yards off the right side before being forced out of bounds. Moravian moved into the red zone and faced a third-and-four from the 11-yard line when Braxmeier connected on an 11-yard touchdown with tight end Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS). Kicker Brian **Reckenbeil** made his 52<sup>nd</sup> straight extra-point to give the Greyhounds a 7-0 lead with 8:22 remaining in the second quarter. Dickinson responded on its next possession with a seven-play, 74-yard scoring drive. Mitchell hit O'Conner with three passes on the drive of 25, 20 and 22 yards with the final one going for a touchdown on a fourth-and-six play from the Moravian 22-yard line. Craig added the extra-point to tie the game at 7-7 with 5:11 to go in the first half. Moravian would get a 20-yard kickoff return from tailback Tyler McCambridge to set the Greyhound offense up at its own 40-yard line. Moravian moved the ball into the red zone after a 25-yard run by Braxmeier and a personal foul on Dickinson. However, Braxmeier would be intercepted at the two-yard line by Dickinson lineman Tredell **Johns**, who fumbled the ball and it was recovered by Red Devil defensive back Michael Dalton at the Dickinson three-yard line with just 35 seconds left in the first half. The interception was Braxmeier's first of the season, the second straight year his first interception of the year has come against the Red Devils. Dickinson would take a knee to finish the half. Moravian received the opening kickoff of the second half and would pick up one first down before having to punt. The Red Devils would do the same on Dickinson's first drive of the half as well. The Greyhounds ran just three plays on their next drive before punting again. O'Conner had a 17-yard punt return to set the Dickinson offense up at the Moravian 35-yard line. Two plays later, Mitchell hit O'Conner with another 22-yard touchdown pass. Craig's extra-point attempt was wide right, setting the score at 13-7 with 6:58 to play in the third quarter. The teams traded punts on the next four possessions of the game to finish out the third quarter. The

Greyhounds would start the fourth quarter with the ball on their own 16yard line. McCambridge would run for 12 yards on the first play. However, fullback Morgan deRouen fumbled on the next play, the Greyhounds' third turnover of the game, with Dickinson defensive lineman Steve Bokron recovering at the Moravian 32-yard line. The Red Devils would run 12 plays and pick up just 20 yards while running 4:16 off the clock before Craig hit a 29-yard field goal with 10:20 to play in the game to give Dickinson a 16-7 lead. The Red Devils picked up a pair of fourth downs on the drive with Mitchell running for three yards on a fourth-andone and running back Tim Wells going for two yards on another fourthand-one. Dickinson did have a touchdown called back on the drive by a penalty. Wide receiver Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) had a 26-yard return on the kickoff for the Greyhounds and a personal foul penalty on Dickinson gave Moravian the ball at the Dickinson 43-yard line. Tyler deRouen ran for 15 yards on the first play for the Greyhounds; however, Moravian would turn the ball over on downs at the Dickinson 19yard line after Braxmeier was stopped short on a quarterback sneak on a fourth-and one play. Dickinson would essentially run out the clock on its next drive, taking 5:01 off of the game clock while running 12 plays to pick up 52 yards. The Red Devils eventually turned the ball over on downs when Wells was stopped for a loss at the Moravian 29-yard line. Moravian threw three incomplete passes and Braxmeier was sacked for the third time in the game as the Greyhounds turned the ball back over on downs with just 1:52 remaining in the contest. Dickinson took a pair of kneel downs to run out the clock. Wells led all runners with 106 yards on 24 carries as Dickinson ran the ball 47 times for 180 yards. Mitchell added 39 yards on eight attempts while sophomore running back Greg Lord had 39 yards on 12 carries. O'Conner caught seven passes for 129 yards while Lord caught Mitchell's other pass for three yards. Tyler deRouen led the Moravian rushing attack with 55 yards on 13 carries as the Greyhounds ran for just 106 yards on 41 attempts, 156 yards below their Centennial Conference leading average of 262.8 yards per game. McCambridge had 45 yards on 14 carries while **Braxmeier** netted just four yards on nine carries after being sacked three times. Braxmeier did complete ten of 19 passes for 67 yards with a touchdown and an interception. **Dencker** caught five passes for 48 yards to go with his touchdown. Voskian averaged over 40 yards per punt for the second straight game with an average of 40.5 yards and a long of 51 yards on six punts. Linebacker Ben Hargrave led the Dickinson defense with 13 tackles including one and a half for loss and a pass break-up while Johns had ten tackles, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a pass breakup to go with his interception. Linebacker Kevin Wood added eight tackles with a sack and a forced fumble for the Red Devils. Linebacker Andrew Morrissev led the Moravian defense with 12 tackles including one for loss while linebacker Kevin McGorry and defensive lineman Don Maxwell each had eight tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass break-up. defensive lineman Doug Bocchino added seven tackles with a half a tackle for loss and a pass break-up while defensive back Carl Robinson, sophomore defensive back Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS) and linebacker Jason Lauver each had six tackles. Robinson and Burley had pass breakups while Lauver had a tackle for loss.

THE QUARTERBACKS: Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk has completed 31 of 60 passes for 330 yards with two touchdowns and four interceptions. He has also been sacked ten times this season. Senior Patrick Weiss has played in two games, completing seven of 25 pass attempts for 95 yards with two interceptions. Weiss has gained 29 yards on five carries this season while being sacked twice. Sophomore Andy Polony (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) started for the Greyhounds in the game at Susquehanna University and completed just four-of-eight passes for 31 yards with two interceptions in the first half. Polony has been sacked three times this season.

IN THE BACKFIELD: In the backfield, senior running back Ryan Rempe leads the Greyhounds with 152 yards on 40 attempts. Sophomore fullback Phillip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) has added 75 yards on 27 carries for Moravian while freshman running back Rocco Del Priore (Center Valley, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) has 24 yards on 11 attempts. Freshman running back Langston Ross (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) has 11 yards on ten carries while senior running back Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has six yards on ten attempts with one

touchdown. Freshman linebacker **Stephen Kircher (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS)** has 14 yards on a fake punt against McDaniel College while freshman defensive back **Travis King** picked up seven yards on a fake punt against Johns Hopkins University.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: The Greyhounds have had 12 different players catch a pass this season led by junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS), who has caught 12 passes for 130 yards and two touchdowns. Junior wide receiver Alex Hersch, who missed the game versus Lebanon Valley College, has added seven catches for 90 yards while senior tight end Brian Dencker has seven receptions for 76 yards. Dencker also has a two-point conversion reception. Sophomore running back Phillip Redline has four catches for 52 yards while junior wide receiver Ray Olivo (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) has three receptions for 24 yards. Sophomore tight end Mike Zanoni (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) has two receptions for 29 yards while senior running back Anthony Falco has added two catches for 23 yards. Junior wide receiver Eric Woodruff (Brodheadsville, PA/Pius X HS) has one reception for 31 yards.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Senior Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS) and junior Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) are back on the offensive line with Grando as the only returning All-Conference player for the Greyhounds. Sophomore Nicholas Marzuoli (Easton, PA/Easton HS) and junior Matthew Washer (Ogdensburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) saw plenty of playing time last season while senior Kyle Passarelli (Princeton, NJ/Montgomery HS) gives Moravian five experienced players on the line that will average 6-3, 275. Freshman Frank Costantini (Middletown, NJ/Middletown HS) starts at center while sophomore Ed Matta (Exton, PA/Downingtown East HS) has also seen action this season.

DEFENSIVE FRONT: Junior defensive lineman Allen Petros, who missed the game at Johns Hopkins University with an injury, leads the Moravian defensive line with 16 tackles including 12 solo stops, four and a half tackles for loss and two sacks. Junior defensive lineman Michael McClarin (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) has also added 16 tackles with two for loss while junior defensive lineman Jacob Millen (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) has nine tackles, a fumble recovery and a blocked extrapoint versus McDaniel College. Sophomore defensive lineman Seth Payne (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) has eight tackles and four pass break-ups while junior defensive lineman Ryan Ulk (Temple, PA/Muhlenberg HS) has four tackles. Sophomore defensive lineman Patrick Gordon (Bethlehem, PA/Notre Dame HS) has contributed three stops.

THE LINEBACKER CORPS: Sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer leads the linebackers and the Moravian defense 33 tackles with two and a half tackles for loss, one sack, a forced fumble, an interception returned 15 yards and a total of two passes defended. Junior linebacker Philip Bortz has contributed 29 tackles, a tackle for loss and two pass break-ups while senior linebacker Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS) has 18 tackles including one for loss. Freshman linebacker Jake Hildebrand (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) has 12 tackles this season while senior linebacker Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) has 14 tackles with one for loss. Junior linebacker Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has made 14 stops with a pass break-up and a forced fumble, which sealed the team's victory over McDaniel College. Senior linebacker Michael Bishop (Nazareth, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has added four tackles while freshman linebacker Stephen Kircher has five tackles with one for loss.

**THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD:** In the defensive backfield, sophomore defensive back **David Wacker**) has 25 tackles with one for loss while senior defensive back **Brad Bodine** has 20 stops, a tackle for loss, a team high three interceptions with 15 yards in returns and a total of four passes defended. Junior defensive back **Daniel Burley** has 21 tackles, a tackle for loss, an interception returned 18 yards and a fumble recovery for eight yards. Senior defensive back **Kyle Krupa** has contributed 19 tackles and three pass break-ups while freshman defensive back **Marc Olivo** 

(Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) has 11 tackles on the season. Freshman defensive back Travis King has made ten stops with one for loss while freshman defensive back Matt Johnson (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) has four tackles.

**KICKING GAME:** Sophomore kicker **Ian Heck** has eight kickoffs this season with an average of 55.1 yards per kickoff. **Heck** is also one-for-two on extra-point attempts, and made his first career field goal attempt of 30 yards versus Lebanon Valley College. Junior punter **Eric Dziengelski** has punted 25 times for an average of 35.1 yards per punt with a long of 53 yards versus Lebanon Valley College, four inside the 20-yard line, three fair caught and one touchback.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Freshman defensive back Travis King has returned 13 kickoffs for 280 yards with a long return of 43 yards at Johns Hopkins University, and King also has two punt returns for four yards. Freshman running back Langston Ross has six kickoff returns for 163 yards with a long return of 52 yards versus McDaniel College while junior wide receiver Eric Woodruff has one kickoff return for 28 yards. Woodruff also has two tackles on special teams. Junior wide receiver Alex Hersch has returned one punt this fall for a yard.

**STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME:** As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAN The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-Game Show. Last week, freshman defensive back **Travis King** was selected as the Starters Players of the Game for his performance. **King** 

three kickoff returns for 73 yards including a career long of 43 yards, and he made five tackles with one for loss and picked up seven yards on a fake punt in Moravian's 27-0 loss at Johns Hopkins University. Starters Riverport, Starters Pub and Starter Clubhouse Grille, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street, Route 378 South of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Municipal Golf Course.

**BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS:** Of the 90 players on the Moravian roster, 30 are freshmen, 18 are sophomores and 27 are juniors. There are 15 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 54 letterwinners including five from the 2007 season and 13 starters.

**WINNING WAYS:** Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 16 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 21 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

**OVERTIME 'HOUNDS:** Moravian has played a total of seven overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 5-2 all-time in the extra-session. Last year was the seventh time since 1996 that the Greyhounds did not play at least one overtime game.
