THE GAME: Moravian looks to snap a three-game losing streak in a Centennial Conference game versus Gettysburg College. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Rocco Calvo Field in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania.

THE COACHES: Scot Dapp (West Chester '73) is in his 23rd season at Moravian, with a career record of 136-94-1 (.591), the winningest football coach in Moravian history. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. **Dapp**, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004, 2005 and 2008, winning the title in 2005.

Gettysburg coach Barry Streeter (Lebanon Valley '71) has a record of 153-151-5 (.505) in his 31st year at the school.

THE SERIES: Saturday's meeting will be the eighth in the series with Gettysburg owning a 6-1 advantage. Moravian's only win in the series was the first in the series, a 17-7 win in 1978. Gettysburg won last season's meeting, 48-41 in Gettysburg, and the Bullets earned a 27-20 win in 2007 after the schools had not met since 1982. The Greyhounds have made just three trips to Shirk Field at Musselman Stadium and have lost all three games contests.

CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE HONORS: Freshman kick returner/defensive back **Travis King** (Wilmington, DE/Concord HS) and sophomore defensive back **David Wacker** (Parkton, MD/Hereford HS) of Moravian were named to the Centennial Conference Weekly Honor Roll for their performances in the Greyhounds' 21-3 loss to Dickinson College Saturday afternoon. **King** racked up 146 all-purpose yards with two kickoff returns for 82 yards including a season long return of 56 yards and five punt returns for 64 yards with a season long of 29 yards. **King** also made three tackles including one for a loss of five yards that forced one of Dickinson's eight punts in the game. **Wacker** led the Greyhounds' defense with 12 tackles as Moravian kept the Red Devils, ranked second in the Centennial Conference, 100 yards below their season offense average..

GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE: Moravian joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fourth in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors poll while Gettysburg College was picked fifth.

The broadcast kicks off at 12:00 p.m. with an hour pregame show.

kickoff returns to move into a tie for tenth. **King** currently has 362 yards on 15 returns this fall.

THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS:

The Greyhounds are sixth in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 392.8 yards per game. The squad is fourth in passing defense at 200.8 yards per game, and the defense is ninth in rushing yards allowed at 192.0 per game. The Greyhounds are fifth in points allowed at 24.0 per game, and the squad is eighth in points scored per game at 5.4. Offensively, Moravian is ninth in the Centennial Conference at 171.0 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked seventh in rushing offense at 74.8 yards per game and ninth in passing offense at 96.2 yards per game. Moravian is eighth in turnover margin with a -1.40 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed 15 turnovers while forcing eight turnovers. Moravian leads the Centennial Conference in penalties, being flagged just 16 times for 126 yards, an average of 25.2 yards per game, and the squad is first in kickoff returns with an average of 25.4 yards per return. Individually, senior running back **Rvan Rempe** is sixth in the conference in rushing at 80.2 vards per game. Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk (Yorktown, VA/New Egypt HS) is eighth in the conference in pass efficiency with a 91.9 rating, and he is ninth in passing yardage at 86.8 yards per game. Freshman defensive back Travis King is fourth in kickoff returns with an average of 24.1 yards per return, and he is third in punt returns at 9.7 yards per return. Junior punter Eric Dziengelski (Coatesville, PA/Chestnut Hill Academy) is seventh in punting with an average of 34.5 yards per punt while sophomore kicker Ian Heck (Easton, PA/Easton HS) is ninth in kick scoring at 1.4 points per game, and he is tied for seventh in field goals per game at 0.40. Sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is tied for third in the Centennial Conference in tackles with an average of 8.4 per game while sophomore defensive back David Wacker is tied for 12th at 7.4 tackles per contest. Junior linebacker Philip Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS) is 17th at 7.0 tackles per contest while junior defensive back **Daniel Burley** (**Easton, PA/Easton HS**) is 20th in tackles per game with an average of 6.2. Senior defensive back Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) is tied for third in the Centennial Conference in interceptions at 0.60 per game, and he is tied for 32nd in tackles at 5.4 per game. Junior defensive lineman Allen Petros (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is 36th in tackles with 5.3 per game, and Petros is tied for second in tackles for loss with 1.5 per game and fourth in sacks at 0.67 per contest.

SCOUTING GETTYSBURG COLLEGE: The Bullets enter the game with an overall record of 1-4 and a 1-2 slate in Centennial Conference action after falling Ursinus College, 55-50, last weekend in a game Gettysburg trailed 48-23 at halftime. Senior quarterback Matt Flynn leads Gettysburg on the field. He has completed 125 of 203 passes for 1,769 yards with 15 touchdowns and five interceptions. Flynn has spread his passes around with 11 different players catching a pass including six with more than 15 receptions. Junior wide receiver Brian Betley has a team high 26 receptions for 327 yards and two touchdowns while junior win back Charles Curcio has 22 receptions for 273 yards and three scores. Senior wing back Ricky Manigat has grabbed 20 passes for 262 yards and two touchdowns while junior tailback Jamel Mutanga has 17 catches for 209 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Senior tight end A.J. Perrotti has a team leading four touchdown receptions among his 16 catches for 360 yards while junior wide receiver Gavin Jablonski has 15 receptions for 227 yards and a score. All six receivers have at least on reception of 33 or more yards with **Perrotti** having a season long of 80 yards. On the ground, **Mutunga** leads Gettysburg with 490 yards and three touchdowns on 120 carries while Manigat has added 205 yards and a score on 28 attempts. Flynn has run

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have two players closing in on milestones for his career. Senior running back Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS) became the 20th player in school history to rush for 1,000 career yards last week against Dickinson College. Rempe, who came to Moravian as a quarterback, has 1,100 career yards on just 289 carries with seven touchdowns in 30 games. Rempe, who tied the school record with 51 attempts at Juniata College last season, had 727 of those yards on 178 carries last season with 165 carries in the last four games of the year. Rempe did not play in Moravian's loss versus Lebanon Valley College, and he only played one play in the victory over McDaniel College. Rempe needs 194 yards to move into 15th in school history, and 700 yards to crack into the top ten. His 289 carries rank tenth in school history. Freshman kick returner/defensive back Travis King needs just 29 yards in kickoff returns to move into tenth in school history in a single season, and two

for 84 yards and two touchdowns on 38 carries while junior tailback Anthony DeSalva has 16 rushing attempts for 73 yards and a score. Curcio has added ten carries for 45 yards and two touchdowns, and he has 27 kickoff returns for 463 yards and four punt returns for 19 yards. Junior kicker/defensive back Mike Barrett is 18-for-19 on extra-points this season and four-for-eight on field goal attempts with a long of 27 yards, and he is averaging 57.0 yards per kickoff to go with five tackles. Betley has punted 16 times this season with an average of 38.7 yards including a long punt of 61 yards, three touchbacks, three inside the 20 yard line and two fair caught. The Bullets have a total of eight interceptions with junior defensive backs Bryan DiSabato and Tairi Mobley and sophomore defensive back Joe Delaney each having two interceptions. Delaney leads the Gettysburg defense with 43 tackles while junior defensive lineman Sebastian Sullivan has 42 tackles with four and a half for loss, two sacks, two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble. Senior linebacker Tim Widdoes also has 42 tackles on the season to go with two tackles for loss, a sack, a pass break-up and a forced fumble while junior defensive back Nik Duerr has 26 stops with three pass break-ups and a forced fumble. **Mobley** has contributed 25 tackles with one for loss and a total of three passes defended while senior linebacker **Taylor Byrne** has 20 tackles for the Bullets.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: In Gettysburg last fall, quarterback Matt Flynn threw for a touchdown and ran for another while the Gettysburg College defense turned three turnovers into touchdowns in a 48-41 Centennial Conference game over Moravian at Shirk Field at Musselman Stadium. Ian Heck kicked off to the Gettysburg eight-yard line where Gettysburg wide receiver Charles Curcio received the ball and returned it 92 yards up the right side of the field for a touchdown. However, senior Josh Huson's extra-point hit the left upright and was no good to give Gettysburg a 6-0 lead. Moravian would pick up a first down on its first drive on a 21-yard pass from quarterback Marc Braxmeier to tailback Tyler McCambridge. However, the Greyhounds would turn the ball over on downs at the Gettysburg 35-yard line. The Bullets needed just six plays to extend its lead on a five-yard touchdown run by Flynn. Husson made this extra-point attempt, the 100th of his career, for a 13-0 Gettysburg lead with 10:47 to go in the first quarter. Moravian needed just four plays to answer with the Greyhounds' first score of the game. Tailback Tvler deRouen ran in from one-yard out on a sweep to the right. Kicker Brian Reckenbeil connected on the extra-point to pull Moravian within 13-7 with 8:47 remaining in the first quarter. Two plays before the touchdown, Braxmeier hit wide receiver Tyler Williams with a 59-yard pass to the Gettysburg one-yard line. The Bullets picked up one first down before a quick kick by **Flynn** on fourth-and-four from the Moravian 49-yard line that was downed at the Greyhound 21-yard line. The Greyhounds needed just one play to take the lead with McCambridge running for a 79-yard touchdown off the left side, the longest rush of his career and the fifth longest touchdown run in Moravian history. Reckenbeil added the extrapoint to give the Greyhounds a 14-13 lead with 6:42 to go in the first quarter. McCambridge also moved over 1,800 career yards on the run and into ninth in school history. McCambridge had 152 yards on 20 carries in the game and now has 1,926 yards in his career on 405 carries. Gettysburg picked up two first downs with Flynn hitting Brian Betley with a 42-yard pass and Flynn rushing on a fourth-and-one. The Bullets would get into the red zone at the Moravian 18-yard line but were forced into a field goal attempt. Huson's 35-yard field goal attempt was wide left to give the Greyhounds the ball at their own 20-yard line. Moravian moved down into the red zone on the following possession but back-to-back losses forced a fourth down from the Gettysburg 21-yard line. Reckenbeil came on a drilled the 38-yard field goal, his seventh field goal of the season, to give

Moravian a 17-13 lead with 13:58 to go in the second quarter. On the second play of the drive, McCambridge broke through the left side for a 60-yard touchdown run that was called back by a holding penalty at the line of scrimmage. The Bullets would retake the lead on their next drive. Flynn would cap the six-play drive with a one-yard touchdown pass to tight end A.J. Perrotti. Huson's extra-point would give Gettysburg a 20-17 lead with 10:54 remaining in the first half. Flynn was 21 of 34 in the game for 275 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions. The Greyhounds needed just 13 seconds to retake the lead with tailback Ryan Rempe returning the ensuing kickoff 82 yards for a touchdown, Moravian's first kickoff return for a score this season and first since the 2006 season. Reckenbeil made his third extra-point of the game. The PAT was **Reckenbeil's** 55th straight and his 46th straight in the Centennial Conference, setting a new conference record. The kick also gave Moravian a 24-20 lead with 10:41 to go in the second quarter. Gettysburg put together a 12-play drive to move into the red zone that included a fake field goal; however, Huson's 29-yard field goal was wide left to leave the score at 24-20. Moravian took over at its own 20-yard line and would have the first turnover in the game when fullback Morgan deRouen was unable to control a handoff. Gettysburg defensive lineman Connor Quinn covered the ball at the Moravian 18-yard line. The Bullets needed just three plays to capitalize on the turnover and retake the lead. Running back Jamel Mutunga would run in from nine-yards out and Huson added the extrapoint after a false start penalty to give Gettysburg a 27-24 lead with 3:25 to play in the first half. The Greyhounds turned the ball over again, this time with McCambridge fumbling on the second play of the drive. Quinn forced the fumble while defensive lineman Sebastian Sullivan recovered the loose ball again at the Moravian 40-yard line. Curcio, who had 42 yards on seven carries, would cap of a five-play drive with a six-yard touchdown run. **Huson** added the extra-point to extend the Gettysburg lead to 34-24 with 1:01 to play before the intermission. The Greyhounds would commit a miscue for the third straight drive with a Braxmeier pass being tipped by wide receiver Tyler Hersch before being intercepted at midfield by linebacker **Dean Staley**. Gettysburg appeared to score on the final play of the first half with Betley catching a tipped ball in the back of the end zone. However, a holding penalty called the play back. Flynn's final pass of the half was intercepted by Moravian defensive back Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS) at the Greyhound one-yard line to keep the score at 34-24 Gettysburg at halftime. Both teams would start the second half with a drive that included a first down before each squad punted for the first time in the game. Moravian began its second drive of the second half at its own 21-yard line with Braxmeier hitting wide Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) for a 48-yard gain to the Gettysburg 31-yard line. Five rushes later, Rempe dove in from a yard out for his first rushing touchdown of the season. Reckenbeil added his fourth extra-point of the game to pull the Greyhounds within 34-31 with 8:16 to go in the third quarter. The point was the 193rd of **Reckenbeil's** career, moving him into second all-time in school history. Reckenbeil was already the school's all-time leading scorer for kickers. Gettysburg would begin driving again before Greyhound defensive back Carl Robinson intercepted a Flynn pass and returned it to the Gettysburg 47-yard line. McCambridge would carry the ball on the first three plays of the of Moravian drive before Braxmeier found tight end Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) with a 35-yard touchdown pass to give the Greyhounds the lead again. Reckenbeil was true on his fifth point-after attempt of the game set the Moravian lead at 38-34 with 4:12 to play in the third quarter. **Braxmeier** completed 12 of 21 passes for 285 yards with a touchdown and an interception while Dencker caught three passes for 69 yards. The Bullets would pick up a pair of first downs on their next drive before the Greyhound defense stiffened to force a punt from near midfield. Moravian would only run three plays on the next drive before punting on the first play of the fourth quarter. Gettysburg started its first drive of the final quarter on its own 39-yard line. The Bullets put together an 11-play drive capped off by a five-yard touchdown run by tailback Nick McConnell to give Gettysburg the lead again. Huson's extra-point set the score at 41-38 Gettysburg with 10:38 to go in the fourth quarter. Moravian's drive started at its own 40-yard line after the kickoff went out of bounds. The Greyhounds moved down to the Gettysburg 32yard line where **Braxmeier** was hit on a third-and-four play by Gettysburg defensive lineman Anthony Pastore forcing a fumble. Bullet defensive

lineman Matt Lessler picked up the ball at the Moravian 49-yard line and returned it for a touchdown. Huson made the extra-point to push the Gettysburg lead to 48-38 with 6:30 to play in the game. The Greyhounds would start again at the 40-yard line after another kickoff out of bounds. Braxmeier would lead the offense into the red zone at the Gettysburg seven-yard line before Moravian settled for a 24-yard field goal by Reckenbeil to cut the lead to 48-41 with 3:52 to go. Reckenbeil finished the game with 11 points, the sixth time in his career he has had 11 or more points in a game. Moravian attempted an onside kick but the Bullets recovered the kick and would pick up two first downs to run out the clock. The Bullets had 527 yards on 85 plays in the game. McConnell led the Gettysburg rushing attack with 69 yards on ten carries while Mutugna had 59 yards on a team high 18 carries. Flynn ran for 51 yards on nine carries while being sacked once while junior wide receiver Ricky Manigat added 29 yards on five carries. Curcio caught game high seven passes for 82 yards while Betley added 78 yards on four receptions. Moravian had 451 yards on 58 plays in the game. Tyler deRouen had 22 and a touchdown on six carries before leaving the game with an injury while Morgan deRouen had four yards on four carries. Williams caught five passes for 129 yards while McCambridge had two receptions for 28 yards. Linebacker Terence Hartigan had a game high 13 tackles to lead Gettysburg while linebacker Tim Widdeos had eight stops. Pastore and Staley each had seven tackles with Pastore adding one of the Bullets' three sacks. Burley and linebacker Kevin McGorry led the Greyhound defense with 11 tackles with Burley adding a tackles loss and a pass break-up. Defensive lineman Doug **Bocchino** had nine tackles with a forced fumble while **Robinson**, defensive back Erik Brinkerhoff and linebacker Andrew Morrissey each made eight tackles. Brinkerhoff added three pass break-ups in the game.

THE QUARTERBACKS: Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk has completed 32 of 65 passes for 347 yards with two touchdowns and four interceptions. He has also been sacked 14 times this season. Senior Patrick Weiss (Gilbertsville, PA/St. Pius X HS) has played in three games, completing eight of 30 pass attempts for 103 yards with five interceptions. Weiss has gained 28 yards on nine carries this season while being sacked three times. Sophomore Andy Polony (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) started for the Greyhounds in the game at Susquehanna University and completed just four-of-eight passes for 31 yards with two interceptions in the first half. Polony has been sacked three times this season.

IN THE BACKFIELD: In the backfield, senior running back Ryan Rempe leads the Greyhounds with 321 yards on 77 attempts. Sophomore fullback Phillip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) has added 77 yards on 29 carries for Moravian while freshman running back Rocco Del Priore (Center Valley, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) has 26 yards on 12 attempts. Freshman running back Langston Ross (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) has 11 yards on ten carries while senior running back Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has six yards on ten attempts with one touchdown. Freshman linebacker Stephen Kircher (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS) has 14 yards on a fake punt against McDaniel College while freshman defensive back Travis King picked up seven yards on a fake punt against Johns Hopkins University.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: The Greyhounds have had 12 different players catch a pass this season led by junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS), who has caught 12 passes for 130 yards and two touchdowns. Junior wide receiver Alex Hersch, who missed the game versus Lebanon Valley College, has added eight catches for 107 yards while senior tight end Brian Dencker has seven receptions for 76 yards. Dencker also has a two-point conversion reception. Sophomore running back Phillip Redline has four catches for 52 yards. Sophomore tight end Mike Zanoni (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) has two receptions for 29 yards while senior running back Anthony Falco has added two catches for 23 yards. Junior wide receiver Eric Woodruff (Brodheadsville, PA/Pius X HS) has one reception for 31 yards while senior running back Ryan Rempe has a catch for three yards.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Senior Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS) and junior Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury

HS) are back on the offensive line with Grando as the only returning All-Conference player for the Greyhounds. Sophomore Nicholas Marzuoli (Easton, PA/Easton HS) and junior Matthew Washer (Ogdensburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) saw plenty of playing time last season while senior Kyle Passarelli (Princeton, NJ/Montgomery HS) gives Moravian five experienced players on the line that will average 6-3, 275. Freshman Frank Costantini (Middletown, NJ/Middletown HS) starts at center while sophomore Ed Matta (Exton, PA/Downingtown East HS) junior Thomas Mulligan (Ardmore, PA/Episcopal Academy) have also seen action this season.

DEFENSIVE FRONT: Junior defensive lineman Michael McClarin (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) leads the Moravian defensive line 18 tackles with two and a half tackles for loss. Junior defensive lineman Allen Petros, who has missed the last two games at Johns Hopkins University and versus Dickinson College with an injury, has also added 16 tackles including 12 solo stops, four and a half tackles for loss and two sacks while junior defensive lineman Jacob Millen (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) has 11 tackles, a fumble recovery, a pass break-up and two blocked kicks, an extrapoint versus McDaniel College and a field goal versus Dickinson. defensive lineman Seth Pavne (Collingswood, **NJ/Collingswood HS**) has nine tackles, a half tackle for loss and four pass break-ups while junior defensive lineman Rvan Ulk (Temple, PA/Muhlenberg HS) has four tackles. Sophomore defensive lineman Patrick Gordon (Bethlehem, PA/Notre Dame HS) has contributed five stops with one for loss.

THE LINEBACKER CORPS: Sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer leads the linebackers and the Moravian defense 42 tackles with two and a half tackles for loss, one sack, a forced fumble, an interception returned 15 yards and a total of two passes defended. Junior linebacker Philip Bortz has contributed 35 tackles, a tackle for loss and three pass break-ups while senior linebacker Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS) has 22 tackles including one for loss. Junior linebacker Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has made 19 stops with a pass break-up and a forced fumble, which sealed the team's victory over McDaniel College while senior linebacker Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) has 17 tackles with one for loss. Freshman linebacker Jake Hildebrand (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) has 13 tackles this season. Senior linebacker Michael Bishop (Nazareth, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has added four tackles while freshman linebacker Stephen Kircher has five tackles with one for loss.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD: In the defensive backfield, sophomore defensive back David Wacker has 37 tackles with one for loss while senior defensive back Brad Bodine has 27 stops, a tackle for loss, a team high three interceptions with 15 yards in returns and a total of four passes defended. Junior defensive back Daniel Burley has 31 tackles, two and a half tackles for loss, an interception returned 18 yards and a fumble recovery for eight yards. Senior defensive back Kyle Krupa has contributed 20 tackles and three pass break-ups while freshman defensive back Travis King has made 13 stops with two tackles for loss while freshman defensive back Matt Johnson (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) has five tackles.

KICKING GAME: Sophomore kicker **Ian Heck** has ten kickoffs this season with an average of 54.5 yards per kickoff. **Heck** is also one-for-two on extra-point attempts, and made his first career field goal attempt of 30 yards versus Lebanon Valley College. **Heck** is two-for-three on field goals this season Junior punter **Eric Dziengelski** has punted 32 times for an average of 34.5 yards per punt with a long of 53 yards versus Lebanon Valley College, seven inside the 20-yard line, four fair caught and one touchback.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Freshman defensive back Travis King has returned 15 kickoffs for 362 yards with a long return of 56 yards versus Dickinson College, and King also has seven punt returns for 68 yards including a long return of 29 yards also against Dickinson. Freshman running back Langston Ross has eight kickoff returns for 219 yards with a long return of 52 yards versus McDaniel College while junior wide receiver Eric Woodruff has one kickoff return for 28 yards. Woodruff also has two tackles on special teams while sophomore kicker Ian Heck has made two tackles. Junior wide receiver Alex Hersch has returned two punts this fall for nine yards.

STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME: As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAN The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-Game Show. Last week, freshman defensive back **Travis King** and sophomore defensive back **David Wacker** were selected as the Starters Co-Players of the Game for his performance. **King** two kickoff returns for 82 yards, five punt returns for 64 yards and three tackles in Moravian's 21-3 loss to Dickinson College. **Wacker** led the Moravian defense with 12 tackles. Starters Riverport, Starters Pub and Starter Clubhouse Grille, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street, Route 378 South of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Municipal Golf Course.

BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS: Of the 88 players on the Moravian roster, 29 are freshmen, 18 are sophomores and 26 are juniors. There are 15 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 54 letterwinners including five from the 2007 season and 13 starters.

WINNING WAYS: Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 16 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 21 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

OVERTIME 'HOUNDS: Moravian has played a total of seven overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 5-2 all-time in the extra-session. Last year was the seventh time since 1996 that the Greyhounds did not play at least one overtime game.
