THE GAME: Moravian looks to snap a four-game losing streak in a Centennial Conference game at Franklin & Marshall College. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Sponaugle-Williamson Field in Lancaster, Pennsylvania.

THE COACHES: Scot Dapp (West Chester '73) is in his 23rd season at Moravian, with a career record of 136-96-1 (.586), the winningest football coach in Moravian history. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. **Dapp**, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004, 2005 and 2008, winning the title in 2005.

Franklin & Marshall coach **John Troxell (Lafayette '94)** has a record of 15-20 (.429) in his fourth year at the school.

THE SERIES: Saturday's meeting will be the 22nd in the series with Franklin & Marshall owning a 16-5 advantage. Moravian posted a 38-24 win in Lancaster back in 2007 when the schools renewed their rivalry as Centennial Conference opponents, and the Greyhounds posted a 23-20 victory in Bethlehem last October. The Diplomats' win in the series was 37-20 victory in the 2004 ECAC Southwest Bowl in Lancaster, and Franklin & Marshall won the first eight games between the schools and 15 of the first 16 contests

GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE: Moravian joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fourth in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors poll while Franklin & Marshall College was picked sixth.

WEEKLY CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE COACHES WEB CHAT: Head Football Coach **Scot Dapp** will be participating in the weekly Centennial Conference football chats every Tuesday beginning at 10:00 a.m. Coach **Dapp** is scheduled to be on-line beginning at 10:49 a.m. each week as all nine Centennial Conference head coaches will be available.

BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS: Of the 88 players on the Moravian roster, 29 are freshmen, 18 are sophomores and 26 are juniors. There are 15 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 54 letterwinners including five from the 2007 season and 13 starters.

OVERTIME 'HOUNDS: Moravian has played a total of seven overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 5-2 all-time in the extra-session. Last year was the seventh time since 1996 that the Greyhounds did not play at least one overtime game.

ON THE AIRWAVES: For the 13th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAN 1470 AM The Fox for the fifth straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance from **John Elliott**. The broadcast kicks off at 12:00 p.m. with an hour pregame show.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have three players closing in on milestones for his career. Senior running back Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS) became the 20th player in school history to rush for 1,000 career yards against Dickinson College. Rempe, who came to Moravian as a quarterback, has 1,241 career yards on just 324 carries with seven touchdowns in 31 games. Rempe, who tied the school record with 51 attempts at Juniata College last season, had 727 of those yards on 178 carries last season with 165 carries in the last four games of the year. Rempe did not play in Moravian's loss versus Lebanon Valley College, and he only played one play in the victory over McDaniel College. **Rempe** needs 53 yards to move into 15th in school history, and 559 yards to crack into the top ten. His 324 carries rank eighth in school history. Freshman kick returner/defensive back Travis King (Wilmington, DE/Concord HS) has 502 yards on 21 kickoff returns this fall, which rank fourth and sixth respectively. King needs 183 yards and five kickoff returns to set the single season school records in each category. King is also moving up the record book in punt returns. He has ten punt returns for 111 yards, which is 15th in a single season. The school season records for punt returns are 32 returns and 326 yards. Junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS) is closing in on becoming the 18th player in school history with 1,000 career receiving yards. Sylvainus has 877 yards on 61 career catches, which ranks 19th.

THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS: The Greyhounds are seventh in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 401.3 yards per game. The squad is third in passing defense at 191.3 yards per game, and the defense is ninth in rushing yards allowed at 210.0 per game. The Greyhounds are seventh in points allowed at 25.7 per game, and the squad is eighth in points scored per game at 5.0. Offensively, Moravian is eighth in the Centennial Conference at 182.5 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked seventh in rushing offense at 81.5 yards per game and ninth in passing offense at 101.0 yards per game. Moravian is eighth in turnover margin with a -1.17 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed 16 turnovers while forcing nine turnovers. Moravian leads the Centennial

Conference in kickoff returns with an average of 25.0 yards per return. Individually, senior running back Ryan Rempe is fourth in the conference in rushing at 92.4 yards per game. Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk (Yorktown, VA/New Egypt HS) is ninth in the conference in pass efficiency with a 91.9 rating, and he is ninth in passing yardage at 86.8 yards per game. Freshman defensive back Travis King is fourth in kickoff returns with an average of 23.8 yards per return, and he is second in punt returns at 11.1 yards per return while freshman running back Langston Ross (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) leads the Centennial Conference in kickoff returns at 27.4 yards per return. Junior punter Eric Dziengelski (Coatesville, PA/Chestnut Hill Academy) is sixth in punting with an average of 34.1 yards per punt while sophomore kicker Ian Heck (Easton, PA/Easton HS) is ninth in kick scoring at 1.7 points per game, and he is sixth in field goals per game at 0.75. Junior linebacker Philip Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS) is tied for fifth in tackles at 8.0 tackles per contest while sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is tied for eighth with an average of 7.8 per game. Sophomore defensive back David Wacker (Parkton, MD/Hereford HS) is 12th at 7.4 tackles per contest while junior defensive back Daniel Burley (Easton, **PA/Easton HS**) is 20th in tackles per game with an average of 6.2. Senior defensive back Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) is fourth in the Centennial Conference in interceptions at 0.50 per game, and he is 27th in tackles at 5.5 per game. Junior linebacker Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) is tied for 39th in tackles at 4.8 per contest while senior linebacker Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS) is 48th in tackles with 4.5 per game.

SCOUTING FRANKLIN & MARSHALL COLLEGE: The Diplomats enter the game with an overall record of 4-1 and a 2-1 slate in Centennial Conference action after defeating Ursinus College, 21-14. .Sophomore quarterback John Harrison leads Franklin & Marshall on the field. Harrison has completed 136 of 194 passes for 1,633 yards with 17 touchdowns and just four interceptions. His top targets have been senior wide receiver George Eager, who has 42 receptions for 527 yards and eight touchdowns, junior wide receiver Jay Ridinger, who has caught 24 passes for 343 yards and one score, sophomore tailback **John Kaschak**, who was 20 receptions for 229 yards and two touchdowns, sophomore wide receiver Jarell Diggs, who has caught 16 passes for 175 yards and one score, senior fullback RyanMurray, who has t16 receptions for 154 yards and a touchdown, and sophomore tight end Michael Deutch, who has caught 14 passes for 154 yards and three scores. Kaschak leads the Diplomats' rushing attack with 231 yards and six touchdowns on 46 carries while sophomore running back Alan Williams has 151 yards on 43 attempts. Murray gas added 51 yards on 18 carries. Diggs has returned 14 punts for 124 yards this season while Eager has ten kickoff returns for 264 yards

with an 80-yard touchdown return. Williams has added four kickoff returns for 99 yards. Freshman kicker Devin Hunter is seven-for-12 on extrapoints and one-for-two on field goals with a long of 23 yards for the Diplomats while freshman Mike Shin is seven-for-seven on extra-points. Hunter is averaging 50.4 yards per kickoff while freshman punter Brian Prater has an average of 36.1 yards per punt on 18 punts with a long of 45 yards, six inside the 20-yard line, one fair caught and one touchback. Sophomore defensive back Tv Savastio and senior defensive back Barry Lovett lead F&M with two interceptions apiece. Freshman linebacker Sam Massaro leads the Diplomats' defense with 36 tackles, six and a half tackles for loss, four sacks and an interception return of 30 yards. Senior linebacker Frank DiMattia has added 24 tackles with one and a half for loss and a pass break-up while junior linebacker Drew Hutcheon has 23 stops with three and a half for loss, one sack and one pass break-up. Junior linebacker **James Freeman** also has 23 tackles with two pass break-ups and a fumble recovery while senior defensive back Jeffrey Liberatore has 20 tackles with one interception and two passes defended. Savastio has 19 tackles, a sack and a total of six passes defended.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: In Bethlehem last fall, quarterback Mark Braxmeier ran for an eight-yard touchdown run to help lead Moravian to a 23-20 come-from-behind Centennial Conference win over Franklin & Marshall College on Moravian's Homecoming at Rocco Calvo Field. For the second straight week, Moravian fell behind in the first 18 seconds of the game. The Greyhounds', who won the toss for the seventh straight time, kickoff off only to see Diplomat junior wide receiver George Eager return the kick 53 yards to the Moravian 30-yard line. Greyhound kicker Brian Reckenbeil was able to force Eager out of bounds so Moravian did not give up a kickoff return for a touchdown for the second straight week. However, Eager would score on F&M's first play, a 30-yard touchdown pass from quarterback John Harrison. Defensive back/kicker Paul Sousa was wide on the extra-point attempt, leaving the Diplomats with a 6-0 lead just 18 second into the game. Moravian would pick up one first down on its initial drive of the game before a sack of Braxmeier by F&M defensive lineman Alex Pastore forced a fourth-and-16 for the Greyhounds and a punt. Punter Michael Voskian had a 50-yard punt as the F&M offense would begin at its own 21-yard line. Voskian would punt three times in the game for an average of 45.7 yards per punt. The Diplomats put together a 14-play drive that included a six-yard pass from Harrison to wide receiver Jay Ridinger on a fourth-and-two play in the red zone. Facing a second-and-nine from the Moravian 12-yard line, Harrison was throwing to the right side but Greyhound defensive back Erik Brinkerhoff intercepted the pass at the one-yard line and returned it four yards to give the ball back to Moravian. The interception was Brinkerhoffs' second of the season. The Greyhounds were able to get just

one first down again before **Voskian** came on to punt for the second time in the game. Voskian would get off another good punt, this one for 48 yards; however, Diplomat wide receiver Jarrell Diggs would return the ball 34 yards to the Moravian 35-yard line. On the fifth play of the drive and the first play of the second quarter, Harrison found Ridinger for a 12-yard touchdown pass. Sousa added the extra-point for a 13-0 F&M lead with 14:54 to go in the first half. This marked the second straight week that Moravian had trailed 13-0. Greyhound tailback Tyler McCambridge ran for 29 yards on the first play of Moravian's next drive. Moravian would pick up another first down on the drive before turning the ball over on downs in the red zone at the F&M 19-yard line. The Moravian defense stepped up and with a penalty on the Diplomat offense, F&M actually lost four yards on the drive before Jeff Hogan came on to punt for the first time in the game. Greyhound wide receiver Alex Hersch returned the punt 15 yards to the F&M 31-yard line. On the first play of the drive, McCambridge ran off the left side for 24 yards and a first-and-goal from the seven-yard line. With the 24 yards, McCambridge became the ninth player in Moravian history to surpass 2,000 yards in a career. McCambridge would then take the next two handoffs, the first for four yards and the second for a three-yard touchdown to get the Greyhounds on the scoreboard. **Reckenbeil** made his 58th straight extra-point to pull Moravian within 13-7 with 6:48 remaining in the second quarter. The touchdown was McCambridge's ninth rushing touchdown of the season, and his tenth overall touchdown. The Diplomats were unable to pick up a first down on their next drive, punting after three plays; however, the Greyhounds did the same. F&M started from its own 49-yard line with 3:16 remaining in the second quarter. The Diplomats ran a wide receiver sweep with Diggs on the second play. Diggs was hit by Greyhound senior Andrew Morrissey, who forced a fumble that was recovered by Moravian linebacker Kevin McGorry at the Moravian 49-yard line. The Greyhounds picked up four first downs, one by penalty and another on a fourth-and-one run by McCambridge to move the ball into the red zone. With just seven seconds remaining in the half, **Braxmeier** rolled to his right and eventually scrambled out-of-bounds at the three-yard line. However, the clock ran out before he stepped out of bounds, ending the first half with Moravian still trailing 13-7. Moravian received the opening kickoff of the second half, and with a 27 yard return by wide receiver Jesse Phillips, the Greyhounds began at their own 48-yard line. The Greyhuonds put together an eight play drive including five rushes by McCambridge to move into the red zone. Facing a fourth-and-five at the 14-yard line, Reckenbeil made a 32-yard field goal with 10:53 remaining in the third quarter to pull the Greyhounds within 13-10. The field goal gave Reckenbeil 201 points for his career, making him the second player in school history to reach 200 career points. The other is all-time leading rusher Chris Jacoubs, who had 216 career points. The Diplomats ran just three plays on their first drive of the second half before calling on Hogan to punt. A short punt would set the Greyhound offense up at the Moravian 33-yard line. The Greyhounds would run nine plays on this drive, again with the drive stalling in the red zone. On fourth-and-seven at the F&M 15-yard line, Reckenbeil drilled another 32-yard field goal to tie the score at 13-13 with 4:30 to go in the third quarter. McCambridge had five carries on the drive and finished with a season high 168 yards on a career high 34 carries. McCambridge also moved into eighth in school history in career rushing, now with 2,094 yards on 439 attempts. F&M's offense struggles would continue on the next Diplomat drive. On the second play, Harrison was high on a pass attempt and Moravian defensive back Brad Bodine intercepted the pass at the Moravian 48-yard line and returned it to the F&M 19-yard line. The Greyhounds would get four yards from McCambridge on first down before a pair of incompletions forced a fourth-and-six from the 15-yard line. **Reckenbeil** would come on to connect on his third straight 32-yard field goal, giving Moravian its first lead of the game at 16-13 with 2:48 to play in the third quarter. The field goal was **Reckenbeil's** 11th of the season, tying his own school mark set last season. It was also the fourth time in his career that Reckenbeil had made at least three field goals, and he finished with 11 points in the game for the second straight week and the seventh time in his career. The Diplomats would get things going on the kickoff return with Eager returning the ball 60 yards to the Moravian 25-yard line. F&M moved the ball to the one-yard line on a two-yard run by running back Ryan Murray. The Greyhound defense would stop the Diplomats on two

shots from the goal line before **Diggs** ran a wide receiver sweep and scored off the right side of the line to put F&M right back in the lead. Sousa's extra-point gave the Diplomats a 20-16 lead with just 16 seconds left in the third quarter. Moravian responded with a 13-play, 67-yard drive on the ground and through the air. The Greyhounds faced a fourth-and-ten on the ninth play of the drive at the F&M 32-yard line when Braxmeier found wide receiver Tyler Williams for a 12-yard reception and a first down at the 20-yard line. Four plays later, **Braxmeier** scampered out of the pocket, unable to find an open receiver and dashed to the left side for his eight-yard touchdown run, his second of the season. Reckenbeil added his second extra-point of the game to extend his streak to 59 straight makes and his Centennial Conference record to 50 consecutive extra-points, giving the Greyhounds a 23-20 lead with 10:31 remaining in the contest. The Diplomats would start driving on the ensuing possession with Harrison connecting on a five-yard pass to Eager on a fourth-and three play. The first down was the 12th fourth-down conversion in 17 attempts against the Moravian defense this season. Four plays later, F&M faced another fourthand-three at the Moravian 31-yard line. This time Harrison's pass intended for Diggs was incomplete, giving the ball back to Moravian. The Greyhounds would pick up a pair of first downs on the drive, both on personal fouls penalties against F&M to move the ball to the Diplomat 29yard line. Braxmeier, who was 13 of 29 for 133 yards in the game, was intercepted F&M 24-yard line by Diplomat cornerback Barry Lovett. F&M quickly picked up a pair of first downs to move the ball over midfield before the Moravian defense stiffened again. The Greyhounds allowed a short two-yard completion on first down before forcing Harrison into three straight incompletions, giving the ball back to Moravian at the Greyhound 42-yard line with just 1:28 to play. McCambridge and tailback Ryan Rempe each had 12 yard runs for the Greyhounds, and another personal foul penalty on the Diplomats moved the ball into the red zone at the F&M 19-yard line. Braxmeier would kneel down twice to run out the clock. Moravian finished the game with 324 yards on 79 plays while controlling the ball for 33:11. Moravian had 191 yards on the ground on 48 attempts led by McCambridge's 168 yards. Rempe finished with 13 yards on two carries while fullback Morgan deRouen had 11 yards on five attempts. Braxmeier had just two yards on five carries after being sacked twice in the game. Wide receiver Tyler Hersch led the Greyhound receivers with four receptions for 46 yards while McCambridge caught three passes for 11 yards. Wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus caught his first two passes for the season for Moravian for 31 yards after missing the first five games with an injury while Williams added two catches for 30 yards. F&M had 276 yards on 58 plays in the game but just 112 yards in the second half. Running back John Kaschak had 29 yards to led the Diplomat rushing attack while Murray added 21 yards. Diggs and running back Alan Williams each had 19 yards in the contest. Harrison was 24 for 35 in the game with 188 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. Eager caught nine of those passes for 77 yards and a score while Ridinger had seven catches for 37 yards and a touchdown. Kaschak, Murray and Williams all had two receptions. Morrissey led Moravian with ten tackles and a forced fumble while **Bodine** and linebacker **Anthony Carney** each added eight tackles. Bodine had a pass break-up to go with his interception while Carney had a half a tackle for loss. Defensive back Carl Robinson and McGorry each added seven tackles with Robinson breaking up one pass. Linebacker James Gregory had a game high 14 tackles for the Diplomats including a half a tackle for loss while linebacker Zach Romash had 13 tackles and a tackle for loss. Defensive back Jeffrey Liberatore added ten tackles for the F&M defense while linebacker Bryon Avery had seven stops.

THE QUARTERBACKS: Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk has completed 32 of 65 passes for 347 yards with two touchdowns and four interceptions. He has also been sacked 14 times this season. Senior Patrick Weiss (Gilbertsville, PA/St. Pius X HS) has played in three games, completing eight of 30 pass attempts for 103 yards with five interceptions. Weiss has gained 28 yards on nine carries this season while being sacked three times. Sophomore Andy Polony (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) started for the Greyhounds in the game at Susquehanna University and last week versus Gettysburg College. Polony has completed 19-of-39 passes for 156 yards with three interceptions. Polony has been sacked six times this season.

IN THE BACKFIELD: In the backfield, senior running back Ryan Rempe leads the Greyhounds with 462 yards on 112 attempts. Sophomore fullback Phillip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) has added 77 yards on 29 carries for Moravian while freshman running back Rocco Del Priore (Center Valley, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) has 26 yards on 12 attempts. Junior fullback Michael Crann (Columbia, NJ/North Warren Regional HS) has nine yards on two carries. Freshman running back Langston Ross has eight yards on 11 carries while senior running back Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has six yards on ten attempts with one touchdown. Freshman linebacker Stephen Kircher (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS) has 14 yards on a fake punt against McDaniel College while freshman defensive back Travis King picked up seven yards on a fake punt against Johns Hopkins University.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: The Greyhounds have had 13 different players catch a pass this season led by junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus, who has caught 15 passes for 152 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore tight end Mike Zanoni (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) has five receptions for 56 yards while sophomore running back Phillip Redline has four catches for 52 yards. Junior wide receiver Eric Woodruff (Brodheadsville, PA/Pius X HS) has three receptions for 41 yards while senior running back Ryan Rempe has four catches for 15 yards. Freshman wide receiver Albie Moran (Phillipsburg, NJ/Phillipsburg HS) has grabbed two passes for 16 yards while senior running back Anthony Falco has added two catches for 23 yards.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Senior Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS) and junior Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) are back on the offensive line with Grando as the only returning All-Conference player for the Greyhounds. Junior defensive lineman **Allen Petros** (**Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS**), who has missed the games at Johns Hopkins University and versus Dickinson College with an injury, has added 19 tackles including 14 solo stops, five tackles for loss and two of Moravian's three sacks while junior defensive lineman **Jacob Millen** (**Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS**) has 12 tackles, a fumble recovery, a pass break-up and two blocked kicks, an extra-point versus McDaniel College and a field goal versus Dickinson College. Sophomore defensive lineman **Seth Payne** (**Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS**) has 12 tackles, a tackle for loss and four pass break-ups while junior defensive lineman **Patrick Gordon** (**Bethlehem, PA/Notre Dame HS**) has contributed six stops with one for loss. Sophomore defensive lineman **Ryan Ulk** (**Temple, PA/Muhlenberg HS**) has four tackles.

THE LINEBACKER CORPS: Junior linebacker Philip Bortz leads the linebackers and the Moravian defense with 48 tackles, two and a half tackles for loss, an interception with a three-yard return and three pass break-ups Sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer has contributed 47 tackles with two and a half tackles for loss, one sack, a forced fumble, an interception returned 15 yards and a total of two passes defended while senior linebacker Derek Protasiewicz has 27 tackles including one for loss. Junior linebacker Anthony Carney has made 29 stops with a half a tackle

for loss, a pass break-up and a forced fumble, which sealed the team's victory over McDaniel College while senior linebacker **Jayson Williams** (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) has 21 tackles with one for loss. Freshman linebacker **Jake Hildebrand** (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) has 13 tackles this season. KICKING GAME: Sophomore kicker **Ian Heck** has 12 kickoffs this season with an average of 54.2 yards per kickoff. **Heck** is also one-for-two on extra-point attempts, and made his first career field goal attempt of 30 yards versus Lebanon Valley College. **Heck** is three-for-four on field goals this season Junior punter **Eric Dziengelski** has punted 40 times for an average of 34.1 yards per punt with a long of 53 yards versus Lebanon Valley College, nine inside the 20-yard line, four fair caught and one touchback. **Dziengelski** has had a total of three punts longer than 50 yards this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Freshman defensive back Travis King has returned 21 kickoffs for 502 yards with a long return of 56 yards versus Dickinson College, and King also has ten punt returns for 111 yards including a long return of 29 yards also against Dickinson. Freshman running back Langston Ross has eight kickoff returns for 219 yards with a long return of 52 yards versus McDaniel College while junior wide receiver Eric Woodruff has one kickoff return for 28 yards. Woodruff also has two tackles on special teams while sophomore kicker Ian Heck has made two tackles. Junior wide receiver Alex Hersch has returned three punts this fall for nine yards.

STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME: As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAN The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-Game Show. Last week, junior defensive back **Thomas Dailey** and junior linebacker **Philip Bortz** were selected as the Starters Co-Players of the Game for his performance. **Dailey** led the Moravian defense with 14 tackles and a pass break-up while **Bortz** made 13 stops with one and a half tackles for loss and an interception he returned three yards. Starters Riverport, Starters Pub and Starter Clubhouse Grille, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street, Route 378 South of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Municipal Golf Course.

WINNING WAYS: Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 16 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 21 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.
