THE GAME: Moravian, which is looking to snap a five-game losing streak, plays its final home game of the 2009 season in a Centennial Conference game versus Juniata College. Kickoff for Moravian's annual Homecoming and Family Day is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Rocco Calvo Field.

THE COACHES: Scot Dapp (West Chester '73) is in his 23rd season at Moravian, with a career record of 136-97-1 (.583), the winningest football coach in Moravian history. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. **Dapp**, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004, 2005 and 2008, winning the title in 2005.

Juniata coach Carmen Felus (Western Maryland '95) is in his first year at the school.

THE SERIES: Saturday's meeting will be the 55th in the series with Moravian holding a 27-25-2 lead. The Greyhounds won last season's contest, 23-17 in three overtimes out in Huntingdon. Moravian posted a 28-13 win in Bethlehem in 2007, and the Greyhounds have owned the series recently with a 13-5-1 record in the last 19 games. The series has had a history of close games with a streak of five straight years in which the game ended in a regulation tie from 1995 until 1999. Four of those games went to overtime and three won by Moravian.

CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE HONORS: Junior defensive back **Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** of Moravian was named to the Centennial Conference Weekly Honor Roll for his performance in the Greyhounds' 29-13 loss to Franklin & Marshall College. **Burley** led the Greyhounds' defense with nine tackles, one and a half tackles for loss and three pass break-ups as Moravian kept the Diplomats, ranked second in the Centennial Conference, 92 yards below their season offense average.

GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE: Moravian joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fourth in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors poll Juniata College was picked ninth.

WEEKLY CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE COACHES WEB CHAT: Head Football Coach **Scot Dapp** will be participating in the weekly Centennial Conference football chats every Tuesday beginning at 10:00 a.m. Coach **Dapp** is scheduled to be on-line beginning at 10:49 a.m. each week as all nine Centennial Conference head coaches will be available.

ON THE AIRWAVES: For the 13th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAN 1470 AM The Fox for the fifth straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance from **John Elliott**. The broadcast kicks off at 12:00 p.m. with an hour pregame show.

ON TELEVISION: Saturday's game is scheduled to be broadcast live on television by Service-Electric TV-2 Sports with play-by-play from **Doug Heater**, color commentary from **Jim Wills**. This is the second of three Moravian games that will be aired this season.

BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS: Of the 88 players on the Moravian roster, 29 are freshmen, 18 are sophomores and 26 are juniors. There are 15 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 54 letterwinners including five from the 2007 season and 13 starters.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have four players closing in on milestones for his career. Senior running back Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS) became the 20th player in school history to rush for 1,000 career yards against Dickinson College. Rempe, who came to Moravian as a quarterback, has 1,330 career yards on just 347 carries with eight touchdowns in 32 games. Rempe, who tied the school record with 51 attempts at Juniata College last season, had 727 of those yards on 178 carries last season with 165 carries in the last four games of the 2008 season. Rempe did not play in Moravian's loss versus Lebanon Valley College, and he only played one play in the victory over McDaniel College. Rempe needs 38 yards to move into 12th in school history, 93 yards to move into 11th place and 470 yards to crack into the top ten. His 347 carries rank sixth in school history, and he needs 111 carries to move into fifth. Junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS) is closing in on becoming the 18th player in school history with 1,000 career receiving yards. **Sylvainus** has 957 yards on 65 career catches, which ranks 18th in Moravian's record books. Freshman kick returner/defensive back Travis King (Wilmington, DE/Concord HS) has 502 yards on 21 kickoff returns this fall, which rank fourth and sixth respectively. King needs 183 yards and five kickoff returns to set the single season school records in each category. King is also moving up the record book in punt returns. He has 11 punt returns for 113 yards, which is tied for 14th in a single season. The school season records for punt returns are 32 returns and 326 yards. Junior punter Eric Dziengelski (Coatesville, PA/Chestnut Hill Academy) is tied for 18th in a single season with 47 punts for 1,590 yards, which is tied for 17th in a single season.

THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS: The Grevhounds are seventh in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 389.9 yards per game. The squad is fourth in passing defense at 198.4 yards per game, and the defense is eighth in rushing yards allowed at 191.4 per game. The Greyhounds are seventh in points allowed at 26.1 per game, and the squad is eighth in points scored per game at 6.1. Offensively, Moravian is ninth in the Centennial Conference at 187.7 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked seventh in rushing offense at 82.4 yards per game and ninth in passing offense at 105.3 yards per game. Moravian is eighth in turnover margin with a -1.43 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed 20 turnovers while forcing ten turnovers. Moravian leads the Centennial Conference in fewest penalties with just 24 penalties for an average of 28.7 yards per game. Individually, senior running back Ryan Rempe is fourth in the conference in rushing at 91.8 yards per game, and he is tenth in total offense at 91.8 yards per contest. Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk (Yorktown, VA/New Egypt HS) is seventh in the conference in pass efficiency with a 91.9 rating, and he is eighth in passing yardage at 86.8 yards per game. Freshman defensive back Travis King is third in kickoff returns with an average of 23.8 yards per return, and he is second in punt returns at 10.3 yards per return while freshman running back Langston Ross (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is second the Centennial Conference in kickoff returns at 24.3 yards per return. Junior punter Eric Dziengelski is sixth in punting with an average of 33.8 yards per punt while sophomore kicker Ian Heck (Easton, PA/Easton HS) is eighth in kick scoring at 1.6 points per game, and he is sixth in field goals per game at 0.43. Sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is eighth in the Centennial Conference with an average of 7.7 tackles per game while junior linebacker Philip Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS) is 14th in tackles at 7.1 tackles per contest. Junior defensive back **Daniel Burley** is 19th in tackles per game with an average of 6.6 while sophomore defensive back David Wacker (Parkton, MD/Hereford HS) is tied for 20th at 6.3 tackles per contest. Senior defensive back Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) is tied for sixth in the Centennial Conference in interceptions at 0.43 per game, and he is tied for 38th in tackles at 5.0 per game. Junior linebacker Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) is tied for 42nd in tackles at 4.9 per contest while senior defensive back **Kyle Krupa** (Ashley, PA/Hanover **HS**) is tied for 49th in tackles with 4.4 per game.

SCOUTING JUNIATA COLLEGE: The Eagles enter Saturday's game with an overall record of 0-7 and an 0-5 mark in Centennial Conference action. Senior quarterback Alex Snyder leads Juniata on the field, having completed 69 of 139 passes for 692 yards with three interceptions. Snyder's top targets have been senior wide receiver Matt Dunker, who has 22 catches for 280 yards, sophomore wide receiver Abram Mellinger, who has 17 receptions for 142 yards and a touchdown and freshman wide receiver Jullian Valdiserri, who has 12 catches for 84 yards. Junior quarterback Mike DeTemple has completed and a half tackles for loss, and Hall has added a pass break-up. Senior

and a half tackles for loss, and Hall has added a pass break-up. Senior defensive back Brandon Spayd, sophomore defensive lineman Jason Marquis and junior defensive lineman Matthew Walton each had 38 tackles. Walton leads the Eagles with seven tackles for loss and four sacks while forcing one fumble. Marquis has four and a half tackles for loss, a sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery while Spayd has contributed one and a half tackles for loss, two pass break-ups and a fumble recovery. Senior linebacker Michael Casper has 36 tackles with three for loss, two pass break-ups and a fumble recovery.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: In Huntingdon, last fall, quarterback **Marc Braxmeier** scored on a one-yard dive in the third overtime for his second touchdown run of the game to lead Moravian to a 23-17, triple-overtime come-from-behind victory at Juniata College in Centennial Conference action at Knox Stadium. The victory clinched the Greyhounds'

17th winning season under head coach **Scot Dapp**. The win was also Moravian's fourth in five overtime games with Juniata. Moravian won the coin toss for the eighth straight game this season but received the opening kickoff for just the second time. Tailback Ryan Rempe gave the Greyhounds the ball near midfield with a long return. Rempe, who started for an injured Tyler McCambridge, had 37 yards on four carries on the drive that stalled at the Juniata ten-yard line. **Rempe** tied the school record in the game with 51 carries, and he had a career high 174 yards. Kicker **Bran Reckenbeil** came in to attempt a 27-yard field goal from the left hash mark; however, his kick hit the left upright and bounced away. The miss was just Reckenbeil's third of the season in 14 attempts. The Eagles would run just three plays before punting the ball back to Moravian. The Greyhounds put together a 13-play drive to move down to Juniata 20-yard line with nine carries by Rempe, and Moravian picked up a pair of fourth downs in the drive. Reckenbeil would come on to attempt another field goal, this one of 38 yards. Juniata defensive back Brandon Spayd broke through the line and as Reckenbeil had a slower attempt because of the rain and wet and muddy field, Spavd blocked the field goal attempt. Moravian needed just six plays to get the ball back when defensive back Carl Robinson intercepted a pass by Eagle quarterback Jay Leonard at the Moravian 49-yard line. However, Rempe would fumble three plays later on the final play of the first quarter that was recovered by Juniata defensive lineman Jason Marquis. The Eagles ran just three plays before punting again. The teams would trade punts with Moravian Michael Voskian having his first punt of the game downed at the Juniata 14-yard line. After the Eagles third punt of the game, Moravian began its next drive at the Juniata 47-yard line. On the first play Braxmeier connected on a 31-yard pass to wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus to put the ball in the red zone for the third time for the Greyhounds. Rempe would run three times and pick up a first down while moving the ball to the one-yard line. Braxmeier would finally get the Greyhounds on the scoreboard with a one-yard dive for his third rushing touchdown of the season. Reckenbeil connected on his 60th straight extra-point to give Moravian a 7-0 lead with 9:19 to go in the second quarter. Juniata would run just three plays before punting back to the Greyhounds. Wide receiver Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) had a 13-yard punt return to set the Moravian offense up at its own 47yard line. However, the Greyhounds would punt after three plays. Each team would again punt after a pair of three-and-outs. On Voskian's third punt, Greyhound linebacker Andrew Morrissey made his fifth tackle of the game, which was the 300th tackle of his career, just the tenth Greyhound player to reach 300 career tackles. On Juniata's seven drive of the game, Robinson intercepted his second pass of the game and returned it one yard to the Juniata 47-yard line to set the Greyhound offense up with 1:46 remaining in the first half. Moravian picked up a pair of first downs on throws by **Braxmeier**. The Greyhounds appeared to score on a 24-yard touchdown pass from Braxmeier to Sylvainus; however, a Moravian holding penalty negated the score. Braxmeier was eventually intercepted by Spayd on the three-yard line on a fourth-and-23 play. The Eagles received the opening kickoff of the second half and started at its own 40yard line after the kickoff went out of the bounds. Juniata put together its drive of the game and moved 60 yards in eight plays to tie the game on a three-yard pass from Leonard to wide receiver Matt Dunker. Tyler **Thomas** made the extra-point to tie the game with 12:10 to play in the third quarter. On the drive, Leonard hit Dunker with a 25-yard completion on a fourth-and-seven play from the Moravian 28-yard line. Dunker ended the game with four receptions for 71 yards. Moravian picked up one first down on its first drive of the second half but would eventually punt with Voskian's punt sailing into the end zone for a touchback. Juniata covered the 80 yards to the end zone and took the lead on seven plays. **Leonard** connected on a ten-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Chad Steiner. Thomas made the extra-point to take a 14-7 lead with 6:23 to play in the third quarter. Leonard completed 20 of 52 passes for 180 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions while Steiner caught six passes for 37 yards. The Greyhounds turned the ball over on its first play when Braxmeier was intercepted by Juniata defensive back Andy Miller and returned it ten yards to the Moravian 20-yard line. However, the Eagles threw four incomplete passes to turn the ball back over the Moravian. Each team would have a pair of three-and-out drives before the Greyhounds took over at their own 32-yard line. Moravian picked up two first downs before

turning the ball over on downs at the Juniata 36-yard line. The Eagles would get a first down before punting on their first drive of the fourth quarter while Moravian would do the same. Juniata then punted after three plays on its next possession. After one more punt by each school, Braxmeier would be sacked and fumble on a hit by Juniata defensive end Dan Kraft. Marquis recovered his second fumble for the Eagles as Juniata took over at its own 34-yard line with 3:10 to play. The Greyhound defense would get the ball back just three players later when Robinson hit Eagle fullback Rvan Blanchette at the Juniata 41-vard line and forced a fumble. **Robinson** fell on the ball to set the Moravian offense up with 1:51 to play. Braxmeier hit Sylvainus with a 34-yard reception on the first play to the four-yard line. Rempe was stopped for a loss of a yard before Braxmeier found wide receiver Tyler Hersch with a five-yard touchdown pass. Reckenbeil added the extra-point to tie the game at 14-14 with 30 seconds remaining in regulation. Braxmeier completed 16 of 31 passes for 191 yards in the game while Sylvainus finished with career highs of 11 receptions and 155 yards. Tyler Hersch had three catches for 35 yards. The Eagles attempted to move down the field to get in position to win the game; however, Leonard was intercepted by Moravian defense back Daniel Burley at the Moravian 34-yard line. Burley returned the ball 44 yards to the Juniata 22-yard line, and after the officials discussed the time situation, there was one second remaining in the game. Reckenbeil came on to attempt a 39-yard field goal that ended up going to wide left to end regulation. This marked the seventh time in the 54-games between the two schools that the squads were tied at the end of regulation including five straight games from 1995 to 1999. The last four of those games were played under the NCAAs overtime rules with Moravian winning three of those contests. Juniata had the ball first in overtime and would gain just four yards before Thomas came in to attempt a 38-yard field goal. Moravian defensive back David Wacker came in untouched from the right side to block **Thomas'** attempt. On Moravian first possession of overtime, the Greyhounds handed the ball to **Rempe** on four straight plays to move to the Juniata seven-yard line. Reckenbeil came in on third-and-three to attempt a 25-yard field goal that sailed wide left while kicking from the end of the field where a majority of the game was played and muddy. Moravian had the ball first in the second overtime session. Braxmeier hit Sylvainus with an eight-yard pass on first down before Rempe ran three times to move the ball back to the Juniata seven-yard line. Braxmeier was sacked on third down setting up Reckenbeil's fifth field goal attempt of the game. Reckenbeil connected on the 28-yard attempt to give the Greyhounds a 17-14 lead. It was his school record 12th of the season and the 40th of his career. Juniata would pick up one first down on its second possession of overtime on a five-yard draw play by Leonard with an empty backfield. However, the Eagle drive stalled at the ten-yard line. Thomas would come in and make a 27-yard field goal that barely cleared the cross bar. The Eagles would have the ball on offense first in the third overtime. Leonard threw three incomplete passes forcing Thomas to attempt a 42-yard field goal. Thomas' kick would end up being blocked by Moravian defensive lineman Don Maxwell. Moravian would start its possession with a fouryard loss by running back Ricky Allen. Rempe then carried three straight times to gain a first down and move the ball to the 11-yard line. Braxmeier would run the ball twice to pick up a first down at the Juniata four-yard line. Rempe then ran the ball down to the one-yard line on his record tying 51st carry of the game where Braxmeier would then score his second touchdown of the game and earn the Moravian win. The Greyhounds ran a total of 97 plays in the game for 341 yards in the game with 150 yards on the ground. Rempe was the only one of Moravian's four players that carried the ball that ended up in positive vardage. Alex Hersch tied the school record with seven punt returns in the game for a total of 46 yards. The Eagles were limited to 245 yards on 78 plays with just 65 yards on the ground. Derek Kramer had 29 yards on 12 attempts while Leonard had 26 yards on six carries. Wide receiver **Abram Mellinger** had three catches for 42 yards while wide receiver **Dan Fenton** caught three passes for 12 passes. Morrissey led the Moravian defense with nine tackles including one and a half tackles for loss and one pass break-up while linebacker Kevin McGorry added eight tackles. Burley, Robinson and linebacker Anthony Carney each had four tackles. Burley had one interception an another pass break up while **Robinson** had two interceptions, a pass breakup, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a tackle for loss. Senior

linebacker **Josh Roy** led the Juniata defense with a game high 18 tackles with three and a half tackles for loss while defensive back **Jordan Baird** had 17 tackles with one and a half tackle for loss. **Marquis**, **Spayd** and linebacker **Tyler Hall** each had ten tackles with **Marquis** recovering two fumbles and one tackle for loss. **Spayd** had an interception, a pass breakup, a blocked kick and one and a half tackle for loss while **Hall** had a sack, two tackles for loss and a forced fumble.

THE QUARTERBACKS: Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk has started four games and completed 32 of 65 passes for 347 yards with two touchdowns and four interceptions. He has also been sacked 14 times this season. Sophomore Andy Polony (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) has started three games for the Greyhounds and has completed 29-of-63 passes for 287 yards with a touchdown and six interceptions. Polony has been sacked eight times this season. Senior Patrick Weiss (Gilbertsville, PA/St. Pius X HS) has played in three games, completing eight of 30 pass attempts for 103 yards with five interceptions. Weiss has gained 28 yards on nine carries this season while being sacked three times.

IN THE BACKFIELD: In the backfield, senior running back Ryan Rempe leads the Greyhounds with 551 yards and a touchdown on 135 attempts. Sophomore running back Phillip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) has added 77 yards on 29 carries for Moravian while freshman running back Rocco Del Priore (Center Valley, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) has 26 yards on 12 attempts. Junior fullback Michael Crann (Columbia, NJ/North Warren Regional HS) has nine yards on two carries. Freshman running back Langston Ross has 14 yards on 12 carries while senior running back Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has six yards on ten attempts with one touchdown. Freshman linebacker Stephen Kircher (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS) has 14 yards on a fake punt against McDaniel College while freshman defensive back Travis King picked up nine yards on a fake punt attempts against Johns Hopkins University and Franklin & Marshall College.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: The Greyhounds have had 13 different players catch a pass this season led by junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus, who has caught 19 passes for 232 yards and three touchdowns. Junior wide receiver Alex Hersch, who missed the game versus Lebanon Valley College, has added 12 catches for 165 yards while senior tight end Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) has seven receptions for 76 yards. Dencker also has a two-point conversion reception. Sophomore tight end Mike Zanoni (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) has eight receptions for 83 vards while sophomore running back Phillip Redline has four catches for 52 yards. Junior wide receiver Eric Woodruff (Brodheadsville, PA/Pius X HS) has three receptions for 41 yards while senior running back Ryan Rempe has four catches for 15 yards. Sophomore wide receiver Max Coveleski (Lewes, DE/Cape Henlopen HS) has added three receptions for Freshman wide receiver Albie Moran (Phillipsburg, NJ/Phillipsburg HS) has grabbed two passes for 16 yards while senior running back **Anthony Falco** has added two catches for 23 yards.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Senior Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS) and junior Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) are back on the offensive line with Grando as the only returning All-Conference player for the Greyhounds. Sophomore Nicholas Marzuoli (Easton, PA/Easton HS), who has missed the last two games with an injury, and junior Matthew Washer (Ogdensburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) saw plenty of playing time last season while senior Kyle Passarelli (Princeton, NJ/Montgomery HS) gives Moravian five experienced players on the line that will average 6-3, 275. Freshman Frank Costantini (Middletown, NJ/Middletown HS) starts at center while sophomore Ed Matta (Exton, PA/Downingtown East HS) junior Thomas Mulligan (Ardmore, PA/Episcopal Academy) have also seen action this season.

DEFENSIVE FRONT: Junior defensive lineman **Allen Petros** (**Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS**), who has missed the games at Johns Hopkins University and versus Dickinson College with an injury, leads the Moravian defensive line with 26 tackles including 20 solo stops, seven tackles for loss and three of Moravian's seven sacks. Junior defensive lineman **Michael McClarin (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS**) has also added 26 tackles with

three tackles for loss and a pass break-up while sophomore defensive lineman **Seth Payne** (**Collingswood**, **NJ/Collingswood HS**) has 17 tackles, two and a half tackles for loss, a sack and four pass break-ups. Junior defensive lineman **Jacob Millen** (**Whitehall**, **PA/Whitehall HS**) has 13 tackles, a fumble recovery, a pass break-up and two blocked kicks, an extrapoint versus McDaniel and a field goal versus Dickinson while junior defensive lineman **Patrick Gordon** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/Notre Dame HS**) has contributed seven stops with one for loss. Sophomore defensive lineman **Rvan Ulk** (**Temple**, **PA/Muhlenberg HS**) has four tackles.

THE LINEBACKER CORPS: Sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer leads the linebackers and the Moravian defense with 54 tackles with two and a half tackles for loss, one sack, a forced fumble, an interception returned 15 yards and a total of two passes defended. Junior linebacker Philip Bortz has contributed 50 tackles, three tackles for loss, an interception with a three-yard return and three pass break-ups while Junior linebacker Anthony Carney has made 34 stops with two and a half tackles for loss, two sacks, a pass break-up and a forced fumble, which sealed the team's victory over McDaniel College. Senior linebacker Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) has 29 tackles with two for loss and an interception while senior linebacker Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS) has 29 tackles including one for loss. Freshman linebacker Jake Hildebrand (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) has 14 tackles this season. Senior linebacker Michael Bishop (Nazareth, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has added five tackles while freshman linebacker Stephen Kircher, who has missed the Dickinson College and Gettysburg College games with an injury, has six tackles with one for loss.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD: In the defensive backfield, junior defensive back Daniel Burley has 46 tackles, five and a half tackles for loss, an interception returned 18 yards, a total of four passes defended and a fumble recovery for eight yards in the win over McDaniel. Sophomore defensive back David Wacker, who missed the game versus Gettysburg with an injury, has contributed 38 tackles with one for loss while senior defensive back Brad Bodine has 35 stops, a tackle for loss, a team high three interceptions with 15 yards in returns, a total of seven passes defended and a forced fumble. Senior defensive back Kyle Krupa has contributed 31 tackles, a tackle for loss and three pass break-ups while junior defensive back Thomas Dailey (Easton, PA/Notre Dame HS) has 19 tackles and a pass break-up this season. Freshman defensive back Travis King has made 18 stops with three tackles for loss while freshman defensive back Matt Johnson (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) has seven tackles.

KICKING GAME: Sophomore kicker **Ian Heck** has 15 kickoffs this season with an average of 52.1 yards per kickoff. **Heck** is also two-for-three on extra-point attempts, and made his first career field goal attempt of 30 yards versus Lebanon Valley College. **Heck** is three-for-four on field goals this season Junior punter **Eric Dziengelski** has punted 47 times for an average of 33.8 yards per punt with a long of 53 yards versus Lebanon Valley College, 12 inside the 20-yard line, four fair caught and one touchback. **Dziengelski** has had a total of three punts longer than 50 yards this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Freshman defensive back Travis King has returned 21 kickoffs for 502 yards with a long return of 56 yards versus Dickinson College, and King also has 11 punt returns for 113 yards including a long return of 29 yards also against Dickinson. Freshman running back Langston Ross has 13 kickoff returns for 316 yards with a long return of 52 yards versus McDaniel College while junior wide receiver Eric Woodruff has one kickoff return for 28 yards. Woodruff also has two tackles on special teams while sophomore kicker Ian Heck has made two tackles. Junior wide receiver Alex Hersch has returned three punts this fall for nine vards.

STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME: As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAN The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-Game Show. Last week, junior wide receiver **Shawn Sylvainus** was selected as the Starters Player of the Game for his performance. **Sylvainus** caught four passes for 80 yards including a 35-yard touchdown reception,

his third score of the season. Starters Riverport, Starters Pub and Starter Clubhouse Grille, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street, Route 378 South of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Municipal Golf Course.

WINNING WAYS: Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 17 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 22 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

OVERTIME 'HOUNDS: Moravian has played a total of nine overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 7-2 all-time in the extra-session. Five of those nine overtime games have been against Juniata College with the Greyhounds going 4-1 in those games. Moravian's contest in Huntingdon last fall marked the first time in the Greyhounds' have needed more than one overtime session in a game. The 2008 season also marked the second year that Moravian has played two overtimes games in one season, the other year was 1999.
