**THE GAME:** Moravian looks to snap a six-game losing streak in a Centennial Conference game at Ursinus College. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Patterson Field in Collegeville, Pennsylvania.

**THE COACHES: Scot Dapp** (West Chester '73) is in his 23rd season at Moravian, with a career record of 136-98-1 (.581), the winningest football coach in Moravian history. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. **Dapp**, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004, 2005 and 2008, winning the title in 2005.

Ursinus coach **Peter Gallagher (West Virginia Wesleyan '93**) has a record of 38-50 (.439) in his ninth year at the school.

**THE SERIES:** Saturday's meeting will be the 12<sup>th</sup> in the series with Moravian leading 7-3-1. The Bears posted a 27-0 win in 2007 in Collegeville in the first meeting between the two schools in 25 years while the Greyhounds had a 17-7 win in Bethlehem, last season. Ursinus has won two of the last three meetings with a 10-7 back in 1982.

**GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE:** Moravian joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fourth in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors poll Ursinus College was picked seventh.

**WEEKLY CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE COACHES WEB CHAT:** Head Football Coach **Scot Dapp** will be participating in the weekly Centennial Conference football chats every Tuesday beginning at 10:00 a.m. Coach **Dapp** is scheduled to be on-line beginning at 10:49 a.m. each week as all nine Centennial Conference head coaches will be available.

**BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS:** Of the 88 players on the Moravian roster, 29 are freshmen, 18 are sophomores and 26 are juniors. There are 15 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 54 letterwinners including five from the 2007 season and 13 starters.

**OVERTIME 'HOUNDS:** Moravian has played a total of nine overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 7-2 all-time in the extra-session. Five of those nine overtime games have been against Juniata College with the Greyhounds going 4-1 in those games. Moravian's contest in Huntingdon last fall marked the first time in the Greyhounds' have needed more than one overtime session in a game. The 2008 season also marked the second year that Moravian has played two overtimes games in one season, the other year was 1999.

**ON THE AIRWAVES:** For the 13th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAN 1470 AM The Fox for the fifth straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance from **John Elliott**. The broadcast kicks off at 12:00 p.m. with an hour pregame show.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have four players closing in on milestones for his career. Senior running back Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS) became the 20<sup>th</sup> player in school history to rush for 1,000 career yards against Dickinson College. Rempe, who came to Moravian as a quarterback, has 1,390 career yards on 368 carries with eight touchdowns in 33 games. Rempe, who tied the school record with 51 attempts at Juniata College last season, had 727 of those yards on 178 carries last season with 165 carries in the last four games of the 2008 season. Rempe did not play in Moravian's loss versus Lebanon Valley College, and he only played one play in the victory over McDaniel College. Rempe needs 33 yards to move into 11<sup>th</sup> place and 410 yards to crack into the top ten. His 368 carries rank sixth in school history, and he needs 90 carries to move into fifth. Junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS) is closing in on becoming the 18<sup>th</sup> player in school history with 1,000 career receiving yards. Sylvainus has 982 yards on 67 career catches, which ranks 18<sup>th</sup> in Moravian's record books. Freshman kick returner/defensive back Travis King (Wilmington, DE/Concord HS) has 534 yards on 22 kickoff returns this fall, which rank fourth and tied for fifth, respectively. King needs 161 yards and six kickoff returns to set the single season school records in each

category. **King** is also moving up the record book in punt returns. He has 12 punt returns for 110 yards, which is 15<sup>th</sup> in a single season. The school season records for punt returns are 32 returns and 326 yards. Junior punter **Eric Dziengelski (Coatesville, PA/Chestnut Hill Academy)** is tied for 15<sup>th</sup> in a single season with 51 punts for 1,713 yards, which is 16<sup>th</sup>.

has 327 yards and three scores on 59 carries. **Pittman** has added 109 yards on 34 attempts while **Decristofaro** has 51 yards and three touchdowns on 76 carries. **Desiderio** has eight punt returns for 40 yards and 15 kickoff returns for 408 yards with one touchdown. Sophomore defensive back Mike Rissmiller has added ten kickoff returns for 169 yards while freshman defensive back Chris Roundtree has a team high five interceptions. Sophomore linebacker Greg Martell leads Ursinus defense with 52 tackles including three tackles for loss, one pass defended and a fumble recovery. Junior linebacker Joe Galie has 39 tackles with four tackles for loss, a sack, an interception and a fumble recovery while sophomore defensive back Joe Henry has 37 tackles with four and a half tackle for loss, a sack, two interceptions and a total of three passes defended. Rissmiller has 26 tackles with six passes defended including two interceptions while junior defensive lineman Tony Stefanoni has a team high three sacks among his 23 tackles. Junior defensive lineman Dave Queroli has 25 tackles with two sacks, four tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble.

THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS: The Greyhounds are sixth in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 362.8 yards per game. The squad is third in passing defense at 189.0 yards per game, and the defense is seventh in rushing yards allowed at 173.8 per game. The Greyhounds are sixth in points allowed at 24.1 per game, and the squad is ninth in points scored per game at 5.8. Offensively, Moravian is eighth in the Centennial Conference at 197.6 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked seventh in rushing offense at 82.5 yards per game and ninth in passing offense at 115.1 yards per game. Moravian is eighth in turnover margin with a -1.38 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed 21 turnovers while forcing ten turnovers. Moravian leads the Centennial Conference in fewest penalties with just 30 penalties for an average of 32.8 yards per game, and the Greyhounds are first in kickoff returns at 24.0 yards a return. Individually, senior running back Ryan **Rempe** is fourth in the conference in rushing at 87.3 yards per game, and he is tenth in total offense at 87.3 yards per contest. Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk (Yorktown, VA/New Egypt HS) is eighth in the conference in pass efficiency with a 89.9 rating, and he is eighth in passing yardage at 66.7 yards per game. Freshman defensive back **Travis King** is third in kickoff returns with an average of 24.3 yards per return, and he is second in punt returns at 9.2 yards per return while freshman running back Langston Ross (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is fourth the Centennial Conference in kickoff returns at 23.7 yards per return. Junior punter Eric Dziengelski is eighth in punting with an average of 33.6 yards per punt while sophomore kicker Ian Heck (Easton, PA/Easton HS) is eighth in kick scoring at 1.8 points per game, and he is seventh in field goals per game at 0.50. Sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is 12<sup>th</sup> in the Centennial Conference with an average of 7.4 tackles per game while junior linebacker Philip Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS) is 15th in tackles at 6.8 tackles per contest. Junior defensive back **Daniel Burley** (Easton, PA/Easton HS) is 22<sup>nd</sup> in tackles per game with an average of 6.2 while sophomore defensive back **David Wacker** (Parkton, MD/Hereford HS) is tied for 24<sup>th</sup> at 6.0 tackles per contest. Senior defensive back Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) is eighth in the Centennial Conference in passes defended with 0.88 per game and he is tied for ninth in interceptions at 0.38 per game and 46<sup>th</sup> in tackles at 4.6 per contest. Junior linebacker Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) is 41st in tackles at 5.1 per contest while junior defensive lineman Allen Petros (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is third in tackles for loss with 1.33 per game.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: In Bethlehem last fall, quarterback Patrick Weiss (Gilbertsville, PA/St. Pius X HS) threw his first touchdown pass as of a member of the Moravian College football team to help lead the Greyhounds to a 17-7 Centennial Conference victory over Ursinus College at Rocco Calvo Field. Weiss was seeing his most extensive action of the season for Moravian after Greyhound starting quarterback Marc Braxmeier was carted off the field in an ambulance in the second quarter, two plays before Moravian scored the first points of the game. Braxmeier did return from the hospital and was on the field after the game. The contest also saw the teams combine for 16 penalties for 162 yards with Ursinus being called for 12 penalties and Moravian earning five of its 20 first downs by penalty. There were seven personal foul penalties including roughing the passer on the play that knocked Braxmeier out of the game, and another two that were offsetting calls. Moravian received the opening kickoff of the game after not winning the coin toss for the first time this season. The Greyhounds would put together a nine-play drive, helped by three penalties on the Bears including a pass interference call on a third-and-nine play. On the seventh play of the drive, tailback Tyler McCambridge ran the ball to the Ursinus one-yard line but was injured on the play and did not return. Tailback Ryan Rempe came into the game and was stuffed at the goal line, and Braxmeier was stopped on fourth down as Moravian turned the ball over on downs. The Bears would get a first down on their first possession of the game; however, facing a third-and-eight from their own 12-yard line, Ursinus quarterback Nicholas Dye never controlled a snap in a shotgun formation. Moravian defensive end Allen Petros covered the ball for the Greyhounds at the Ursinus eight-yard line. Moravian was unable to score again as Braxmeier was intercepted in the end zone on second down by Ursinus defensive back Joe Kost as Braxmeier tried to find wide receiver Tyler Hersch across the back of the end zone. Ursinus moved the ball down to the Moravian 40-yard line but a rush for no gain and back-to-back sacks by Petros and defensive linemen Doug Bocchino and Don Maxwell forced the Bears back to their own 41-yard line and the first punt of the game. Dve was injured on the second sack and would not return to the contest. The Greyhounds would begin at their own 19-yard line after the punt and put together a 12-play drive to the end zone. Braxmeier threw a 14-yard pass to Rempe for a first down, and then Braxmeier connected on a 15-yard pass to wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus for another first down on the first play of the second quarter. Rempe ran for 12 yards and another first down to put the Greyhounds on the Ursinus 29-yard line. Facing a third-and-seven, Braxmeier rolled to his left towards the Moravian sideline and tossed a ten-

SCOUTING URSINUS COLLEGE: The Bears enter the game with an overall record of 4-3 and a 4-1 mark in Centennial Conference action. Senior quarterback Justin Decristofaro leads Ursinus on the field having completed 102 of 204 passes for 1,584 yards with 13 touchdowns and seven interceptions. Decristofaro's top targets have been sophomore wide receiver Nick Giarratano, who has 30 receptions for 524 yards and seven touchdowns, sophomore wide receiver Al Desideri, who has 23 catches for 546 yards and three scores, and sophomore wide receiver Kahlil Pittman, who has 18 receptions for 136 yards and two touchdowns. Freshman running back leads the Bears' rushing attack with 396 yards and six touchdowns on 107 carries while sophomore running back Travis Evans

yard completion to sophomore wide receiver Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) for a first down. On the play, Braxmeier was hit in the head going out of bounds and would be immobilized by the training staff as the ambulance was immediately on the field. After about a ten minute delay, the Greyhounds had a first and goal at the Ursinus eight-yard line after the penalty for the late hit on Braxmeier. Rempe would run for two yards on first down before fullback Morgan deRouen scampered six yards into the end zone with the first points of the game on deRouen's first rushing touchdown of the season. Kicker Brian Reckenbeil made his 62<sup>nd</sup> straight extra-point to give Moravian a 7-0 lead with 12:25 to play in the second quarter. The Bears would come right back down the field with quarterback Justin Decristofaro leading the offense. Ursinus put together a 12 play drive of its own capped off by a one-yard touchdown run tailback Kahill Pittman. Greg Zara added the extra-point to tie the contest at 7-7 with 6:26 before the intermission. During the drive, the Greyhounds were called for a personal foul on the first play while Moravian defensive back **Daniel Burley** hit **Decristofaro** on a quarterback keeper on the second play, forcing a fumble in Moravian territory; however, tight end Carl Scholl covered the ball for the Bears at the Moravian 40-yard line to keep the Ursinus drive alive. Rempe ran for 14-yards on the first play of the next drive for a first down, but Moravian was unable to move the ball past midfield bringing punter Michael Voskian in for his first punt of the game. Ursinus would get one first down on its next possession before punting the ball back to Moravian. A personal foul penalty on the Bears during the punt set the Moravian offense up at the Ursinus 49-yard line with 1:07 to play. However, Voskian would punt after three plays with the ball rolling into the end zone for a touch back. The Bears would take over with 30 second until the intermission. On the first play, Decristofaro was sacked by Bocchino and fumbled the ball. However, an inadvertent whistle while the ball was rolling loose on the field and ruled that the play would be done over. Ursinus would then take a knee to run out the clock and head to the locker room tied 7-7. Ursinus received the opening kickoff of the second half, but another personal foul pushed the Bears to their own 25-yard line to start the drive. Running back Kory Kapinos, who started for injured starter Mark **Jaskowski** for the Bears, was dropped for a one-yard loss on first down. On second down, Bocchino pushed the offensive lineman blocking him into Decristofaro and knocking the ball loose. Bocchino fell on the ball to set the Moravian offense up at the Ursinus 20-yard line. The Greyhounds would run the ball twice and Weiss was incomplete on a pass attempt bringing up a fourth-and-five from the Bears' 15-yard line. Reckenbeil would come on and drill a 32-yard field goal to give the Greyhounds the lead back, 10-7, with 12:37 to play in the third quarter. On the field goal, **Reckenbeil's** school record 13<sup>th</sup> of the season, he became the school's alltime leading scorer with 217 points, passing former running back Chris Jacoubs' mark of 216 points. Ursinus picked up two first downs on its next possession with a 19-yard pass from Decristofaro to wide receiver Al Desiderio and a Moravian personal foul. However, the Bears would face a fourth-and-12 from the Moravian 26-yard line and Decristofaro's pass to Kapinos was good for just five yards, turning the ball back over to the Greyhounds on downs. The stop for the Moravian defense was just the ninth in 22 fourth down attempts by its opponents this season. Taking over on their own 21-yard line, the Greyhounds would get a first down on a Rempe run and a personal foul by Ursinus to move the ball to the Moravian 49-yard line. Weiss then hit Sylvainus with a 16-yard completion on thirdand-three to put the ball on the Ursinus 28-yard line. After a Rempe rush for a first down to put the ball in the red zone, deRouen would run for 14vards to move the Greyhound offense to the three-yard line. Two plays later, Weiss found Alex Hersch in the left front corner of the end zone for a four-yard touchdown pass. Reckenbeil's extra-point pushed the Greyhound lead to 17-7 with 3:09 remaining in the third quarter. The Bears would get a first down on a 16-yard pass from DeCristofaro to wide receiver Blaze Wasserleben on the first play of the possession. However, DeCristofaro was hit by Moravian defensive back Erik Brinkerhoff on a quarterback keeper on the next play and fumbled. Burley grabbed the ball for the Greyhounds, setting the Moravian offense up at its own 42-yard line. The Greyhounds would actually lose a yard on three plays. On fourth down, Voskian connected on a career long punt of 56 yards that was downed at the Ursinus three-yard line, After an Ursinus punt, Moravian began at its own 44-yard line and was moving the ball into Ursinus territory when a holding call moved the Greyhounds back to the Ursinus 40 yard line. On a secondand-21 play, Weiss through a pass towards the Ursinus sideline that bounced off of his intended receivers hands and was intercepted by Bear linebacker Joe Galie at the Ursinus 27-yard line. The Bears would get just three plays in, all incomplete passes before bringing Zara onto the field to punt for the fourth time in the game. The Greyhounds would also run just three plays before having Voskian punt for the fourth time in the contest. Ursinus began its final drive at its own 35-yard line. Two **Decristofaro** passes, including a 20-yard completion to wide receiver **Jessie Ordonio**, moved the ball to the Moravian 40-yard line. That would be as far as the Bears would get with **Decristofaro** being sacked by **Bocchino**, a false start penalty and a sack by **Petros** moved the ball all the way back to the Ursinus 39-yard line and forcing a third-and-31. After an incomplete pass, Zara would punt the ball back to the Greyhounds. Moravian took over at its own 26-yard line and had Rempe run for 12 yards on first down. Rempe would add five yards on the next play to go over the 100-yard mark for the second straight week. Moravian would not pick up another first down, bringing Voskian in to punt on fourth-and-three. Voskian's punt would be downed at the Ursinus nine-yard line; however, a running into the kicker penalty gave Moravian the yardage it needed for a first down at midfield. Rempe ran for six yards on first down while **deRouen** added three yards on second down. The Bears would use their final timeout. When play resumed, Weiss faked a handoff to Rempe and rolled to his right on a quarterback keeper that gained nine yards and the final first down of the game. Weiss would kneel down once to run out the clock. The Moravian offense finished with 269 yards on 69 plays in the game with **Rempe** running for 107 yards on 32 carries after tying the school record a week ago with 51 carries at Juniata College. McCambridge had 38 yards on five carries to move into seventh in school history with 2,132 yards before leaving with an injury while deRouen added 29 yards on nine attempts. Weiss had 15 yards on three carries, and he completed five of his nine passes for 43 yards with a touchdown and an interception. Braxmeier was three-for-six for 39 yards with an interception before his injury while **Rempe**, who came to Moravian as a guarterback and even started five games at the position as a freshman, was 0-for-2 on pass attempts. Tyler Hersch caught three passes for 23 yards while Sylvainus had two catches for 31 yards. Alex Hersch added two catches for 14 yards. The Bears' offense was limited to just 204 yards on 56 plays with Decristofaro completing 11 of 19 passes for 130 yards, but he was sacked four times and had just 15 yards on nine carries. Kapinos had 35 yards on 12 rushing attempts while Pittman added 26 yards and his touchdown run on seven carries. Wasserleben was Ursinus' leading receiver with four catches for 52 yards while Desiderio had two receptions for 25 yards and Ordonio had two catches for 23 yards. Bocchino and Petros led the Moravian defense as the Greyhound defensive line had a big game. Bocchino had eight tackles, six of them solo stops, with two and a half sacks, three and a half tackles for loss, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery while Petros had eight tackles, two and a half sacks, four tackles for loss and a fumble recovery. Maxwell added seven tackles with half a sack, two tackles for loss and a pass break-up at the line of scrimmage while defensive lineman Michael McClarin (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) added four tackles. **Brinkerhoff** made six tackles to go with this forced fumble for Moravian while linebacker Kevin McGorry added six tackles and a half a sack. Linebacker Andrew Morrissey and linebacker Anthony Carney each added five tackles and a tackle for loss. Morrissey's five tackles gave him 309 for his career, moving him up to ninth in school history. Galie led the Ursinus defense with a game high 13 tackles to go with his interception while defensive lineman Dave Queroli added ten tackles with three tackles for loss. Linebacker Nate Mast had nine tackles with one for loss for the Bears while defensive lineman **Tony Stefanoni** had eight stops with a half a tackle for loss.

**THE QUARTERBACKS:** Sophomore quarterback **Steve Panasuk** has started four games and completed 45 of 90 passes for 467 yards with two touchdowns and five interceptions. He has also been sacked 16 times. Sophomore **Andy Polony (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS)** has started four games for the Greyhounds and has completed 38-of-76 passes for 351 yards with a touchdown and six interceptions. **Polony** has been sacked nine times this season. Senior **Patrick Weiss** has played in three games, completing

Sophomore running back Phillip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) has added 77 yards on 29 carries for Moravian while freshman running back Rocco Del Priore (Center Valley, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) has 26 yards on 12 attempts. Junior fullback Michael Crann (Columbia, NJ/North Warren Regional HS) has nine yards on two carries. Freshman running back Langston Ross has 18 yards on 14 carries while senior running back Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has six yards on ten attempts with one touchdown. Freshman linebacker Stephen Kircher (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS) has 19 yards on fake punt attempts against McDaniel College and Juniata College while freshman defensive back Travis King picked up nine yards on a fake punt attempts against Johns Hopkins University and Franklin & Marshall College.

**THE WIDE RECEIVERS:** The Greyhounds have had 13 different players catch a pass this season led by junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus, who has caught 21 passes for 257 yards and three touchdowns. Junior wide receiver Alex Hersch, who missed the Lebanon Valley College game, has added 16 catches for 230 yards while senior tight end Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) has 11 receptions for 107 yards. Dencker also has a two-point conversion reception. Sophomore tight end Mike Zanoni (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) has 14 receptions for 119 yards while senior running back Ryan Rempe has eight catches for 29 yards. Freshman wide receiver Albie Moran (Phillipsburg, NJ/Phillipsburg HS) has grabbed four passes for 29 yards while sophomore running back Phillip Redline has four catches for 52 yards. Junior wide receiver Eric Woodruff (Brodheadsville, PA/Pius X HS) has three receptions for 41 yards while. Sophomore wide receiver Max Coveleski (Lewes, DE/Cape Henlopen HS) has added three receptions for 20 yards while senior running back Anthony Falco has added two catches for 23 yards.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Senior Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS) and junior Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) are back on the offensive line with Grando as the only returning All-Conference player for the Greyhounds. Sophomore Nicholas Marzuoli (Easton, PA/Easton HS), who has missed the last two games with an injury, and junior Matthew Washer (Ogdensburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) saw plenty of playing time last season while senior Kyle Passarelli (Princeton, NJ/Montgomery HS) gives Moravian five experienced players on the line that will average 6-3, 275. Freshman Frank Costantini (Middletown, NJ/Middletown HS) starts at center while sophomores Ed Matta (Exton, PA/Downingtown East HS) and Louis Scalia (Hockessin, DE/Charter School of Wilmington) and junior Thomas Mulligan (Ardmore, PA/Episcopal Academy) have also seen action this season.

**DEFENSIVE FRONT:** Junior defensive lineman **Allen Petros**, who has missed the games at Johns Hopkins University and versus Dickinson College with an injury, leads the Moravian defensive line with 34 tackles including 21 solo stops, eight tackles for loss and three of Moravian's ten sacks. Junior defensive lineman **Michael McClarin** has added 31 tackles with four and a half tackles for loss and a pass break-up while sophomore defensive lineman **Seth Payne (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS)** has 23 tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack and four pass break-ups. Junior defensive lineman **Jacob Millen (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS)** has 13 tackles, a fumble recovery, a pass break-up and two blocked kicks, an extrapoint versus McDaniel and a field goal versus Dickinson while junior defensive lineman **Patrick Gordon (Bethlehem, PA/Notre Dame HS)** has contributed seven stops with one for loss. Sophomore defensive lineman **Ryan Ulk (Temple, PA/Muhlenberg HS)** has four tackles.

**THE LINEBACKER CORPS:** Sophomore linebacker **Evan Bauer** leads the linebackers and the Moravian defense with 59 tackles with three tackles for loss, one sack, a forced fumble, an interception returned 15 yards and a total of two passes defended. Junior linebacker **Philip Bortz** has contributed 54 tackles, four and a half tackles for loss, an interception with a

Senior linebacker Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) has 32 tackles with four and a half for loss, two sacks and an interception while senior linebacker Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS) has 29 tackles including one for loss. Freshman linebacker Jake Hildebrand (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) has 20 tackles this season with two tackle for loss and a sack. Senior linebacker Michael Bishop (Nazareth, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has added five tackles while freshman linebacker Stephen Kircher, who missed the Dickinson College and Gettysburg College games with an injury, has six tackles with one for loss.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD: In the defensive backfield, junior defensive back Daniel Burley has 50 tackles, five and a half tackles for loss, an interception returned 18 yards, a total of five passes defended and a fumble recovery for eight yards in the win over McDaniel College. Sophomore defensive back David Wacker, who missed the game versus Gettysburg College with an injury, has contributed 42 tackles with one for loss while senior defensive back Brad Bodine has 37 stops, a tackle for loss, a team high three interceptions with 15 yards in returns, a total of seven passes defended and a forced fumble. Senior defensive back Kyle Krupa (Ashley, PA/Hanover HS) has contributed 32 tackles, a tackle for loss and three pass break-ups while junior defensive back Thomas Dailey (Easton, PA/Notre Dame HS) has 22 tackles and a pass break-up this season. Freshman defensive back Travis King has made 23 stops with three tackles for loss while freshman defensive back Matt Johnson (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) has seven tackles.

KICKING GAME: Sophomore kicker Ian Heck has 16 kickoffs this season with an average of 52.4 yards per kickoff. Heck is also two-for-three on extra-point attempts, and made his first career field goal attempt of 30 yards versus Lebanon Valley College. Heck is four-for-five on field goals this season Junior punter Eric Dziengelski has punted 51 times for an average of 33.6 yards per punt with a long of 53 yards versus Lebanon Valley College, 13 inside the 20-yard line, four fair caught and one touchback. Dziengelski has had a total of three punts longer than 50 yards.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Freshman defensive back Travis King has returned 22 kickoffs for 534 yards with a long return of 56 yards versus Dickinson College, and King also has 12 punt returns for 110 yards including a long return of 29 yards also against Dickinson. Freshman running back Langston Ross has 14 kickoff returns for 332 yards with a long return of 52 yards versus McDaniel College while junior wide receiver Eric Woodruff has one kickoff return for 28 yards. Woodruff also has two tackles on special teams while sophomore kicker Ian Heck has made two tackles. Junior wide receiver Alex Hersch has returned three punts this fall for nine yards while junior linebacker Jason Pauloski (Bloomingdale, NJ/Butler HS) blocked a field goal attempt versus Juniata College.

STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME: As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAN The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-Game Show. Last week, sophomore defensive lineman Seth Payne was selected as the Starters Player of the Game for his performance. Payne had six tackles with a half a tackle for loss. Starters Riverport, Starters Pub and Starter Clubhouse Grille, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street, Route 378 South of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Municipal Golf Course.

**WINNING WAYS:** Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 17 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 22 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.
