THE GAME: Moravian closes out the 2009 season in a Centennial Conference game at rival Muhlenberg College. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Scotty Wood Stadium and Frank Marino Field in Allentown.

THE COACHES: Scot Dapp (West Chester '73) is in his 23rd season at Moravian, with a career record of 137-98-1 (.583), the winningest football coach in Moravian history. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. **Dapp**, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004, 2005 and 2008, winning the title in 2005.

Muhlenberg coach Mike Donnelly (Ithaca '75) has a record of 83-54 (.606) in his 13th year at the school.

THE SERIES: Saturday's meeting will be the 58th in the series with Moravian holding a 32-23-2 advantage. Moravian posted a 27-24 overtime win in Bethlehem last season while Muhlenberg earned a 35-7 win in Allentown in 2007 and a 24-10 victory in Bethlehem in 2006. Moravian captured a 24-19 win in 2005 in Allentown to snap a three-game losing streak in the series.

GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE: Moravian joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football in 2007. The Greyhounds were selected fourth in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors poll while Muhlenberg was tied for second in the poll with five first-place votes.

WINNING WAYS: Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 17 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 22 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS: Of the 88 players on the Moravian roster, 29 are freshmen, 18 are sophomores and 26 are juniors. There are 15 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 54 letterwinners including five from the 2007 season and 13 starters.

WEEKLY CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE COACHES WEB CHAT: Head Football Coach **Scot Dapp** will be participating in the weekly Centennial Conference football chats every Tuesday beginning at 10:00 a.m. Coach **Dapp** is scheduled to be on-line beginning at 10:49 a.m. each week as all nine Centennial Conference head coaches will be available.

ON THE AIRWAVES: For the 13th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAN 1470 AM The Fox for the fifth straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance from **John Elliott**. The broadcast kicks off at 12:00 p.m. with an hour pregame show.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have four players closing in on milestones for his career. Senior running back Ryan Rempe (Dickson City, PA/Mid-Valley HS) became the 20th player in school history to rush for 1,000 career yards against Dickinson College. Rempe, who came to Moravian as a quarterback, has 1,495 career yards on 405 carries with eight touchdowns in 34 games. Rempe, who tied the school record with 51 attempts at Juniata College last season, had 727 of those yards on 178 carries last season with 165 carries in the last four games of the 2008 season. Rempe did not play in Moravian's loss versus Lebanon Valley College, and he only played one play in the victory over McDaniel College. Rempe needs 305 yards to crack into the top ten. His 495 carries rank sixth in school history, and he needs 53 carries to move into fifth. Junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS) became the 18th player in school history with 1,000 career receiving yards against Ursinus College. Sylvainus has 1.062 yards, 17th in the record books, on 70 career catches, which ranks 17th in Moravian's record books. Freshman kick returner/defensive back Travis King (Wilmington, DE/Concord HS) has 588 yards on 25 kickoff returns this fall, which rank second and tied for first, respectively. King needs 97 yards and one kickoff returns to set the single season school records in each category. King is also moving up the record book in punt returns. He has 14 punt returns for 125 yards, which is 12th in a single season. The school season records for punt returns are 32 returns and 326 yards. Junior punter Eric Dziengelski (Coatesville, PA/Chestnut Hill Academy) is tied for sixth in a single season with 58 punts for 1,964 yards, which is 11th.

THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE STATISTICAL RANKINGS: The Greyhounds are seventh in the Centennial Conference in total defense, allowing 357.2 yards per game. The squad is fifth in passing defense at 189.0 yards per game, and the defense is seventh in rushing yards allowed at 168.2 per game. The Greyhounds are sixth in points allowed at 23.6 per game, and the squad is eighth in points scored per game at 7.3. Offensively, Moravian is eighth in the Centennial Conference at 203.6 yards per game. The Greyhounds are ranked seventh in rushing offense at 85.8 yards per game and ninth in passing offense at 117.8 yards per game. Moravian is eighth in turnover margin with a -1.11 per game average as the Greyhounds have committed 22 turnovers while forcing 12 turnovers. Moravian leads the Centennial Conference in fewest penalties with just 34 penalties for an average of 32.4 yards per game, and the Greyhounds are first in kickoff returns at 23.4 yards a return. Individually, senior running back Ryan Rempe is fourth in the conference in rushing at 89.5 yards per game, and he is tenth in total offense at 89.5 yards per contest and ninth in all-purpose yardage at 93.1 yards per game. Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk (Yorktown, VA/New Egypt HS) is seventh in the conference in pass efficiency with a 95.5 rating, and he is eighth in passing yardage at 75.8 yards per game. Freshman defensive back **Travis** King is third in kickoff returns with an average of 23.5 yards per return, and he is third in punt returns at 8.9 yards per return while freshman running back Langston Ross (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is fourth the Centennial Conference in kickoff returns at 23.3 yards per return. Junior punter Eric Dziengelski is sixth in punting with an average of 33.9 yards per punt while sophomore kicker Ian Heck (Easton, PA/Easton HS) is eighth in kick scoring at 2.4 points per game, and he is fifth in field goals per game at 0.67. Sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is tied for ninth in the Centennial Conference with an average of 7.1 tackles per game while junior linebacker Philip Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS) is tied for 14th in tackles at 6.6 tackles per contest. Junior defensive back Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS) is tied for 16th in tackles per game with an average of 6.3 while sophomore defensive back David Wacker (Parkton, MD/Hereford HS) is 26th at 5.9 tackles per contest. Senior defensive back Brad Bodine (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) is tied for eighth in the Centennial Conference in passes defended with 0.89 per game and he is tied for 47th in tackles at 4.7 per contest. Junior linebacker Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) is tied for 40th in tackles at 4.9 per contest while junior defensive lineman Allen Petros (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) is third in tackles for loss with 1.43 per game.

SCOUTING MUHLENBERG COLLEGE: The Mules enter the game with an overall record of 2-7 and a Centennial Conference mark of 1-6 after a 24-10 loss to Ursinus College this past Saturday. Muhlenberg has used three different quarterbacks this season. Freshman quarterback Dan Deighan has completed 35 of 75 passes for 368 yards with two interceptions while freshman quarterback Justin Kreamer has completed 40 of 81 passes for 439 yards with one touchdown and seven interceptions. Sophomore quarterback Justin Myers has completed 32 of 65 passes for 479 yards with five touchdowns and four interceptions. Senior wide receiver Phil Cresta has caught a team high 59 passes for 870 yards and three touchdowns while sophomore tight end Steve Liparini has 23 catches for 160 yards and a score. Freshman running back Terrence Dandridge has caught ten passes for 100 yards and a touchdown while junior wide receiver Bobby Bushong has nine receptions for 106 yards. Dandridge leads the Muhlenberg rushing attack with 479 yards and three touchdowns on 126 carries while sophomore running back J.T. Merklinger has 221 yards and a score on 80 carries. Junior running back Joe Montemurro has added

143 yards on 35 attempts while **Deighan** has 120 yards and a touchdown on 51 carries. Junior kicker **Michael Katz** is 11-for-12 on extra-points and tenfor-14 on field goals with a long of 45 yards. Junior punter **Jason LoPipero** is averaging 35.1 yards per punt on 49 punts with a long of 51 yards. **Merklinger** has 12 kickoff returns for 242 yards while sophomore defensive back **Chase Nadell** has eight kickoff returns for 205 yards with an 87-yard return for a touchdown. **Dandridge** has six kickoff returns for 144 yards while sophomore defensive back **Steve Nissley** has returned 15 punts for 129 yards. Sophomore defensive back **Kevin Ryan** leads the Mules with three interceptions while sophomore defensive back **Chris Hartzell** and senior defensive back **Cameron Ahouse** each have two interceptions.

Junior linebacker **Patrick McDonough** leads the Muhlenberg defense with 71 tackles including two for loss and a fumble recovery. Junior linebacker **Andy Curley** has contributed 52 tackles including six and a half tackles for loss, three and a half sacks, a pass break-up and a fumble recovery while senior linebacker **Frank Emmett** has 47 tackles, three and a half tackles for loss, a half a sack, three pass break-ups and a fumble recovery. Senior defensive lineman **Jake Floyd** leads the Mules with nine and a half tackles for loss and six sacks among his 43 tackles, and he has forced two fumbles while recovering one fumble. Junior defensive back **Mark Accomando** has 37 tackles with four pass break-ups and two tackles for loss while junior linebacker **Scott Gavin** has 34 tackles and an interception.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: Tailback Ryan Rempe ran for 180 yards and four touchdowns including the winning score in overtime to lead Moravian to a 27-24 overtime upset victory over sixth-ranked and arch-rival Muhlenberg College in Centennial Conference action at Rocco Calvo Field. Rempe, who was filling in for injured starting tailback Tyler McCambridge for the second time in three games, ran for his third straight 100-yard game and became the first Greyhound to run for four touchdowns in a game since Tim Barlok had four rushing touchdowns in a fivetouchdown performance at Susquehanna University on October 28, 2000. Rempe was named Moravian's Most Valuable Player of the game, and he had one kickoff return to 18 yards. Running back John DeLuca won the Bianco Award as Muhlenberg's MVP in the game as he ran for 148 yards and a score on 40 carries and added one kickoff return for 23 yards. Moravian received the opening kickoff and would take half of the first quarter time off of the clock while building a 7-0 lead. The Greyhounds slowly moved the ball down the field with Rempe running eight times, fullback Morgan deRouen carrying the ball three times, and quarterback Marc Braxmeier completing a pair of passes and running once. Moravian picked up five first downs on the drive including two by penalty with Muhlenberg being called for pass interference in the end zone on a thirdand-four play from the 20-yard line, and a personal foul face mask on the next play to put the ball at the two-yard line. deRouen had the first crack at the end zone but fumbled the ball. Greyhound tight end Brian Dencker (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) covered the ball inside the one-yard line to set up Rempe's first one-yard touchdown run of the game. Kicker Brian **Reckenbeil** made his 64th straight extra-point to give the Greyhounds a 7-0 lead with 7:28 to play in the first quarter. The Mules were called for a penalty before running an offensive play and two penalties on the their first short drive of the game. Muhlenberg punter David Mazzola kicked the ball away after just three plays. Moravian would then punt for the first time in the game on its next possession as punter Michael Voskian kicked the ball back to the Mules after three plays. Muhlenberg would get one first down on its next drive on an eight yard scramble by quarterback Eric Santagato on a third down play before Mazzola punted on the first play of the second quarter. The Greyhounds took over at their own 36-yard line after the punt and would put together an 11-play, 64-yard scoring drive that included nine runs by Rempe with six of the carries going for more than five yards, and a pair of completions by Braxmeier. Rempe finished the drive with a fiveyard touchdown run, and Reckenbeil's extra-point pushed the Moravian lead to 14-0 with 9:45 remaining in the first half. The Mules would start from their own 30-yard line, and DeLuca ran for 11 yards on the first play of the drive. Three plays later, Muhlenberg lined up for a punt but wide receiver Edward DeRisi took a short snap on the fake and ran 22 on a fourth-and-six play for a first down. The Mules picked up one more first down before a penalty and a sack of Santagato by Moravian linebacker Andrew Morrissey forced a fourth-and-15 at the Moravian 26-yard line. Morrissey forced Santagato to fumble on the sack but Muhlenberg offensive lineman Steve Halupka recovered the ball. Mule kicker Michael Katz came on to attempt a career long 43-yard field goal but was wide to the left. Moravian took control of the ball at its own 26-yard line but punted for the second time on a fourth-and-one play after Braxmeier's third down completion to deRouen was short. Muhlenberg would then put together its first scoring drive of the game. The nine-play, 78-yard drive was capped off with a 29-yard touchdown pass from Santagato to wide receiver Bobby Bushong. Bushong was covered by a pair of Moravian defenders in the back of the end zone but was able to win the struggled for the ball as the players fell to the turf. Katz made the extra-point to close the Moravian lead to 14-7 with just 20 seconds remaining until the intermission. Moravian would take a knee to head to the locker room with the 14-7 lead. Muhlenberg received the opening kickoff of the second half, and after the ball rolled out of bounds on the kick, the Mules began at their own 40-yard line. Muhlenberg picked up two first downs including a fourth-and-one, a problem for the Greyhound defense this season as Moravian has allowed 16 of 25 fourth down attempts to be converted into first downs this season after the game. However, a penalty, a short run on first down and an incomplete pass forced the Mules into a third-and-14. Santagato had a pass tipped by Moravian defensive back Carl Robinson and intercepted by Greyhound linebacker Anthony Carney (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) at the Moravian 23-yard line. Carney returned the ball out to the Moravian 39-yard line but a personal foul penalty on the Greyhounds forced Moravian to start from its own 24 yard line. The Greyhounds would get a first down on the three straight runs by Rempe, but a sack of Braxmeier by Muhlenberg linebacker Matt Rathbun forced Moravian into a fourth-and-12 from the Moravian 33-yard line. On Voskian's punt attempt, Mule defensive back Chris Hartzell burst through the middle of the line and blocked the punt. Hartzell would scoop up the ball at the Moravian 17-yard line and run it into the end zone for the score. **Katz** drilled the extra-point to tie the game at 14-14 with 5:33 to play in the third quarter. Moravian would begin from its own 45-yard line after a personal foul by Muhlenberg on the kickoff return by Greyhound wide receiver Jesse Phillips. On a third-andfive play from midfield, Braxmeier connected on a 36-yard pass to wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus down the right side line to move the ball to the Muhlenberg 14-yard line. However, Rempe was unable to control a handoff on the next play and fumbled with Hartzell covering the ball for the Mules at their own 12-yard line. Muhlenberg picked up two quick first downs on long runs by **DeLuca** to move out the Mule 41-yard line. After moving the ball into Moravian territory, Muhlenberg was called for holding penalties around a ten-yard completion from Santagato to DeRisi. Facing a secondand-20 from their own 43-yard line, Santagato attempted a shovel pass but the ball deflected off of a player and into the hands of Moravian defensive lineman **Doug Bocchino** for an interception at the Muhlenberg 40-yard line. The Greyhounds, however, were unable to move the ball and with Braxmeier sacked for the second time in the game, punted on fourth-and-18 from the Muhlenberg 48-yard line on the third play of the fourth quarter. Starting from their own 20-yard line after a touchback in the punt, Muhlenberg would put together a 12-play drive to move to the Moravian 28vard line with four first downs on completions by Santagato. But Santagato was sacked by Bocchino and Greyhound defensive lineman Michael McClarin (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) to set up a fourth-and-14 from the Moravian 30-yard line. **Katz** came on to attempt a career best 47yard field goal but the kick was short. Moravian took over on its own 30yard line and Rempe was stopped for a three-yard loss on first down. On the next play, **Braxmeier** has a pass tipped in the secondary in intercepted by Muhlenberg defensive back Cameron Ahouse to give the Mules possession at the Moravian 40-yard line. Muhlenberg would need just seven plays to tie the game, five of them runs by DeLuca, who scored on a 17yard run off of the left side of the line. Katz's extra-point gave the Mules a 21-14 leads with just 4:13 remaining in regulation. unsportsmanlike conduct foul on the Moravian sideline before the kickoff, Phillips would take the ball in the end zone and return it to just the Moravian 16-yard line. Rempe ran for eight yards on the first play and then one on the second play of the drive before bursting through the left side for a career long 63-yard run down left side line. Hartzell tripped up Rempe at the Muhlenberg 12-yard line and saved the touchdown. deRouen ran for seven yards on first down but **Rempe** was then held to a yard on two carries. Facing a fourth-and-two at the Mule four-yard line, Moravian called timeout. After the stop in play, Braxmeier attempted to hit wide receiver Tyler Hersch in the left front corner of the end zone but Ahouse got a hand on the ball. The Mules took over on the four-yard line with just 1:23 to play but with Moravian holding two timeouts, Muhlenberg couldn't kneel down. **DeLuca** ran for seven yards on the first play before the Greyhounds called a timeout. DeLuca would also get the call on second down but was stripped by Morrissey and Carney covered the ball at the Muhlenberg ten-yard line with 1:11 to go. Rempe ran for three yards on first down before Moravian called its final timeout. Braxmeier attempted a quick strike to Dencker on the next play but the pass was too high. On third and goal from the sevenvard line, Braxmeier looked for wide receiver Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) but the pass was wide. However, Muhlenberg was called for pass interference, the Mules' 12th penalty of the game, to give the Greyhounds a first-and-goal at the two-yard line. Rempe would run up the middle for his third score of the game. Reckenbeil made the extra-point, his 66th in a row and his 57th consecutive PAT as a member of the Centennial Conference, to tie the game at 21-21 with just 54 seconds remaining. On the ensuing drive, Santagato would connect on a 26-yard pass to DeRisi to move the ball to the Moravian 44-yard line. After another first down on a seven-yard pass from Santagato to wide receiver Joe Caporoso, the Moravian defense, ranked in the top 20 in the nation in turnover margin and first in the Centennial Conference, would force its fourth turnover of the

game and 33rd of the season. **Santagato** rolled to his right on first down at the Moravian 33-yard line and attempted a pass that was batted into the air by Greyhound defensive lineman Allen Petros. Morrissey would grab the ball out of the air for the interception at the Moravian 28-yard line and he returned it 13 yards. The Greyhounds were called for a delay of game penalty before snapping the ball at their own 41-yard line with 11 seconds to play, just Moravian's fifth penalty of the game. Braxmeier threw a pass to **Sylvainus** but the ball was tipped around and fell to the turf. The Greyhounds would then take a knee and go to overtime for the second time in three games. Muhlenberg had the ball first in the overtime and picked up a first down on two straight DeLuca runs. Santagato hit DeRisi with a nine-yard completion and DeLuca ran for another first down, moving the ball to the Moravian four-yard line. **DeLuca** was then stopped for a loss by Carney and Maxwell, and Santagato was sacked for the fourth time in the game by Moravian defensive back Brad Bodine for a four yard loss on second down. Santagato was incomplete on his attempt to Caporoso on third and goal from the nine so Katz was called on for this third field goal attempt of the game. Katz drilled the 27-yard field goal to give the Mules a 24-21 lead. On Moravian's overtime possession, **Rempe** ran for a yard on first down and then 11 more yards to move the ball to the 13-yard line. deRouen ran for a yard before Rempe was stopped for a two-yard loss. On third-and-11, Braxmeier found Tyler Hersch down the right side line for an 11-yard game and a first-and-goal from the three-yard line. Rempe gained two yards on first down but was stopped for no gain on second down. **Rempe** would then score his fourth touchdown of the game on a one-yard run up the middle to end the game. The Greyhound offense had just 277 yards in the game on 65 plays but Moravian improved to 8-0 on the season when running at least 61 offensive plays in a contest. deRouen finished with 18 yards on six carries while Braxmeier completed seven of 13 passes for 94 yards with one interception and he was sacked twice. Tyler Hersch caught three passes for 31 yards while Sylvainus has two receptions for 42 yards. The Muhlenberg offense ran up 284 yards on 80 plays and controlled the ball for 33:46 of regulation, but the Mules committed four turnovers after committing just 11 turnovers in the first nine games of the season. Santagato completed 16 of 29 passes for 191 yards and a score, but he was intercepted three times and sacked four times. Santagato had thrown just four interceptions in 201 pass attempts this season entering the game. DeRisi caught eight passes for 87 yards to go with his 22-yard run while Caporoso has four receptions for 43 yards. Bishong has two catches for 47 yards including his touchdown and a pair of kickoff returns for 30 yards. Petros led the Moravian defense with 12 tackles including a sack and two tackles for loss while Bodine had 11 tackles and a sack. Linebacker Kevin McGorry also added 11 tackles while Morrissey had ten stops with a sack, forced fumble and interception. Defensive back Daniel Burley made nine tackles with a pair of pass break-ups while Robinson had eight tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass break-up. Carney finished with six tackles, a half tackle for loss, the interception and the fumble recovery while defensive back Erik Brinkerhoff had six tackles and a pass break-up. Rathbun made a game high 15 tackles to lead the Muhlenberg defense, and he added a sack and four tackles for loss while linebacker Scott Gavin had nine tackles with a half a tackle for loss. Defensive back Jared Holenda and defensive lineman Frank Emmett each had eight tackles for the Mules with Emmett forcing a fumble.

THE QUARTERBACKS: Sophomore quarterback Steve Panasuk has started five games and completed 51 of 110 passes for 606 yards with four touchdowns and five interceptions. He has also been sacked 16 times. Sophomore Andy Polony (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) has started four games for the Greyhounds and has completed 38-of-76 passes for 351 yards with a touchdown and six interceptions. Polony has been sacked nine times this season. Senior Patrick Weiss (Gilbertsville, PA/St. Pius X HS) has played in three games, completing eight of 30 pass attempts for 103 yards with five interceptions. Weiss has gained 28 yards on nine carries while being sacked three times.

IN THE BACKFIELD: In the backfield, senior running back Ryan Rempe leads the Greyhounds with 716 yards and a touchdown on 193 attempts. Sophomore running back Phillip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) has added 77 yards on 29 carries for Moravian while freshman running back Rocco Del Priore (Center Valley, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) has 26

yards on 12 attempts. Junior fullback Michael Crann (Columbia, NJ/North Warren Regional HS) has nine yards on two carries. Freshman running back Langston Ross has 21 yards on 15 carries while senior running back Anthony Falco (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) has six yards on ten attempts with one touchdown. Freshman linebacker Stephen Kircher (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS) has 19 yards on fake punt attempts against McDaniel College and Juniata College while freshman defensive back Travis King picked up nine yards on a fake punt attempts against Johns Hopkins University and Franklin & Marshall College.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: The Greyhounds have had 13 different players catch a pass this season led by junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus, who has caught 24 passes for 337 yards and four touchdowns. Junior wide receiver Alex Hersch, who missed the Lebanon Valley College game, has added 16 catches for 230 yards while senior tight end **Brian Dencker** has 13 receptions for 145 yards. **Dencker** also has a two-point conversion reception. Sophomore tight end Mike Zanoni (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) has 14 receptions for 119 yards while senior running back Ryan Rempe has eight catches for 29 yards. Freshman wide receiver Albie Moran (Phillipsburg, NJ/Phillipsburg HS) has grabbed five passes for 50 yards and a touchdown while sophomore running back Phillip Redline has four catches for 52 yards. Junior wide receiver Eric Woodruff (Brodheadsville, PA/Pius X HS) has three receptions for 41 yards while. Sophomore wide receiver Max Coveleski (Lewes, DE/Cape Henlopen HS) has added three receptions for 20 yards while senior running back Anthony Falco has added two catches for 23 yards.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Senior Andrew Grando (Whiting, NJ/Manchester Township HS) and junior Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS) are back on the offensive line with Grando as the only returning All-Conference player for the Greyhounds. Sophomore Nicholas Marzuoli (Easton, PA/Easton HS), who has missed the last two games with an injury, and junior Matthew Washer (Ogdensburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) saw plenty of playing time last season while senior Kyle Passarelli (Princeton, NJ/Montgomery HS) gives Moravian five experienced players on the line that will average 6-3, 275. Freshman Frank Costantini (Middletown, NJ/Middletown HS) starts at center while sophomores Ed Matta (Exton, PA/Downingtown East HS) and Louis Scalia (Hockessin, DE/Charter School of Wilmington) and junior Thomas Mulligan (Ardmore, PA/Episcopal Academy) have also seen action this season.

DEFENSIVE FRONT: Junior defensive lineman **Allen Petros**, who has missed the games at Johns Hopkins University and versus Dickinson College with an injury, leads the Moravian defensive line with 37 tackles including 22 solo stops, ten tackles for loss, two pass break-ups and four of Moravian's 13 sacks. Junior defensive lineman **Michael McClarin** has added 34 tackles with five and a half tackles for loss and a pass break-up while sophomore defensive lineman **Seth Payne** (**Collingswood**, **NJ/Collingswood HS**) has 30 tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack and four pass break-ups. Junior defensive lineman **Jacob Millen** (**Whitehall**, **PA/Whitehall HS**) has 13 tackles, a fumble recovery, a pass break-up and two blocked kicks, an extra-point versus McDaniel College and a field goal versus Dickinson while junior defensive lineman **Patrick Gordon** (**Bethlehem, PA/Notre Dame HS**) has contributed seven stops with one for loss. Sophomore defensive lineman **Ryan Ulk** (**Temple, PA/Muhlenberg HS**) has four tackles.

THE LINEBACKER CORPS: Sophomore linebacker Evan Bauer leads the linebackers and the Moravian defense with 64 tackles with three and a half tackles for loss, one sack, a forced fumble, an interception returned 15 yards and a total of two passes defended. Junior linebacker Philip Bortz has contributed 59 tackles, six tackles for loss, a half a sack, an interception with a three-yard return and four pass break-ups while junior linebacker Anthony Carney has made 44 stops with three and a half tackles for loss, two sacks, a pass break-up and a forced fumble, which sealed the team's victory over McDaniel College. Senior linebacker Jayson Williams (Collingswood, NJ/Collingswood HS) has 34 tackles with four and a half for loss, two sacks and an interception while senior linebacker Derek Protasiewicz (Whippany, NJ/Whippany Park HS) has 30 tackles including one and a half for loss. Freshman linebacker Jake Hildebrand

(Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) has 29 tackles this season with two and a half tackle for loss and one and a half sacks. Senior linebacker Michael Bishop (Nazareth, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) has added five tackles while freshman linebacker Stephen Kircher, who missed the Dickinson College and Gettysburg College games with an injury, has seven tackles with one for loss.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD: In the defensive backfield, junior defensive back Daniel Burley has 57 tackles, six tackles for loss, an interception returned 18 yards, a total of five passes defended and a fumble recovery for eight yards in the win over McDaniel College. Sophomore defensive back David Wacker, who missed the game versus Gettysburg College with an injury, has contributed 47 tackles with two for loss, a sack and an interception while senior defensive back **Brad Bodine** has 42 stops, a tackle for loss, a team high three interceptions with 15 yards in returns, a total of eight passes defended and a forced fumble. Senior defensive back Kyle Krupa (Ashley, PA/Hanover HS) has contributed 36 tackles, a tackle for loss and three pass break-ups while junior defensive back Thomas Dailey (Easton, PA/Notre Dame HS) has 22 tackles and a pass break-up this season. Freshman defensive back Travis King has made 28 stops with three and a half tackles for loss, an interception and a total of two passes defended while freshman defensive back Matt Johnson (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) has ten tackles.

KICKING GAME: Sophomore kicker **Ian Heck** has 20 kickoffs this season with an average of 52.7 yards per kickoff. **Heck** is also four-for-five on extra-point attempts, and made his first career field goal attempt of 30 yards versus Lebanon Valley College. **Heck** is six-for-seven on field goals this season Junior punter **Eric Dziengelski** has punted 58 times for an average of 33.9 yards per punt with a long of 53 yards versus Lebanon Valley College, 13 inside the 20-yard line, four fair caught and one touchback. **Dziengelski** has had a total of three punts longer than 50 yards.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Freshman defensive back **Travis King** has returned 25 kickoffs for 588 yards with a long return of 56 yards versus Dickinson

College, and **King** also has 14 punt returns for 125 yards including a long return of 29 yards also against Dickinson. Freshman running back **Langston Ross** has 15 kickoff returns for 350 yards with a long return of 52 yards versus McDaniel College while junior wide receiver **Eric Woodruff** has one kickoff return for 28 yards. **Woodruff** also has two tackles on special teams while sophomore kicker **Ian Heck** has made two tackles. Junior wide receiver **Alex Hersch** has returned three punts this fall for nine yards while junior linebacker **Jason Pauloski** (**Bloomingdale**, **NJ/Butler HS**) blocked a field goal attempt versus Juniata College and one tackle.

STARTERS PLAYER OF THE GAME: As part of Moravian's radio contract with Fox Sports Radio 1470 AM WSAN The Fox, the announcers will select the Starters Player of the Game for Moravian during the Post-Game Show. Last week, junior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus was selected as the Starters Player of the Game for his performance. Sylvainus caught three passes for 80 yards and a touchdown in Moravian's 20-19 win over Ursinus College. He also became the 18th player in school history to reach 1,000 career receiving yards on this first reception of the game. Starters Riverport, Starters Pub and Starter Clubhouse Grille, sponsors of Moravian College Athletics, are located on 2nd Street, Route 378 South of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Municipal Golf Course.

OVERTIME 'HOUNDS: Moravian has played a total of nine overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 7-2 all-time in the extra-session. Five of those nine overtime games have been against Juniata College with the Greyhounds going 4-1 in those games. Moravian's contest in Huntingdon last fall marked the first time in the Greyhounds' have needed more than one overtime session in a game. The 2008 season also marked the second year that Moravian has played two overtimes games in one season, the other year was 1999.
