THE GAME: Moravian opens its 2010 season with a Centennial Conference game versus Susquehanna University. Kickoff is slated for 1:00 p.m. at Rocco Calvo Field in Bethlehem. Beginning this season, the two schools will be back in the same conference as Susquehanna joins the Centennial Conference as an associate member after three years in the Liberty League.

THE COACHES: Scot Dapp (West Chester '73) enters his 24thseason at Moravian, with a career record of 137-99-1 (.580), the winningest football coach in Moravian history. He entered the season in the top 50 in winning percentage among NCAA Division III active coaches. **Dapp**, who served as the president of the American Football Coaches Association in 2005, has earned Coach-of-the-Year honors from the MAC three times including Co-Coach of the Year in 1997 and has led the 'Hounds to two appearances in the NCAA playoffs, the ECAC Southeast Bowl game in 2002, the ECAC Southwest Bowl game in 2004, 2005 and 2008, winning the title in 2005.

Susquehanna coach **Steve Briggs (Springfield '84)** is in his 21st season at the school with an overall mark of 110-93 (.542). Briggs is the winningest coach in Susquehanna history.

THE SERIES: Saturday's meeting will be the 37th in the series with Moravian holding a 20-15-1 advantage. The Crusaders posted a 24-0 win to open the 2009 season in Selinsgrove while the Greyhounds began their 2008 season with a 27-14 in Bethlehem and started the 2007 campaign in Selinsgrove with a 34-27 win. Moravian also won in 2006, 24-17 in the season opener while the Greyhounds earned a 22-10 win in Bethlehem in 2005 and a 32-13 victory over Susquehanna in Bethlehem in 2004. Moravian captured a 23-6 victory also in Selinsgrove back in 2002 and that victory was the 100th win in coach **Scot Dapp's** career.

SEASON OPENING GAMES: The Greyhounds will be looking for their eighth season opening victory in the last 11 years. The Greyhounds defeated Delaware Valley College, 19-10, in Doylestown to open the 2000 season, FDU-Florham, 21-14, in 2002 and 16-8, and 2003, Juniata College, 34-0, in 2004, Susquehanna University, 24-17, 34-27 in 2007 and 27-14 in 2008. Moravian lost to Delaware Valley, 31-22, in Bethlehem to open Rocco Calvo Field at the start of the 2005 season and to Susquehanna University, 24-0 a year ago.

GREYHOUNDS IN THE CENTENNIAL CONFERENCE: Moravian joined the Centennial Conference as an associate member in the sport of football in 2007 while Susquehanna is joining the conference this season. The Greyhounds were selected eighth in the Centennial Conference preseason coaches and sports information directors poll while Susquehanna was picked fourth and received on first-place vote.

WINNING WAYS: Moravian had 11 consecutive winning seasons—all under Coach **Scot Dapp**, from 1987 to 1997 and has had 17 winning seasons in **Dapp's** 23 years. The 11-straight winning seasons is the longest in school history. **Dapp** ranks third among Greyhound coaches in winning percentage.

ON THE AIRWAVES: For the 14th straight year, the Greyhounds' games will be on the radio. Moravian's games will be aired on WSAN 1470 AM The Fox for the seventh straight year. **Phil May** calls the play-by-play call with color commentary from **Craig Barnes** and technical assistance from **John Elliott**. The pre-game show starts one hour prior to kickoff.

Crusaders took a knee to end the half. The Greyhounds received the opening kickoff of the second half and started with a 19-yard run by Rempe. Quarterback Patrick Weiss then hit wide receiver Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) with a 25-yard completion to the Susquehanna 13-yard line. Facing a third-and-four at the seven, Weiss had a pass intercepted at the goal line by Crusader defensive back Branden Klingler. Susquehanna would not be able to move the ball, punting from its own end zone. Moravian picked up a first down but Weiss's pass to Sylvainus on a fourth-and-11 play was incomplete as Sylvainus came down out of bounds. The Crusaders would then embark on an 11-play, 64yard drive with ten straight runs to start the drive. After the Moravian defense held in the red zone, Susquehanna was forced to settle for a 23-yard field goal by **Eppleman** to extend the lead to 17-0 with 1:37 to play in the third quarter. Moravian would run just three plays before punting again. Susquehanna would need just three plays to extend its lead with 64-yard touchdown run by Paveletz. Eppleman added the extra-point for a 24-0 lead with 13:25 remaining in the game. The Greyhounds would drive into the red zone for the third time in the game on the next drive on a 21-yard pass from Weiss to Hersch. However, Moravian turned the ball over on downs when Dencker was unable to hold on to a Weiss pass on fourth down from the seven yard line. The teams would trade punts before Susquehanna took over at its own 26-yard line to run out the clock. Paveletz also led the Crusaders in receiving with four receptions for 60 yards while wide receiver Mike Ritter had four receptions for 56 yards. Running back Josh Gordon added 48 yards on seven carries. Weiss was three-for-14 in the game for 54 yards while Polony completed four-of-eight passes for 31 yards. Hersch caught two passes for 46 yards while Dencker had two receptions for 19 yards and Sylvainus added two catches for 15 yards. Rempe led the Greyhounds with 97 yards on 19 carries while running back Philip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) had 25 yards on eight carries. Weiss added 32 yards on three carries. Phillips led

BALANCED & EXPERIENCED 'HOUNDS: Of the 85 players on the Moravian roster, 35 are freshmen, 21 are sophomores and 15 are juniors. There are 14 seniors on this season's squad, and the Greyhounds return 42 letterwinners and 14 starters.

MILESTONE WATCH: The Greyhounds have one player closing in on milestones for his career. Senior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS) enters his final season with 1,095 yards on 74 career receptions, and he needs just 305 yards to crack the top ten in school history and 26 receptions to become the seventh player in Moravian history to catch 100 career passes.

OVERTIME 'HOUNDS: Moravian has played a total of nine overtime games since the NCAA instituted the rule for the 1996 season and is 7-2 all-time in the extra-session. Five of those nine overtime games have been against Juniata College with the Greyhounds going 4-1 in those games. Moravian's contest in Huntingdon in 2008 marked the first time in the Greyhounds' have needed more than one overtime session in a game. The 2008 season also marked the second year that Moravian has played two overtimes games in one season, the other year was 1999.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: In Selinsgrove last fall, running back Dave Paveletz ran for 185 yards and two touchdowns on 30 carries, and he also caught a touchdown pass to lead Susquehanna to a 24-0 victory over Moravian in non-conference action. The Crusaders took the opening kickoff and drove 64 yards on eight plays with quarterback Rich Palazzi hitting Paveletz with a three-yard touchdown pass that was tipped by a Moravian defensive player and another Susquehanna receiver before Paveletz grabbed the ball out of the air. Bobby Eppleman made the extra-point to give Susquehanna a 7-0 lead with 10:29 left in the first quarter. Palazzi was 11 of 16 in the game for 178 yards with a touchdown and an interception. Moravian would pick up a pair of first downs, the first on a ten-yard pass completion from quarterback Andy Polony to wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus and the other on a 14-yard from tailback Ryan Rempe. However, the drive would end with the first collegiate punt by Eric Dzingelski (Coatesville, PA/Chestnut Hill Academy). Susquehanna's next drive would go just three plays before ending in an Eppleman punt. The Greyhounds again picked up two first downs before punting again on the first play of the second quarter. Polony hit tight end Brian **Dencker** with an 11-yard pass for a first down while **Rempe** had a 12-yard run. On the third play of the Crusaders next drive, Moravian defensive back Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS) intercepted a Palazzi pass at the Susquehanna 30-yard line and returned it to the 13 yard line. However, three plays later, Susquehanna linebacker Mitch Phillips intercepted Polony at the Crusader five and returned it to the 43-yard line. Susquehanna moved the ball to the Moravian 27-yard line before the Greyhound defense stopped Paveletz on a fourth-and-two. However, Moravian would punt after just three plays. The Crusaders put together a nine-play, 72-yard scoring drive with Paveletz capping off the drive with a two-yard dive over the top for the touchdown. Eppleman's kick put the score at 14-0 with 2:58 to play in the second quarter. During the drive, Palazzi completed four straight passes for first downs for a total of 58 yards. Moravian picked up a first down on a Rempe run on its next drive and another on a Susquehanna penalty after Polony was sacked. However, Crusader defensive back Josh Simpson intercepted Polony's next pass at the Susquehanna 18-yard line. The

the Susquehanna defense with seven tackles with one tackle for loss while defensive lineman Marc McDonough had six tackles with two sacks. Defensive lineman Allen Petros (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) led Greyhounds with eight tackles with two for loss and a sack. Linebacker Philip Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS) and defensive back David Wacker (Parktom, MD/Hereford HS) each had seven tackles while linebacker Evan Bauer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) added six stops. Defensive back Travis King (Wilmington, DE/Concord HS) had four tackles in his collegiate debut while returning five kickoffs for 118 yards and a punt for eight yards.

SCOUTING SUSQUEHANNA: The Crusaders, fresh off a 2009 Liberty League title, joins the Centennial this fall, marking the third conference in which the Crusaders have played in the last five seasons. Susquehanna finished the 2009 campaign with an 8-3 overall record and competed in the NCAA Division III playoffs for the first time since 1991. SU returns 12 starters, but needs to replace a void in the backfield. Dave Paveletz graduated from SU as the school's all-time leader in rushing yards, attempts and touchdowns. The transition to finding a new running game should be aided by returning three starters on the offensive line. Senior center Ryan Schumann (Fair Haven, N.J./Rumson-Fair Haven) will anchor the line that led the way to an average of 160.3 yards per game last season, second in the Liberty League. For the second year in a row, senior punter **Bobby** Eppleman (Chester Springs, Pa./Great Valley) has picked up preseason honors from D3football.com. Eppleman earned an honorable mention on the list, released on Tuesday. Eppleman, one of six Centennial Conference players named to the list, is a two-time All-Liberty League punter as well as a three-time All-Liberty League placekicker. Entering his senior season, Eppleman already stands near the top of many all-time and single-season lists at Susquehanna. He is third in career yards per punt (37.5) and set the single-season mark in 2008 with his 42.7 average.

THE QUARTERBACKS: Moravian entered preseason camp looking for a quarterback for the second straight year. Freshman Phil Garner (Mechanicsville, VA/Lee-Davis HS) has emerged as the starting quarterback with junior Max Coveleski (Lewes, DE/Cape Henlopen HS) and freshman Brandon Lesko (Catasauqua, PA/Catasauqua HS) listed as the back-ups.

IN THE BACKFIELD: The Greyhounds have a trio of runners returning to the backfield. Junior Philip Redline (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) had 28 yards on 29 carries last season while sophomore Rocco Del Priore (Center Valley, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) added 26 yards on 12 attempts. Junior Langston Ross (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) gained 21 yards on ten attempts in his first year with the squad.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: Moravian three of its top four receivers returning this season led by senior wide receiver Shawn Sylvainus (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS), who caught 28 passes for 370 yards with four touchdowns last fall. Senior wide receiver Alex Hersch (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) is back at the other starting receiver position, and he caught 19 passes for 262 yards a year ago. Junior tight end Mike Zanoni (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) added 14 receptions for 119 yards and looks to move into the starting line-up. The Greyhounds will also have sophomore wide receiver Albie Moran (Phillipsburg, NJ/Phillipsburg HS) back after he caught five passes for 50 yards and a touchdown in his debut season.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Seniors Daniel Cancelliere (Succasunna, NJ/Roxbury HS), Matthew Washer (Ogdensburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) and Thomas Mulligan (Ardmore, PA/Episcopal Academy) are back on the offensive line. Joining the starting line-up will be junior center Nicholas Guerriero (New Providence, NJ/New Providence HS) and sophomore Billy Viscuso (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS). The Greyhounds' front five has an average size of 6-1, 271.

DEFENSIVE FRONT: The defensive line returns all three starters and is anchored by junior nose tackle **Seth Payne** (Collingswood, **NJ/Collingswood HS**), who was an All-Centennial Conference First Team selection last season after making 32 total tackles that included four and a half tackles for loss and two sacks. Payne also had four pass break-ups. Senior **Allen Petros** (**Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS**) returns to one of the defensive end positions after 40 tackles, 13 for loss, five sacks and three pass break-ups in just eight games, and he earned a spot on the All-Centennial Conference Honorable Mention last season. Senior **Michael McClarin** (**Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS**) is back at the other defensive end position, and he had 35 tackles with six and a half tackle for loss in 2009.

THE LINEBACKER CORPS: Moravian has three of its starting linebackers returning led by junior Evan Bauer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS), who was the squad's leading tackler with 68 stops to go along with four and a half tackles for loss, two sacks and an interception in his first year with the Greyhounds. Senior Philip Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS) had 65 tackles a year ago with six tackles for loss, a half a sack, an interception and three passes defended while sophomore Jake Hildebrand (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) contributed 36 tackles, four and a half tackles for loss and two and a half sacks. Junior Stephen Kircher (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS) made seven tackles and adds depth for the Greyhounds.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD: Moravian also returns three starters in the defensive backfield led by senior cornerback Daniel Burley (Easton, PA/Easton HS), who was named to the All-Centennial Conference Honorable Mention squad after contributing 61 tackles with six for loss, an interception, four passes defended and a fumble recovery. Junior safety David Wacker (Parkton, MD/Hereford HS) had 53 tackles last year in his first season as a starter to go with two tackles for loss, a sack and an interception while sophomore cornerback Travis King (Wilmington, DE/Concord HS) split time as a starter and made 29 tackles with three and a half for loss and an interception. Senior safety Thomas Dailey (Easton, PA/Notre Dame HS), who had 23 tackles in 2009, and sophomore safety Matt Johnston (Macungie, PA/Emmaus HS) who contributed ten stops last year, adds depth to the Greyhounds' secondary.

KICKING GAME: Special teams is an area the staff will just work on fine tuning during camp with both kickers and returners back this fall. Junior placekicker Ian Heck (Easton, PA/Easton HS) was four-for-five on extrapoint attempts and six-for-seven on field goal attempts with a long of 30 yards in his first year as the starting kicker. Heck also averaged 53.1 yards per kickoff during the season. Senior punter Eric Dziengelski (Coatesville, PA/Chestnut Hill Academy) is also back after averaging 33.7 yards per punt on 65 attempts. He had a log of 53 yards and placed 13 punts inside the 20 yard line, and junior linebacker Doug DiMattia (Cedar Grove, NJ/Cedar Grove HS) returns for his third season as long snapper.

SPECIAL TEAMS: King will be back returning kicks after setting a school record last season of 26 kickoff returns for 615 yards (the second most in school history). **King** also had 16 punt returns for 142 yards. **Ross** also returned 16 kickoffs for 364 yards in 2009 while **Hersch** returned three punts for nine yards.
