Women's Basketball – 5-7 (Commonwealth Conference 2-3, MAC 2-4)

Last Week – Defeated *Albright, 62-46; Lost to *Lebanon Valley, 74-62. *Commonwealth game

Sophomore forward **Kelly McLean (Allentown/Salisbury HS)** scored a team high 18 points and pulled down nine rebounds to help the Greyhounds rally from a three point halftime deficit to defeat Albright College, 62-46, in Commonwealth Conference action. The Greyhounds used a 19-0 in the middle of the second half to build a 53-35 lead with 7:22 left to play. Moravian out-rebounded Albright 49-31 behind an 11-rebound performance from sophomore forward **Kristen Sarnocinski (Harleysville/Germantown Academy)**. Freshman guard **Kim Hughes (Manasquan, NJ/St. Rose HS)** joined McLean in double figures with 12 points while sophomore guard **Tara Wozniak (Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS)** had nine points, five rebounds and three steals. Sophomore guard **Jennifer Tannous** (**Bethlehem/Liberty HS**) chipped in a season high eight points off the bench in the game. The win keeps the Greyhounds undefeated in the month of January.

The Greyhounds then ran into a hot-shooting Lebanon Valley College squad as Moravian suffered a 74-62 loss to the Flying Dutchwomen in Commonwealth Conference action. Lebanon Valley connected on 51 percent of its field goals in the game and 58 percent in the second half and the Greyhounds only made 39 percent of their shots in the contest. McLean and Wozniak each had 13 points in the contest for Moravian while Hughes added 12 points. Freshman center **Kristen Rohal (Bethlehem/Liberty HS)** and Tannous each contributed six points in the loss. McLean pulled down nine rebounds and Sarnocinski added seven boards as Moravian lost the battle of the boards to Lebanon Valley by one, 38-37.

Junior Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown/Lower Dauphin HS) won the 5,000 meters at the Bucknell University-Hershey Relays with a time of 18:08.12 while classmate Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic/Riverside HS) was second in the 3,000 meters with a time of 10:04.46. Wolfsberger was also a member of two relay teams for the Greyhounds, helping the distance medley relay team to a third place finish in 12:19.19 (a new Moravian College record) and leading the 4x800-meter relay squad to a fourth place finish in 9:52.99. Joining Wolfsberger on the distance medley relay squad were juniors Kim Jaick (Coopersburg/Southern Lehigh HS) and Erin Boyle (Philadelphia/Nazareth Academy) and freshman Jaime Marks (Macungie/Emmaus HS). Wolfsberger's running mates in the 4x800-meter relay were juniors Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem/Freedom HS) and Amanda Samok (Palmerton/Palmerton HS) and sophomore Jennifer Wagner (Riegelsville/Wilson HS). Junior Sarah Shaneberger (Bethlehem/Southern Lehigh HS) placed fourth in the shot put with a toss of 38 feet, 11 inches.

Senior Anthony Rediger (Sellersville/Pennridge HS) placed fourth in both the triple jump and the high jump for the Greyhounds at the Bucknell University-Hershey Relays. Rediger had a distance of 42 feet, 8 ½ inches in the triple jump and cleared five feet, 11 inches in the high jump. Sophomore Wes Zimmerman (Boyertown/Boyertown HS) was third in the 5,000 meters with a time of 16:09.41. Junior Josh Heebner (Lansdale/North Penn HS) was sixth in the 500-meter race with a time of 1:08.48. Heebner also competed in the 4x800-meter relay with senior Damon Rutherford (Reading/Exeter HS), sophomore George Wacker (Honesdale/Honesdale HS) and freshman Joe Grady (Nanticoke/Nanticoke HS) to a third place finish in 8:11.77. Moravian's other two competitors were senior Doug Joseph (Allentown/Parkland HS), who ran a 6.73 in the 55-meter dash while freshman Steve Hartenstine (Danielsville/Northampton HS) had an 8.46 in the 55-meter high hurdles.

Senior forward **Chris Hayn (Whitehall/Whitehall HS)** scored 16 points and grabbed five rebounds but it wasn't enough as the Greyhounds fell to Albright College, 75-58, in Commonwealth Conference action. Moravian played the taller Lion squad even in the second half with each team scoring 43 points and the Greyhounds only lost the battle of the boards for the game by one, 39-38, however, Moravian trailed 32-15 at the end of the first half. Senior guard **David Jordan (Point Pleasant, NJ/Point Pleasant Boro HS)** scored 11 points and led the Greyhounds with eight rebounds. Sophomore forward **Ken Greb (Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS)** added five rebounds and four points in the game.

Jordan scored 27 points and the Greyhounds connected on 30 of 35 free throws in the game as the Greyhounds earned their first Commonwealth Conference win of the season, defeating Lebanon Valley College, 83-47. Moravian trailed by two points at halftime but connected on 23 of 26 free throws in the second half to earn the win over the Flying Dutchmen. Jordan also led the Greyhounds with nine rebounds as Moravian out-rebounded the taller Lebanon Valley squad, 36-29. Sophomore guard **Kevin Hall (Mountain Top/Pocono Mountain HS)** and Greb each scored 13 points for the Greyhounds and Greb added seven boards. Hayn, junior forward **Mike Frew (Glen Ridge, NJ/Glen Ridge HS)** and junior guard **Doug Spadt (Emmaus/Emmaus HS)** each added eight points in the win.

MORAVIAN RANKED 45th IN FALL SEARS DIRECTORS' CUP STANDINGS

CLEVELAND, OH — The Moravian College athletic teams have helped the Greyhounds to 45th place with 71 points after the fall season in the 2000-01 NCAA Division III Sears Directors' Cup Standings.

Moravian is in the top third of the 150 schools that scored points this fall and third among the eight schools in the Middle Atlantic Conference that received points. The only two MAC schools currently ahead of Moravian were Messiah College in 13th and Widener University in a tie for 43rd.

In the Lehigh Valley, Moravian is first of the three Division III schools while Muhlenberg College was tied for 91st and DeSales University had not received any points.

Last year marked the first time in the six-year history of the Sears Directors' Cup that Moravian had cracked the top 100 in the nation, finishing 84th. The Greyhounds were tied for 101st in 1998-99 and 1997-98, tied for 141st in 1996-97 and 114th overall in the first year of competition, 1995-96.

For a school to receive points, sports must compete in the NCAA National Championships (for individual sports) and the NCAA Tournament (for team sports).

Moravian earned its 71 points this fall from the women's cross country team's fifth place finish in the NCAA Division III National Championships. Last year, Moravian was in 40th place after the fall.

Developed as a joint effort between *USA Today* and NACDA, the Sears Directors' Cup program is the only all-sports competition that recognizes the institution in each of the four categories with the best overall athletics program. It is administered by NACDA and sponsored by Sears, Roebuck and Co. The Sears Directors' Cup is part of the Sears Collegiate Champions program which annually awards more than 2,200 conference and sport champion trophies and a quarter-of-a-million dollars in academic scholarships.

The University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh has closed the fall championship season with a nine-point lead in race for the Division III Sears Directors' Cup, presented by the nation's athletics directors. Wisconsin-Oshkosh scored in four of seven sports, placing third in men's cross country and soccer; fourth in women's cross country and ninth in women's volleyball to earn 280 points.

Right behind is Williams (MA), a four-time champion, with 271 points. Rounding out the top five are the College of New Jersey, third with 236 points; Trinity (TX), fourth with 205 points; and tied for fifth were Hobart/William Smith (NY) and Ithaca (NY), each with 190 points.

These final fall standings include the sports of women and men's cross country, field hockey, football, women's and men's soccer and women's volleyball. Winning national championships were Middlebury (VT) in women's cross country; Calvin (MI) in men's cross country; Hobart/William Smith in field hockey; Mount Union (OH) in football; The College of New Jersey in women's soccer; Messiah (PA) in men's soccer; and Central (IA) in women's volleyball.

Of the 393 eligible colleges and universities in the NCAA Division III, a total of 150 (38 percent) scored points in the Sears Directors' Cup competition this fall. Complete rankings on all of these institutions are available on NACDA's Web site at www.nacda.com.
