Women's Basketball – 6-9 (Commonwealth Conference 2-5, MAC 2-6)

Last Week – Lost to *Elizabethtown, 72-53; Defeated Franklin & Marshall, 83-62; Lost to *Messiah, 89-78. *Commonwealth game

The Greyhounds dropped their second straight contest to open the week as Moravian fell to nationally ranked Elizabethtown College, 72-53, in Commonwealth Conference action. The Greyhounds trailed the entire contest. Sophomore guard **Tara Wozniak** (**Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS**) led the squad with 17 points and four blocked shots while sophomore forward **Kelly McLean** (**Allentown/Salisbury HS**) added 12 points. Freshman forward **Tracie Shipman** (**Philadelphia/Archbishop Ryan HS**) led the Greyhounds on the boards with seven rebounds while freshman guard **Kim Hughes** (**Manasquan, NJ/St. Rose HS**) added four assists and four steals.

The Greyhounds had four players score in double figures and shot 64 percent to lead 49-38 at halftime in an 83-62 non-conference win over Franklin & Marshall College. Hughes led all scorers with 19 points in the game while Wozniak added 15 points. Sophomore guard **Jennifer Tannous** (**Bethlehem/Liberty HS**) and McLean each scored 13 points with McLean adding ten rebounds. Shipman started for an injured sophomore forward **Kristen Sarnocinski** (**Harleysville/Germantown Academy**) and pulled down a career best 11 rebounds and Shipman scored eight points while leading the team with 32 minutes. The Greyhounds held a 42-29 advantage on the boards in the contest. The game was the 249th win of head coach **Mary Beth Spirk's** 14-year stint.

Moravian gave the top team in the Commonwealth Conference a game for most of the contest before Messiah put the contest away. The Greyhounds were up 27-20 midway through the first half and trailed by just three points, 72-69, with 6:44 to play. Both teams shot over 50 percent for the game with the Falcons connecting on 59 percent of their shots. Moravian shot 57 percent behind the three-point line and 83 percent from the foul line but Messiah was 92 percent at the foul line thanks to a 14-of-14 performance by sophomore Christina Vouriotis of Messiah. Wozniak tossed in 23 points for the Greyhounds while Hughes had 19 points. McLean had 16 points and had a team high seven rebounds as the Greyhounds had a 29-24 advantage in rebounds for the game.

Despite the first double-double of senior guard **David Jordan's (Point Pleasant, NJ/Point Pleasant Boro HS)** career and another double-double from sophomore forward **Ken Greb (Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS)**, the Greyhounds suffered an 83-75 loss to Elizabethtown College in Commonwealth Conference action. Jordan led the Greyhounds with 23 points on 9-of-18 shooting and he had a career best 12 rebounds in the contest. Greb had a career high 18 points and added 12 rebounds with eight on the offensive end in the loss. Moravian trailed 53-50 with 9:37 to play when the Greyhound bench was assessed a technical foul. The Blue Jays would extend their lead to 70-54 before Moravian would make a run at the end of the game. The Greyhounds got within five points at 78-73 with 1:12 left in the game but Elizabethtown would put the game away from the foul line. Sophomore guard **Kevin Hall (Mountain Top/Pocono Mountain HS)** added 15 points in the contest which saw Moravian play without senior forward and starter **Chris Hayn (Whitehall/Whitehall HS)** due to a concussion.

The Greyhounds were never able to get on track as Moravian fell to Messiah College, 66-45, in the final Commonwealth Conference game in the first half of the season. The Hounds shot just 27 percent from the floor and 58 percent at the foul line for the contest while trailing 43-21 at the half. Greb led Moravian with 14 points while Hayn added 12 points and both players have five rebounds. Freshman forward **John Cartegna** (**Greentown/Wallenpaupack HS**) had a team high six rebounds and Jordan was held to a pair of free throws in the game.

Juniors Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic/Riverside HS) and Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown/Lower Dauphin HS) continue to lead the women's track and field team as each won an event at the Haverford College Open over the weekend. Wolfsberger captured first in the 1,500 meters with an NCAA Division III provisional qualifying time of 4:40.8. Wolfsberger is already an automatic qualifier in the event. Shertzer captured first place in the 3,000 meters in 10:24.9. Wolfsberger also led the Greyhounds to a second place finish in the 4x400-meter relay with a time of 4:14.8. Joining Wolfsberger on the relay squad were sophomores Ann Corless (Plainsville, CT/Plainsville HS) and Jennifer Wagner (Riegelsville/Wilson HS) and freshman Jaime Marks (Macungie/Emmaus HS). Wagner was also fifth in the 1,500 meters in 5:10.9 while Corless was fourth in the 400 meters at 1:04.3.

Junior **Kim Jaick (Coopersburg/Southern Lehigh HS)** placed second in the 1,500 meters in 4:54.2 and she was ninth in the 800 meters at 2:30.5. Junior **Erin Boyle (Philadelphia/Nazareth Academy)** was second in the 800 meters at 2:21.0 while junior **Amanda Samok (Palmerton/Palmerton Area HS)** was fifth at 2:26.4. Junior **Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem/Freedom HS)** placed tenth in the 1,500 meters in 5:20.2. Freshman **Christina Scherwin (Denmark)** participated in her first collegiate competition and placed ninth in the 55-meters in 7.6 seconds and just missed provisionally qualifying for the national championships in the shot put with a toss of 12.51 meters. Freshman **Nicole Sabaliauskas (Butler, NJ/Butler HS)** placed seventh in the 55-meter hurdles at 10.1 seconds and she was 11th in the long jump at 4.25 meters.

Senior **Brooke Dancho** (**Bethlehem/Freedom HS**) captured 11th place in the 200 meters in 29.0 seconds and she won the triple jump with a lead of 10.00 meters. Dancho was also second in the long jump at 4.78 meters and ninth in the high jump at four feet, six meters. Senior **Lindsey Forman** (**Sharon, MA/Sharon HS**) placed fourth in the triple jump at 9.61 meters and sixth in the long jump with a leap of 4.65 meters. Sophomore **Brooke Dawson** (**Emmaus/Emmaus HS**) was eighth in the high jump, clearing four feet, eight inches.

Junior Josh Heebner (Lansdale/North Penn HS) won the 400 meters in 51.2 second and he was part of the third place 4x400-meter relay team with a time of 3:30.0 for the Greyhounds as the team competed at the Haverford Open last weekend. Joining Heebner on the 4x400-meter relay team were junior Kevin Bush (Stroudsburg/Stroudsburg HS), sophomore George Wacker (Honesdale/Honesdale HS) and freshman Steve Hartenstine (Danielsville/Northampton HS). Bush was fifth in the 55 meters at 6.6 seconds while Wacker placed third in the 800-meters with a time of 2:00.7. Hartenstine placed third in the 55-meter hurdles in 8.2 seconds and he was tenth in the 55 meters at 6.7 seconds. Senior Damon Rutherford (Reading/Exeter HS) placed 14th in the 1,500 meters at 4:12.9.

In the field events, senior **Anthony Rediger** (**Sellersville/Pennridge HS**) won the triple jump with a leap of 12.63 meters and he was fifth in the long jump at 5.89 meters. Rediger also had a sixth place showing in the high jump at five feet, ten inches. Freshman **Joe Moore** (**Andover, NJ/Newtown HS**) was third in the long jump at 5.99 meters and freshman **Anthony Merz** (**Philadelphia/Archbishop Ryan HS**) placed fourth in the long jump at 5.96 meters. Freshman **Taylor Guerin** (**Coopersburg/Southern Lehigh HS**) rounded out the Greyhound top ten finishers with a fourth place in the shot put with a toss of 12.50 meters.
