Women's Basketball – 8-10 (Commonwealth Conference 3-6, MAC 4-7)

The Greyhounds came back from a six-point deficit with 8:19 to play to earn a 71-65 victory over Widener University in Commonwealth Conference action and give head coach **Mary Beth Spirk** the 250th win of her career. Moravian had most of its offense from three players with sophomores guard **Tara Wozniak (Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS)** and forward **Kelly McLean (Allentown/Salisbury HS)** each scoring 21 points and freshman guard **Kim Hughes (Point Pleasant, NJ/St. Rose HS)** tossing in 20 points. McLean led the Greyhounds with eight rebounds while freshmen forwards **Sue Creelman (Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS)** and **Tracie Shipman (Philadelphia/Archbishop Ryan HS)** each had seven boards. Creelman added six points off the bench. The Greyhounds were up by one point at the half, 37-36, but were out-rebounded in the game, 44-38.

Moravian continued to stay hot in the month of January as they defeated Drew University, 70-47, for the squad's sixth win in nine games this month. McLean led a balanced attack with a game high 15 points. Hughes added ten points while Wozniak was held nine points under her average to six points in the contest, however, Wozniak only played 15 minutes in the game with Moravian ahead 34-23 at the half. The Greyhounds used 13 players in the contest with 12 of them scoring at least two points. Creelman added seven points while Shipman led the team with seven rebounds. McLean added six rebounds as Moravian won the battle of the boards, 36-22. The Greyhounds had their best shooting day of the season, connecting on 56 percent of their shots while having just 43 attempts. Moravian was 12 of 18 from the floor in the second half.

Moravian trailed Juniata College by just one point, 36-35, at halftime after having a ten-point lead in a Commonwealth Conference but the Greyhounds couldn't stop the hot-shooting Eagles in the second half as Moravian fell 87-76. Juniata was 53 percent from the floor in the second half and 81 percent from the foul line as the two teams combined to take 83 free throws and make 62 (each team made 31 attempts). Hughes paced the Greyhound offense with 24 points including a nine of ten performance from the foul line. Wozniak added 20 points while McLean had a double-double with 14 points and 14 rebounds. Moravian out-rebounded Juniata 44-33 thanks to McLean's 14 boards and eight rebounds apiece from Wozniak and Creelman.

Juniors **Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic/Riverside HS)**, **Kim Jaick (Coopersburg/Southern Lehigh HS)** and **Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown/Lower Dauphin HS)** helped the Greyhounds to an outstanding showing at the mainly NCAA Division I field of the Penn State University National Open, which featured over 1,600 student-athletes from around the country. Wolfsberger won her heat and was eighth overall in the mile with a school record time and NCAA Division III provisional qualifying standard of 4:57.59. Jaick placed 28th overall in the mile with a time of 5:19.42. Shertzer placed 15th overall in the 5,000-meter unseeded race with a time of 18:27.93. Wolfsberger and Jaick teamed with junior **Erin Boyle (Philadelphia/Nazareth Academy HS)** and freshman **Jaime Marks (Macungie/Emmaus HS)** to set a school record and provisionally qualify for the NCAA Division III Championships in the distance medley relay of 12:07.45. The quartet won their heat and placed 8th overall in the race and became the first NCAA Division III team to qualify for the national championships in the event this season.

The 4x800-meter relay team of Boyle, juniors **Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem/Freedom HS)** and **Amanda Samok (Palmerton/Palmerton Area HS)** and sophomore **Jennifer Wagner (Riegelsville/Wilson HS)** placed sixth in the event with a time of 9:37.92.

Men's Basketball – 4-13 (Commonwealth Conference 1-8, MAC 3-9)

The Greyhounds used a balanced scoring attack to snap a two-game losing streak and earn a 93-79 win over Drew University in Middle Atlantic Conference action. Moravian won for the fourth time at home this season and for the first time when the team had shot over 50 percent from the floor. Senior guard **David Jordan (Point Pleasant, NJ/Point Pleasant Boro HS)**, senior forward **Chris Hayn (Whitehall/Whitehall HS)** and sophomore forward **Ken Greb (Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS)** each scored 18 points in the victory and sophomore guard **Kevin Hall (Mountain Top/Pocono Mountain HS)** added 11 points. Greb, who tied his career high with the 18 points, led Moravian on the boards with seven rebounds while Jordan and Hayn each grabbed five boards. Freshman guard **Lucas Malishchak (Wanamie/Nanticoke HS)** added seven points, four assists and two steals in the game.

Despite shooting 51 percent from the floor and having four players score in double figures, the Greyhounds were unable to slow down the top team in the Commonwealth Conference, falling at Widener University, 93-70. Moravian trailed 43-34 at the half after shooting 58 percent in the first half. Jordan had a team best 16 in the contest. Hayn added 15 points while Hall and Greb each had 13 points. Hayn and Greb each grabbed eight rebounds for Moravian.

The Greyhounds had a pair of runs at the end of each half to make a game of it, posting a 15-2 run to take a 36-34 halftime lead and another 15-2 run late in the second half to tie the game at 67-67 with 3:18 to play, before Juniata College's Shane Crandall hit a baseline jumper with six seconds left to give Juniata a 76-75 win in Commonwealth Conference action. Moravian had taken a 75-74 lead with 29 seconds remaining on a driving lay-up by freshman **Jay Leader (Halifax/Halifax HS)**, who scored a career best ten points in the contest. Juniata was hot in the second half, making 57 percent of its shots and 67 percent of its three-pointers. Jordan paced the Moravian offense with 24 points to move within 52 of 1,000 in his career. Hall had 15 points while Greb added ten points and team leading nine rebounds. Jordan also had five rebounds in the loss.

Junior sprinter **Kevin Bush (Stroudsburg/Stroudsburg HS)** was third in his heat and 33rd overall in the 200 meters with a school record time of 22.62 seconds in the mainly NCAA Division I field at the Penn State University National Open last weekend. Bush also finished sixth in his heat of the 60-meter dash and tied for 41st overall with a time of 7.19 seconds. The 4x800-meter relay squad of senior **Damon Rutherford (Reading/Exeter HS)**, junior **Josh Heebner (Lansdale/North Penn HS)**, sophomore **George Wacker (Honesdale/Honesdale HS)** and freshman **Joe Grady (Nanticoke/Nanticoke HS)** placed seventh in the meet at 8:05.46.
