Moravian nearly pulled off an upset as the Greyhounds lost to Susquehanna University, 78-75, in Commonwealth Conference action. Sophomore guard **Tara Wozniak (Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS)** had a chance to send the contest into overtime but her three-pointer at the buzzer bounced off the backboard and rolled around the rim twice before falling out. The miss was **Wozniak's** first behind the three-point line in the game and just her sixth of the game. She scored a career high 30 points and added eight rebounds, three assists and three blocked shots. Sophomore forward **Kelly McLean (Allentown/Salisbury HS)** added 16 points and eight rebounds while freshman guard **Kim Hughes (Point Pleasant, NJ/St. Rose HS)** scored 14 points. Freshman forward **Tracie Shipman (Philadelphia/Archbishop Ryan HS)** led the team with a career high 13 rebounds as the Greyhounds out-rebounded the Crusaders 40-35 in the contest despite Susquehanna's Karyn Kern grabbing her 1,000th career rebound. Moravian's one downfall in the game was its free throw shooting in the first half when the team blew a nine-point lead and was 5 of 11 from the line.

Despite shooting just 48.5 percent from the foul line the Greyhounds were able to snap a two-game losing streak with a 64-47 victory at Wilkes University. **Wozniak** led the Greyhounds with 20 points and **McLean** added 13 points in the win. Moravian was out-rebounded 52-35 despite seven boards from **McLean** and six from **Wozniak**. Sophomore guard **Jennifer Tannous** (**Bethlehem/Liberty HS**) added seven points while **Hughes** was held to two points, 12 under her season average.

Men's Indoor Track & Field 0-0 (Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 0-0)

Senior **Anthony Rediger** (**Sellersville/Pennridge HS**) had a good evening for the Greyhounds with a pair of first place finishes in the 2nd Annual Greyhound Field Challenge. Rediger was first in the high jump, clearing six feet, two inches and he won the triple jump with a distance of 13.08 meters. Rediger also placed second in the long jump at 6.48 meters while freshman **Anthony Merz** (**Philadelphia/Archbishop Ryan HS**) was third in the long jump at 6.36 meters. Sophomore **John Stanko** (**Lansford/Panther Valley HS**) placed third in the triple jump at 12.43 meters while senior **Bill Schmidt** (**Basking Ridge, NJ/Ridge HS**) was fourth in the shot put at 13.24 meters. Freshman **Jason Buckman** (**Easton/Easton HS**) placed fifth in the men's pole vault, clearing 3.30 meters.

The Greyhounds had several top six finishes in the 2nd Annual Dick DeShriver Invitational hosted by East Stroudsburg University of Pennsylvania. The distance medley relay team of freshman **Joe Grady (Nanticoke/Nanticoke HS)**, sophomore **George Wacker (Honesdale/Honesdale HS)**, junior **Josh Heebner (Lansdale/North Penn HS)** and senior **Damon Rutherford (Reading/Exeter HS)** was second in a time of 10:35.86. Heebner placed fourth in the 500 meters in 1:06.47 while Wacker was fifth in the 800 meters at 2:02.93. Junior **Kevin Bush (Stroudsburg/Stroudsburg HS)** was sixth in the 200 meters in 23.23 seconds while **Rediger** placed fourth in the triple jump at 42 feet.

The Greyhounds had their highest point output of the season and handed the Susquehanna University squad its worst loss since the 1967-68 season as Moravian topped the Crusaders, 95-55, in Commonwealth Conference action. Sophomore guard **Kevin Hall (Mountain Top/Pocono Mountain HS)** tied his career high with 21 points to lead all players. Hall was 5 of 9 behind the three-point line and the Greyhounds were 50 percent behind the arc, making 13 of 26 three-point attempts. Three other Greyhounds scored in double figures with sophomore forward **Ken Greb (Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS)** netting 16 points, senior guard **David Jordan (Point Pleasant, NJ/Point Pleasant Boro HS)** scoring 13 points and freshman guard **Steve Weiler (Edgewater Park, NJ/Burlington City HS)** netting 11 points. Jordan led the team with seven rebounds as Moravian out-rebounded Susquehanna 49-36. Freshman guard **Jay Leader (Halifax/Halifax HS)** had six rebounds while senior forward **Chris Hayn (Whitehall/Whitehall HS)** and sophomore guard **Willie Reynolds (Bethlehem/Liberty HS)** each scored eight points in the victory.

For the second straight game, Moravian used a big offensive second half to post a victory as the Greyhounds won their first road game of the season and their first in a year with an 89-81 victory at Delaware Valley College. **Hayn** netted a career best 26 points while **Hall** had a career high 25 points in the contest. **Jordan** chipped in 16 points and freshman guard **Lucas Malishchak (Wanamie/Nanticoke HS)** added ten points and six assists. **Jordan** led Moravian on the boards with nine rebounds while **Hall** grabbed a career best six boards. **Greb** had six points, five rebounds and four assists in the win while **Leader** had four assists. Moravian shot 50 percent for the second straight contest and was 80 percent from the free throw line while Delaware Valley was just 53 percent from the foul line.

Jordan scored 28 points to surpass 1,000 points for his career and the Greyhounds scored 64 points in the second half to defeat the number on team in the nation Wilkes University, 104-96 on Alumni day. Moravian led by 12 points midway through the first half before Wilkes responded to take a 41-40 halftime lead. The Colonels extended their lead to 53-45 before the Greyhounds began to rally in the game. Moravian tied the score at 57-57 on a three-pointer with 12:12 to play. The two teams traded the lead until the four-minute mark when the Greyhounds took the lead for good, 79-77 on a lay-up by Greb. Jordan would get his 1,000th career point on a three-pointer, one of seven in the game, with 2:37 to play, giving Moravian an 85-80 lead. Moravian was 15 of 26 behind the three-point line in the contest with Hall adding four treys with two of over 25 feet. Hall added 24 points in the victory while Greb gad 16 points. Hayn had 12 points for the Greyhounds while Malishchak added 14 points including an 8-for-8 performance from the foul line in the final two minutes of the game. The Greyhounds out-rebounded Wilkes 32-31 behind eight boards from Greb and six from Jordan. Moravian shot over 50 percent for the third game this week (the team was 3-0 and averaged 96 points per game). The Greyhounds were 28 of 55 from the floor (51 percent) and 33 of 42 from the foul line (79 percent). Moravian shot 18 of 20 from the foul line in the final 3:38 of the game as Wilkes was pressing and foul line after falling behind on Greb's lay-up. The 104 points was the first time the Greyhounds had scored 100 since netting 105 points in a win over Western Maryland College on January 6, 1996.

Women's Indoor Track & Field 0-0 (Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 0-0)

Freshman Christina Scherwin (Denmark) had a good first home field meet for the Greyhounds as she provisionally qualified for the NCAA Division III Indoor National Championships in the shot put with a first place toss of 12.96 meters and she also won the long jump at 5.00 meters. Senior Brooke Dancho (Bethlehem/Freedom HS) took third place in the long jump with a leap of 4.79 meters and she was third in the triple jump at 9.97 meters. Junior Sarah Shaneberger (Bethlehem/Southern Lehigh HS) placed third to Scherwin in the shot put at 11.52 meters and she was fourth in the women's weight throw at 12.05 meters. Sophomore Brooke Dawson (Emmaus/Emmaus HS) placed second in the women's high jump at four feet, four inches. Freshman Shannon McNeil (Reading/Reading Central Catholic HS) was sixth in the long jump at 4.39 meters while junior Carrie McCaffery (Lebanon/Annville-Cleona HS) was fifth in the shot put at 10.75 meters.

The Greyhounds had five winners and set four meet records while competing at the 2nd Annual Dick DeShriver Invitational at East Stroudsburg University of Pennsylvania. Junior **Heidi Wolfsberger** (**Moosic/ Riverside HS**) won the 800 meters in a meet record and NCAA Division III provisional qualifying time of 2:15.99. Wolfsberger was also part of the "A" distance medley relay team with junior **Erin Boyle** (**Philadelphia/Nazareth Academy**), freshman **Jaime Marks** (**Macungie/Emmaus HS**) and sophomore **Jennifer Wagner** (**Riegelsville/Wilson HS**) that won the DMR in a meet record time of 12:21.09. Junior **Kim Jaick** (**Coopersburg/Southern Lehigh HS**) captured first in the 1,000 meters in a record time of 3:08.07 and she won the 3,000 meters in another meet record time of 10:23.17.

Junior Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown/Lower Dauphin HS) was third in the mile run at 5:24.48 and she anchored the "B" DMR team with a time of 12:56.18. Joining Shertzer in the relay were juniors Amanda Samok (Palmerton/Palmerton Area HS) and Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem/Freedom HS) and sophomore Ann Corless (Plainsville, CT/Plainsville HS). Moravian had a third DMR team of junior Jen Boberg (Lansford/Panther Valley HS), sophomore Gina Lacombe (Andover CT/Rham HS) and freshmen Robin Edward (Massapequa, NY/Plainedge HS) and Jen Brief (Clark, NJ/Arthur L. Johnson HS) place sixth in 14:52.69.

Shaneberger won the shot put with a toss of 39 feet while **McCaffery** was fourth at 35 feet, nine inches.
