Women's Cross Country 0-0 (MAC Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 0-0) Last Week -1^{st} of 11 teams at Lafayette College Invitational, Easton, PA

This Week – Sat., Sept. 16th at Muhlenberg College Invitational, Allentown, PA

The Moravian women's cross country team captured first of 11 schools at the Lafayette College Invitational last weekend for its second win in two weeks. The Greyhounds defeated six NCAA Division I and three NCAA Division II schools in the 6,000-meter race.

Junior Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown/Lower Dauphin HS) captured first place in the meet and she was one of three Greyhounds in the top ten. Shertzer completed the course in 21:40 followed by classmate Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic/Riverside HS) in second at 22:00. Junior Kim Jaick (Coopersburg/Southern Lehigh HS) took sixth place in 22:16. Moravian had its next two runners in the top 16 with junior Erin Boyle (Philadelphia/Nazareth Academy) placing 15th in 22:36 while senior Hannah Wood (Palm/Upper Perkiomen HS) was 16th at 22:39.

Moravian had six other competitors among the field of 110 runners. Sophomore Jennifer Wagner (Riegelsville/Wilson HS) was 41st in 24:03 while junior Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem/Freedom HS) was 55th at 24:30. Freshman Angie Morgan (Bethlehem/Liberty HS) was 68th in a time of 25:01. Rounding out the Greyhound competitors were junior Amanda Samok (Palmerton/Palmerton Area HS) in 81st at 25:44, freshman Lauren Laviola (Jersey City, NJ/St. Dominic Academy) at 85th with a time of 26:16, and sophomore Gina Lacombe (Andover, CT/Rham HS) at 96th in 27:10.

The women's soccer team won all three of its matches last week including a pair at the Beaver College Tournament to win first place. Two of the three Greyhound wins were by shutout.

In a 4-0 victory over Alvernia College, senior forward Lindsey Forman (Sharon, MA/Sharon HS) scored a pair of goals and an assist while senior midfielder Becky Matijasich (Alpharetta, GA/Wilson West Lawn {PA} HS) had a goal and an assist. Freshman Justin Bria (Warminster/William Tennent HS) scored a goal in the match and senior midfielder Marisa Confuorto (Neshanic Station, NJ/Hillsborough HS) added one assist. Senior goalie Becky Roe (Worcester, NY/Worcester Central HS) made one save in 65 minutes while freshman Kelly Wakeman (Easton) did not make a save in 25 minutes.

Freshman defender Jackie Buschta (Whitehall/Allentown Central Catholic HS) scored Moravian's lone goal in a 1-0 victory over Catholic University. Confuorto had the assist while sophomore Neali Miller (Wyomissing/Wilson West Lawn HS) had two saves for the shutout. Moravian won the Beaver College Tournament 2-1 in two overtimes against host Beaver College on Confuorto's first goal of the season 22 seconds in to the second overtime. Sophomore Erin Glynn (Bernardsville, NJ/Bernards HS) netted her first career goal with 2:15 left in regulation to tie the match. Roe made two saves in the contest for her second win. Moravian out shot its opponents 70-11 in the two matches.

Sophomore quarterback Charlie Bowden (Parlin, NJ/Sayreville War Memorial HS) completed 11 of 20 passes for 136 yards and led all four scoring drives as Moravian opened the 2000 season with a 19-10 victory at Delaware Valley College. The season opening victory for the Greyhounds was their first since defeating King's College to begin the 1996 season. Bowden, who rotated at quarterback with senior Jed Moyer (Dresher/Upper Dublin HS), led the Greyhounds to a 3-0 lead with 3:56 remaining in the second quarter. Junior Marc Roesch (Egg Harbor City, NJ/St, Augustine HS) connected on a 28-vard field goal after Bowden took Moravian 29 yards in nine plays to set up the kick. Mover completed five of eight passes for 67 yards.

After falling behind 7-3 with 33 seconds to play, Moravian started at its own 38-yard line with 27 seconds remaining. On the first play of the drive, Bowden hit sophomore wide receiver Jarod Rhinehart (Washington, NJ/Warren Hills Regional HS) for a 22-yard completion. After a timeout, Bowden connected with junior wideout Michael Abbate (South Plainfield, NJ/Bishop Ahr HS) for an 11-yard gain out of bounds. Bowden then connected with Rhinehart again for a 26-yard completion to the Delaware Valley threeyard line. The Greyhounds used another timeout to stop the clock with four seconds before the half. Bowden flipped the ball to Abbate on an option play after the timeout to give the Greyhounds a 9-7 halftime lead.

After the Aggies scored a field goal with 11:36 remaining in the third quarter, Bowden led the Greyhounds to ten points in the final stanza. The Greyhounds took the lead for good 26 seconds into the fourth quarter as sophomore Josh Fick (Emmaus/Emmaus HS) took a Bowden handoff 40 yards up the middle for a touchdown. Roesch's extra-point put Moravian up 16-10. Fick finished the day with 58 yards on nine carries. Moravian's final score came with 6:40 left on a 33-yard field goal by Roesch.

On defense for the Greyhounds, sophomore linebacker Bill Engler (Coopersburg/ Southern Lehigh HS) had 10 tackles with two for loss and half a sack. Senior linebacker J.D. Rhinehart (Washington/Warren Hills Regional HS) had 12 tackles with one and a half sacks, a forced fumble and three tackles for loss. Sophomore safety Jarrod Pence (Livingston, NJ/Livingston HS) had a pair of interceptions and six tackles while junior safety Mike Wukitsch (Allentown/ Allentown Central Catholic HS) had one interception, three pass break-ups and five tackles. Junior defensive lineman John Kwiatkowski (Whitehall/Whitehall HS) and sophomore defensive lineman Tom Blackledge (Sellersville/Pennridge HS) each had one sack in the game.

The women's volleyball team won four of five matches last week including a trio of wins at the Gettysburg Battlefield Classic. In a 3-0 win over Allentown College, senior middle hitter Becky Falk (Allentown/Dieruff HS) had 16 kills while freshman outside hitter Shannon McNeil (Reading/Reading Central Catholic HS) had 10 kills in 10 digs. Freshman setter Amy Lawrence (Gettysburg/Delone Catholic HS) had 22 assists while freshman setter Andrea Frankenfield (Emmaus/Emmaus HS). Junior outside hitter Krystol Kessack (Bethlehem/Liberty HS) had 13 digs and freshman outside hitter Kim Zipf (Wyomissing/Holy Name HS) added nine kills and ten digs.

On the first day of the Gettysburg Battlefield Classic, the Greyhounds won their pool with a 3-1 victory over Salisbury State University and a 3-0 victory over Villa Julie College. Zipf, who was named to the All-Tournament Team, had 21 kills and 11 digs against Salisbury State while Lawrence had 27 assists. Frankenfield contributed 19 assists and five digs while Falk had ten kills and senior middle hitter **Sara Young** (**Tunkhannock/Tunkhannock HS**) had nine kills. Falk led Moravian with eight kills against Villa Julie while Zipf had seven kills. Freshman outside hitter **Mary Kate Cordisco (Bethlehem/Notre Dame HS)** had six kills and three digs.

Moravian's only loss in the tournament was a 3-0 loss to Wheaton College to open the second day of the tournament. Zipf had 11 kills in the match while Lawrence made 15 assists and Frankenfield had ten assists. Freshman defensive specialist **Alissa Bucsi (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** had seven digs. In a 3-1 victory over Western Maryland College, Zipf made 13 kills while McNeil, Falk and Young had ten kills. Senior defensive specialist **Emily Shonk (Ligonier/Ligonier HS)** had eight digs.
