Football – 3-1 (Commonwealth Conference 2-1, MAC 3-1)

Last Week – Lost to *Widener, 46-20. *Commonwealth game

This Week – Sat., Oct. 7th at #King's College, 1:30 p.m. #MAC Game

The Greyhounds suffered their first loss of the 2000 season in a 46-20 defeat to Widener University in Middle Atlantic Conference Commonwealth action. Moravian falls to 3-1 overall and 2-1 in the MAC Commonwealth with the loss.

Trailing 21-0, Moravian would strike on a five-yard pass from sophomore quarterback Charlie Bowden (Parlin, NJ/Sayreville War Memorial HS) to freshman tailback Tim Barlok (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS). Freshman Josh Miller (Boyertown/Boyertown HS) made the extra-point to cut the score to 21-7. Bowden completed 24 of 38 passes for 343 yards, a career best, and three touchdowns. Barlok led Moravian on the ground with 27 yards in nine carries. Senior running back P.J. Jankowicz (Belle Mead, NJ/Hillsborough HS) had 12 yards on five carries to move within 74 of 2,000 yards in his career.

Moravian, trailing 34-7, would make a game of it with a pair of touchdown passes from Bowden to junior wide receiver **Michael Abbate** (**South Plainfield, NJ/Bishop Ahr HS**). The first pass covered 21 yards and was followed by a Miller kick while the second score was from 41 yards and the extra-point failed, making the score 34-20 Widener with 7:24 to play in the fourth quarter. Abbate had seven receptions for 188 yards on the day, the third highest single game-receiving total in Moravian history. Freshman wide receiver **Kevin Miltenberger** (**Carlisle/Carlisle HS**) grabbed six passes for 56 yards while sophomore wide receiver **Jarod Rhinehart** (**Washington, NJ/Warren Hills Regional HS**) had six catches for 43 yards.

Sophomore linebacker John Cupples (Allentown/Allentown Central Catholic HS) had 13 tackles in the game for Moravian. Sophomore safety Jarrod Pence (Livingston, NJ/Livingston HS) had one interception for the Greyhounds, his fourth of the season, and 11 tackles while junior safety Mike Wukitsch (Allentown/Allentown Central Catholic HS) also had one interception to give the Greyhounds 11 interceptions in four games this fall. Sophomore cornerback Nate Pogue (Bethlehem/Liberty HS) made nine tackles in the game.

Women's Soccer – 10-2 (Commonwealth Conference 3-1, MAC 4-1)

The women's soccer team won two matches last week, one by forfeit over Centenary College and a 3-1 win over Susquehanna University in Commonwealth Conference action.

Senior forward Lindsey Forman (Sharon, MA/Sharon HS) scored a goal in the 62nd minute off a pass from senior midfielder Marisa Confuorto (Neshanic Station, NJ/Hillsborough HS) to give Moravian a 2-1 lead in the victory over Susquehanna. Moravian would tie the match in the 35th minute on a goal by senior forward Becky Matijasich (Alpharetta, GA/Wilson West Lawn {PA} HS). Forman's goal put Moravian ahead for good and junior midfielder Stevie Ochse (Bethlehem/Saucon Valley HS) sealed the match with an unassisted goal in the 84th minute. Moravian used two goalies in the game with sophomore Neali Miller (Wyomissing/Wilson West Lawn HS) playing the first half with two saves and senior Becky Roe (Worcester, NY/Worcester Central HS) making one save in the second half.

Senior middle hitter Becky Falk (Allentown/Dieruff HS) had 10 kills and six blocks while junior outside hitter Sara Walkiewicz (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS) added six kills and seven digs to lead the Greyhounds to a 15-9, 15-2, 15-10 victory over Albright College in Commonwealth Conference action. Senior middle hitter Sara Young (Tunkhannock/Tunkhannock HS) added four kills and 11 blocks while freshman setter Amy Lawrence (Gettysburg/Delone Catholic HS) had 16 assists and three service aces. Freshman setter Andrea Frankenfield (Emmaus/Emmaus HS) also had ten assists in the match.

Freshman outside hitter **Kim Zipf (Wyomissing/Holy Name HS)** had nine kills and nine digs to lead the Greyhounds to a 15-7, 15-10, 15-11 victory over the University of Scranton in Middle Atlantic Conference action. Falk added seven kills while Lawrence had 16 assists and four service aces. Freshman right side hitter **Shannon McNeil (Reading/Reading Central Catholic HS)** added six kills and three blocks while junior outside hitter **Krystol Kessack (Bethlehem/Liberty HS)** had 14 digs and three service aces. Young made six kills for the Greyhounds in the win.

Zipf led Moravian with 14 kills and 21 digs in a 9-15, 4-15, 15-12, 7-15 loss to NCAA Division II Kutztown University. Falk added 13 kills and six blocks while Young had 12 kills. Lawrence made added 36 assists and 11 digs while freshman outside hitter **Mary Kate Cordisco (Bethlehem/Notre Dame HS)** had nine kills.

The Moravian versus the University of Scranton tennis match was suspended after the doubles matches due to rain. Scranton was leading 2-1 at the time. The match has yet to be rescheduled.

Juniors Corinne Kleinsmith (Shillington/Governor Mifflin HS) and Lacey Leverberg (East Stroudsburg/Stroudsburg HS) and sophomores Jen Genevese (Whitehall/Whitehall HS) and Jill Simms (Hampton, NJ/Voorhees HS) each earned singles and doubles wins to lift Moravian to 7-2 victory over Elizabethtown College in MAC Commonwealth action. Junior Katie Copf (Allentown/Salisbury HS) also had a singles victory for the Greyhounds while classmate Julie Simms (Hampton, NJ/Voorhees HS) teamed with her sister Jill for a doubles win.

Messiah College handed Moravian squad their first loss in MAC Commonwealth action in over three years with a 7-2 victory. Moravian's last MAC Commonwealth loss was on September 13, 1997 to Juniata College, 5-4. Winning in the match for the Greyhounds were sophomore **Missy Graeff (Reading/Schuylkill Valley HS)** in singles action and Kleinsmith and Genevese in double play.

Senior forward Van Pham (Reading/Reading HS) and freshman midfielder Anthony Merz (Philadelphia/Archbishop Ryan HS) each had a goal and an assist to lead Moravian to a 4-0 non-conference win over Alvernia College. Pham headed home the first goal of the match in the sixth minute off a pass from Merz and the two traded places in the 53rd minute when Merz scored the goal. Sophomore Wilson Gonzalez (Bethlehem/Liberty HS) tallied a goal for the Greyhounds in the 57th minute off a pass from senior defender Kevin Byrne (Spring Lake, NJ/Manasquan HS). Junior midfielder Paul Melniczek (Philadelphia/Roman Catholic HS) scored Moravian's final goal on a direct kick in the 73rd minute. Moravian sophomore goalie Ryan Sculley (Bethlehem/Northampton HS) made 11 saves for his second straight shutout.

Pham scored a pair of goals to help Moravian to a 5-1 victory over the University of Scranton in Middle Atlantic Conference action. Pham tallied the first goal of the match in the 18th minute when he headed home a corner kick from junior midfielder Evan Weller (Sinking Spring/Wilson West Lawn HS). The Greyhounds extended the lead to 2-0 in the 19th minute on a goal by junior midfielder Rich Tate (Warrington/LaSalle College HS) from senior defender Andrew Grezlak (Doylestown/Central Bucks East HS). Pham would score again on another header in the 23rd minute off a cross from freshman midfielder Brian Donofrio (Havertown/Archbishop Carroll HS). Junior midfielder Scott Heydt (Boyertown/Boyertown HS) booted home Moravian's fourth goal of the first half in the 39th minute off a pass from junior midfielder Nick Jordal (Doylestown/LaSalle College HS). Freshman Dan Shane (Allentown/Parkland HS) would finish the scoring with an unassisted goal in the 76th minute after Scranton had scored its only tally in the 57th minute. Sculley made 11 saves for his third straight victory in net for the Greyhounds.

Grezlak had two first half goals, the first two goals of his career, to help the Greyhounds to a 5-0 halftime lead and a 6-2 victory over Susquehanna University in Commonwealth Conference action. Moravian has now won six straight matches after starting the season 0-4. Pham started the scoring in the fourth minute off a pass from Gonzalez. Grezlak scored his first goal in the 8th minute from Tate. Grezlak's second goal was in the 20th minute and was unassisted. Senior defender **Matt Kling (Chatham, NJ/Oratory Prep HS)** extended the Greyhounds lead to 4-0 in the 23rd minute when he made a penalty kick and Melniczek ended the scoring in the first half with a goal in the 36th minute off a pass from freshman midfielder **Mike Grillo (Pennington, NJ/The Pennington School)**. The Greyhounds final goal of the match was an own goal by Susquehanna. Sculley played 70 minutes with seven saves while freshman **Greg Bechtel (Reading/Exeter HS)** made two saves in the final 20 minutes.

The Greyhounds dropped a pair of Commonwealth Conference matches last week to fall to 3-7 on the season. Senior forward **Brooke Dancho (Bethlehem/Freedom HS)** scored with 3:07 remaining in regulation off a pass from junior midfielder **Elissa Gerstel (Warminster/William Tennent HS)** to tie the match but Moravian allowed an overtime goal in a 2-1 loss to Albright College in Commonwealth Conference action. Junior goalie **Kristie Cupples (Allentown/Salisbury HS)** had 25 saves for the Greyhounds. Moravian was out shot 27-9 in the match. The Greyhounds were shutout 6-0 by the number one team in the country, Lebanon Valley College, in Commonwealth Conference action. Cupples had nine saves in one half while sophomore **Mary Peterson (Winston-Salem, NC/Salem Academy)** made two saves in the second half.
