**Football – 3-2 (Commonwealth Conference 2-1, MAC 3-2)**

*Last Week – Lost to #King’s, 17-14. #MAC game*

**This Week – Sat., Oct. 14<sup>th</sup> vs. \*Juniata College (Homecoming), 1:00 p.m. \*Commonwealth Game**

The Greyhounds lost to King’s College, 17-14, on a field goal with 4:38 left in the fourth quarter. Moravian did hold the Monarchs’ and MAC rushing leader senior Damon Saxon to 107 yards on 28 carries, 81 yards below his season average. Moravian jumped out to a 7-0 lead with 8:22 remaining in the first quarter on a one-yard touchdown run by senior running back **P.J. Jankowicz (Belle Mead, NJ/Hillsborough HS)**. Freshman **Josh Miller (Boyertown/Boyertown HS)** made the extra-point. Jankowicz led Moravian on the ground with 41 yards on 12 carries and now needs just 33 yards to become the seventh player in Greyhound history to run for 2,000 yards in a career. The Monarchs would take a 14-7 lead with 1:41 to play in the third quarter before the Greyhounds scored again.

The Greyhounds got a break early in the fourth quarter when junior defensive back **Jim McIntyre (Hackettstown/Hackettstown HS)** blocked a punt and Moravian took over on the King’s 45-yard line. Moravian drove down to the 23-yard line where the offense faced a fourth-and-12. For the fourth time this season, the Greyhounds connected for a touchdown on the fourth down play as sophomore quarterback **Charlie Bowden (Parlin, NJ/Sayreville/War Memorial HS)** hit freshman wide receiver **Kevin Miltenberger (Carlisle/Carlisle HS)** for a 23-yard touchdown. Miller’s extra-point tied the game at 14:14 with 8:40 to play in regulation.

Bowden completed 14 of 30 passes for 184 yards but he was intercepted twice and sacked six times. Bowden also fumbled three times, losing one. Sophomore wide receiver **Jarod Rhinehart (Washington, NJ/Warren Hills Regional HS)** grabbed six passes for 82 yards in the game. Moravian had two chances to drive down the field and win the game but one ended in a punt and the other by a sack of Bowden. Senior defensive tackle **Dustin Collier (Easton/Freedom HS)** led the Moravian defense with 14 tackles and two pass break-ups while freshman safety **John Panikiewsky (Carteret, NJ/Carteret HS)** had 12 tackles and a pair of pass break-ups in his first collegiate start.

**Women’s Soccer – 10-3 (Commonwealth Conference 3-1, MAC 4-2)**

Senior forward **Becky Matijasich (Alpharetta, GA/Wilson West Lawn {PA} HS)** scored the first goal of the match but the University of Scranton rebounded for two goals and a 2-1 victory in the Middle Atlantic Conference match. The contest, the only one of the week for Moravian, also matched two of the top ten teams in the NCAA Division III Mid-Atlantic Region with Scranton ranked ninth and the Greyhounds in tenth. Senior goalie **Becky Roe (Worcester, NY/Worcester Central HS)** made six saves in the loss.

**Men’s Cross Country – 0-0 (Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 0-0)**

Running without top runner, senior **Damon Rutherford (Reading/Exeter HS)**, the Greyhounds placed 14th of 39 schools at the Dickinson Invitational. Freshman **Joe Grady (Nanticoke/Nanticoke HS)** led the Greyhounds with a 34th place finish in 27:24.0 over the 8,000-meter course. Sophomore **Wes Zimmerman (Boyertown/Boyertown HS)** placed second for Moravian in the 268-runner meet with a 38th place finish in 27:29.2. Rounding out the Greyhounds top five were sophomore **George Wacker (Honesdale/Honesdale HS)** in 119th at 28:47.8, freshman **Sean McDonnell (Scranton/Scranton Prep)** in 124th at 28:53.0 and junior **Chris DeWalt (Easton/Easton HS)** at 128th with a time of 28:55.0. Moravian’s other competitors in the meet were freshman **Will Gayeski (Neshanic Station, NJ/Hillsborough HS)** placing 162nd in 29:33.3 and sophomore **Justin Arnold (Basking Ridge, NJ/Ridge HS)** taking 187th in 30:10.9.

Freshman outside hitter **Kim Zipf (Wyomissing/Holy Name HS)** had 15 kills and 19 digs to lead Moravian to a 6-15, 15-12, 15-12, 11-15, 15-9 victory over Lycoming College. Senior middle hitter **Becky Falk (Allentown/Dieruff HS)** and freshman right side hitter **Sara Hollenbacher (Reading/Reading Central Catholic HS)** each had 13 kills while senior middle hitter **Sara Young (Tunkhannock/Tunkhannock HS)** had 11 kills and five blocks. Freshman setter **Amy Lawrence (Gettysburg/Delone Catholic HS)** added 36 assists and 17 digs in the win for Moravian. Freshman setter **Andrea Frankenfield (Emmaus/Emmaus HS)** had 20 assists and 17 digs while freshman outside hitter **Shannon McNeil (Reading/Reading Central Catholic HS)** had ten kills and eight digs.

Zipf had six kills and 11 digs to lead Moravian in a 15-3, 15-11, 15-5 loss to #4 Juniata College in Commonwealth Conference action. The loss snapped the Greyhounds 18-match home winning streak. Lawrence had 13 assists and three service aces in the match while Frankenfield had four service aces. Moravian scored ten of its 19 points in the match on service aces. Junior right side hitter **Sara Walkiewicz (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** had four kills and seven digs while Falk had four kills.

The Moravian women's tennis team had a pair of matches postponed last week and the squad won two Middle Atlantic Conference Commonwealth matches to earn its seventh straight berth in the MAC playoffs. The Greyhounds earned a 9-0 victory over Juniata College in MAC Commonwealth action. Juniors **Corinne Kleinsmith (Shillington/Governor Mifflin HS)**, **Lacey Leverberg (East Stroudsburg/Stroudsburg HS)** and **Katie Copf (Allentown/Salisbury HS)** each earned singles and doubles wins in the match as did sophomores **Jen Genevese (Whitehall/Whitehall HS)** and **Christie Sieger (Emmaus/Emmaus HS)**. Sophomore **Missy Graeff (Reading/Schuylkill Valley HS)** won in singles while senior **Courtney Rice (Nazareth/Nazareth HS)** won in doubles action.

With five wins in singles action and a sweep in doubles play, Moravian earned its seventh straight berth to the Middle Atlantic Conference playoffs with an 8-1 victory over Lebanon Valley College in MAC Commonwealth action. The victory also guarantees the Greyhounds at least a second place tie with Juniata College and Moravian owns the tiebreaker. Winning in singles for the Greyhounds were Copf, Leverberg, Genevese, Sieger and Graeff. Genevese and Kleinsmith earned a doubles win as did Sieger and Leverberg and the sister duo of sophomore **Jill** and junior **Julie Simms (Hampton, NJ/Voorhees HS)**.

For the fourth time in five meets this fall, Moravian, currently ranked eighth in the nation, won the team race, finishing first at the 39-team Dickinson Invitational Saturday. Junior **Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic/Riverside HS)** placed fourth in the race in a time of 18:38.2 for the Greyhounds while junior **Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown/Lower Dauphin HS)** was sixth in 18:49.1 and junior **Kim Jaick (Coopersburg/Southern Lehigh HS)** was tenth in 19:04.1. Junior **Erin Boyle (Philadelphia/Nazareth Academy)** placed 16th in 19:15.8 while senior **Hannah Wood (Palm/Upper Perkiomen HS)** rounded out the Greyhounds top five in 38th place at 19:54.1. Freshman **Jamie Marks (Macungie/Emmaus HS)** was 54th in 20:16.5 and sophomore **Jen Wagner (Riegelsville/Wilson HS)** placed 62nd in 20:28.3 to round out the Greyhound runners in the 281-competitor race.

The Greyhounds were on the losing end of the score both times last week, falling to Allentown College, 1-0, in Middle Atlantic Conference action despite out shooting the Centaurs, 19-17. Sophomore goalie **Ryan Sculley (Bethlehem/Northampton HS)** made 13 saves in the match.

The Greyhounds dropped a 4-3 Middle Atlantic Conference match to Drew University. Moravian, which trailed 3-0 at halftime, pulled within one goal early in the second half with goals by freshman midfielder **Brian Donofrio (Havertown/Archbishop Carroll HS)** assisted by freshman midfielder **Tim Shannon (Leesport/Schuylkill Valley HS)** and junior midfielder **Evan Weller (Sinking Spring/Wilson West Lawn HS)** assisted by freshman defender **Dan Shane (Allentown/Parkland HS)**. After the Rangers took a 4-2 lead, Weller tallied a second goal off an assist from junior midfielder **Scott Heydt (Boyertown/Boyertown HS)** with just less than four minutes left in the match. Sculley had five saves in the match.

The Greyhounds dropped all three matches last week. Against Marywood University, junior midfielder **Suzy Wargo (Somerville, NJ/Hillsborough HS)** scored off a pass from freshman midfielder **Kate Hunter (Stillwater, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS)** with 11:10 to play in the first half and junior forward **Elissa Gerstel (Warminster/William Tennent HS)** gave the Greyhounds the lead in the match with five and a half minutes remaining until the half on a pass from senior forward **Brooke Dancho (Bethlehem/Freedom HS)** but Moravian couldn't hold a 2-1 lead in a 3-2 loss. Junior goalie **Kristie Cupples (Allentown/Salisbury HS)** had two saves in the match.

Gerstel scored a first half goal to tie the match but the Greyhounds ended up losing to nationally ranked Elizabethtown College, 4-1, in Commonwealth Conference action. Senior forward **Chelsea Roberts (Philadelphia/St. Basil Academy)** assisted on Gerstel's ninth goal of the season while Cupples had 17 saves in the match. Wargo scored a second half goal but the Greyhounds fell to Montclair State University, 4-1, in non-conference action. Cupples had 13 saves in the first half while sophomore keeper **Mary Peterson (Winston-Salem, NC/Salem Academy)** made four saves in the second half.
