Season Complete

Moravian fell to longtime rival Muhlenberg College, 45-20 to close out the season on the 100th anniversary of the first two meetings between the two schools. The Greyhounds finish the 2000 campaign at 6-4, a large improvement over the 2-8 campaign of 1999. Moravian leads the series at 30-18-1.

Muhlenberg would score twice in the first quarter to take a 14-0 lead before the Greyhounds would get on the scoreboard. Moravian would cut the lead to 14-6 early in the second stanza when sophomore wide receiver **Josh Fick (Emmaus/Emmaus HS)** took a handoff and ran three yards for a touchdown. The extra-point failed and Moravian trailed 14-6. Fick also grabbed three passes for 62 yards.

The Mules would extend the lead right back to 21-6 before the Hounds had the ball again. Moravian would score on its next drive as well on a 14 yard pass from sophomore quarterback **Charlie Bowden (Parlin, NJ/Sayreville War Memorial HS)** to sophomore wide receiver **Jarod Rhinehart (Washington, NJ/Warren Hills Regional HS)** but the two-point conversion failed to set the score at 21-12. Bowden, Moravian's MVP in the game, completed 16 of 32 passes for 250 yards to give him 2,237 on the year, the third best single season in Moravian history. However, Bowden was intercepted twice in the game. Rhinehart had four receptions for 39 yards with the touchdown his first of the year after five scores as a freshman.

Muhlenberg would need exactly 13 seconds to pad its lead as Joshua Carter received the kickoff at the ten yard line and ran up the middle of the field 90 yards for a touchdown. The score gave the Mules a 28-12 halftime lead.

The Greyhounds would be the only team to score in the third quarter as freshman tailback **Tim Barlok (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** scampered up the middle 36 yards for the touchdown. A Bowden pass to Rhinehart for two points put Moravian down by eight points, 28-20 with 4:02 left in the third quarter. Barlok led the Moravian ground game with 75 yards on 12 carries and he also had 50 yards on three receptions.

Senior running back **P.J. Jankowicz (Belle Mead, NJ/Hillsborough HS)** ran for 38 yards on seven attempts to complete his collegiate career with 2,103 yards, the sixth highest total in school history, on 587 carries, the second best total in school history.

Muhlenberg would finish out the scoring in the fourth quarter with 17 points. Senior linebacker **J.D. Rhinehart (Washington, NJ/Warren Hills Regional HS)** paced the Greyhounds with 13 tackles, one interception and two pass break-ups. Sophomore linebacker **John Cupples (Allentown/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** had 11 tackles in the game with one for loss. Senior cornerback **Doug Joseph (Allentown/ Parkland HS)** and sophomore cornerback **Nate Pogue (Bethlehem/Liberty HS)** each made interceptions in the contest.

Junior **Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic/Riverside HS)** placed first of 237 runners in a time of 18:17.00 to lead the Moravian College women's cross country team to a first place finish at the NCAA Division III Mideast Regional at Dickinson College Saturday.

Moravian, which has won all but one race this season, qualifies for the NCAA Division III Championships in Spokane, WA, on Saturday, November 18th with the win. The regional championship was the first for the Moravian team since 1993, the Greyhounds first of now eight consecutive appearances in the NCAA Division III National Championships, and Wolfsberger is the first Moravian individual to win the race since **Tracy Wartman** won in 1994.

Wolfsberger, who won her second straight Middle Atlantic Conference Championship two weeks ago, wasn't Moravian's only top ten finisher with junior **Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown/Lower Dauphin HS)** placing fourth in 18:40.60, junior **Kim Jaick (Coopersburg/Southern Lehigh HS)** in sixth at 18:48.20 and junior **Erin Boyle (Philadelphia/Nazareth Academy)** finishing tenth in 19:01.40. All four runners earned All-Region status for finishing in the top 35. Freshman **Ashley Kimmel (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** was Moravian's fifth runner, placing 36th in 20:09.40 while sophomore **Jen Wagner (Riegelsville/Wilson HS)** placed 51st in 20:33.00. Senior **Hannah Wood (Palm/Upper Perkiomen HS)** rounded out the Moravian squad with a 63rd place finish in 20:43.00.

Sophomore **Wes Zimmerman (Boyertown/Boyertown HS)** placed 30th of 245 runners to lead the men's cross country team to a seventh place team finish at the 2000 NCAA Division III Mideast Regional. Zimmerman ran the 8,000-meter course in 27:30.70 and he was followed by freshman **Joe Grady (Nanticoke/Nanticoke HS)** in 34th place at 27:35.00. The duo earns All-Region accolades for finishing in the top 35 of the race.

Sophomore **George Wacker (Honesdale/Honesdale HS)** just missed All-Region honors with a 36th place finish in 27:45.00. Senior **Damon Rutherford (Reading/Exeter HS)** closed out his career with a 71st place finish in 28:31.60 and junior **Chris DeWalt (Easton/Easton HS)** placed 96th in 29:02.00. Rounding out the Greyhound squad was freshman **Sean McDonnell (Scranton/Scranton Prep)** in 124th at 29:30.20 and sophomore **Matt Plewinski (Hatfield/North Penn HS)** in 138th position at 29:54.30.
