Women's Basketball – 8-3 (Commonwealth Conference 2-0, MAC 4-1)

The Greyhounds opened the 2002 Moravian New Year's Tip-Off Tournament with a 77-64 victory over Ursinus College. Moravian played the Bears since North Carolina Wesleyan College was delayed leaving North Carolina due to heavy snow. Junior guard **Tara Wozniak** (**Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS**) led the Greyhounds with 19 points and eight rebounds in the game while junior forward **Kelly McLean** (**Allentown, PA/Salisbury HS**) had 17 points and seven boards. Sophomore guard Kim Hughes contributed ten points while junior forward **Kristen Sarnocinski** (**Harleysville, PA/Germantown Academy**) had seven rebounds. Freshman guard **Jen Behagg** (**Hamburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS**) dished out a career best six assists in the game while scoring five points. Moravian shot 54.5 percent from the floor in the game and held a 47-29 advantage on the boards.

Moravian earned its sixth straight win overall and second of the Moravian New Year's Tip-Off Tournament with a 62-44 victory over North Carolina Wesleyan College. The Greyhounds placed second in the tournament as The College of New Jersey gave up fewer points in its two games while also going 2-0. The Battling Bishops came out hot in the game and held a 21-10 lead with 10:10 left in the first half before Moravian went on a 15-2 run to finish the half. Moravian didn't let up in the second half and only let North Carolina Wesleyan get within two points early in the half before pulling away for the 18-point victory. **McLean**, who was named to the All-Tournament Team, led the Greyhounds with 15 points and seven rebounds while **Wozniak**, a member of the All-Tournament Team, added 14 points as the only other Moravian player in double figures. Sophomore forward **Tracie Shipman** (**Philadelphia**, **PA/Archbishop Ryan HS**) added nine points and six rebounds while **Sarnocinski** contributed nine points, with two three-pointers in the second half to help Moravian pull away, and four rebounds.

Moravian dropped its second straight decision and its first of the new year in the first round of the 24th Annual Greyhound Rock Classic with a 73-65 loss to Dickinson College. For the first time since 1992, the Greyhounds did not in the championship game of their own tournament. In the game, the Greyhounds trailed most of the way, taking their first of two one-point leads in the game at 51-50 with 8:17 to play in the second half. Freshman forward **Brandon Zaleski** (**Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS**) led the Greyhounds with 15 points and nine rebounds while sophomore guard **Steve Weiler (Edgewater Park, NJ/Burlington City HS**) had 13 points, all in the second half, before fouling out. Junior guard **Kevin Hall (Mount Pocono, PA/Pocono Mountain HS**) scored ten points off the bench in his first action of the season due to an injury. Senior guard **Doug Spadt (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS**) contributed nine points while freshman forward **Mike Howell (Floral Park, NY/Holy Cross HS**) had five rebounds.

The Greyhounds won the consolation game of the 24th Annual Greyhound Rock Classic with an 85-69 victory over Salisbury (MD) University. **Zaleski**, who was named to the All-Tournament Team, led all scorers in the game with 29 points and he added a team high eight rebounds in the win. **Weiler** chipped in 20 points for the Greyhounds while senior forward **Mike Frew** (**Glen Ridge**, **NJ/Glen Ridge HS**) had ten points. Sophomore guard **Lucas Malishchak** (**Wanamie**, **PA/Nanticoke HS**) ran the Greyhound offense with seven assists and he had four steals.
