### Women's Basketball – 9-5 (Commonwealth Conference 3-1, MAC 5-3)

The Greyhounds had their six-game winning streak snapped on a cold shooting night with a 78-61 loss at Delaware Valley College. Moravian was just 21 of 75 from the floor (28.0 percent) and 15 of 28 at the foul line (53.6 percent). Sophomore forward **Tracie Shipman (Philadelphia, PA/Archbishop Ryan HS)** led the Greyhounds in scoring with 13 points off the bench and she added 11 rebounds for a double-double. Junior forward **Kelly McLean (Allentown, PA/Salisbury HS)** also had a double-double with a game high 16 rebounds to go along with 12 points. Junior guard **Tara Wozniak (Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS)** also tossed in 12 points and she added eight rebounds as Moravian held a 54-46 advantage on the boards with 26 offensive rebounds. Junior forward **Kristen Sarnocinski (Harleysville, PA/Germantown Academy HS)** contributed eight points while sophomore guard **Kim Hughes (Manasquan, NJ/St. Rose HS)** had seven points.

Moravian bounced back from its first loss of the new year to do something it has done just once before in 13 career games, earn a Commonwealth Conference victory at Elizabethtown College. Moravian's only prior win at Elizabethtown came on December 8, 1990. The Greyhounds posted a 61-38 victory over the Blue Jays to move to 3-0 on the season and setup a first place showdown with Messiah College on Saturday. Moravian made 40.4 percent of its shots in the game (19 of 47) and the Greyhounds were 20 of 24 from the foul line (83.3 percent). Moravian also had a 46-30 advantage on the boards with **McLean** pulling down a game high 11 rebounds. **McLean** also led all scorers with 16 points. **Wozniak** was the only other Greyhound to score in double figures with ten points. **Wozniak** added eight rebounds while **Shipman** contributed eight points and six rebounds.

The Greyhounds dropped a 68-61 decision to #11 Messiah College in Commonwealth Conference action. Moravian, which trailed by as many as 12 points, was within four points in the final three minutes of the game before Messiah iced the contest at the free throw line. The Falcons were 23 of 30 in the game while the Greyhounds were 28 of 32 at the charity stripe. Wozniak led the Greyhounds with 14 points while Sarnocinski and Shipman each had 13 points for Moravian. McLean had eight rebounds while Hughes had eight points. Freshman guard Jen Behagg (Hamburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) contributed six points, four rebounds and three assists.

Moravian had two competitors travel to Rutgers University to compete in the first invitational of the new year. Junior **George Wacker (Honesdale, PA/Honesdale HS)** placed fifth in the 800 meters with a time of 2:05.5 while junior **Matt Bowers (Annville, PA/Annville-Cleona HS)** was sixth in the 35-pound weight throw with a toss of 12.82 meters (42 feet, ¾ inches).

## Men's Basketball – 8-5 (Commonwealth Conference 2-2, MAC 4-4)

Moravian dropped its first Commonwealth Conference contest of the new year, falling to #12 Elizabethtown College, 106-82 on the road. The Blue Jays jumped out quick on the Greyhounds and led 29-15 just ten minutes into the game and 57-34 at halftime. Elizabethtown shot 62.9 percent from the floor (44 of 70) while the Greyhounds shot 45.5 percent (25 of 55). Moravian did connect on 23 of 25 free throws in the game (92.0 percent). Freshman forward **Brandon Zaleski** (Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS) led the Greyhounds with 19 points and he added seven rebounds, three assists and three blocked shots. Junior guard **Kevin Hall** (Mount Pocono, PA/Pocono Mountain HS) contributed 17 points off the bench with three three-pointers. Sophomore guards **Steve Weiler** (Edgewater Park NJ/Burlington City HS) and Kevin Wyers (Hamilton Square, NJ/Notre Dame HS) each had 11 points in the game with Weiler leading Moravian on the boards with nine and he had a team high four assists.

The Greyhounds bounced back from a 44-34 halftime deficit to earn a 76-72 Commonwealth Conference victory over Messiah College. Moravian evens its Commonwealth record at 2-2 with the win. The Greyhounds had four players in double figures led by 16 points from junior forward **Ken Greb** (**Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS**), who returned from an ankle injury, which had kept him out of the lineup since early December, and **Zaleski**. **Wyers** added 13 points with four three-pointers while **Weiler** contributed 11 points. **Greb** led the Greyhounds with seven rebounds while **Weiler** had eight assists. Sophomore guard **Lucas Malishchak** (**Wanamie, PA/Nanticoke HS**) had five assists and three steals in the victory.

## Women's Indoor Track & Field – 0-0 (MAC 0-0)

Last Week – Bucknell University Gulden Relays, Lewisburg, PA; Rutgers University Invitational, Piscataway, NJ This Week – Sun., Jan. 20th at Haverford College Invitational

The Greyhounds had just one competitor in the first day of the Bucknell University Gulden Relays with senior **Heidi Wolfsberger** (**Moosic, PA/Riverside HS**) winning the 3,000 meters in 10:01.73. **Wolfsberger** won the race by 34 seconds over the second place runner from Bucknell.

On the second day of the Bucknell University Gulden Relays, senior Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown, PA/Lower Dauphin HS) won the 5,000 meters with a time of 18:11.38. The Greyhounds distance medley relay team of seniors Erin Boyle (Philadelphia, PA/ Nazareth Academy HS) and Kim Jaick (Coopersburg, PA/Southern Lehigh HS), junior Jen Wagner (Riegelsville, PA/Wilson HS) and freshman Heather McGarvie (Medford, NJ/Shawnee HS) placed second with a time of 12:40.83.

Moravian sent several competitors to the Rutgers University Invitational last weekend and came away with one first place finish by freshman **Kristen Rotzell (Bangor, PA/Bangor HS)** in the long jump at 10.57 meters (34 feet, 8 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inches). Senior **Steph Horne (Sinking Spring, PA/Wilson West Lawn HS)** placed second in the 55-meter hurdles with a time of 9.8 seconds. **Horne** was second in the trials in 9.4 seconds and she finished fifth in the 500 meters in 1:27.2 and fifth in the 200 meters with a time of 28.1 seconds. Sophomore **Nicole Sabaliauskas (Butler, NJ/Butler HS)** was fifth in her trial of the 55-meter hurdles in 11.3 seconds and she was fourth in her trial of the 55-meter dash in 9.3 seconds. Senior **Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS)** finished fourth in the 800 meters with a time of 2:38.7 while freshman **Brittany Currie (Wantagh, NJ/High Point Regional HS)** was fourth in the 500 meters in 1:26.4.
