**Women's Basketball – 11-6 (Commonwealth Conference 5-1, MAC 7-3)**

Junior guard **Tara Wozniak (Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS)** scored 21 points and added eight rebounds, seven assists and three steals to lead Moravian to a 66-59 Commonwealth Conference victory over Widener University. The victory was Moravian's tenth of the season, equaling the squad's win total from last season. Sophomore guard **Kim Hughes (Manasquan, NJ/St. Rose HS)** scored 12 points and added four assists in the game while junior forward **Kelly McLean (Allentown, PA/Salisbury HS)** had 11 points and a team high 12 rebounds. Sophomore guard **Sarah Onkotz (Catasauqua, PA/Catasauqua HS)** was a fourth Greyhound player to score in double figures in the game with ten points, which tied her career high. Junior forward **Kristen Sarnocinski (Harleysville, PA/Germantown Academy HS)** contributed eight points while sophomore forward **Tracie Shipman (Philadelphia, PA/Archbishop Ryan HS)** pulled down six rebounds in the win.

Moravian rallied from a 27-11 deficit in the first half to take a 63-61 lead with 4:12 remaining in the game but the Greyhounds couldn't hold on in a 72-70 non-conference loss to Franklin & Marshall College. The Greyhounds were up 70-69 with under a minute to play but a pair of turnovers cost Moravian the game. The Hounds committed 29 turnovers in the game while allowing the Diplomats' top two players to combine for 48 points. **Hughes** had a team high 20 points with five three-pointers while **McLean** added 16 points and eight rebounds. Moravian had a 40-38 advantage on the boards with **Shipman** grabbing a team high ten rebounds including eight on the offensive glass. **Shipman** added 15 points while **Wozniak** and **Sarnocinski** each scored six points. **Wozniak** also had seven rebounds in the contest.

The Greyhounds jumped out to a 50-23 first half lead and held on for a 76-61 victory over Juniata College in Commonwealth Conference action. Moravian shot 62.5 percent in the first half (15 of 24) and the Greyhounds were 23 of 29 (79.3 percent) from the foul line in the game. Moravian had just two players score in double figures with **Hughes** scoring a game high 21 points and **Wozniak** adding 15 points. Moravian had a 42-36 advantage on the boards with seven rebounds from **Shipman** and five boards from **Hughes** and **McLean**. **Shipman** and **McLean** each had seven points in the game while sophomore guard **Kim Smith (Gilbert, PA/Pleasant Valley HS)** contributed eight points off the bench. Moravian is currently in a three-way tie for first place in the Commonwealth Conference at 5-1 after Lebanon Valley defeated Messiah College on Saturday.

Moravian equaled its win total from the 2000-01 season with its ninth victory of the season in a 64-58 non-conference win over Delaware Valley College. The Greyhounds had to come from behind for the second straight game, trailing 21-10 with 8:22 to play in the first half. Moravian shot 47.8 percent (22 of 46) from the floor and 84.2 percent at the foul line (16 of 19) in the win. The Greyhounds had a balanced scoring attack with just two players in double figures, sophomore guard **Lucas Malishchak (Wanamie, PA/Nanticoke HS)** had a team high 14 points while junior forward **Ken Greb (Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS)** added ten points. **Greb** led Moravian with five rebounds. Sophomore guard **Steve Weiler (Edgewater Park, NJ/Burlington City HS)** had nine points in the contest while freshman forward **Brandon Zaleski (Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS)** added eight points for the Greyhounds.

The Greyhounds dropped an 80-57 loss to defending Commonwealth Conference champion Widener University. Moravian shot 44.4 percent from the floor in the game (24 of 54) while the Pioneers hit a torrid 61.7 percent of their shots (29 of 47). The Greyhounds, one of the top five free throw shooting teams in the nation, hit just seven of 15 free throws in the game (46.7 percent). Widener was also hot behind the three-point line, connecting on 10 of 14 attempts (71.4 percent). **Zaleski** and senior guard **Doug Spadt (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS)** each scored 14 points for the Greyhounds. Senior forward **Mike Frew (Glen Ridge, NJ/Glen Ridge HS)** tied a career high with ten points in the loss while **Greb** added a team high ten rebounds to go along with seven points.

Moravian got back to .500 in the Commonwealth Conference with an 86-72 victory over Juniata College. The Greyhounds are 3-3 in the Commonwealth Conference with one game left in the first half of the season. The Greyhounds connected on 56 percent of their shots in the game (31 of 55) and 59 percent behind the three-point arc (13 of 22). Moravian, the second ranked free throw shooting team in the nation, had another hot day from the foul line hitting 84.6 percent of their attempts (11 of 13). **Zaleski** had a game high 24 points and seven rebounds for the Greyhounds while **Weiler** had 15 points. **Spadt** was a third Moravian player in double figures with 13 points while junior guard **Kevin Hall (Mount Pocono, PA/Pocono Mountain HS)** added nine points off the bench. **Greb** had eight points and five rebounds in the game. Moravian had eight different players make a three-pointer in the win. The victory moved head coach **Jim Walker** within two of 300 in his career at Moravian.
