Women's Basketball – 12-7 (Commonwealth Conference 6-2, MAC 8-4)

*Last Week – Defeated *Susquehanna, 59-51; Lost to *Lebanon Valley, 65-40. *Commonwealth Conference game*

Moravian struggled out to an 18-14 halftime lead before turning it on in the second half in a 59-51 victory over Susquehanna University in Commonwealth Conference action. The win gave the Greyhounds a 6-1 conference mark in the first half of the season, a three-way tie for first place. Junior forward **Kelly McLean (Allentown, PA/Salisbury HS)** led the Greyhounds with game highs of 17 points and 11 rebounds. The 11 rebounds gave **McLean** 502 in her career, making her the tenth Moravian player to pull down 500 career rebounds. Junior guard **Tara Wozniak (Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS)** had 14 points, four rebounds and three steals in the game while sophomore guard **Kim Hughes (Manasquan, NJ/St. Rose HS)** had 12 points and four boards. Sophomore forward **Tracie Shipman (Philadelphia, PA/Germantown Academy HS)** added nine points and four rebounds as Moravian out-rebounded Susquehanna, 39-34 in the win.

The Greyhounds fell out of a three-way tie for first place in the Commonwealth Conference with a 65-40 loss at Lebanon Valley College. Moravian had been tied with LVC and Messiah for first place after the first round of conference play. The Greyhounds had a 28-26 halftime lead in the game but scored just 12 points in the second half while shooting just 10.3 percent from the floor. **Wozniak** was the only Moravian player in double figures with 22 points and she had seven rebounds and five steals. **McLean** added nine points and seven rebounds. **Hughes** and **Shipman** had five rebounds in the loss.

Senior **Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic, PA/Riverside HS)** won a pair of races to lead the Greyhounds at the Haverford College Invitational on January 20th. **Wolfsberger** captured first in the 1,500 meters with a time of 4:42.2 and she won the 800 meters in 2:19.5. Moravian had 14 other runners compete in the 1,500 meters in addition to **Wolfsberger** with seniors **Erin Boyle (Philadelphia, PA/Nazareth Academy HS)**, **Kim Jaick (Coopersburg, PA/Southern Lehigh HS)** and **Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown, PA/Lower Dauphin HS)** all finishing in the top ten. **Boyle** was fourth in 4:49.7 while **Jaick** was fifth in 4:56.3 and **Shertzer** was sixth with a time of 4:58.4. Freshman **Megan Wise (North Wales, PA/North Penn HS)** placed 11th in 5:11.4 while freshman **Chelsea Mullins (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS)** was 12th in 5:11.6. Moravian had two other top 20 finishers with freshman **Holly Bofinger (Warminster, PA/William Tennent HS)** placing 15th in 5:18.4 and freshman **Ali Stoyko (Reading, PA/Governor Mifflin HS)** taking 17th in 5:24.7. Senior **Steph Horne (Sinking Spring, PA/Wilson West lawn HS)** was fifth in the 200 meters with a time of 28.0 seconds and she tied for fourth in the 55 meters in 7.5 seconds. **Horne** also ran a time of 1:04.0 in the 400 meters while freshman **Anne Guzevich (Kenilworth, NJ/David Baerly Regional HS)** finished in 1:06.6 and senior **Amanda Samok (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS)** had a time of 1:07.0.

Following **Wolfsberger** in the 800 meters with top 20 finishes were freshman **Heather McGarvie (Medford, NJ/Shawnee HS)** in fifth at 2:24.4, junior **Jen Wagner (Riegelsville, PA/Wilson HS)** in eight with a time of 2:25.4, **Boyle** at ninth in 2:27.9, senior **Jen Boberg (Lansford, PA/Panther Valley HS)** 11th in 2:31.4, **Wise** at 12th in 2:34.0, freshman **Kellie Smith (Perkasie, PA/Pennridge HS)** at 15th with a time of 2:36.3 and senior **Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS)** in 17th at 2:39.8. **Shertzer** placed second in the 3,000 meters with a time of 10:22.8 while **Jaick** was fourth in 10:45.3. **Mullins** was sixth in the 3,000 at 11:06.7 while **Bofinger** placed eighth in 11:16.2. Sophomore **Angie Morgan (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** came in 11th with a time of 11:29.3 while **Stoyko** was 12th in 11:41.2. Sophomore **Jen Brief (Clark, NJ/Arthur L. Johnson HS)** was 16th at 12:31.1 and freshman **Megan Krebs (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS)** placed 17th in 12:31.3. Moravian's only field competitor was sophomore **Nicole Sabaliauskas (Butler, NJ/Butler HS)** placing 12th in the shot put with a toss of 7.38 meters (24 feet, 2 1/2 inches). The Greyhounds had two 4x400-meter relay teams compete at Haverford with the "A" team of **Samok, Wagner, Boyle** and **Horne** running a time of 4:27.0 and the "B" team of **Catalino, Smith, Boberg** and freshman **Sarah Krebs (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS)** finishing in 4:34.6.

Men's Basketball – 12-7 (Commonwealth Conference 4-4, MAC 7-6)

The Greyhounds moved head coach **Jim Walker** two wins away from 300 in his 22 years at Moravian with a 72-56 non-conference victory over Swarthmore College. Freshman forward **Brandon Zaleski (Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS)** was one of two Greyhounds in double figures with 25 points. **Zaleski** hit 11 of 14 field goals and grabbed seven rebounds in the win. Junior guard **Kevin Hall (Mount Pocono, PA/Pocono Mountain HS)** came off the bench to score 12 points and grab four rebounds. Junior forward **Ken Greb (Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS)** was held scoreless in the game but he pulled down a team high nine rebounds. Senior forward **Mike Frew (Glen Ridge, NJ/Glen Ridge HS)** had eight points and seven rebounds while sophomore guard **Steve Weiler (Edgewater Park, NJ/Burlington City HS)** contributed eight points and six boards. **Weiler** had three assists in the game while sophomore **Kevin Burke (Turnersville, NJ/St. Augustine Prep HS)** dished out a team high four assists while playing for sophomore guard **Lucas Malishchak (Wanamie, PA/Nanticoke HS)**, who sat out the second half with an injury. Senior guard **Doug Spadt (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS)** contributed seven points and three assists for the Hounds.

Moravian dropped an 81-68 decision to Susquehanna University to finish the first half of the Commonwealth Conference season with a 3-4 mark and in fifth place. Freshman forward **Mike Howell (Floral Park, NY/Holy Cross HS)** led Moravian with 15 points while **Zaleski** added 13 points and six rebounds. **Weiler** contributed 12 points in the loss while **Malishchak** had nine points and five assists. **Frew** had seven points in the contest while **Greb** had six points and six rebounds.

The Greyhounds got back to .500 in the Commonwealth Conference with a 71-64 upset victory at Lebanon Valley College. Moravian is now 4-4 in the Commonwealth Conference and 12-7 on the season. The victory also moved coach **Walker** within one win of 300 victories as the Greyhounds' coach. Moravian held a 34-32 lead at halftime. **Spadt** led the Greyhounds with 15 points. **Zaleski** had 14 points and five rebounds in the games while **Weiler** had ten points. **Greb** led the Greyhounds with seven rebounds and he added nine points and three blocked shots. **Malishchak** added six assists and four rebounds in the victory. **Hall** had eight points off the bench while **Frew** added seven points.

The Greyhounds sent ten competitors to the Haverford College Invitational on January 20th with the best individual finish coming from senior **Kevin Bush (Stroudsburg, PA/Stroudsburg HS)** in the 400 meters. **Bush** won his heat in 50.6 seconds and was third overall in the event. **Bush** also ran a 6.5-second race in the 55 meters, which was tied for fourth. Junior **Eric Paul (Reading, PA/Reading Central Catholic HS)** was the fastest Greyhound in the 200 meters, finishing with a time of 24.1 seconds and he also competed in the shot put with a toss of 9.56 meters (31 feet, 4 1/2 inches). Sophomore **Steve Hartenstine (Danielsville, PA/Northampton HS)** ran a 24.6 second race in the 200 meters and he posted a time of 8.4 seconds in the 55-meter hurdles. Senior **Jim McIntyre (Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS)** had a time of 25.2 seconds in the 200 meters and he also had a throw of 9.34 meters (30 feet, 7 3/4 inches) in the shot put. Freshman **Pat Grogan (Nazareth, PA/Notre Dame HS)** competed in the 1,500 meters with a time of 4:22.8 while junior **Matt Plewinski (Hatfield, PA/North Penn HS)** posted a 4:53.3 and freshman **Anthony Bisti (Haddonfield, NJ/Haddon Heights HS)** had a time of 4:59.2. Junior **George Wacker (Honesdale, PA/Honesdale HS)** placed 16th in the 800 meters in 2:04.4 while sophomore **Sean McDonnell (Scranton, PA/Scranton Prep HS)** had a time of 2:07.7. Rounding out the Moravian competitors was sophomore **John Lesoine (East Stroudsburg, PA/East Stroudsburg HS)** with a tenth place finish in the shot put with a toss of 11.56 meters (37 feet, 11 1/2 inches).

MORAVIAN ADDING MEN'S LACROSSE AS 18TH SPORT

BETHLEHEM, PA — Moravian College will add men's lacrosse as its 18th varsity sport, beginning with the 2002-03 academic year.

"It is clear that lacrosse, on both the college and high school levels, is expanding (over 125 NCAA Division III schools offer men's lacrosse) and is a sport that will fit very well with our athletics program and the institution," Moravian College Director of Athletics & Recreation Paul Moyer stated. "The interest from our current student population as well as a number of perspective student-athletes with lacrosse backgrounds is certainly a driving force behind this decision. We want to be proactive in our promotion of sport programs that respond to student interest and assure that we accommodate the popularity and abilities of the outstanding student-athletes we attract."

Moravian will begin a search for a full-time head men's lacrosse and assistant football coach who will develop and kickoff the lacrosse program as well as assist Moravian's football squad. Moravian will have a club lacrosse team this spring prior to moving to varsity status in 2003.

The Bethlehem school will also be adding women's lacrosse as a varsity sport in 2002-03. The last sport Moravian added was women's soccer in 1994, which posted a 7-3 record in its debut season. Moravian currently offers basketball, cross country, soccer, tennis and indoor and outdoor track & field for both men and women; baseball, football and golf for men; and field hockey, softball and volleyball for women.

Moravian will become the 11th school of 16 in the Middle Atlantic Conference to sponsor men's lacrosse. The MAC currently earns one automatic berth in men's lacrosse to the NCAA Division III National Championship Tournament.
