Women's Basketball – 16-10 (Commonwealth Conference 10-4, MAC 12-7)

Last Week – Lost to #Messiah, 66-56. #Commonwealth Conference Semifinals This Week – Wed., Feb. 27th in Eastern College Athletic Conference South First Round at site to be determined (if qualify)

Moravian, seeded third, was knocked out of the 2002 Commonwealth Conference Semifinals with a 66-56 loss at Messiah College, the second seed. The Greyhounds, making their first playoff appearance in five years, trailed just 49-48 with five minutes to play in the second half and Moravian led early with a 13-5 lead six minutes into the game. The key for the Falcons in the second half was shooting 46 percent from the floor while Moravian only shot 31 percent. Messiah was also 11 of 16 from the charity stripe in the second half while Moravian was only one for two. Junior guard **Tara Wozniak (Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS)** and junior forward **Kelly McLean (Allentown, PA/Salisbury HS)** each had 14 points in the game for the Greyhounds and **McLean** had her second straight double-double of the season and her seventh overall with a team high 11 rebounds. Sophomore forward **Tracie Shipman (Philadelphia, PA/Archbishop Ryan HS)**, sophomore guard **Kim Smith (Gilbert, PA/Pleasant Valley HS)** and freshman guard **Jen Behagg (Hamburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS)** each scored seven points for Moravian in the game while **Wozniak** and junior guard/ forward **Kristen Sarnocinski (Harleysville, PA/Germantown Academy HS)** each had five rebounds. **Wozniak** added four steals in the contest.

The Greyhounds must wait for a possible bid from the Eastern College Athletic Conference to the 2002 South Tournament that will be announced on the afternoon of Monday, February 25th.

Women's Indoor Track & Field – 0-0 (MAC 0-0) – MAC Champions (7th straight year)

Last Week – 1st of 10 teams at the 2002 Middle Atlantic Conference Championships hosted by Susquehanna University, Selinsgrove, PA

This Week – Fri., Mar. 1st & Sat., Mar. 2nd at 2002 Eastern College Athletic Conference Championships hosted by Tufts University, Medford, MA

Freshman jumper and sprinter **Kirsten Rotzell (Bangor, PA/Bangor HS)** was named the Women's Most Outstanding Performer while winning the long jump and triple jump and leading Moravian to its seventh straight Middle Atlantic Conference Indoor Track & Field Championship. The Greyhounds squad posted a team score of 147, 65 points ahead of second place Widener University. **Rotzell** won the long jump with an Eastern College Athletic Conference qualifying leap of 5.29 meters (17 feet, 4 ¼ inches) and she captured the triple jump with an ECAC qualifying distance of 10.92 meters (35 feet, ten inches). **Rotzell**, who was Moravian's third straight Most Outstanding Performer, placed sixth in the 55 meters with an ECAC qualifying time of 7.68 seconds. Senior **Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic, PA/Riverside HS)**, who did not compete due to an ankle injury, had been the meet's Most Outstanding Performer the last two years.

The women's team had six other MAC Individual Champions with two relay squads taking first. Freshman **Heather McGarvie (Medford, NJ/Shawnee HS)** won the 800 meters in an ECAC qualifying time of 2:22.37 while senior **Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown, PA/Lower Dauphin HS)** captured first in the 5,000 meters in a MAC record time, an ECAC qualifying time and a NCAA Division III provisional qualifying time of 17:50.90. Senior **Sarah Shaneberger** (**Bethlehem, PA/Southern Lehigh HS**) won the 20-lb weight throw with a toss of 12.62 meters (41 feet, five inches) while sophomore **Christina Scherwin (Denmark)** won the shot put with an MAC record, an ECAC qualifying standard and NCAA Division III provisional qualifying distance of 13.36 meters (43 feet, ten inches). The Greyhounds distance medley relay team of seniors **Kim Jaick (Coopersburg, PA/Southern Lehigh HS)**, **Erin Boyle (Philadelphia, PA/ Nazareth Academy HS), Amanda Samok (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS)** and **Shertzer** captured first in a MAC record time and NCAA Division III provisional qualifying time of 12:29.59. The 4x800-meter relay team of **McGarvie**, senior **Jen Boberg (Lansford, PA/Panther Valley HS)** and freshmen **Kellie Smith (Perkasie, PA/Pennridge HS)** and **Megan Wise (North Wales, PA/North Penn HS)** won with a MAC record time of 9:57.96.

Other Moravian finishers in the sprint events included senior **Steph Horne** (**Sinking Spring, PA/Wilson West Lawn HS**) placing sixth in the 200 meters in a school record and ECAC qualifying time of 27.33 seconds and second in the 55meter hurdles in 8.70 seconds, also a Moravian record and an ECAC qualifying time. Sophomore **Nicole Sabaliauskas** (**Butler, NJ/Butler HS**) was 18th in the 200 meters in 29.69 seconds and seventh in the 55-meter high hurdles with a time of 9.95 seconds. Freshman **Ann Guzevich** (**Kenilworth, NJ/David Brearley Regional HS**) placed 12th in the 400 meters in 1:07.29 and she was 19th in the 200 meters at 29.70. **Samok** took fourth in the 400 meters in 1:03.37.

In addition to McGarvie in the 800 meters, Boyle was third in an ECAC qualifying time of 2:24.92 and Boberg was ninth in 2:28.57. Junior Jen Wagner (Riegelsville, PA/Wilson HS) placed tenth in 2:29.22 while senior Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) was 13th in 2:35.62 and freshman Sarah Krebs (Palmerton, PA/ Palmerton HS) finished 14thin 2:35.85. Boyle placed second in the 1,500 meters with an ECAC qualifying time of 4:53.01 while Wagner was fifth in an ECAC qualifying time of 4:59.92 and Wise was sixth in an ECAC qualifying time of 5:00.14. Freshman Alison Stoyko (Reading, PA/Governor Mifflin HS) finished seventh in the 1,500 meters in 5:09.71 while sophomore Lauren Laviola (Jersey City, NJ/St. Dominic Academy HS) was tenth in 5:18.61 and Catalino in 12th at 5:20.21. Following Shertzer in the 5,000 meters were Jaick in second at 18:17.90 (an ECAC qualifying time), freshman Holly Bofinger (Warminster, PA/William Tennent HS) in eighth at 19:09.58 and sophomore Angie Morgan (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) at tenth in 19:19.61.

Shaneberger placed second to **Scherwin** in the shot put with a toss of 12.05 meters (39 feet, 6 ½ inches), which qualified her for the ECAC Championships. Freshman **Julie Anderson (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** was second to **Shaneberger** in the 20-lb weight throw with a distance of 11.80 meters (38 feet, 8 ¾ inches) and sophomore **Alicia Fowler (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** in fifth place at 11.15 meters (36 feet, 7 ½ meters). Sophomore **Amanda Wynn** (**Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley HS**) took third in the pole vault at 2.67 meters (eight feet, nine inches).

Men's Indoor Track & Field – 0-0 (MAC 0-0)

Last Week – 3rd of 10 teams at the 2002 Middle Atlantic Conference Championships hosted by Susquehanna University, Selinsgrove, PA

Senior sprinter **Kevin Bush** (**Stroudsburg, PA/Stroudsburg HS**) was named the Men's Most Outstanding Performer after winning the 200 and 400 meters in Middle Atlantic Conference record time and he helped the Greyhounds to a third place team finish at the 2002 MAC Indoor Track & Field Championships. Widener University captured the men's championship with a score of 139. Messiah College was second with 84 points while Moravian had a score of 68 for third place. **Bush**, Moravian's first Most Outstanding Performer since **CJ Brown** in 1996, won the 200 meters in a MAC record time and ECAC qualifying time of 22.68 seconds and he captured the 400 meters with a MAC record time and Eastern College Athletic Conference qualifying time of 50.41 seconds. **Bush** also ran the anchor leg of the 4x400-meter relay and helped the team capture the MAC title in a MAC record time of 3:28.28. **Bush** joined freshman **Scott Silvoy** (**Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS**), senior **Josh Heebner (Lansdale, PA/North Penn HS**) and junior **George Wacker (Honesdale, PA/Honesdale HS**) on the 4x400-meter relay squad. In **Bush's** final event, he placed seventh in the 55 meters in 7.24 seconds after qualifying for the finals with a time of 6.67 seconds in the preliminaries.

The Greyhounds had two other MAC Individual Champions with sophomore **Joe Moore (Andover, NJ/Newton HS)** winning the long jump with a distance of 7.04 meters (23 feet, 1 ¼ inches), a NCAA Division III provisional qualifying distance and an ECAC qualifying standard. **Heebner** and **Wacker** joined with sophomore **Joe Grady (Nanticoke, PA/Nanticoke HS)** and freshman **Patrick Grogan (Nazareth, PA/Notre Dame HS)** won the distance medley relay in a time of 10:41.17.

Following **Bush** in the 200 meters were **Silvoy** in second at 22.96 seconds, junior **Eric Paul (Reading, PA/ Reading Central Catholic HS)** in 21st at 24.34 seconds and senior **Jim McIntyre (Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS)** in 24th at 24.56 seconds. **Silvoy** was also second to **Bush** in the 400 meters with a time of 52.02 seconds. Sophomore **Steve Hartenstine (Danielsville, PA/Northampton HS)** took eighth in the 55-meter hurdles in 8.39 seconds. **McIntyre, Paul, Heebner** and **Hartenstine** placed seventh in the 4x200-meter relay with a time of 1:36.6.

In the distance events, sophomore **Sean McDonnell (Scranton, PA/Scranton Prep HS)** was ninth in the 800 meters in a time of 2:06.37 while **Wacker** was tenth at 2:10.16. **Grady** was eighth in the 1,500 meters with a time of 4:14.44 while senior **Chris DeWalt (Easton, PA/Easton HS)** was 15th in 4:30.95, junior **Justin Arnold (Basking Ridge, NJ/ Ridge HS)** in 20th at 4:34.85 and junior **Matt Plewinski (Hatfield, PA/North Penn HS)** in 24th with a time of 4:42.40. Junior **Wes Zimmerman (Boyertown, PA/Boyertown HS)** placed ninth in the 5,000 meters in 16:02.58. **Grady**, **Grogan** and **McDonnell** combined with freshman **Matt Oertner (Slatington, PA/Northern Lehigh HS)** for a second place finish in the 4x800-meter relay in 8:19.21.

In the field throwing events, sophomore John Lesoine (East Stroudsburg, PA/East Stroudsburg HS) was seventh in the 35-lb weight throw with a toss of 13.39 meters (43 feet, 11 ¹/₄ inches) and he was 12th in the shot put with a distance of 11.74 meters (38 feet, 6 ¹/₄ inches). Junior Matt Bowers (Annville, PA/Annville-Cleona HS) was eighth in the weight throw with a toss of 13.25 meters (43 feet, 5 ³/₄ inches) while sophomore Scott Williams (Bangor, PA/Bangor HS) was 17th in the weight throw with a distance of 10.20 meters (33 feet, 5 ³/₄ meters).
