Women's Basketball - 16-10 (Commonwealth Conference 10-4, MAC 12-7)

Season Complete

Junior guard **Tara Wozniak** (**Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS**) of the Moravian College women's basketball team has been named to the 2001-02 Commonwealth Conference All-Star First Team announced Wednesday.

Moravian finished the season with an overall record of 16-10 and the squad made the Commonwealth Conference Playoffs for the first time since 1997-98, falling to eventual champion Messiah College, 66-56 in the semifinals. The Greyhounds were 10-4 in the Commonwealth Conference regular season and were the third seed in the playoffs.

For the second straight year, **Wozniak** led Moravian in scoring with an average of 14.5 points per game. **Wozniak** also averaged 5.8 rebounds per contest while leading Moravian with 55 assists, 51 steals and 47 three-pointers. She added 20 blocked shots and was among the top ten in the Commonwealth Conference in scoring, steals, three-point field goal percentage (47 of 132 for 35.6 percent) and free thrown percentage (93 of 122 for 76.2 percent). **Wozniak**, who was a Commonwealth Conference Second Team All-Star last year, needs just four points next season to become the 13th player in Moravian history to score 1,000 points in a career.

Moravian is currently 22nd in the nation in free throw percentage at 72.0 percent (479 of 665).

Men's Basketball – 14-11 (Commonwealth Conference 6-8, MAC 9-10)

Season Complete

Freshman forward **Brandon Zaleski** (**Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS**) of the Moravian men's basketball team has been named to the Commonwealth Conference All-Star Second Team announced Tuesday and **Zaleski** was also named the Commonwealth Conference's Rookie of the Year by the conference coaches.

Moravian finished the 2001-02 season with an overall record of 14-11 and a 6-8 slate in the Commonwealth Conference, which put the squad in fifth place. The Greyhounds are currently ranked as the top free throw shooting teams in the nation at 79.5 percent (407 of 512).

Zaleski started all but one of the team's 25 games during his freshman season and he finished the year with a scoring average of 19.1 points per game, second in the Commonwealth Conference. His 477 points was the seventh highest single season total in Moravian history. Zaleski also averaged 6.6 rebounds per contest (sixth in the conference) with a total of 164 boards. Zaleski, one of the top 25 shooters in the nation, finished the season with a 59.9 shooting percentage (191 of 319) to lead the Commonwealth Conference and he was fourth on the Moravian squad in free throw percentage at 82.9 percent (92 of 111). His attempts and percentage ranked him third in the Commonwealth Conference. Zaleski led the Greyhounds with 17 blocked shots and he added 24 assists and 32 steals in his debut season.

The Greyhounds had six student-athletes compete on the first day of the 2002 Eastern College Athletic Conference Championships hosted by Tufts University and the team was tied for 32nd. The Moravian distance medley relay earned Moravian its point with an eighth place finish in a time of 12:30.25, a NCAA Division III provisional qualifying time. The DMR team was made up of senior **Erin Boyle** (**Philadelphia, PA/Nazareth Academy HS**), junior **Jen Wagner** (**Riegelsville, PA/Wilson HS**) and freshmen **Heather McGarvie** (**Medford, NJ/Shawnee HS**) and **Megan Wise** (**North Wales, PA/North Penn HS**). Senior **Steph Horne** (**Sinking Spring, PA/Wilson West Lawn HS**) placed second in her heat of the 55-meter hurdle preliminaries and moved into the finals with a top eight time of 8.54 seconds, just one-one hundredth off the school record she set at the MAC Championships. Freshman **Kirsten Rotzell** (**Bangor, PA/Bangor HS**) placed 16th in the long jump with a leap of 4.83 meters (15 feet, 10 1/4 inches).

Moravian placed 20th of 51 schools that scored points at the 2002 ECAC Championships. Wheaton (MA) College won the women's title. Earning points for the Greyhounds on the second day of competition were senior **Kim Jaick** (Coopersburg, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) with a second place finish in the 3,000 meters with a time of 10:18.10, Boyle with a fifth place showing in the 1,500 meters in a NCAA Division III provisional qualifying time of 4:41.87 and **Horne** with a sixth place finish in the 55-meter hurdles in 8.69 seconds, a NCAA Division III provisional qualifying time. Other competitors from Moravian were **Horne** in the 200 meters, placing 31st in 27.74 seconds, **Rotzell** in the triple jump, finishing 10th with a distance of 10.94 meters (35 feet, 10 3.4 inches), **Wagner** in the 1,500 meters, placing 24th with a time of 4:58.47, **McGarvie** in the 800 meters, finishing 19th with a time of 2:23.26 and **Wise** in the 3,000 meters, placing 22nd in 10:48.12.

Moravian had just one competitor on the first day of the 2002 Eastern College Athletic Conference Championships hosted by Tufts University and he earned the Greyhounds one point to put the team in 26th place. Sophomore **Joe Moore** (**Andover, NJ/Newton HS**) finished eighth in the long jump with a leap of 6.64 meters (21 feet, 9 1/2 inches).

The Greyhounds finished tied for 45th of 46 schools that scored points at the 2002 ECAC Championships. The College of New Jersey won the ECAC Championship. Moravian received its lone point from **Moore** in the long jump on the first day of competition. On the second day, senior sprinter **Kevin Bush** (**Stroudsburg**, **PA/Stroudsburg HS**) placed 19th in the 400 meters in a time of 51.50 seconds. **Bush** teamed with senior **Josh Heebner** (**Lansdale**, **PA/North Penn HS**), junior **George Wacker** (**Honesdale**, **PA/Honesdale HS**) and freshman **Scott Silvoy** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS**) to place 11th in the 4x400-meter relay in a time of 3:26.88.

26 MORAVIAN TRACK & FIELD ATHLETES NAMED TO MAC ALL-STAR TEAMS

ANNVILLE, PA — Moravian's men's and women's indoor track & field teams had 26 student-athletes named to 46 positions on the 2002 Middle Atlantic Conference All-Star First & Second Teams. To earn MAC All-Star honors, a student-athlete must finish in the top six of an event at the MAC Championships with the medal winners being named to the All-Star First Team and the fourth though sixth place finishers earning All-Star Second Team accolades.

The Moravian women, who won their seventh straight MAC indoor title, had 17 student-athletes earn 28 spots. Freshman **Kirsten Rotzell (Bangor, PA/Bangor HS)**, who was named the Women's Most Outstanding Performer of the MAC Championships, earned All-Star First Team honors in the long jump, where she was the champion with a jump of 5.29 meters, and in the triple jump, which she was also the champion of with a distance of 10.92 meters. **Rotzell** earned All-Star Second Team accolades for a fourth place finish in the 55 meters in 7.68 seconds.

Senior Erin Boyle (Philadelphia, PA/Nazareth Academy HS) earned All-Star First Team honors in three events with a second place in the 1,500 meters with a time of 4:53.01, a third place showing in the 800 meters with a time of 2:24.92, and a championship in the distance medley relay with fellow seniors Kim Jaick (Coopersburg, PA/Southern Lehigh HS), Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown, PA/Lower Dauphin HS) and Amanda Samok (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS) in a meet record time of 12:29.59. Shertzer also earned First Team honors for winning the 5,000 meters in a meet record time of 17:50.90, and Jaick was on the First Team for the 5,000 meters, finishing second in 18:17.59. Samok earned Second Team honors for a fourth place in the 400 meters in 1:03.37.

Senior Sarah Shaneberger (Bethlehem, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) earned All-Star First Team accolades in the weight throw with a winning toss of 12.61 meters and in the shot put with a second place distance of 12.05 meters. Senior Steph Horne (Sinking Spring, PA/Wilson West Lawn HS) was named to the All-Star First Team in the 55-meter hurdles for her second place finish in a Moravian record time of 8.70 seconds. Horne also earned Second Team honors in the 200 meters with a sixth place finish in the school record time of 27.33 seconds.

Freshman **Heather McGarvie** (**Medford, NJ/Shawnee HS**) earned All-Star First Team accolades in the 800 meters with a winning time of 2:22.37, and she teamed with senior **Jen Boberg** (**Lansford, PA/Panther Valley HS**) and freshmen **Megan Wise** (**North Wales, PA/North Penn HS**) and **Kellie Smith** (**Perkasie, PA/Pennridge HS**) to win the 4x800-meter relay in a meet record time of 9:57.96. **Wise** was also named to the All-Star Second Team for a sixth place finish in the 1,500 meters in 5:00.14.

Rounding out the Moravian women honorees were sophomore **Christina Scherwin** (**Denmark**) earning First Team honors for winning the shot put with a meet record toss of 13.36 meters, freshman **Julie Anderson** (**Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS**) earning First Team accolades for a second place showing in the weight throw with a second place toss of 11.80 meters, and sophomore **Amanda Wynn** (**Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley HS**) earning a First Team sport for a third place finish in the pole vault, clearing a height of 2.67 meters. Junior **Jen Wagner** (**Riegelsville, PA/Wilson HS**) was named to the All-Star Second Team for a fifth place finish in the 1,500 meters with a time of 4:59.92, while freshman **Chelsea Mullins** (**Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS**) was sixth in the 5,000 meters with a time of 18:46.15 for Second Team honors and sophomore **Alicia Fowler** (**Easton, PA/Easton HS**) was fifth in the weight throw with a toss of 11.15 meters for Second Team accolades.

The Moravian men's squad, which finished third at the MAC Championships last weekend, had nine student-athletes earn 18 All-Star slots led by senior **Kevin Bush** (**Stroudsburg**, **PA/Stroudsburg HS**). **Bush**, who was named the Men's Most Outstanding Performer at the MAC meet, was named to the All-Star First Team in the 200 meters for winning the race in a meet record time of 22.68 seconds and winning the 400 meters in a meet record time of 50.41 seconds. **Bush** teamed with senior **Josh Heebner** (**Lansdale**, **PA/North Penn HS**), junior **George Wacker** (**Honesdale**, **PA/Honesdale HS**) and freshman **Scott Silvoy** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS**) to earn All-Star First Team honors in the 4x400-meter relay in a meet record time of 3:28.28. **Bush** also earned All-Star Second Team accolades in the 55 meters with a sixth place time of 7.24 seconds in the final.

Silvoy earned All-Star First Team honors in the 200 meters, finishing in second at 22.96 seconds, and he was named to the All-Star Second Team in the 400 meters for a sixth place finish in 52.02 seconds. Heebner and Wacker also earned All-Star First Team honors in the distance medley relay with sophomore Joe Grady (Nanticoke, PA/Nanticoke HS) and freshman Patrick Grogan (Nazareth, PA/Notre Dame HS) in a winning time of 10:41.17. Grady and Grogan teamed with sophomore Sean McDonnell (Scranton, PA/Scranton Prep HS) and freshman Matt Oertner (Slatington, PA/Northern Lehigh HS) to earn All-Star Second Team accolades in the 4x800-meter relay with a second place finish in a time of 8:19.21.

Moravian's only other male honoree was sophomore **Joe Moore** (**Andover, NJ/Newton HS**), who was on the All-Star First Team for his first place finish in the long jump with a leap of 7.04 meters.
