### Softball – 17-3 (Commonwealth Conference 3-1, MAC 3-2)

Last Week – Defeated Ursinus, 4-2 & 7-0; Defeated Haverford, 8-0 & 13-1; Defeated \*Susquehanna, 7-3 & 6-2. \*Commonwealth Conference game

The Greyhounds won the first game of a non-conference doubleheader with Ursinus College, 4-2. Moravian jumped out to a 3-0 lead in the first inning on a delayed steal of home by freshman shortstop **Leah Holmes** (**Clarks Green**, **PA/Abington Heights HS**), a RBI single by senior designated player **Deb Noble** (**Cranford**, **NJ/Cranford HS**) and an Ursinus error. The Greyhounds extended their lead to 4-0 in the second inning when senior **Laurie Rentschler** (**Slatington**, **PA/Northern Lehigh HS**) scored on a throw after a single by **Holmes**. **Holmes** was two-for-four in the game with two stolen bases while sophomore outfielder **Melissa Soroka** (**Newton**, **NJ/Pope John XXIII HS**) was two-for-three with a double and a stolen base. Senior pitcher **Rachel Mowrey** (**Hellertown**, **PA/Saucon Valley HS**) earned her seventh win of the season, allowing just three hits and two walks while striking out four. One of the runs **Mowrey** allowed was unearned.

Moravian completed the doubleheader sweep of Ursinus, winning the nightcap, 7-0, in a game shortened to six innings by darkness. The Greyhounds took a 3-0 lead in the bottom of the first inning on a RBI singles by senior designated player Summer Miller (Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS) and senior catcher Stacy Matuczinski (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) and a sacrifice fly by junior third baseman Kim Gehman (Topton, PA/Brandywine Heights HS). The Greyhounds added three more runs in the second inning on a RBI single by sophomore second baseman Megan Smith (Phillipsburg, NJ/Belvidere HS) and two Ursinus errors. The Greyhounds finished the scoring in the fifth inning with a RBI grounder off the bat of senior first baseman Sarah Leiby (Fleetwood, PA/Fleetwood HS) with the bases loaded. Sophomore Donna Weiner (East Hanover, NJ/ Hanover Park HS) earned the victory. Weiner scattered three hits and allowed one walk while striking out three.

The Greyhounds won the first game of a non-conference doubleheader at Haverford College, 8-0, in six innings. Sophomore **Jessica Naugle (Mohrsville, PA/Schuylkill Valley HS)** tossed Moravian's second no-hitter of the season, allowing just one walk while striking out three for her second victory of the year. Moravian took a 1-0 lead in the first inning when sophomore third baseman **Janelle Brey (Allentown, PA/Dieruff HS)** doubled home **Holmes**. The Greyhounds added two runs in the second inning on a RBI single by **Rentschler** and a delayed steal of home by **Miller**. Moravian would make the lead 5-0 in the third on a two-run double by **Miller**. The Greyhounds scored a single run in the fifth inning when **Brey** scored on a passed ball. Moravian ended the game by the eight-run rule with a pair of runs in the sixth inning, both scoring on passed balls. **Brey** was three-for-five in the game with three doubles, which tied the Moravian single game record while **Miller** and **Gehman** were each two-for-two.

Moravian completed the doubleheader sweep of Haverford, winning the nightcap, 13-1. Freshman **Ashley Hughes** (**Slatington**, **PA/Northern Lehigh HS**) earned her first career victory on the mound, allowing just an unearned run on five hits and a walk while striking out five. The Greyhounds took a 4-0 lead in the second inning on a RBI single by freshman outfielder **Krissy Cianfichi** (**Warrington**, **PA/Central Bucks East HS**), a sacrifice fly by **Soroka** and a two-RBI double off the bat of **Holmes**. Moravian added two runs in the fourth inning on a RBI double by **Brey** and an infielder ground by freshman outfielder **Stephanie Eddinger** (**Allentown**, **PA/Parkland HS**). The Greyhounds tacked on a single run in the sixth on a ground out by **Brey** before scoring six times in the top of the seventh inning. **Cianfichi**, **Holmes**, **Brey**, **Eddinger**, **Leiby** and sophomore catcher **Jenn Hastings** (**Pottstown**, **PA/Owen J. Roberts HS**) each had RBI singles. **Cianfichi** finished the game three-for-four with three runs scored and two RBIs while **Brey** was three-for-five with three RBIs and two doubles. **Holmes** went two-for-four with three RBIs while **Smith** was two-for-four with a pair of runs. **Hastings** was two-for-five in the contest.

Brey connected on a two-run homerun in the fifth inning to give Moravian a 5-1 lead in a 7-3 victory over Susquehanna University in the first game of a Commonwealth Conference doubleheader. Brey's homer was her fourth of the season and the ninth of her career, tying the Moravian career record. The Greyhounds opened the game with a 2-0 lead in the first inning when Soroka led off with a triple. Sophomore outfielder Jessica Esposito (Madison, NJ/Madison HS) hit a two-out RBI double to score Soroka and Esposito would score when Leiby got in an intentional rundown. Moravian extended its lead to 3-0 in the third inning on a two-out double by Esposito and a RBI single by Leiby. Brey hit her homer in the fifth and the round-tripper scored Soroka, who had led off the inning with an infield single. The Greyhounds tacked on two more runs in the sixth inning to make the lead 7-1. Freshman shortstop Heather Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS) connected on a two-out RBI single that scored Holmes. Bortz scored on a double by Brey that was just inches from clearing the right field fence for her second homer of the game. Brey was two-for-four in the game with three RBIs while Esposito was three-for-four with two doubles and two runs. Leiby was also three-for-four and Soroka was two-for-four with two runs. Mowrey earned her eighth win of the season on the mound, allowing three runs on nine hits with one walk and two strikeouts.

Brey broke the Moravian career record for homeruns with her tenth homer in just 50 career games to lead the Greyhounds to a 6-2 victory in the second game versus Susquehanna. Brey hit the first pitch she saw in the fourth inning over the right-centerfield fence and onto the track at Steel Field for a grand slam, giving the Greyhounds a 6-1 lead in the game. Moravian took the lead in the second as Matuczinski delivered a two-out, two-run single that scored Miller and Rentschler. At the plate for the Greyhounds, Bortz and Leiby were each three-for-four in the game while Soroka was two-for-three. Weiner earned her sixth victory of the season, allowing two runs on five hits with one strikeout.

Moravian dropped its fourth straight game, falling to Alvernia College, 9-4, in an eight-inning, non-conference game. The Greyhounds trailed 6-0 after two innings before scoring a run in third. Junior third baseman Jeff Meila (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) hit a sacrifice fly to centerfield to score senior outfielder Michael Abbate (South Plainfield, NJ/Bishop Ahr HS). The Greyhounds would cut the score to 6-3 in the fifth inning when sophomore outfielder Ethan Ordog (Roebling, NJ/Holy Cross HS) hit a double to the gap in right center to score freshman outfielder Chris Clancy (Kendall Park, NJ/Bishop Ahr HS) and Meila. Moravian scored its final run in the bottom of the sixth inning after allowing three runs in the top half of the inning. Sophomore second baseman Matthew Turtell (Lindenhurst, NY/Lindenhurst HS) led off the inning with a single and he scored on a triple by freshman shortstop Chris Benigno (Howell, NJ/St. Rose HS). Turtell finished the game four-for-four at the plate for Moravian while Clancy was three-for-four and Benigno was two-for-three. Junior Ryan Boyle (Bethlehem, PA/ Liberty HS) suffered the loss on the mound for the Greyhounds, lasting just two innings. Sophomore Greg Peters (Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley HS) and freshman Steve Tomaszewski (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) each tossed three innings in relief while sophomore Andrew Park (Harrisburg, PA/Lower Dauphin HS) pitched to five batters in the sixth inning.

The Greyhounds snapped a four-game losing streak with a 3-0 victory over Susquehanna University in Commonwealth Conference action. Clancy tossed his second straight complete game and won for the first time in his Moravian career, scattering five hits and allowing three walks while striking out eight in the victory. Clancy also got the offense started for the Greyhounds. In the bottom of the first inning, Clancy doubled to left field with one out and moved to third on a ground out by Meila before scoring on a single by junior first baseman Bob Frey (Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley HS). Moravian would extend the lead to 2-0 in the fourth inning when Ordog scored on a single by Turtell. The Greyhounds final run came in the seventh inning when Benigno scored on a single by Meila. Frey and Turtell were both two-for-three with a RBI in the game while Meila was two-for-four with a RBI.

Moravian swept the six singles matches with straight sets victories from juniors **David Kurvink** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/Liberty HS**), **Todd Edwards** (**Conyngham**, **PA/Hazleton HS**) and **Dan Gorman** (**Saylorsburg**, **PA/Pleasant Valley HS**), sophomores **Jason Toedter** (**Easton**, **PA/Easton HS**) and **Mike Helmuth** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/ Harrisonburg {VA} HS**) and freshman **Tasch Tinsley** (**Bangor**, **PA/Bangor HS**). The Greyhounds also won two of the tree doubles contests to earn the doubles point. Moravian's wins came from the teams of **Toedter** and **Tinsley** and **Kurvink** and **Helmuth**.

# This Week - Fri. & Sat., Apr. 5th & 6th at Princeton University Invitational, Princeton, NJ

Sophomore **Christina Scherwin (Denmark)** threw the javelin for the first time in her Moravian career at the Quaker Invitational hosted by the University of Pennsylvania and she finished in first place with the best throw at the NCAA Division III level this season and the 13th best throw of 2002 in the world. **Scherwin's** toss of 55.99 meters (183 feet, eight inches) was well over the NCAA Division III automatic qualifying standard of 41.00 meters and she won the event by more that 12 meters. Senior **Jennifer Lohn (Media, PA/Penncrest HS)** was fifth in the javelin with an NCAA Division III provisional qualifying toss of 40.34 meters (132 feet, four inches).

Moravian opened its 2002 outdoor season with a third place finish at the Lehigh Valley Championships hosted by Muhlenberg College. The Greyhounds had five first place finishers, set three track records, qualified six student-athletes for the NCAA Division III Championships and qualified 14 student-athletes for the Eastern College Athletic Conference Championships.

Freshman **Kirsten Rotzell (Bangor, PA/Bangor HS)** won both her field events, taking first in the long jump with a leap of 5.23 meters (17 feet, two inches), good enough to qualify for the ECAC meet, and she won the triple jump with a track record and ECAC qualifying distance of 11.24 meters (36 feet, 10 ½ inches). **Scherwin** captured first in the shot put with a track record, ECAC qualifying and NCAA provisional qualifying distance of 13.35 meters (43 feet, 9 3/4 inches). Moravian's other winners came on the track where senior **Erin Boyle (Philadelphia, PA/Nazareth Academy HS)** captured first in the 1,500 meters in a NCAA provisional and ECAC qualifying time of 4:43.77 and senior **Kim Jaick (Coopersburg, PA/Southern Lehigh HS)** won the 5,000 meters in a track record, NCAA provisional and ECAC qualifying time of 17:39.64.

Boyle also took second in the 800 meters in a ECAC qualifying time of 2:24.43 while freshman Sarah Krebs (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS) placed tenth in the 800 in 2:38.6. Following Boyle in the 1,500 meters were freshman Heather McGarvie (Medford, NJ/Shawnee HS) in second with a ECAC qualifying time of 4:49.01, freshman Megan Wise (North Wales, PA/North Penn HS) in fifth place in 5:04.66, senior Jen Boberg (Lansford, PA/Panther Valley HS) in 11th at 5:14.51, freshman Alison Stoyko (Reading, PA/Governor Mifflin HS) in 12th at 5:28.78 and freshman Meghan Krebs (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS) at 14th with a time of 5:33.31. Following Jaick in the 5,000 meters were freshman Chelsea Mullins (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) in third with an ECAC qualifying time of 18:43.27, junior Jen Wagner (Riegelsville, PA/Wilson HS) in fourth with an ECAC qualifying time of 19:00.62 and sophomore Angie Morgan (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) in sixth at 19:34.75. Senior Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown, PA/Lower Dauphin HS) was second in the 3,000-meter steeplechase with a NCAA provisional qualifying time of 11:24.33 while senior Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) was fifth in 12:50.80.

In the sprint events, senior **Steph Horne** (**Sinking Spring**, **PA/Wilson West Lawn HS**) was fifth in the 100 meters in 13.73 seconds, seventh in the 200 meters in 28.05 seconds and second in the 100-meter high hurdles with a ECAC qualifying time of 16.75 seconds. **Rotzell** took seventh in the 100 meters in 13.24 seconds and sixth in the 200 meters in 27.76 seconds. Sophomore **Nicole Sabaliauskas** (**Butler**, **NJ/Butler HS**) was 13th in the 200 meters in 29.98 seconds while freshman **Marcy Burke** (**Kintersville**, **PA/Palisades HS**) was 14th in 30.72 seconds and freshman **Ann Guzevich** (**Kenilworth**, **NJ/David Brearley Regional HS**) was 15th in 30.82 seconds. Senior **Amanda Samok** (**Palmerton**, **PA/ Palmerton HS**) took third in the 400 meters in 1:02.26 while **Guzevich** was seventh in 1:07.60.

Senior Sarah Shaneberger (Bethlehem, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) placed in three events, taking second in the discus with an ECAC qualifying toss of 38.77 meters (127 feet, two inches), third in the hammer throw at 37.40 meters (122 feet, eight inches) and third in the shot put in an ECAC qualifying distance of 12.07 meters (39 feet, 7 ¼ inches). Senior Carrie McCaffery (Lebanon, PA/Annville-Cleona HS) took fourth in the hammer throw at 36.48 meters (119 feet, eight inches), fourth in the discus with an ECAC qualifying toss of 34.65 meters (113 feet, eight inches), fourth in the javelin with a NCAA provisional and ECAC qualifying toss of 38.82 meters (127 feet, four inches) and ninth in the shot put at 10.27 meters (33 feet, 8 ½ inches). Lohn was third in the javelin with a NCAA provisional and ECAC qualifying toss of 40.01 meters (131 feet, three inches) while freshman Julie Anderson (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) was sixth in the discus at 32.49 meters (106 feet, seven inches) and seventh in the hammer throw at 26.35 meters (86 feet, five inches). Finishing out the field events, Sabaliauskas was fifth in the long jump with a leap of 4.62 meters (15 feet, 1 ¾ inches) and sophomore Amanda Wynn (Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley HS) was tied for fourth in the pole vault, clearing a height of 2.89 meters (nine feet, six inches).

#### Men's Outdoor Track & Field - 0-0 (MAC 0-0)

Freshman sprinter **Scott Silvoy** (**Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS**) qualified for the Eastern College Athletic Conference Championships in a pair of events to lead Moravian to a fifth place team finish at the Lehigh Valley Championships hosted by Muhlenberg College. **Silvoy** placed third in the 100 meters in 11.26 seconds and he was second in the 200 meters in 22.52 seconds. Senior **Kevin Bush** (**Stroudsburg, PA/Stroudsburg HS**) also qualified for the ECAC meet in the 200 meters, finishing third in 22.90 seconds. **Bush** was seventh in the 100 meters in 11.57 seconds. Junior **Brian Mack** (**Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS**) was ninth in both the 100 and 200 meters finishing in 11.58 and 23.76 seconds. Sophomore **Joe Moore** (**Andover, NJ/Newton HS**) posted a time of 11.75 seconds in the 100 meters while junior **Eric Paul** (**Reading, PA/Reading Central Catholic HS**) had a 24.66-second race in the 200 meters. Freshman **Dan Corey** (**Fair Lawn, NJ/Glen Rock HS**) ran 25.51 seconds in the 200 meters. The Greyhounds 4x100-meter relay team of **Silvoy, Bush, Mack** and **Paul** placed third in 43.40 seconds.

Senior Josh Heebner (Lansdale, PA/North Penn HS) placed fifth in the 400 meters, finishing in 51.97 seconds while senior Jim McIntyre (Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS) was 17th in 59.76 seconds. Junior George Wacker (Honesdale, PA/Honesdale HS) placed third in the 800 meters in 2:02.14 while freshman Matt Oertner (Slatington, PA/Northern Lehigh HS) was sixth in 2:03.76 and sophomore Sean McDonnell (Scranton, PA/ Scranton Prep HS) was 11th in 2:05.94. Freshman Patrick Grogan (Nazareth, PA/Notre Dame HS) had a fourth place finish in the 1,500 meters with a time of 4:14.74 while sophomore Joe Grady (Nanticoke, PA/Nanticoke HS) was sixth in 4:17.05 and freshman Anthony Bisti (Haddonfield, NJ/Haddon Heights HS) was 16th in 4:45.98. Junior Wes Zimmerman (Boyertown, PA/Boyertown HS) placed fourth in the 5,000 meters with a time of 16:05.29 and he was followed by junior Justin Arnold (Basking Ridge, NJ/Ridge HS) in tenth place at 16:53.88 and sophomore Marty Miller (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) in 18th place at 17:32.33. Junior Matt Plewinski (Hatfield, PA/North Penn HS) was seventh in the 3,000-meter steeplechase with a time of 11:16.55.

In the field events, **Moore** qualified for the ECAC Championships in the long jump with a leap of 6.65 meters (21 feet, ten inches), to place fourth. He was also fifth in the triple jump with a distance of 11.57 meters (37 feet, 11 ½ inches). **Paul** placed eighth in the long jump with a leap of 6.07 meters (19 feet, 11 inches) and **Corey** was 13th at 5.62 meters (18 feet, 5 ¼ inches). Junior **Matt Bowers** (**Annville, PA/Annville-Cleona HS**) took second in the hammer throw with a toss of 41.05 meters (134 feet, eight inches) while sophomore **John Lesoine** (**East Stroudsburg, PA/East Stroudsburg HS**) was fourth at 40.17 meters (131 feet, nine inches). Sophomore **Scott Williams** (**Bangor, PA/ Bangor HS**) took eighth at 28.73 meters (94 feet, three inches). **Lesoine** also finished ninth in the discus with a toss of 31.96 meters (104 feet, ten inches) and ninth in the shot put at 11.00 meters (36 feet, 1 ¼ inches). **Corey** was 12th in both events, throwing the discus 29.78 meters (97 feet, eight inches) and tossing the shot 10.14 meters (33 feet, 3 ¼ inches). **Williams** was 11th in the shot put with a distance of 10.25 meters (33 feet, 7 ½ inches) while **Paul** was 14th in the discus at 27.19 meters (89 feet, two inches).
