Moravian won its fourth straight game, taking the first game of a Commonwealth Conference doubleheader with Elizabethtown College, 5-0. Freshman shortstop Heather Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS) was three-for-three in the game with four RBIs while senior second baseman Laurie Rentschler (Slatington, Pa/Northern Lehigh HS) was two-for-three. The Greyhounds took a 2-0 lead in the top of the third inning when senior catcher Stacy Matuczinski (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) led off the inning with a double. Rentschler hit an infield single for the 100th hit of her Moravian career, the 13th Greyhound to get 100 career hits and second in two games. After a sacrifice bunt to get the runners to second and third and a ground out, Bortz delivered a two-run triple to right centerfield. Moravian extended the lead to 4-0 in the fifth inning when Rentschler led off with a single and moved to second base when freshman outfielder Krissy Cianfichi (Warrington, PA/Central Bucks East HS) reached on a fielder's choice. After another sacrifice bunt to move the runners to second and third, Bortz delivered two-run single. Bortz would score Moravian's final run in the seventh inning after reaching base on a two-out single. Sophomore third baseman Janelle Brey (Allentown, PA/Dieruff HS) hit double to left center to score Bortz. Senior Rachel Mowrey (Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley HS) moved to 10-2 on the season, scattering six hits while striking out two in her fifth shutout of the year.

The Greyhounds swept their third straight Commonwealth Conference twinbill, winning the second game at Elizabethtown, 3-1. Moravian jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the top of the first inning of game number two as sophomore outfielder **Melissa Soroka** (Newton, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) led off the game with a walk and Bortz followed with a bunt base hit. After a double-steal put the runners at second and third, Brey hit a ground out to score Soroka and sophomore outfielder Jessica Esposito (Madison, NJ/Madison HS) doubled home Bortz. Moravian took a 3-0 lead in the third inning when senior first baseman Sarah Leiby (Fleetwood, PA/Fleetwood HS) started the inning off with a double and Esposito followed with a RBI single. Esposito and Rentschler were each two-for-three in the game as Moravian had nine hits, five for extra-bases including doubles by Esposito, Leiby, Soroka and Cianfichi and a triple by Rentschler. Sophomore hurler Donna Weiner (East Hanover, NJ/Hanover Park HS) improved to 9-2 on the year with the victory. Weiner allowed the one run on five hits and three walks while striking out one.

Sophomore pitcher Jessica Naugle (Mohrsville, PA/Schuylkill Valley HS) tossed a five-hit shutout and Brey connected on her seventh homerun of the season to lead the Greyhounds to a 7-0 victory over Dickinson College in the first game of a non-conference doubleheader. The victory was also the 250th of head coach John Byrne's nine-year career as Moravian's head coach. Brey gave Naugle all the offense she would need in the bottom of the first inning, driving a 0-2 pitch over the fence in dead center for a solo homer. Moravian added two runs in the bottom of the second inning when Esposito scored on an error and Matuczinski crossed the plate on a wild pitch. Matuczinski would give Moravian a 4-0 lead in the fourth inning when she scored on a delayed steal of home while Bortz got into an intentional rundown. The Greyhounds scored their final three runs in the bottom of the fifth inning on a RBI single by Matuczinski, a passed ball to score sophomore designated player Jenn Hastings (Pottstown, PA/Owen J. Roberts HS) and a RBI ground out by freshman infielder Leah Holmes (Clarks Green, PA/Abington Heights HS). Moravian only had six hits in the game. Naugle tossed her second complete game and improved to 3-0 on the season, scattering the five hits and stranding eight runners on base (the other three reached on Moravian errors). Naugle also struck out five batters.

Moravian swept its third straight doubleheader and ran its winning streak to seven straight games, defeating Dickinson, 5-0, in the second game of a doubleheader. The game was scoreless into the bottom of the fourth inning before **Hastings** connected on a two-run homerun, the first of her career, to left center to score **Bortz** and give freshman pitcher **Ashley Hughes** (**Slatington**, **PA/Northern Lehigh HS**) all the offense she would need. The Greyhounds added three more runs in the sixth inning when **Brey** led off the inning with a double and scored on a Dickinson error. **Rentschler** and senior pinch hitter **Deb Noble** (**Cranford**, **NJ/Cranford HS**) each added a RBI singles in the inning. The Greyhounds had just six hits in the victory, two off the bat of **Bortz**. **Hughes** improved to 2-0 on the season, scattering three hits and walking four while striking out five batters.

Moravian had its Commonwealth Conference twinbill at Juniata College postponed until Sunday, April 21st due to rain. The Greyhounds had made the trip to Huntingdon for the doubleheader and were leading 3-0 early in the first game when the skies opened up and forced the postponement.

The Greyhounds dropped a 6-5 non-conference decision to Delaware Valley College as the team played the fifth of 11 games in a 12-day stretch. Moravian had three homeruns in the contest but it wasn't enough to pull out the victory. The Greyhounds trailed 3-0 before sophomore second baseman Matthew Turtell (Lindenhurst, NY/Lindenhurst HS) connected on his first career homerun, a two-run shot in the top of the seventh inning. Sophomore outfielder Greg Peters (Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley HS) hit his fourth homer of the year in the top of the eighth, another two-run dinger. The Greyhounds final run came on a solo shot by junior first baseman Bob Frey (Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley HS), his record breaking eighth of the season and the 16th of his career. Frey breaks his own school record of seven homers in a year. Frey and junior third baseman Jeff Meila (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) were each two-for-five in the contest. Junior pitcher Ryan Boyle (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) tossed the complete game for the Greyhounds, allowing six runs on eight hits with two walks and three strikeouts. Delaware Valley won the game with back-to-back-to-back homeruns in the eighth inning.

Moravian dropped it second straight non-conference game, falling to NCAA Division I Lehigh University, 11-5. The Mountain Hawks had a 2-0 lead after the first inning and never looked back, leading by as many as eight runs in the game. The Greyhounds cut Lehigh's lead to 2-1 in the bottom of the second inning on an error by Lehigh's centerfielder that scored freshman outfielder **Chris Clancy (Kendall Park, NJ/Bishop Ahr HS)**, who had singled. Moravian scored three runs in the seventh inning with **Turtell** hitting a two-RBI double down the left field line. **Turtell** would cross the plate on a RBI single by **Frey**. The Greyhounds final tally came in the ninth inning when sophomore second baseman **Anthony Capo (Little Falls, NJ/Passaic Valley HS)** drove home senior outfielder **Michael Abbate (South Plainfield, NJ/Bishop Ahr HS)** with a doubled off the left field fence. **Turtell** was two-for-four in the game as Moravian had seven hits. Lehigh had 16 hits in the game led by a six-for-six performance by Jesse Novalis, who homered and doubled in the game while scoring four runs. Moravian senior **Bill Quinn (Lebanon, CT/ Lyman Memorial HS)** suffered the loss on the mound, allowing six runs on ten hits with six strikeouts in six innings of work. Freshman **Chris Benigno (Howell, NJ/St. Rose HS)** moved in from his shortstop position to pitch the final three innings, allowing five runs, two of them earned, on six hits with one walk and four strikeouts.

The Greyhounds had a three-game series with Messiah College and a single game with Drew University postponed until early this coming week due to rain and poor field conditions this past weekend.

In a battle of the top two teams in the Middle Atlantic Conference Commonwealth, the Greyhounds had their six-match winning streak snapped, dropping a close match to Lebanon Valley College, 4-3. Moravian had three singles victories with wins from juniors **David Kurvink** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/Liberty HS**) and **Todd Edwards** (**Conyngham**, **PA/Hazleton HS**) and sophomore **Mike Helmuth** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/Harrisonburg** {VA} HS). **Kurvink** and **Helmuth** also combined for a win in doubles action. The singles victory for **Kurvink** was the 30th of his career, making him the fourth Moravian player since 1980 to reach 30 career victories.

The Greyhounds bounced back from their first loss of the season in Middle Atlantic Conference Commonwealth action to earn a 6-1 victory over Susquehanna University and moved within one win of making the MAC Playoffs for the second straight year. Moravian had straight set singles victories from **Kurvink** and **Edwards**, sophomores **Jason Toedter** (**Easton**, **PA/Easton HS**) and **Helmuth** and freshman **Tasch Tinsley** (**Bangor**, **PA/Bangor HS**). The Greyhounds had doubles victories from the teams of **Kurvink** and **Helmuth** and **Toedter** and **Edwards**. The Greyhounds need a victory over Albright College in their next MAC Commonwealth match to earn a playoff berth.

Moravian clinched its second straight 10-win season with a 5-2 non-conference victory over King's College for the squad's tenth victory of the year. The Greyhounds had four straight-set singles wins with victories from **Kurvink**, junior **Dan Gorman** (**Saylorsburg**, **PA/Pleasant Valley HS**), **Helmuth** and **Tinsley**. Moravian swept the three doubles contests with wins from the tandems of **Toedter** and **Tinsley**, **Helmuth** and **Kurvink** and **Edwards** and **Gorman**.

Moravian was seventh and posted a team score of 333 at the Lebanon Valley College Invitational played at the Lebanon Country Club. Millersville University's Black team won the event with a score of 308. Freshman **Todd Solecitto (Washington, NJ/Warren Hills Regional HS)** led the Greyhounds and tied for 11th with a round of 79 while sophomores **Brian Kurylo** (**Sparta, NJ/Sparta HS**) and **Jamison Licausi (Tobyhanna, PA/Pocono Mountain HS**) tied for 22nd and each shot 81. Junior **Charles Tice (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS**) had a round of 92, which tied for 73rd, while senior **Sean Carney (Ariel, PA/Wallenpaupack HS)** rounded out the Moravian squad with a 93, tied for 76th.

The Greyhounds had a team score of 335 at the Elizabethtown College Blue Jay Classic played at the Hershey Country Club. Junior **Jason Pozniak** (**Tunkhannock**, **PA/Tunkhannock HS**) led Moravian with round of 82, good enough to tie for 18th place while **Carney** and **Kurylo** each fired 18-hole totals of 83, tying for 29th. Senior **Ricky Gower** (**Bath**, **PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS**) turned in an 87 on his card to tie for 48th place while **Licausi** had an 88 to tie for 50th.

Senior Sarah Shaneberger (Bethlehem, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) captured first place in the hammer throw in a school record toss of 38.32 meters (125 feet, nine inches) to lead Moravian on the first day of the Greyhound Invitational at Steel Field. Senior Carrie McCaffery (Lebanon, PA/Annville-Cleona HS) was third with a distance of 35.67 meters (117 feet) while sophomore Alicia Fowler (Easton, PA/Easton HS) was fifth at 32.51 meters (106 feet, eight inches) and freshman Julie Anderson (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) placed ninth with a toss of 30.44 meters (99 feet, ten inches). Shaneberger broke McCaffery's school mark by over two feet. On the track, freshman Chelsea Mullins (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) took third in the 10,000 meters with an Eastern College Athletic Conference qualifying time of 38:32.69. Sophomore Angie Morgan (Bethlehem PA/Liberty HS) placed fifth in a time of 40:09.00 and freshman Holly Bofinger (Warminster, PA/William Tennent HS) placed fifth in 40:59.00, both ECAC qualifying times. Sophomore Jennifer Brief (Clark, NJ/Arthur L. Johnson HS) placed fifth in the 5,000 meters with a time of 20:43.44 while freshman Meghan Krebs (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS) was seventh in 20:59.18.

Moravian had an outstanding second day at its own Greyhound Invitational with nine first place finishes, three Steel Field and Breidegam Track records, three NCAA Division III qualifiers and 13 ECAC qualifiers. The Greyhounds also defeated rival Muhlenberg College 106-58 in a meet for the annual Matte Award.

The Greyhounds individual winners were senior **Erin Boyle** (**Philadelphia**, **PA/Nazareth Academy HS**) in the 1,500 meters with an ECAC qualifying time of 4:43.17, senior **Emily Shertzer** (**Hummelstown**, **PA/Lower Dauphin HS**) in the 3,000-meter steeple-chase with an NCAA Division III provisional, ECAC qualifying and stadium record of 11:01.00, senior **Steph Horne** (**Sinking Spring**, **PA/Wilson West Lawn HS**) in the 100-meter hurdles with an ECAC qualifying standard of 15.57 seconds, **McCaffery** in the discus with an ECAC qualifying toss of 37.37 meters (122 feet, seven inches), sophomore **Christina Scherwin** (**Denmark**) in the javelin with a NCAA automatic, an ECAC qualifying and stadium record toss of 53.80 meter (176 feet, six inches), **Shaneberger** in the shot put with a NCAA provisional and ECAC qualifying toss of 12.54 meters (41 feet, 1 ¾ inches), freshman **Kirsten Rotzell** (**Bangor**, **PA/Bangor HS**) in the long jump with an ECAC qualifying leap of 11.00 meters (36 feet, 1 ¼ inches) and sophomore **Amanda Wynn** (**Hellertown**, **PA/Saucon Valley HS**) in the pole vault with an ECAC qualifying height of 2.89 meters (nine feet, six inches). The Greyhounds 4x800-meter relay team of **Boyle**, senior **Heidi Wolfsberger** (**Moosic**, **PA/Riverside HS**), junior **Jennifer Wagner** (**Riegelsville**, **PA/Wilson HS**) and freshman **Heather McGarvie** (**Medford**, **NJ/Shawnee HS**) won the race in a stadium record time of 9:32.23.

In the sprint events, **Rotzell** qualified for the ECAC meet in the 100 meters with a time of 13.19 seconds and **Horne** won her heat of the 100 in 13.38 seconds. Senior **Amanda Samok** (**Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS**) placed third in her heat of the 400 meters with a time of 1:02.22. Sophomore **Nicole Sabaliauskas** (**Butler, NJ/Butler HS**) captured first in her heat of the 100-meter hurdles with a time of 17.59 seconds while freshman **Ann Guzevich** (**Kenilworth, NJ/David Brearley Regional HS**) ran a time of 23.31 seconds.

Wagner was sixth in the 800 meters with an ECAC qualifying time of 2:24.02 while senior Jen Boberg (Lansford, PA/Panther Valley HS) ran a time of 2:27.76 in the first heat. In the second heat of the 800 meters, freshman Kellie Smith (Perkasie, PA/Pennridge HS) was second in 2:32.11 while freshman Sarah Krebs (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS) was fourth in 2:35.27. Sabaliauskas posted a 2:36.48 in the 800 while Guzevich had a 2:44.39. Rounding out Moravian's competitors in the 800 meters were freshman Britta Jacobson (Sister Bay, WI/Gibraltar HS) with a time of 2:46.52 and freshman Kim Bushner (Allentown, PA/Dieruff HS) with a 2:54.55. Senior Kim Jaick (Coopersburg, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) took second in the 1,500 meters with an ECAC qualifying time of 4:48.19 while McGarvie was third in a ECAC qualifying standard of 4:51.13. Freshman Megan Wise (North Wales, PA/North Penn HS) ran a 5:03.84 while freshman O'Dea Parson (Lawrenceville, NJ/Lawrence HS) posted a 5:53.0. Senior Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) took sixth in the 3,000-meter steeplechase in 12:36.56 while freshman Alison Stoyko (Reading, PA/Governor Mifflin HS) was one spat back in 12:40.75. Sophomore Lauren Laviola (Jersey City, NJ/St. Dominic Academy HS) posted a 13:06.10 in the steeplechase.

The Greyhound squad of **Samok**, **Horne**, **Boberg** and **Meghan Krebs** was second in their heat of the 4x400-meter relay with a time of 4:18.69. Moravian's 'B" team in the 4x800-meter relay of **Sarah Krebs**, **Jaick**, **Smith** and **Stoyko** was third with a time of 10:10.76.

In addition to her win in the shot put, **Shaneberger** was second in the discus with an ECAC qualifying toss of 36.29 meters (119 feet). **McCaffery** placed fourth in the javelin at 36.08 meters, (118 feet, four inches), an ECAC qualifying distance, and she was fourth in the shot put at 11.08 meters (36 feet, 4 ½ inches). **Fowler** placed eighth in the discus with a toss of 30.99 meters (101 feet, eight inches) while **Anderson** was 11th at 28.87 meters (94 feet, eight inches). **Sabaliauskas** had a 14th place finish in the shot put at 7.59 meters (24 feet, 11 inches) while **Guzevich** had a toss of 5.77 meters (18 feet, 11 ¼ inches). **Sabaliauskas** was also sixth in the long jump with a leap of 4.69 meters (15 feet, 4 ½ inches).

Junior Matt Bowers (Annville, PA/Annville-Cleona HS) set a school record in the hammer throw to lead Moravian on the first day of the Greyhound Invitational at Steel Field. Bowers finished second the hammer event with a toss of 41.44 meters (135 feet, 11 inches); over four feet past his own previous school record. Sophomore John Lesoine (East Stroudsburg, PA/East Stroudsburg HS) took third in the hammer with a throw of 41.35 meters (135 feet, eight inches) while sophomore Scott Williams (Bangor, PA/Bangor HS) was eighth at 27.10 meters (88 feet, 11 inches). Junior Wes Zimmerman (Boyertown, PA/Boyertown HS) placed second in the 5,000 meters with a time of 15:47.31. Sophomore Marty Miller (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) was fourth in the 10,000 meters in 35:19.19 while junior Justin Arnold (Basking Ridge, NJ/Ridge HS) was fifth with a time of 35:19.70.

The Greyhounds had four first place finishers, three Eastern College Athletic Conference qualifiers and one Steel Field and Breidegam Track record in Moravian's own Greyhound Invitational. Moravian also defeated rival Muhlenberg College, 95-80 in a meet for the annual Matte Award.

Freshman **Scott Silvoy** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS**) was part of three of Moravian's four first place finishes, winning the 200 meters in an ECAC qualifying time of 22.31 seconds and capturing the 400 meters with an ECAC qualifying standard of 49.11 seconds. **Silvoy** also ran on the first place 4x100-meter relay team with senior **Kevin Bush** (**Stroudsburg**, **PA/Stroudsburg HS**), junior **Brian Mack** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/Liberty HS**) and sophomore **Joe Moore** (**Andover**, **NJ/Newton HS**) that set the stadium record with a time of 42.70 seconds. **Moore** had the Greyhounds other first place finish with an ECAC qualifying jump of 6.99 meters (22 feet, 11 1/4 inches) in the long jump.

Other Moravian finishers in the sprint events included **Bush** taking second in his heat of the 100 meters in 11.39 seconds and senior **Jim McIntyre** (**Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS**) running a time of 12.21 seconds. **Bush** also ran a 24.80 in the 200 meters. In the 400 meters, senior Josh Heebner posted a time of 52.83 seconds while freshman **Dan Corey** (**Fair Lawn, NJ/Glen Ridge HS**) ran a 57.02 race. Sophomore **Steve Hartenstine** (**Danielsville, PA/Northampton HS**) placed fifth in the first heat of the 110-meter high hurdles with a time of 16.88 seconds while junior **Eric Paul** (**Reading, PA/Reading Central Catholic HS**) was third in the second heat in 19.02 seconds and **Corey** was fourth at 19.11 seconds. **Hartenstine** also placed fourth in the first heat of the 400-meter intermediate hurdles in 58.93 seconds while **Paul** was second in the third heat at 59.13 seconds.

Junior George Wacker (Honesdale, PA/Honesdale HS) had his best time of the season in the 800 meters with a 1:59.23 while freshman Anthony Bisti (Haddonfield, NJ/Haddon Heights HS) ran the 800 meters in 2:20.07. Freshman Patrick Grogan (Nazareth, PA/Notre Dame HS) was tenth in the 1,500 meters with a time of 4:11.95 while Zimmerman was fourth in the second heat at 4:24.44 and Bisti was ninth in the second heat at 4:43.81. Sophomore Joe Grady (Nanticoke, PA/Nanticoke HS) ran Moravian's best time of the year in the 3,000-meter steeplechase, placing sixth in 10:06.62 while junior Matt Plewinski (Hatfield, PA/North Penn HS) was 13th in 10:53.00.

In the other relays, the Moravian 'B' team in the 4x100-meter relay of McIntyre, juniors Josh Fick (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) and Jarrod Pence (Livingston, NJ/Livingston HS) and freshman Michael Miltenberger (Carlisle, PA/Carlisle HS) was second in heat number two with a time of 46.69 seconds. Moravian's 4x400-meter relay team of McIntyre, Heebner, Wacker and Paul took third in the race with a time of 3:29.53 while the 4x800-meter relay squad of Grogan Grady, sophomore Sean McDonnell (Scranton, PA/Scranton Prep HS) and freshman Matt Oertner (Slatington, PA/Northern Lehigh HS) was second in 8:17.86.

Moore was third in the high jump with a height of 1.73 meters (five feet, eight inches). **Lesoine** placed 21st in the discus with a toss of 31.11 meters (102 feet) while **Williams** was 25th at 19.36 meters (63 feet, six inches). **Lesoine** also took 16th in the shot put with a distance of 11.23 meters (36 feet, 10 ½ inches) while **Williams** was 18th at 9.55 meters (31 feet, four inches). **McIntyre** was eighth in the javelin with a throw of 41.25 meters (135 feet, four inches) while **Corey** took 11th at 36.90 meters (121 feet, one inch) and **Paul** was 13th with a throw of 33.50 meters (109 feet, 11 inches). **Paul** finished tenth in the long jump with a leap of 5.49 meters while **Corey** was sixth in the triple jump at 11.26 meters (36 feet, 11 ½ inches).
