Women's Cross Country 0-0 (MAC 0-0)

Last Week – 1st of 7 teams at Lehigh Valley Championships hosted by Lehigh University, Bethlehem, PA This Week – Sat., Sept. 15th at Middlebury (VT) College Invitational, Middlebury, VT

The Greyhounds won first place of seven schools at the Lehigh Valley Collegiate Championships hosted by NCAA Division I Lehigh University. The Greyhounds defeated the Mountain Hawks as well as NCAA Division I Lehigh University and NCAA Division II schools East Stroudsburg University and Kutztown University in the 6,000-meter race. Moravian also topped rivals DeSales University and Muhlenberg College. Senior **Kim Jaick** (**Coopersburg**, **PA**/ **Southern Lehigh HS**) ran the best race of her career, finishing first of 84 runners with a time of 21:56.7. The Greyhounds would put five runners in the top ten to beat Lehigh by 20 points. Senior **Heidi Wolfsberger** (**Moosic**, **PA**/ **Riverside HS**) was third overall in 22:08.5 while senior **Emily Shertzer** (**Hummelstown**, **PA/Lower Dauphin HS**) placed sixth in 22:37.7. Senior **Erin Boyle** (**Philadelphia**, **PA/Nazareth Academy**) was seventh at 22:47.7 and freshman **Chelsea Mullins** (**Jim Thorpe**, **PA/Jim Thorpe HS**) finished tenth in 23:14.4 for Moravian.

Moravian's other runners in the race included junior Jennifer Wagner (Riegelsville, PA/Wilson HS) placing 15th in 23:48.6, freshman Megan Wise (North Wales, PA/North Penn HS) taking 21st in 24:22.1, sophomore Angie Morgan (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) finishing 28th in 24:48.8, senior Amanda Samok (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS) taking 30th in 24:52.1, freshman Alison Stoyko (Reading, PA/Governor Mifflin HS) at 35th in 25:01.6, freshman Heather McGarvie (Medford, NJ/Shawnee HS) in 36th place at 25:02.1 and senior Jen Boberg (Lansford, PA/Panther Valley HS) at 41st with a time of 25:32.8. The Greyhounds also had the following competitors in the race - senior Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS) in 48th at 25:49.0, freshman Kellie Smith (Perkasie, PA/Pennridge HS) at 52nd in 26:01.8, freshman Britta Jacobson (Sister Bay, WI/Gibraltar HS) in 57th with a time of 26:19.4, sophomore Lauren Laviola (Jersey City, NJ/St. Dominic Academy) at 59th with a time of 26:25.1, freshman Sarah Krebs (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS) in 61st at 26:29.3, freshman Meghan Krebs (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS) at 64th in 26:49.5, sophomore Robin Edward (Massapequa, NY/Plainedge HS) in 66th at 27:01.2, sophomore Jen Brief (Clark, NJ/Arthur L. The Greyhounds placed third of seven teams and were the top NCAA Division III team at the Lehigh Valley Collegiate Championships hosted by Lehigh University. Moravian finished behind NCAA Division I Lehigh University and Lafayette College but defeated NCAA Division II East Stroudsburg University and Kutztown University as well as normal rivals DeSales University and Muhlenberg College. Freshman Pat Grogan (Nazareth, PA/Notre Dame HS) was the top runner for the Greyhounds, just missing the top ten, placing 11th in 27:14.3. Junior George Wacker (Honesdale, PA/Honesdale HS) finished one spot back in 12th at 27:20.2. Sophomore Joe Grady (Nanticoke, PA/Nanticoke HS) also placed in the top 15, finishing 15th with a time of 27:23.5. Rounding out the top five for Moravian were junior Wes Zimmerman (Boyertown, PA/Boyertown HS) in 25th place at 27:49.0 and freshman Matt Oertner (Slatington, PA/Northern Lehigh HS) at 40th in 28:28.6. Other finishers for Moravian included junior Matt Plewinski (Hatfield, PA/North Penn HS) in 49th at 28:54.8, sophomore Sean McDonnell (Scranton, PA/Scranton Prep HS) in 52nd at 29:05.5, senior Chris DeWalt (Easton, PA/Easton HS) at 29:24.5 and freshman Anthony Bisti (Haddonfield, NJ/Haddon Heights HS) at 78th with a time of 33:22.3.

The Greyhounds started their 2001 season with a 7-2 non-conference victory over DeSales University. Moravian had singles wins from senior Katie Copf (Allentown, PA/Salisbury HS), junior Missy Graeff (Reading, PA/Schuylkill Valley HS), sophomores Lauren Castagna (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) and Jaime Diken (Metuchen, NJ/Metuchen HS) and freshmen Becky Deringer (Allentown, PA/Dieruff HS) and Jenn Keller (Downingtown, PA/Chesmont HS). Moravian also had a double win from the team of Keller and freshman Jill Iacovelli (Randolph, NJ/Randolph HS).

Moravian won its second straight match and opened the 2001 MAC Commonwealth season with a 7-2 victory over Juniata College. Moravian won five of the six singles matches with wins from Copf, Deringer, senior Lacey Leverberg (East Stroudsburg, PA/Stroudsburg HS) and juniors Jenn Genevese (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) and Jill Simms (Hampton, NJ/Voorhees HS). The Greyhounds also captured two of the three doubles matches with victories from the teams of Copf & Leverberg and the Simms sisters, Jill and senior Julie (Hampton, NJ/Voorhees HS).

Freshman midfielder Kelly Haymaker (Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley HS) scored a hat trick and senior midfielder Stevie Ochse (Bethlehem, PA/Saucon Valley HS) added two goals to lead Moravian to a 7-1 victory over Alvernia College in non-conference action. The Greyhounds scored seven unanswered goals after giving up the first goal of the match. Sophomore midfielder Erica Napoli (Wyomissing, PA/Wilson West Lawn HS) started the scoring in the 20th minute off a pass from freshman midfielder Faye Zaninelli (Point Pleasant, NJ/Point Pleasant Boro HS). Ochse scored the winning goal just two minutes later. Haymaker tallied her first goal in the 24th minute off a pass from Napoli. Haymaker added an unassisted goal in the 30th minute and Ochse scored off a pass from Napoli in the 34th minute to give the Greyhounds a 5-1 halftime lead. Haymaker finished off her hat trick in the 48th minute before sophomore midfielder Justina Bria (Warminster, PA/William Tennent HS) finished off the scoring with an unassisted goal in the 55th minute. Junior goalie Neali Miller (Wyomissing, PA/Wilson West Lawn HS) had one save in the first 45 minutes to earn the victory. Sophomore Kelly Wakeman (Easton, PA/home schooled) played 20 minutes while freshman keeper Jill Vaccaro (South Salem, NY/John Jay HS) played 25 minutes with one save.

Ochse scored her second straight game-winning goal with an unassisted tally in the 18th minute as the Greyhounds improved their winning streak to four straight matches with a 3-0 shutout of Centenary (NJ) College. Miller made one save for her first shutout of the season and the fourth of her career. Zaninelli gave the Greyhounds a 2-0-halftime lead with a goal in the 33rd minute off a pass from Bria. Bria also assisted on Moravian's final goal that was scored by Napoli in the 64th minute.

The Greyhounds opened the 2001 season with a disappointing 14-13 loss to King's College. Moravian led 13-0 heading to the fourth quarter but was unable to hold on for the win. The Greyhounds led 6-0 at halftime after a pair of second quarter field goals. Senior **Marc Roesch** (**Egg Harbor City, NJ/St. Augustine HS**) connected on a career-long of 40 yards with 12:38 minutes left and senior **Jim McIntyre** (**Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS**) made a 32-yarder with 11 seconds left in the half. **Roesch** also made his debut as the Greyhounds punter and was called on ten times. He averaged 29.1 yards per kick with a long of 42 yards and five downed inside the 20-yard line.

Moravian extended the lead to 13-0 with 1:33 left in the third quarter on a two-yard touchdown dive by sophomore tailback **Tim Barlok** (**Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS**). **McIntyre** made the extra-point. **Barlok**, who averaged over 60 yards per game last season, was held to six yards on seven carries by the King's defense. The Monarch defense held the entire Moravian running game to just 16 yards on 31 carries.

Junior quarterback Charlie Bowden (Parlin, NJ/Sayreville War Memorial HS) led the Greyhound offense, completing 19 of 39 passes for 226 yards. Bowden's top target was junior wide receiver Jarod Rhinehart (Washington, NJ/Warren Hills Regional HS), who caught four passes for 90 yards. Sophomore wide receiver Jeff Lowry (Catawissa, PA/Southern Columbia HS) grabbed three passes for 28 yards while sophomore wideout Kevin Miltenberger (Carlisle, PA/Carlisle HS) grabbed three passes for 26 yards. Senior wide receiver Michael Abbate (South Plainfield, NJ/Bishop Ahr HS) also had three receptions for 20 yards. Bowden completed a pass to nine different players in the game. Sophomore tailback Dave Darmofal (Clarks Summit, PA/Abington Heights HS) led the Greyhounds on the ground with just 10 yards on five carries.

Defensively, junior linebacker Bill Engler (Coopersburg, PA/Southern Lehigh HS), sophomore linebacker Steve Maslanek (Stockholm, NJ/Vernon Township HS) and sophomore cornerback John Panikiewsky (Carteret. NJ/Carteret HS) each made ten tackles for the Greyhounds. Panikiewsky had two tackles for loss while Maslanek recovered on fumble. Junior defensive lineman Pat Mancini (Milford, NJ/Delaware Valley Regional HS), who had seven tackles, and Panikiewsky each forced fumbles in the game. Junior linebacker John Cupples (Allentown, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS) had seven tackles with one sack and a forced fumble while Cowlishaw had eight tackles in his first career start. Senior safety Mike Wukitsch (Allentown, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS) and junior defensive lineman Tom Blackledge (Sellersville, PA/Pennridge HS) each had fumble recoveries in the game. Blackledge and McIntyre each made five stops.

Freshman goalie **Kirsli Spinks** (**Lebanon, NJ/North Hunterdon HS**) made ten saves while posting her first career shutout as Moravian earned a 3-0 victory over Haverford College in non-conference action. The victory was also the first in the Moravian coaching career of head coach **Natalie Gozzard**. Moravian freshman forward **Jamie Lichty** (**Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS**) gave **Spinks** all the offense she would need with 28:09 remaining in the first half on an unassisted tally. Sophomore forward **Rebecca Kipp** (**Bethlehem, PA/Saucon Valley HS**) added an unassisted goal with 20:53 left in the first half to give the Greyhounds a 2-0-halftime lead. Senior midfielder **Elissa Gerstel** (**Warminster, PA/William Tennent HS**) scored the final goal with just 17 seconds left in the match on a penalty stroke.

The Greyhounds dropped a tough 3-1 loss at Susquehanna University in the Commonwealth Conference opener for each school. The match was tied at 1-1 at halftime after **Gerstel** scored with 24:28 left in the first half to tie the match. The Crusaders scored twice in the second half for the win. **Spinks** made 20 saves in the loss.

The Greyhounds earned their second straight victory with a 30-12, 30-25, 30-20 victory over the University of Scranton. Sophomore outside hitter **Kim Zipf (Wyomissing, PA/Holy Name HS)**, who was named the Commonwealth Conference Player of the Week last Tuesday, led the Greyhounds with 14 kills and 11 digs. Sophomore setter **Amy Lawrence (Gettysburg, PA/Delone Catholic HS)** added 29 assists and 13 digs while sophomore defensive specialist **Alissa Bucsi (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** had five service aces. Moravian had 13 service aces in the match. Freshman middle **Kim Horvath (Summit Hill, PA/Marian Catholic HS)** contributed eight kills.

Moravian opened the 2001 Gettysburg College Battlefield Classic with a 30-11, 30-17, 30-10 victory over Goucher College. **Zipf** led the Greyhounds with nine kills and five digs while senior outside hitter **Sara Walkiewicz** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS**) had seven kills and five service aces. Sophomore middle hitter **Shannon McNeil** (**Reading, PA/Reading Central Catholic HS**) had six kills while **Lawrence** contributed 27 assists and six service aces. Senior defensive specialist **Krystol Kessack** (**Bethlehem, PA/ Liberty HS**) had six digs in the win.

The Greyhounds ran their winning streak to four straight matches with a 30-16, 30-23, 30-17 victory over Western Maryland College on the first day of the Gettysburg College Battlefield Classic. **Zipf** had 11 kills and seven digs while **Walkiewicz** had ten kills, nine digs and two service aces. Sophomore outside hitter **Sara Hollenbacher** (**Reading, PA/Reading Central Catholic HS**) added six kills in the match while **Bucsi** had three service aces. **Lawrence** contributed 26 assists and five digs.

The Greyhounds opened the championship bracket pool play with a 30-28, 30-23, 30-19 victory over Lycoming College. **Zipf** had 14 kills and eight digs in the match while **Walkiewicz** added 10 kills. **Hollenbacher** added nine kills and three blocks while **McNeil** had seven kills and five blocks. **Lawrence** contributed 37 assists, four service aces and seven digs while **Bucsi** had three service aces. **Kessack** led the Greyhounds with nine digs.

Moravian won its pool of the championship bracket with a 30-22, 30-21, 30-18 victory over Johns Hopkins University to move into the championship final versus Gettysburg College. **Hollenbacher** led the Greyhounds against Johns Hopkins with 15 kills and she added six digs. **Zipf** added 11 kills and six digs while **Walkiewicz** had seven kills, seven service aces and eight digs. **McNeil** added nine kills while **Kessack** led Moravian with 11 digs. **Lawrence** had 45 assists, six digs and two service aces in Moravian's 3-0 win.

The Greyhounds had their five match winning streak snapped in the championship game of the championship bracket at the Gettysburg Battlefield Classic in a 19-30, 24-30, 15-30 loss to host Gettysburg College. **Zipf** led Moravian with 12 kills and nine digs while **Lawrence** had 24 assists and four service aces. **Zipf** and **Lawrence** were named to the All-Tournament Team for the second straight weekend. **Kessack** had ten digs and four service aces in the match while **McNeil** had five kills and two blocks.
