Football - 3-5 (MAC 3-5)

Last Week - Lost to #Susquehanna, 41-14. #MAC Game

Moravian committed seven turnovers (four fumbles and three interceptions) in a 41-14 loss to Susquehanna University in a Middle Atlantic Conference game last weekend. The Crusaders converted four of those seven turnovers into touchdowns including three in the first half.

After falling behind 21-0 in the first half, Moravian finally got on the board in the third quarter on a one-yard run by sophomore quarterback **Will Seng (Allentown, PA/William Allen HS)**. Senior defensive back/kicker **Jim McIntyre (Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS)** added the extra-point to cut the Susquehanna lead to 21-7. **Seng** came into the game in the second quarter after starter junior quarterback **Charlie Bowden (Parlin, NJ/Sayreville War Memorial HS)** completed just two of seven passes for 21 yards with two interceptions.

Moravian scored its final touchdown with 7:22 remaining in the contest on a 22-yard pass from **Seng** to senior wide receiver **Michael Abbate** (**South Plainfield, NJ/Bishop Ahr HS**) and **McIntyre** adding the extra-point to cut Susquehanna's lead to 35-14. **Seng** completed eight of 14 passes for 94 yards in relief of **Bowden** but he was intercepted once. **Abbate** grabbed four passes for 65 yards to go over 1,500 yards, just the fifth player in Moravian history to reach 1,500 yards with 1,568 yards on 109 career receptions. **Abbate** also had two carries for five yards and four punt returns for 35 yards.

On the ground for the Greyhounds, sophomore tailback **David Darmofal** (**Clarks Summit, PA/Abington Heights HS**) ran for 65 yards on 11 carries while sophomore tailback **Tim Barlok** (**Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS**) added 51 yards on 14 attempts.

Defensively for the Greyhounds, Junior defensive lineman **Tom Blackledge (Sellersville, PA/Pennridge HS)** had nine tackles with three for loss and two half sacks while junior linebacker **John Cupples (Allentown, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS)**, sophomore linebacker **Bill Engler (Coopersburg, PA/Southern Lehigh HS)** and senior defensive lineman **John Kwiatkowski (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS)** each had eight tackles. Junior defensive back **Jarrod Pence (Livingston, NJ/Livingston HS)** added six pass break-ups in the game. The Moravian defense did hold the Crusaders without a touchdown in the final minute of the second quarter with stops on third and fourth down at the one-yard line.

Senior **Heidi Wolfsberger** (**Moosic, PA/Riverside HS**) was named the Eastern College Athletic Conference Co-NCAA Division III Runner of the Week last week after her performance at the Middle Atlantic Conference Champion-ships on October 27th. **Wolfsberger** earned her third straight Middle Atlantic Conference Individual Championship title and led the Greyhounds to their ninth consecutive team title in the 2001 MAC Championships. **Wolfsberger** completed the 5,000-meter course in 18:31.30, 23 seconds ahead of the second place finisher and teammate, **Emily Shertzer** (**Hummelstown, PA/Lower Dauphin HS**). Moravian, which maintained the No. 1 ranking in Division III for the six weeks before falling to No. 3 last week, has had **Wolfsberger** win four of seven races this season.

The Greyhounds closed out the 2001 regular season with a 30-15, 30-11, 30-22 victory at DeSales University. Freshman outside hitter Christina Wallace (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) led the Greyhounds with nine kills while sophomore middle hitter Shannon McNeil (Reading, PA/Reading Central Catholic HS) had eight kills and sophomore outside hitter Kim Zipf (Wyomissing, PA/Holy Name HS) had seven kills. Sophomore setter Amy Lawrence (Gettysburg, PA/Delone Catholic HS) ran the offense with 33 assists and she added 11 digs. Senior defensive specialist Krystol Kessack (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS) contributed 11 digs while sophomore defensive specialist Alissa Bucsi (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) had eight service aces. Sophomore defensive specialist Andrea Frankenfield (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) had ten digs. Sophomore right side hitter Sara Hollenbacher (Reading, PA/Reading central Catholic HS) and sophomore outside hitter Mary Kate Cordisco (Bethlehem, PA/Notre Dame HS) each had six kills in the match.

Zipf had 21 kills and 14 digs to lead Moravian to a 22-30, 30-24, 30-18, 30-17 victory over Susquehanna University in the Commonwealth Conference semifinals. **Lawrence** controlled the Moravian offense with 46 assists and she added ten digs and three service aces. **Hollenbacher** had 12 kills and four blocks while **McNeil** added eight kills. **Wallace** had seven kills and seven digs while **Bucsi** added 13 digs. **Kessack** and **Frankenfield** each added three service aces and seven digs in the match.

The Greyhounds, playing Juniata College for the sixth straight year in the conference championship match, fell to the Eagles, 23-30, 30-28, 15-30, 16-30 in the 2001 Commonwealth Conference Championship contest. Juniata has won 245 straight conference matches and the last 21 conference titles. Moravian currently has a 24-8 record and will await a call from the NCAA or the ECAC for more postseason action. **Zipf** had 18 kills and 15 digs to lead the Greyhounds in the contest. **Lawrence** had 30 assists and 12 digs while **Walkiewicz** had five kills and ten digs.

The loss was the first of the season for the Greyhounds on the road. Moravian now has a record of 12-5-2 on the season and will wait until Monday, November 5th to see if the team will earn a berth in the Eastern College Athletic Conference Mid-Atlantic Championship.
