Men's Basketball – 4-2 (Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 2-2)

Last Week – Lost to #Scranton, 87-84 (ot); Defeated #Drew, 78-70 (ot); Defeated #Wilkes, 88-82. #MAC game

University of Scranton junior guard Dan Loftus hit a running one-handed half court shot with no time left on the clock to lift the Royals to a 87-84 overtime victory over Moravian in non-conference action. The Greyhounds had tied with three seconds left in overtime on a jumper in the lane by junior forward **Ken Greb (Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS)**. The Greyhounds let a 12-point lead slip away in the second half despite shooting 52.8 percent for the game and 59 percent in the second half. Scranton had a chance to win the game at the end of regulation but Moravian freshman forward **Brandon Zaleski (Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS)** blocked a shot with no time on the clock. **Zaleski** had a career night for the Greyhounds, leading the squad with a career best 22 points and he also had a career high 11 rebounds in the loss. **Greb** added 21 points and seven rebounds for the Greyhounds while sophomore guard **Steve Weiler (Edgewater Park, NJ/Burlington City HS)** had 12 points, five assists and five steals. Junior guard **Willie Reynolds (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** added 11 points while sophomore guard **Lucas Malishchak (Wanamie, PA/Nanticoke HS)** contributed six points, five rebounds and four assists. Senior forward **Mike Frew (Glen Ridge, NJ/Glen Ridge HS)** and senior guard **Doug Spadt (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS)** each added six points in the game with **Frew** dishing out four assists.

For the second straight game and the third time in five games this season, the Greyhounds needed overtime to determine the winner of a game with Moravian earning a 78-70 non-conference victory over Drew University. The Greyhounds trailed or were tied the entire game until the first basket of overtime when **Greb** made a lay-up for a 61-59 Moravian lead. The biggest key in the game came at the foul line where the Greyhounds connected on 31 of 41 attempts (75.6 percent) while the Rangers were just 10 of 23 (43.5 percent). Moravian was nine of 11 in the overtime session at the foul line. **Greb** led Moravian with 20 points and he also had a team high 12 rebounds. Freshman guard **Brian Mooney (Philadelphia, PA/Father Judge HS)** had the best night of his young career with his first collegiate double-double of 17 points and ten rebounds. **Mooney** added four steals while freshman forward **Mike Howell (Floral Park, NY/Holy Cross HS)** also scored a career high with ten points and **Howell** added three boards. **Malishchak** led Moravian with six assists and four steals while **Spadt** added eight points and five rebounds.

Zaleski scored a career high 36 points and he added seven rebounds to lead the Greyhounds to an 88-82 non-conference victory over nationally ranked Wilkes University (24th this week in D3Hoops.com poll). **Zaleski** tossed in 25 of his game high 36 total in the second half. After falling behind early, 4-0, Moravian came back and took an 11-8 lead and was in control most of the rest of the game including leading the final 14:37 of the game after a three-pointer by **Zaleski**. **Malishchak** scored 15 points for Moravian, tying his career high and he added four assists while **Greb** had 14 points and seven rebounds. The Greyhounds had their best shooting day of the season, connecting on 60 percent of their field goals (33 of 55).

The Greyhounds opened their 2001-02 indoor season at the non-scoring Lafayette College Invitational. Moravian had just one competitor finish in the top three with freshman **Pat Grogan (Nazareth, PA/Notre Dame HS)** taking third in the mile with a time of 4:40.7.

Women's Basketball – 3-3 (Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 2-1)

Moravian used a balanced scoring attack and controlled the boards as the Greyhounds defeated Wilkes University, 78-52, in non-conference action. Moravian led by 18 points at halftime and owned a 48-33 rebound advantage in the game. Sophomore guard **Kim Hughes (Manasquan, NJ/St. Rose HS)** led Moravian with 18 points while junior guard **Tara Wozniak (Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS)** and junior forward **Kelly McLean (Allentown, PA/Salisbury HS)** each had ten points. **Wozniak** added seven rebounds and four assists while **McLean** had six rebounds and five steals. Freshman guard **Jen Behagg (Hamburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS)** led the Greyhounds with eight rebounds in the game including six on the offensive end. **Behagg** also added five points, three assists and three steals while sophomore forward **Tracie Shipman (Philadelphia, PA/Archbishop Ryan HS)** had nine points. The Greyhounds had 14 of the 15 players that saw action in the game score at least one point.

The Greyhounds suffered through another poor shooting second half, letting a nine-point lead slip away in a 68-64 loss to Muhlenberg College. Moravian shot just 33 percent for the game and led by six points, 54-48, with 10:43 left to play but the squad scored just ten points the remainder of the game. The Greyhounds committed 25 turnovers in the contest with 14 coming in the second half. The loss to Muhlenberg was Moravian's first at home to the Mules since the 1987-88 season. Moravian did have a balanced attack in the game with five players scoring in double figures led by **Hughes, Wozniak** and **McLean** each scoring 11 points in the contest. Junior forward **Kristen Sarnocinski (Harleysville, PA/Germantown Academy HS)** and **Shipman** each added ten points in the loss. **McLean** led Moravian on the boards with nine rebounds while **Sarnocinski** grabbed eight rebounds. **Wozniak** added seven boards. Moravian out-rebounded Muhlenberg 45-32 in the contest. **Behagg** had eight points, four rebounds and four assists in the loss.

Moravian bounced back from a 33-28 halftime deficit to earn a 72-63 victory over Drew University in non-conference action. Moravian turned the five-point deficit into an 11-point lead in the first 5:17 of the second half. Keys for the Greyhounds were the team's best shooting second half of the season at 48.3 percent (14 of 29) and shooting 83.3 from the foul line in the second half (15 of 18) while Drew was just four of nine at the foul line after half time. **Shipman** scored a career high 16 points to lead the Greyhounds and she added six rebounds while **Sarnocinski** had 13 points, a career high. **Hughes** added 12 points while **Wozniak** led the Greyhounds on the boards with six rebounds and she contributed seven points as did sophomore guard **Kim Smith (Gilbert, PA/Pleasant Valley HS)**. Freshman guard Jen Behagg added four rebounds, two assists and two steals while **McLean** and junior forward **Sue Creelman (Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS)** each had four rebounds in the contest.

Women's Indoor Track & Field – 0-0 (MAC 0-0)

Last Week – No Team Scores at Lafayette College Invitational, Easton, PA

The Greyhounds opened their 2001-02 indoor season at the non-scoring Lafayette College Invitational. Moravian had three individual winners with senior **Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic, PA/Riverside HS)** capturing the only mile race in a time of 5:10.0, senior **Sarah Shaneberger (Bethlehem, PA/Southern Lehigh HS)** winning the shot put with a distance of 12.28 meters (40-3 1/2) and freshman **Kirsten Rotzell (Bangor, PA/Bangor HS)** taking first in the triple jump at 10.84 meters (35-6 3/4). **Shaneberger** also placed second in the 20-lb weight throw with a toss of 13.10 meters (45-11 1/4) while **Rotzell** was third in the long jump at 5.13 meters (16-10). Senior **Erin Boyle (Philadelphia, PA/Nazareth Academy HS)** placed second to **Wolfsberger** in the mile in 5:20.3 while freshman **Holly Bofinger (Warminster, PA/William Tennent HS)** was second in the two-mile race in 12:24.4. Senior **Steph Horne (Sinking Spring, PA/Wilson West lawn HS)** placed third in the 60-yard high hurdles in 8.81 seconds and she had a school record time of 8.77 seconds in the preliminaries.

Football – 5-5 (MAC 4-5)

Season Complete

Junior safety **Jarrold Pence (Livingston, NJ/Livingston HS)** and junior offensive lineman **Josh Zagorski (Morris Plains, NJ/Parsippany Hills HS)** of the Moravian College football team have been named to the 2001 *Don Hansen's National Weekly Football Gazette* All-South Region Third Team announced Friday. The selection is regarded as a Regional All-America honor.

The pair led the Greyhounds to a 5-5 overall record this season with victories in the squad's last two games. Moravian has a 93-59-1 record under head coach **Scot Dapp**, who has completed his 15th year at the school, and **Dapp** has had 12 winning seasons during his tenure.

Pence and **Zagorski** were two of 75 players selected to the three teams in the South Region that had over 150 players nominated for All-Region accolades. The Middle Atlantic Conference had 18 players selected to the All-Region Teams with Widener University wide receiver **Michael Coleman** named the South Region Offensive Player of the Year and King's College defensive lineman **Steven Wilson** tabbed as the South Region Defensive Player of the Year.

Pence, who moved to cornerback this season after two years at safety, was an MAC First Team All-Star this season. **Pence** led Moravian and the MAC with 36 pass break-ups this season with a team high five interceptions. **Pence** also added 51 tackles with 33 solo stops, two tackles for loss and one forced fumble. **Pence** had seven tackles, a forced fumble and a school record tying three interceptions in Moravian's 17-7 victory over rival Muhlenberg College.

Zagorski, a starter at center, has helped the Greyhound offense average 351.1 yards per game including 180.4 yards per contest on the ground. **Zagorski**, who was a MAC Second Team All-Star this Fall, and the rest of the Moravian front have allowed the Moravian quarterbacks to be sacked just 17 times this season and three different running backs to gain over 100-yards in a game this season.
