Women's Basketball – 19-6 (Commonwealth Conference 10-4, MAC 13-5)

The Greyhounds won their 18th game of the season and moved closer to a possible home playoff game with a 67-49 victory over Susquehanna University in Commonwealth Conference action. The last time Moravian won 18 games in a season was back in 1993-94 when the team had a 20-8 record. Moravian jumped out to a 31-19 halftime lead after finishing the half on a 16-0 run over the last 5:31. One of the keys to the game for Moravian was at the free throw line where the Greyhounds had the best day in Middle Atlantic Conference history, connecting on all 18 of their attempts while Susquehanna was just seven of nine at the charity stripe. Moravian also made 36.8 percent of its field goals (21 of 57) and 38.9 percent of its three-pointers (seven of 18) while forcing the Crusaders into 26 turnovers. The Greyhounds had just one player in double figures with junior guard Kim Hughes (Manasquan, NJ/St. Rose HS) netting 20 points. Senior guard Tara Wozniak (Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS) tossed in eight points while freshman guard Catherine Golden (Bethlehem, PA/ Freedom HS) scored seven points. Senior forward Kristen Sarnocinski (Harleysville, PA/Germantown Academy HS), junior guard Sarah Onkotz (Catasauqua, PA/Catasauqua HS), junior forward Tracie Shipman (Philadelphia, PA/Archbishop Ryan HS) and freshman forward Stephanie Seaman (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) each had six points in the victory. The Greyhounds had 42-33 advantage on boards with Shipman leading the eight rebounds. Seaman added six boards while Golden and sophomore guard Jen Behagg (Hamburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) both pulled down five rebounds. Hughes dished out five assists while Behagg had four assists and seven steals.

Moravian finished in a tie for second place in the Commonwealth Conference with a 69-48 victory versus Juniata College. The Greyhounds, who finished in a tie with Lebanon Valley College after the Flying Dutchmen's 64-41 loss to Messiah College and won the tiebreaker on point differential to host a playoff game, jumped out to a 38-21 halftime lead. Moravian shot 60 percent (12 of 20) from the floor and 92.9 percent (13 of 14) at the foul line in the first 20 minutes of the game, and the Greyhounds shot 45.3 percent (24 of 53) for the game and 17 of 18 (94.4 percent) at the line. Moravian also had a 40-32 advantage on the boards. **Hughes** scored a game high 19 points to lead the Greyhounds, and she had four assists. Senior forward **Kelly McLean (Allentown, PA/Salisbury HS)** netted ten points to move into eighth all-time in Moravian history with 1,142 points. **Shipman** netted nine points and pulled down a team high eight rebounds. **Sarnocinski** scored six points, grabbed four rebounds and dished out three assists while **Wozniak** had five points, six rebounds and three assists in the victory. **Onkotz** also had five points. **Behagg** contributed five rebounds, four points and four assists while **Seaman** added four points and four rebounds.

Moravian dropped its third straight game and lost its chance for a home playoff game with a 73-67 loss to Susquehanna University in Commonwealth Conference action. The Greyhounds led 33-32 but the Crusaders went on a 10-0 run early in the second half to take control of the game. Moravian shot just 32.4 percent (24 of 74) from the floor while Susquehanna shot 53.7 percent (29 of 54). Moravian did have a 44-35 advantage on the boards. The Greyhounds had a pair of players with double-doubles in the game. Sophomore forward **Brandon Zaleski** (**Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS**) scored a game high 22 points, and he pulled down a game high 15 rebounds while senior forward **Ken Greb** (**Mount Holy, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS**) contributed 17 points and ten boards. Junior guard **Steve Weiler** (**Edgewater Park, NJ/Burlington City HS**) added nine points and five rebounds while senior guard **Willie Reynolds** (**Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS**) had eight points. Junior guard **Lucas Malishchak** (**Wanamie, PA/Nanticoke HS**) contributed seven points and three steals.

The Greyhounds snapped a three-game losing streak and finished in third place in the Commonwealth Conference with a 76-55 victory over Juniata College. Moravian jumped out to a 32-20 halftime lead after shooting 48 percent (12 of 25) from the floor and 45.4 percent (5 of 11) behind the three-point line. The Greyhounds shot even better in the second half, finishing the game 26 of 49 (53.1 percent), 44.4 percent (8 of 18) behind the three-point line and 16 of 21 (76.2 percent at the foul line. Moravian also had a 34-26 advantage on the boards. The Greyhounds had three players score in double figures including a career high 15 points by freshman forward **Geoff Wendel (Sparta, NJ/Sparta HS)** to lead the squad. **Zaleski** tossed in 12 points while **Weiler** had 11 points. **Reynolds** and freshman forward **Zach Zsilavecz (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** both contributed five points in the game while freshman forward **Ed Reid (Pen Argyl, PA/Pen Argyl HS)** had a team high five rebounds. **Reynolds** pulled down four boards and had five assists while **Weiler** dished out five assists and **Zaleski** had four rebounds. **Greb**, junior guard **Kevin Burke (Turnersville, NJ/St. Augustine Prep HS)**, junior guard **Kevin Wyers (Hamilton Square, NJ/Notre Dame HS)** and freshman forward **Chris Betley (Lenape, NJ/Lenape HS)** each scored four points in the victory.

Moravian sent six individuals to the Keogh Invitational hosted by Haverford College as a final tune-up for next weekend's 2003 Middle Atlantic Conference Indoor Championships. Junior **Sean McDonnell (Scranton, PA/Scranton Prep HS)** finished sixth in the 800-meter run in a time of 2:05.0 while freshman **Greg Rarick (Drums, PA/Hazleton HS)** took 13th place in the 1,500-meter race with a time of 4:17.7. Moravian other four competitors also ran in the 1,500 meters and included sophomore **Patrick Grogan (Nazareth, PA/ Notre Dame HS)** in 14th place at 4:20.2, freshman **William Shimer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** at 16th in 4:23.2, freshman **Russell Zaleski (Hillsborough, NJ/Hillsborough HS)** in 30th place with a time of 4:40.9 and sophomore **Anthony Bisti (Haddonfield, NJ/Haddon Heights HS)** in 33rd at 4:57.9.

Junior Christina Scherwin (Denmark) and sophomore Heather McGarvie (Medford, NJ/Shawnee HS) each won events to lead the Greyhounds at the Keogh Invitational hosted by Haverford College. The meet was Moravian's last tune-up before the 2003 Middle Atlantic Conference Championships next weekend. Scherwin won the shot put with an NCAA Division III provisional qualifying toss of 13.47 meters (44 feet, 2 1/2 inches). The distance improved Scherwin to fourth in the nation in the shot put. McGarvie captured first in the 1,500 meters with a time of 4:49.5. Freshman Erica Angell (Poughkeepsie, NY/Spackenkill HS) was sixth in the race in 4:58.2 while freshman Alexis Vergalla (Glen Gardner, NJ/Voorhees HS) placed 11th in 5:12.8.

Rounding out the Greyhounds in the 1,500 meters were sophomore **Alison Stoyko** (**Reading, PA/ Governor Mifflin HS**) in 15th place at 5:17.1, sophomore **Lindsay Stehman** (**Gilbertsville, PA/Boyertown HS**) in 16th position with a time of 5:20.2 and freshman **Deidre Martin** (**Stroudsburg, PA/Pocono Mountain HS**) finishing 17th in 5:21.5. **Smith** also placed seventh in the 800 meters with a time of 2:32.5. Sophomore **Chelsea Mullins** (**Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS**) led a quartet of Greyhounds in the 3,000 meters. **Mullins** placed 13th with a time of 11:29.4 while sophomore **Holly Bofinger** (**Warminster, PA/William Tennent HS**) was 20th in 11:59.9. Sophomore **Kim Bushner** (**Allentown, PA/Dieruff HS**) finished 20th with a time of 12:15.3 while sophomore **Lauren Bahnatka** (**West Chester, PA/Henderson HS**) was 23rd in 12:16.5.
