Football - 4-2 (MAC 4-2)

Last Week – Defeated #Delaware Valley, 33-13. #MAC game

Senior quarterback **Charlie Bowden** (**Parlin, NJ/Sayreville War Memorial HS**) completed nine of 11 passes for 187 yards and three touchdowns and he ran for 47 yards on three carries and another score as Moravian defeated Delaware Valley College, 33-13, in Middle Atlantic Conference action. Moravian has now won three straight games and improves to 4-2 overall and in the MAC.

The Greyhounds took a 7-0 lead with 7:25 to play in the first quarter on a ten-yard scoring strike from **Bowden** to junior wide receiver **Kevin Miltenberger** (**Carlisle, PA/Carlisle HS**). Freshman **Nate Strohl** (**Coplay, PA/ Whitehall HS**) added the extra-point, his 13th of the season. **Bowden** and **Miltenberger** hooked up for a 33-yard pass play on Moravian's first play from scrimmage to start the drive.

Moravian extended its lead to 13-0 with 1:55 left in the first half on a two-yard touchdown run by junior tailback **David Darmofal (Clarks Summit, PA/Abington Heights HS)** to cap a 13-play, 80-yard drive. **Strohl** had the extrapoint blocked, just his second miss of the year. **Darmofal** finished with 36 yards on six attempts.

The Greyhounds added another touchdown with 49 seconds remaining in the second quarter on a 15-yard pass from **Bowden** to senior tight end **Rick Kulp (Walnutport, PA/Northampton HS)**. Moravian went for two but **Bowden's** pass attempt to **Miltenberger** was incomplete to set the halftime score at 19-0. The scoring drive was setup by a 32-yard interception return by junior cornerback **Nate Pogue (Bethlehem, PA/ Liberty HS)** with 1:02 remaining in the half.

Moravian scored on its first possession of the second half on a 20-yard pass from **Bowden** to **Miltenberger** and **Strohl's** extra-point made the score 25-0 with 11:35 remaining in the third quarter. **Bowden**, Moravian's leading rusher in the game, had a 31-yard carry on the third-and-two during the drive. **Miltenberger** finished with four receptions for 68 yards. The scoring pass was the 36th of **Bowden's** career, moving him to third all-time at Moravian moving him past **Rob Light**. The school record is 48 set by **Sean Keville** and tied by **Rob Petrosky**.

Bowden finished off Moravian's next drive with a one-yard touchdown dive with 5:03 left in the third quarter. **Strohl** added the extra-point for a 33-0 lead. The big play on the drive was a 56-yard pass from **Bowden** to sophomore wide receiver **Jed Warsager** (**Newton**, **NJ/Andover HS**) on a third-and-eight play. **Warsager** had two catches for 69 yards in the game but left with a shoulder injury in the third quarter.

The Greyhounds racked up 232 yards on the ground on the afternoon with senior tailback **Josh Fick** (**Emmaus**, **PA/Emmaus HS**) gaining 45 yards on 11 carries and senior fullback **Eric Gustafson** (**Collingswood**, **NJ/ Collingswood HS**) adding 40 yards on six carries. Freshman fullback **Kevin Lukich** (**Ogdensburg**, **NJ/Wallkill Valley HS**) had 28 yards on five carries while sophomore running back **Bill Carasia** (**Fair Haven**, **NJ/Rumson-Fair Haven HS**) contributed 22 yards on six attempts.

Senior linebacker Vince Cowlishaw (Chatham, NJ/Chatham HS) led the Moravian defense with ten tackles including two for loss while senior defensive lineman Tom Blackledge (Sellersville, PA/Pennridge HS) had seven tackles with four for loss and half a sack. Senior linebacker John Cupples (Allentown, PA/Allentown Central Catholic HS) also added seven tackles while senior linebacker Bill Engler (Coopersburg, PA/Southern Lehigh HS) contributed six tackles. Senior defensive back Jarrod Pence (Livingston, NJ/Livingston HS) had four pass break-ups and three tackles. The Moravian defense allowed the Aggies just 49 yards rushing in the contest.

Season Complete

Moravian won its third consecutive Middle Atlantic Conference Championship with an 8-1 victory over Messiah College. The Greyhounds also captured their sixth MAC title in the last seven seasons and improved the team's record to 131-11 since the start of the 1994 season. Moravian opened the match with three wins in doubles action. Senior Jennifer Genevese (Whitehall, PA/Whitehall HS) and sophomore Becky Deringer (Allentown, PA/Dieruff HS) earned an 8-1 victory at first doubles while junior Marion Berry (Avon, NJ/ Avon HS) and sophomore Jillian Iacovelli (Randolph, NJ/Randolph HS) garnered an 8-6 win at second doubles. Senior Lea Ziegler (Schwenksville, PA/Spring-Ford HS) and junior Lauren Castagna (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS) finished off the doubles sweep with an 8-6 victory at third doubles. The Greyhounds then won the first five singles matches to clinch the title. Berry was the first off the court with a 6-1, 6-1 victory at fourth singles to give her and undefeated season in singles action. Genevese captured the championship point with a 6-0, 6-2 triumph at first singles. The victory was the 50th of Genevese's career. Deringer was the next Greyhound to finish with a 6-1, 6-0 victory at second singles and she was quickly followed by senior Jillian Simms (Hampton, NJ/Voorhees HS), who earned a 6-3, 6-1 win at fifth singles. Castagna posted a 6-2, 6-3 at third singles for Moravian's final point. The final contest to finish was at sixth singles where Moravian's freshman Nicole Gruber (Lebanon, PA/Lebanon HS) forced a third set but eventually lost to Messiah's Cristine Kalb, 6-0, 6-7 (8), 13-11.

The Greyhounds closed out its second straight undefeated season and improved their overall winning streak to 38 consecutive matches with a 6-3 non-conference victory over Marywood University in the team's final dual match of the season. The Greyhounds complete the 2002 campaign with a record of 15-0 and the squad is 31-0 the last two seasons. Moravian earned just one point in the doubles action with a victory at third doubles by sophomore **Julie Anderson** (**Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS**) and freshman **Rachel Vannatta** (**Pennsburg, PA/Upper Perkiomen HS**). However, the Greyhounds took five of the six singles contests including straight sets victories from **Genevese**, junior **Petia Damianova** (**Haskovo, Bulgaria/ISM HS**) and freshman **Katie Cooke** (**Milford, PA/Delaware Valley HS**). **Castagna** and **Deringer** both needed three sets to earn their wins against the Pacers. Both players won in super-tiebreakers in the final set.

Genevese and the duo of Berry and Iacovelli advanced to the semifinals on the first day of the 2002 Middle Atlantic Conference Individual Tournament at Drew University. Genevese, seeded third in the tournament had a first round bye and defeated Danielle Dormer of Susquehanna University, 6-4, 6-0 in the second round. Genevese won her third match of the day with a 6-2, 3-6, 6-0 victory over seventh-seeded Megan Michael of King's College. Berry and Iacovelli, seeded fifth in the tournament, also had a first round bye before defeating Alaina Ford and Kathy Massey from Drew University in the second round, 5-7, 6-0, 6-1. The duo moved into the semifinals with a 6-2, 6-3 victory over fourth-seeded Michael Olas and Leyna Bollwage from FDU-Florham. Senior Missy Graeff (Reading, PA/Schuylkill Valley HS) also competed in the singles tournament for the Greyhounds. Graeff won her first round match over Lisa O'Neil from Albright College but top-seeded Tara McHugh of Susquehanna University, 6-0, 6-1, knocked her out of the tournament in the second round. The doubles team of Simms and Ziegler suffered a first round loss to Melanie Parenteau and Kristy Trimbey of Elizabethtown College, 7-6 (1), 6-4.

The duo of **Berry** and **Iacovelli** reached the finals of the 2002 MAC Individual Tournament at Drew University before being eliminated. **Berry** and **Iacovelli**, the number five seed, opened the second day of the tournament with a 6-3, 6-7 (5), 6-2 victory over seventh-seeded Heather Bush and Megan Barnickel of Messiah College in the semifinals. The duo then fell to sixth-seeded Maggie Grezlak and Caitlan Wyble of FDU-Florham in the championship match, 6-2, 5-7, 7-5. In singles action, **Genevese** closed out her Moravian career in the semifinals. **Genevese**, the number three seed lost to second-seeded Cricket Temple in the semis, 6-3, 7-5. **Genevese** completed her career with a singles record of 53-13.

Sophomore midfielder **Jim Feimster** (**Stroudsburg**, **PA/Pocono Mountain HS**) scored in the 15th minute to give Moravian all the offense it would need in a 1-0 shutout of Franklin & Marshall College in non-conference action. **Feimster** headed home a pass from junior midfielder **Mike Grillo** (**Dennington**, **NJ/The Pennington School**), for his third game-winning goal of the season. The Diplomats actually had the advantage in shots in the contest, 13-11. The Greyhounds used a pair of goalies in the shutout as senior **Ryan Sculley** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/Northampton HS**) made two saves in the first half while junior **Vinny Nasuta** (**Mount Holly**, **NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS**) had four saves in the second half.

The Greyhounds won their second straight match as the squad defeated Susquehanna University, 2-1, in Commonwealth Conference action. Moravian had a 2-0 lead in the match on goals by junior midfielder **Tim Shannon** (**Leesport, PA/Schuylkill Valley HS**) in the 50th minutes and sophomore midfielder **Daniel Samuelsson** (**Lebanon, NJ/North Hunterdon HS**) in the 83rd minute. **Feimster** assisted on **Samuelsson's** game-winning goal. **Sculley** made two saves while playing the first half of the match for the Greyhounds while **Nasuta** had three saves in the second half.

Moravian ran for the first time in three weeks and finished second to nationally ranked Dickinson College at the 2002 DeSales University Invitational. The Greyhounds had a team score of 87, 49 points behind Dickinson in the 38-team event. Leading the Greyhound women were sophomore **Heather McGarvie** (**Medford**, **NJ/Shawnee HS**) in fifth place with a time of 19:20.18 on the 5,000-meter course and senior **Jennifer Wagner** (**Riegelsville**, **PA/Wilson HS**) in sixth place among the 278 competitors with a time of 19:27.59. Sophomore **Chelsea Mullins** (**Jim Thorpe**, **PA/Jim Thorpe HS**) placed 20th for the Greyhounds in 20:01.81 while freshman **Erica Angell** (**Poughkeepsie**, **NY/Spackenkill HS**) was 22nd overall in 20:04.50. Rounding out the Moravian runners were freshman **Alexis Vergalla** (**Glen Gardner**, **NJ/Voorhees HS**) in 34th place in 20:22.30, junior **Angie Morgan** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/Liberty HS**) at 68th with a time of 20:59.26 and sophomore **Alison Stoyko** (**Reading**, **PA/Governor Mifflin HS**) in 83rd place at 21:11.95.

The Greyhounds had ten runners compete in the sub-varsity race with Moravian placing fourth of the nine teams in the event. Sophomore Megan Wise (North Wales, PA/North Penn HS) was the top Greyhound in the race with a time of 21:09.12, good enough for 16th place in the 105-runner field. Sophomore Kim Bushner (Allentown, PA/Dieruff HS) was 32nd in 22:08.44 while junior Jennifer Brief (Clark, NJ/Arthur L. Johnson HS) placed 34th with a time of 22:09.26. Junior Robin Edward (Massapequa, NY/Plainedge HS) was one place behind Brief in 35th at 22:09.76 while sophomore Holly Bofinger (Warminster, PA/ William Tennent HS) placed 46th with a time of 22:29.42. Rounding our the Moravian competitors were sophomore Kellie Smith (Perkasie, PA/Pennridge HS) in 50th place at 22:45.13, sophomore Meghan Krebs (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS) at 56th in 23:05.23, junior Lauren Laviola (Jersey City, NJ/St. Dominic Academy HS) placing 57th with a time of 23:05.83, freshman Julie Leiby (Lehighton, PA/Lehighton HS) taking 77th in 24:06.80 and freshman Alicia Hernandez (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS) at 102nd in a time of 27:49.63.

Moravian actually had an advantage in shots in the contest, 15-13, but was unable to find the back of the net. Moravian sophomore keeper **Jill Vaccaro** (**South Salem, NY/John Jay HS**) had five saves in the match.

The Greyhounds played to a scoreless tie with Susquehanna University in Commonwealth Conference action. Moravian held an 11-7 advantage in shots with **Vaccaro** making seven saves for the Greyhounds.

Fall Season Complete

The Greyhounds finished eighth of 15 schools with a team score of 337 at the Muhlenberg College Fall Classic played at the Lehigh Country Club in Allentown. Senior Charles Tice (Manasquan, NJ/Manasquan HS) led the Greyhounds with a score of 82 on the par-70 course, which tied him for 17th place, while freshman Dustin McCormick (East Stroudsburg, PA/East Stroudsburg HS) fired a round of 83 to tie for 23rd place. Junior Brian Kurylo (Sparta, NJ/Sparta HS) and senior Jason Pozniak (Tunkhannock, PA/Tunkhannock HS) both carded rounds of 86 to tie for 33rd position while junior Mike Schlamp (Nazareth, PA/Nazareth HS) rounded out the Moravian quintet with an 87, which tied him for 39th place.

Moravian placed second of 12 schools in its final outing of the 2002 fall season with a team score of 317 at the East Stroudsburg University Invitational. The Greyhounds actually tied New York University for first place after four golfers but NYU had a better fifth score to win the team title. **McCormick** was the medallist at the tournament with a score of 75 on the reconfigured par-73 Shawnee Country Club course. The order of holes was redone for the tournament so par was changed on the course. Junior **Jamison Licausi (Tobyhanna, PA/Pocono Mountain HS)** was second for the Greyhounds and ninth overall with a round of 79 while **Tice** had an 18-hole total of 81 and was tied for 13th. Rounding out the Greyhound quintet was senior **Jerry Coveney (Plymouth Meeting, PA/LaSalle College HS)** with an 82, which was tied for 18th, and **Kurylo** had an 87, tied for 31st place.

Juniata College scored four goals in a span of 20 minutes to earn a 4-1 victory over Moravian in Commonwealth Conference action. The Greyhounds' lone goal came with 15:43 remaining in the contest when junior midfielder Pam Pike (Pennsburg, PA/Upper Perkiomen HS) found the back of the net of a pass from freshman defender Jill Brinckman (East Greenville, PA/Upper Perkiomen HS). Moravian freshman goalie Chelsea Marshall (Hilton Head, SC/Hilton Head Prep HS) made 13 saves in the match.

Moravian won its second straight match overall and the Greyhounds earned their second consecutive Commonwealth Conference win with a 30-26, 30-20, 30-18 victory at Elizabethtown College. Freshman middle hitter Lindsay Siracusa (Yardley, PA/Pennsbury HS) paced Moravian with 16 kills and four blocks and she added eight digs. Sophomore outside hitter Christina Wallace (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) had 12 kills, ten digs and two service aces while junior middle hitter Shannon McNeil (Reading, PA/Reading Central Catholic HS) added nine kills and three blocks. Junior outside hitter Mary Kate Cordisco (Bethlehem, PA/Notre Dame HS) had 14 digs and seven kills while junior setter Amy Lawrence (Gettysburg, PA/Delone Catholic HS) contributed 42 assists, 16 digs and five kills. Junior libero Alissa Bucsi (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) added nine digs. Moravian played the match without two of its starters.

The Greyhounds opened play at the Green Terror Invitational hosted by McDaniel College with a pair of 3-0 victories in pool play. The Greyhounds defeated the College of Notre Dame (MD) 30-27, 34-32, 30-9 and then Moravian beat McDaniel, 30-13, 30-25, 30-26. In the victory over the College of Notre Dame, junior outside hitter **Kim Zipf** (**Wyomissing, PA/Holy Name HS**) had 17 kills while **Siracusa** had 11 kills and two service aces. **Lawrence** contributed 41 assists and 11 digs while **Wallace** had ten digs, seven kills and three service aces. **McNeil**) and **Cordisco** each had six kills in the contest while **Bucsi** had eight digs. **Zipf** also led Moravian with 11 kills in the victory over McDaniel. She added ten digs in the match. **Siracusa** had eight kills and four blocks while **McNeil** had five kills and four blocks. **Lawrence** ran the offense with 31 assists and she had eight digs while **Wallace** had 13 digs and six kills. **Cordisco** contributed three blocks while junior defensive specialist **Andrea Frankenfield** (**Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS**) had three service aces and six digs.

The Greyhounds split a pair of matches on the second day of the Green Terror Invitational. The Greyhounds fell to nationally ranked King's College, 27-30, 18-30, 21-30 and the squad defeated Eastern University, 30-26, 30-28, 30-21. In the loss to King's, which was ranked 23rd in the nation in last week's American Volleyball Coaches Association Division III Top 25 poll, **Zipf** led the Greyhounds with 11 kills and 11 digs while **Siracusa** had eight kills and three blocks. **Lawrence** had 28 assists and 14 digs in the match while **McNeil** had six kills and three blocks. **Bucsi** added eight digs in the contest. **Lawrence** recorded a triple-double in the victory over Eastern with 36 assists, 13 digs and ten kills. **Zipf** contributed 13 kills and eight digs while **Siracusa** had eight kills, three blocks and two service aces. **McNeil** had five blocks, four kills and two service aces while **Bucsi** contributed 12 digs.

Moravian placed 13th of 40 schools with a team score of 365 at the DeSales Invitational. The Greyhounds' top individual in the 275-competitor race was sophomore **Patrick Grogan (Nazareth, PA/Notre Dame HS)** with a time of 27:07.92 on the 8,000-meter course, good enough for 27th place. Junior **Joe Grady (Nanticoke, PA/Nanticoke HS)** was 31st overall in 27:11.11 while junior **Marty Miller (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** took 100th place with a time of 28:46.19. Freshman **Will Shimer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** placed fourth for Moravian and 102nd overall in 28:46.95 while senior **Wes Zimmerman (Boyertown, PA/ Boyertown HS)** was in 110th place with a time of 28:53.22. Rounding out the Moravian runners were sophomore **Matt Oertner (Slatington, PA/Northern Lehigh HS)** in 115th place with a time of 29:04.70 and freshman **Russell Zaleski (Hillsborough, NJ/Hillsborough HS)** in 145th position in a time of 29:45.83.

The Greyhounds also had four runners compete in the sub varsity race with junior **Sean McDonnell (Scranton, PA/Scranton Prep HS)** leading the quartet in a time of 29:48.00, good enough for 53rd place in the field of 116 runners.
