**Women's Basketball – 17-8 (Commonwealth Conference 10-4, MAC 13-6)**

The Greyhounds moved a step closer to the squad's third straight Commonwealth Conference playoff berth with a 70-47 victory over Albright College in Commonwealth action. Moravian jumped out to a 34-22 halftime lead by shooting 12 of 14 (85.7 percent) from the foul line in the game's first 20 minutes. The Greyhounds finished the contest 23 of 28 (82.1 percent) at the charity stripe, and Moravian also made 21 of 55 field goals (38.2 percent) and five of eight three-pointers. The Greyhounds had a 45-29 advantage on the boards and forced Albright into 21 turnovers in the game. The Lions connected on 18 of 51 field goals (35.3 percent), four of eight three-pointers and just seven of 14 free throws in the contest. Moravian had a balanced scoring attack with all 14 players in uniform playing at least three minutes and ten student-athletes netting at least one point. Freshman guard **Rachel Berlin (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS)** was one of three Greyhounds in double figures with 14 points. **Berlin** also had four steals and a pair of rebounds. Freshman forward **Kelly Applegate (Easton, PA/Wilson HS)** added 12 points and two assists while sophomore forward **Lindsay Brase (Bethlehem, PA/Notre Dame HS)** had 11 points and three rebounds. Junior guard **Jen Behagg (Hamburg, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS)** tied her career high with seven steals, and she added nine points, six rebounds and six assists while committing just three turnovers from her point guard position. Freshman forward **Jenny Hackleman (Solvang, CA/ Rutgers Prep {NJ} HS)** led the Greyhounds with 11 rebounds, and she tossed in seven points, as did senior guard **Kim Hughes (Manasquan, NJ/St. Rose HS)** in her return to action. Sophomore forward **Stephanie Seaman (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** contributed eight rebounds and five points in the victory.

**Applegate** scored a career high 22 points and grabbed a career best 12 rebounds to lead Moravian to an 81-68 victory over Elizabethtown College in Commonwealth Conference action to close out the 2003-04 regular season. The Greyhounds will host Lebanon Valley College in the semifinal game on Wednesday, February 25th at 7:00 p.m. Moravian jumped out to a 43-37 halftime lead. The Greyhounds trailed 13-10 at the 15:37 mark but a nine-point run gave the squad a 19-13 lead with 12:10 until the intermission. Elizabethtown would respond with an 11-4 run for a 24-23 lead with 9:21 remaining in the first half, however, the Greyhounds used an 11-4 run of their own for a 34-27 lead with 6:24 left in the first half. The game would be tied several times in the second half at 43-43, 57-57 and finally 62-62 with 5:38 remaining in the contest. The Greyhounds took the lead for good 20 seconds later on a lay-up and free throw by **Applegate**. Moravian made 27 of 75 field goals (36 percent), five of 18 three-pointers (27.8 percent) and 22 of 29 free throws (75.9 percent) for the game. The Greyhounds committed just 15 turnovers in the contest and had a 60-43 advantage on the boards. The Blue Jays connected on 24 of 67 field goals (35.8 percent), four of 19 three-pointers (21.1 percent) and 16 of 29 free throws (55.2 percent). Moravian had a balanced scoring attack with five players in double figures. **Applegate's** 22 points came off of a seven of eight performance from the floor and an eight of eight afternoon at the foul line. **Applegate** also had three blocked shots. **Brase** and **Hughes** each tossed in 12 points with **Brase** adding seven rebounds and **Hughes** contributing three assists and two steals. **Behagg** had 11 points, seven rebounds and six assists while **Seaman** had ten points, eight rebounds and three assists. **Hackleman** grabbed 12 boards to go with eight points and two blocked shots. Freshman guard **Katie Rizman (Wall, NJ/St. Rose HS)** added six rebounds and four points in the victory.

Junior **Heather McGarvie (Medford, NJ/Shawnee HS)** won the 1,500 meters in a season best time of 4:51.18 to lead Moravian at the non-scoring Keogh Invitational hosted by Haverford College. Junior **Chelsea Mullins (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS)** had a time of 5:26.65 in the 1,500-meter run to win her heat while senior **Robin Edward (Massapequa, NY/ Plainedge HS)** placed sixth in the heat in 5:51.81. Junior **Kellie Smith (Perkasie, PA/Pennridge HS)** had a personal best time of 2:26.76 in the 800 meters to win her heat. Sophomore **Stephanie Beitler (Fogelsville, PA/Northwestern Lehigh HS)** ran a 1:02.97 in the 400-meter dash to be place second in her heat.

**Men's Basketball – 10-15 (Commonwealth Conference 2-12, MAC 5-13)**

Albright College earned an 80-72 victory over Moravian in Commonwealth Conference action to hand the Greyhounds their third straight loss. Moravian, which trailed by just one point at the half, 35-34, couldn't overcome the Lions hot shooting in the second half. Albright made 18 of 29 field goals (62.1 percent) and eight of 16 free throws after the intermission while Moravian connected on 16 of 32 field goals (50 percent) and both of its free throw attempts. The biggest advantage the Lions had in the game was from the foul line where Albright made 14 of 25 attempts while Moravian attempted just seven foul shots, making six of them. Albright finished the game connecting on 32 of 57 field goal attempts (56.1 percent) and two of six on three-pointers. The Lions also had a 39-34 advantage on the boards. Moravian made 30 of 70 field goal attempts (42.9 percent) while shooting six of 24 behind the three-point line. Moravian had 60 of 72 points from three players led by junior forward **Brandon Zaleski (Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown HS)**, who scored a game high 28 points. **Zaleski** also added nine rebounds and shot 12 of 21 from the floor and four of five at the foul line. Senior guard **Steve Weiler (Edgewater Park, NJ/Burlington City HS)** tossed in 19 points with four rebounds and three assists while senior guard **Kevin Wyers (Hamilton Square, NJ/Notre Dame HS)** contributed 13 points, five boards and three assists. Sophomore forward **Ed Reid (Pen Argyl, PA/Pen Argyl HS)** added six points and four rebounds while sophomore forward **Zach Zsilavec (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** had four points, four rebounds and four assists. Senior guard **Lucas Malishchak (Wanamie, PA/Nanticoke HS)** added four assists in the game.

Elizabethtown earned an 85-77 victory over Moravian in Commonwealth Conference action. The loss was the fourth straight for the Greyhounds, who finish the season at 10-15 overall and 2-12 in the Commonwealth Conference. Moravian led by as many as seven points at 23-16 with 10:51 remaining in the first half but the Blue Jays would come back to force a 46-46 tie at the intermission. The Greyhounds took a 53-48 lead with 17:31 remaining in the game before Elizabethtown went on a 12-0 run to take control of the contest. Moravian would pull within one point at 74-73 on a three-pointer by **Weiler** with 2:21 remaining, however, Elizabethtown finished the contest with an 11-4 run including a five-for-five performance at the foul line. For the game, Moravian made 25 of 66 field goal attempts (44.6 percent) six of 22 three-point field goals (27.3 percent) and 21 of 24 free throws (87.5 percent). The Blue Jays made 27 of 56 field goals (48.2 percent), seven of 17 three-pointers (41.2 percent) and 24 of 32 free throws (75.0 percent) in the game. Elizabethtown also had a 34-33 advantage on the boards and forced Moravian in 20 turnovers while committing just 16 turnovers. The Greyhounds had three players in double figures led by **Weiler** with 19 points. **Weiler** finishes his career with 976 points and second in school history with 147 three-pointers. **Wyers** netted 18 points in his final game in a Moravian uniform, and he added five rebounds and three assists. **Zaleski** had 16 points and six boards to close out his junior year with career totals of 1,461 points (5th in school history) and 546 rebounds. **Zsilavec** added seven points and three rebounds while sophomore forward **Steve Wenderfer (Chester, NJ/West Morris Mendham HS)** had six boards. **Malishchak** had three assists, two rebounds and two points in his final game while senior guard **Kevin Burke (Turnersville, NJ/St. Augustine HS)** contributed two points and two assists.

Sophomore **Russell Zaleski (Hillsborough, NJ/Hillsborough HS)** had a time of 2:08.71 in the 800-meter run.
