Moravian swept its tenth straight doubleheader and extended its winning streak to 29 consecutive games with sweep of Lebanon Valley College, 3-0 and 6-5, in Commonwealth Conference action. Sophomore pitcher Meagan Hennessy (Freehold, NJ/Freehold Township HS) tossed her fourth straight shutout and her school record ninth shutout of the season in the first game of the twinbill. The win also clinched the top seed in the 2004 Commonwealth Conference Tournament for the Greyhounds. Hennessy scattered two hits and a walk while striking out three batters. She is undefeated on the season at 15-0 and lowered her ERA to 0.53 while extending her scoreless inning streak to 28 innings. Moravian would give Hennessy all the offense she would need in the bottom of the first inning. Junior shortstop Heather Bortz (Allentown, PA/Parkland HS), who had he NCAA record 44-game hitting streak snapped in the Greyhounds' last contest, singled to left field and stole second base. Bortz moved to third on an infield single by senior outfielder Melissa Soroka (Newton, NJ/Pope John XXIII HS) and scored on an RBI single up the middle by sophomore designated player Richelle McWilliams (Riegelsville, PA/Easton HS). Moravian added a run in the third inning when Bortz again led off the inning with a single. She moved to second on a passed ball and scored on an RBI single by Soroka. In the fifth inning, senior third baseman Janelle Brey (Allentown, PA/Dieruff HS) singled with one out and moved to third on a double by Soroka. Brey scored on a grounder by McWilliams as Lebanon Valley attempted to throw Brey out at the plate. The Greyhounds had ten hits in the game with Bortz and Soroka each collecting three hits while McWilliams added two hits. Moravian took a 1-0 lead in the bottom of the first inning of the second game when Bortz singled to third base to lead off the inning, and she advanced to second base when the ball rolled out of play. After moving to third on a ground out by freshman second baseman LeeAnna Roberts (Meshoppen, PA/Elk Lake HS), Bortz scored on an RBI ground out by Brey. The Greyhounds extended their lead to 2-0 in the bottom of the second inning when senior outfielder Jessica Esposito (Madison, NJ/Madison HS) hit a sacrifice fly to score McWilliams, who had reached on an error to start the inning. Moravian would add four runs in the bottom of the third inning for a 6-0 lead. After Bortz and Roberts singled to lead off the inning, Brey connected on a three-run home run down the left field line, her seventh home run of the season. Soroka followed with a single and would eventually score on an RBI single by sophomore catcher Kira Weller (Sinking Spring, PA/Wilson West Lawn HS). The Flying Dutchmen cut Moravian's lead to 6-2 with a pair of runs in the top of the fourth inning. Lebanon Valley then pulled within a run at 6-5 in the top of the fifth inning with three runs. The Flying Dutchmen actually had the bases loaded at the end of the fifth inning and had a total of nine runners left on base in the game but were unable to score any more runs. Moravian had eight hits in the game with Bortz collecting three hits and Weller adding two hits. Senior Donna Weiner (East Hanover, NJ/Hanover Park HS) improved to 12-1 on the mound with her 12th consecutive win, despite allowing five runs on 11 hits in 4 2/3 innings. Weiner also had two strikeouts. Freshman pitcher Becky Thomas (Laureldale, PA/Muhlenberg Township HS) tossed 1/3 of an inning with a walk for the Greyhounds before **Hennessy** came in to close the door for her third save of the season. **Hennessy** allowed two hits and a walk while striking out a batter. She extended her scoreless inning streak to 30 with the relief appearance.

William Paterson (NJ) University earned a non-conference doubleheader sweep of Moravian College, the top ranked team in the nation, 3-2 in eight innings and 4-0. In the first game, Moravian jumped out to a 1-0 lead in the bottom of the first inning when **Bortz** doubled to lead off the inning and scored on an RBI single by **Brey**. **Bortz** had two of Moravian's six hits in the game. The game remained scoreless until the sixth inning when the Pioneers took a 2-1 lead on a two-run home run to left field. The Greyhounds would tie the contest at 2-2 in the bottom of the sixth inning when **McWilliams** hit a solo home run to left centerfield, her fourth dinger of the year. The teams would use the international tiebreaker of placing a runner on second base to start an inning beginning with the eighth inning. William Paterson was able to score on a Moravian error for a 3-2 lead. The Greyhounds were unable to score in the bottom of the eighth, ending their 29-game winning streak. **Weiner** allowed just two runs on six hits and a walk. **Weiner** had four strikeouts and is not charged with the run that scored on the international tiebreaker or the loss. William Paterson took a 1-0 lead in the top of the third inning of the second game. The run snapped a 32-inning scoreless streak for **Hennessy** dating back to April 9th. The Pioneers extended their lead to 3-0 in the top of the fifth inning. William Patterson added a run in the top of the seventh inning on back-to-back doubles to left centerfield. Moravian finished the game with four hits including two off the bat of **Esposito**. **Hennessy** is now 15-1 overall.

Moravian swept its 11th doubleheader of the season, defeating Widener University, 4-2 and 7-0, to finish the 2004 Commonwealth Conference season with an undefeated 14-0 record. With the 4-2 victory in the first game, the Greyhounds clinched their fourth straight 30-win season and snapped a twogame losing streak. Moravian took a 1-0 lead in the top of the second inning when Bortz hit an infield RBI single to score freshman first baseman Lauren Homa (Chalfont, PA/Central Bucks West HS). Widener scored twice in the bottom of the fourth inning to take a 2-1 lead. The Greyhounds took the lead for good in the top of the fifth inning when Bortz scored on a passed ball and McWilliams drove in Brey with a sacrifice fly to left field. Moravian added a run in the top of the sixth inning on an RBI single by **Bortz** to score **Homa** again. Moravian had just six hits in the game with two by **Bortz**, who has hit safely in 50 of Moravian's last 51 games. **Hennessy** improved to 16-1 in the circle for the Greyhounds. She broke her own school record set earlier this season with 15 strikeouts in the game. Hennessy allowed two runs on five hits and two walks in addition to the 15 strikeouts. In the second game, Weiner improved to 13-1 on the mound with her fifth shutout victory of the season for Moravian. Weiner scattered three hits and a walk while striking out seven batters. The Greyhounds gave Weiner all the offense she would need with a run in the top of the first inning. Bortz led off the game with a walk and scored on a ground out by Brey. Moravian added two runs in the top of the third inning for a 3-0 lead. Bortz hit an RBI double to left field to score junior second baseman Leah Holmes (Clarks Green, PA/Abington Heights HS), and Bortz scored on an RBI single by Brey. The Greyhounds doubled their lead to 6-0 in the top of the fifth inning with three runs. Bortz had an RBI single to left field, Brey connected on a sacrifice fly to right field and the final run scored on an error. Moravian finished off the scoring with a run in the top of the seventh inning when Bortz, who had singled with one out, scored on a wild pitch. The hit by Bortz was her third of the game and the 180th of her career, tying the school record of 180 set by Christine Hill from 1995-1998. Moravian had just seven hits in the game with **Homa** collecting two in addition to **Bortz's** three hits.

The Greyhounds' final doubleheader of the week, a non-conference twinbill against rival Muhlenberg College was cancelled due to rain and will not be rescheduled this season.

Moravian snapped a three-game losing streak with a 2-0 victory over Albright College in Commonwealth Conference action at Gillespie Field. Junior Steve Tomaszewski (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) tossed his second complete game shutout of the season for the Greyhounds to improve to 3-2 on the year. Tomaszewski scattered five hits and five walks while striking out nine batters in the nine-inning contest. Tomaszewski has pitched four complete games this season and lowered his ERA to 1.56 with the shutout. Moravian's only two runs of the game were unearned and came in the bottom of the fifth inning. Senior shortstop Matthew Turtell (Lindenhurst, NY/Lindenhurst HS) and sophomore second baseman Andrew Wayne (Hillsborough, NJ/Hillsborough HS) drew back-to-back two-out walks before pulling off a double steal. On the play, the Albright throw to third base ended up going down the left field line, allowing Turtell to score and Wayne to move to third. Wayne then scored on a Lion error on a ball hit by freshman outfielder Sean Brown (Bayville, NJ/Central Regional HS). The closest either team was to scoring in any other inning was when Moravian freshman outfielder Pete Moore (Bogota, NJ/Bogota HS) was thrown out at the plate trying to score from first base on a double to right field by Turtell in the bottom of the third inning. Moravian left eight runners on base while Albright stranded all 11 runners it had on base. The Greyhounds had five hits in the game with junior third baseman Mike Trimble (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) collecting two of them.

The Greyhounds dropped an 11-8 decision to Elizabethtown College in Commonwealth Conference action to close out the three-game series with the Blue Jays that began back on April 9th. Moravian led 7-6 after seven and a half innings before Elizabethtown erupted for five runs in the bottom of the eighth inning for the victory. Moravian's first run of the game came in the top of the third inning when **Turtell** scored on an RBI single by senior designated hitter/catcher **Michael Young (Palmerton, PA/Palmerton HS)**. Moravian scored twice in the fourth inning on an RBI grounder by **Trimble** and a sacrifice fly by **Moore**. The Greyhounds added two runs in the top of the seventh inning two-RBI double by **Tomaszewski**. Moravian would take the 7-6 lead in the top of the eighth inning on a two-run home run by senior outfielder **Greg Peters (Hellertown, PA/Saucon Valley HS)**. Moravian's final run of the game came in the top of the ninth inning on an RBI single by **Moore**. The Greyhounds had 13 hits in the game with **Young** collecting three of them. Turtell, junior third baseman/pitcher **Chris Benigno (Howell, NJ/St. Rose HS)** and **Trimble** each had two hits while freshman second baseman **Mike Rodrigues (Springfield, NJ/Jonathan Dayton HS)** had a double. Senior pitcher **Brett Porter (Florham Park, NJ/Hanover Park HS)** tossed five innings in the game, allowing six runs on 12 hits and two walks while **Benigno** took the loss, allowing five runs, just two of them earned on six hits in three innings. **Benigno** also struck out two batters.

Moravian, playing a rare tripleheader, swept Susquehanna University, 14-1, 8-2 and 6-2, in Commonwealth Conference action. The Greyhounds were the visiting team as the first contest, which was played as a seven-inning game, was originally scheduled to be a nine-inning game played in Selinsgrove. Moravian jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the top of the first inning. Young hit an RBI double to left center field to score Wayne and sophomore first baseman Richie Cline (Union Beach, NJ/Keyport HS) followed with a single up the middle to score Young. The Greyhounds would extend their lead to 5-0 in the top of the second inning on a two-RBI single to right field by Wayne and an RBI single to left field by Young. Moravian would make the score 6-0 with a run in the top of the fourth inning when Turtell stole home on a delayed steal play. Susquehanna would get its only run of the game in the bottom of the fourth inning. The Greyhounds scored twice in the top of the fifth inning on an RBI single up the middle by senior designated hitter Ethan Ordog (Roebling, NJ/Holy Cross HS) and an RBI double to left field by Peters. Moravian added four runs in the top of the sixth inning for a 13-1 lead. Young drove in Wayne with an RBI single to left field and Ordog picked up an RBI on a grounder while Moravian's other two runs scored on Susquehanna errors. The Greyhounds finished off the scoring with a run in the top of the seventh inning on an RBI single to left field by freshman first baseman Mike Dubitsky (Westfield, NJ/Westfield HS). Moravian pounded out 15 hits in the game with Young collecting four of them while Wayne and Turtell each had two hits. Tomaszewski improved to 4-2 on the mound for Moravian with his second complete game victory of the week. **Tomaszewski** allowed just one run on three hits and eight walks while striking out seven batters. Moravian jumped out to a 1-0 lead in the bottom of the first inning of the second game on a bases loaded RBI bunt single by **Trimble**. Moravian would extend its lead to 2-0 in the bottom of the third inning on a solo home run to right field by Cline, his sixth homer of the season. Susquehanna scored a run in the top of the fourth inning on a home to cut the Greyhounds lead to 2-1, before the Crusaders tied the game at 2-2 in the top of the fifth inning. Moravian quickly regained the lead at 3-2 in the bottom of the fifth inning on an RBI single to left centerfield by Cline. The Greyhounds put the game away with five runs in the bottom of the sixth inning. Tomaszewski hit an RBI single down the left field line before Cline delivered a bases loaded triple to right center field to score three more runs. Cline would score on an RBI single to right centerfield by Benigno. The Greyhounds had 11 hits in the game with Cline and Benigno each collecting three of them. Peters improved to 3-3 on the mound for Moravian with a complete game victory. Peters allowed two runs on six hits and four walks while striking out seven batters. Moravian took a 1-0 lead in the bottom of the first inning of the final game on an RBI single to right field by Young that scored Turtell. Susquehanna would take its only lead of the day in the top of the second inning on an attempted double play by Moravian with the bases loaded and one out. A Moravian error allowed the second run to score. The Greyhounds retook the lead at 3-2 in the bottom of the fourth inning with a pair of runs. Benigno hit an RBI triple down the right field line and then scored on a Susquehanna error. Moravian added three insurance runs in the bottom of the fifth inning on a three-RBI double by Wayne. Moravian finished the contest with eight hits including two by Turtell. Junior Andrew Wach (Boonton, NJ/Boonton HS) started on the mound for the Greyhounds but left after 2/3 of an inning with an injury. Senior Brett Porter (Florham Park, NJ/Hanover Park HS) came on to pitch 4 2/3 innings, allowing two runs, just one earned on five hits and two walks with three strikeouts. Benigno tossed the final 1 2/3 innings for his first save of the season, allowing just one hit and one walk.

Season Complete

Moravian closed out the 2004 dual match season with a 9-5 record after a 5-2 victory over DeSales University in non-conference action. The Greyhounds earned the doubles point with victories from the teams of senior **Jason Toedter** (**Easton**, **PA/Easton HS**) and sophomore **Nick Schuett** (**Oviedo**, **FL/Oviedo HS**) and sophomore **Sean Lynch** (**West Chester**, **PA/Henderson HS**) and freshman **Scott Shelbo** (**Bethlehem**, **PA/Freedom HS**). Moravian then captured four of the six singles matches for the 5-2 win. **Toedter** won a three-set match at first singles to capture the 50th singles victory of his career, tying the Moravian record set by **David Kurvink** last season. Sophomore **Neil Caniga** (**Hampton**, **NJ/Voorhees HS**) won a three-set singles match while **Shelbo** and **Lynch** each had straight sets singles wins.

Toedter became the first male player in Moravian College history to win the Middle Atlantic Conference Individual Championship with a pair of three-set victories in the semifinals and finals on the second day of the 2004 MAC Individual Championship co-hosted by Moravian and DeSales University at the Lehigh University tennis complex Saturday and Sunday. Toedter, the number two seed in the singles tournament, defeated sixth seeded Julian Fuller of Drew University, 6-4, 5-7, 6-2, in the semifinals. Toedter had a chance to win the contest in straight sets with two serves for match point. In the championship match, Toedter defeated top seed J.D. Spina of Drew University, 6-3, 2-6, 6-3, for the title. Toedter completes his singles career at Moravian with 54 victories, surpassing the old record of 50 set by **David Kurvink** last season.

On Saturday's first day of competition at the MAC Individual Championships, **Toedter** received a first round bye as the second seed. **Toedter** won his 51st career singles match in the second round, defeating Bernardo Urdaneta of Lycoming College, 6-2, 6-4, to break the Moravian career singles victory record. **Toedter** would move into Sunday's semifinals with a 3-6, 6-1, 6-4 victory over Matt Zimmerman of Albright College in the quarterfinals. **Caniga** was also competing in the singles tournament and defeated Chris Keeney of Lebanon Valley College in the first round, 6-4, 6-1. **Caniga** was knocked out of the tournament in the second round, falling to fifth-seed Jeremy Speicher of Albright College, 6-4, 7-6 (4). In the doubles tournament, Moravian's entry of **Shelbo** and **Lynch** defeated Brad Lutz and Mike Impriano of Widener University in the first round, 6-4, 6-4 before falling to fourth seeded Hassan Shah and Arvin Narula of Wilkes University, 6-0, 6-1.

Season Complete

The Greyhounds captured first place as a team with a score of 313, and senior **Brian Kurylo (Sparta, NJ/Sparta HS)** won medallist honors with a round of 73 at the Franklin & Marshall College Spring Invitational played at the Bent Creek Country Club. Moravian finished two strokes ahead of the host Diplomats. **Kurylo** was one shot over par on the par 72 Bent Creek Course to lead the 77 golfers. Sophomore **Dustin McCormick (East Stroudsburg, PA/East Stroudsburg HS)** was tied for fifth with an 18-hole total of 77 while senior **Jamison Licausi (Tobyhanna, PA/Pocono Mountain HS)** carded an 81 to tie for 16th place. Rounding out the Moravian golfers were freshmen **Brian Bergstol (Mt. Bethel, PA/Bangor HS)**, tied for 18th with an 82, and **Thad Miller (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS)**, tied for 27th with a round of 84.

Moravian placed third of four teams at the Lehigh Valley Tournament hosted by the Greyhounds on the Weyhill course at Saucon Valley Country Club. NCAA Division I Lafayette College was first at 406 while Division I Lehigh University was second at 411 followed by Moravian with a 412 and Muhlenberg College with a team score of 416. Individually for the Greyhounds, **Bergstol** had the low round of the 28 golfers with an 18-hole total of 74, two over par on the Weyhill Course. **Kurylo** and **Miller** each carded rounds of 84 for Moravian while **Licausi** and **McCormick** and sophomore **John Donofrio** (**Easton, PA/Easton HS**) all had rounds of 85. Junior **Todd Solecitto** (**Washington, NJ/Warren Hills Regional HS**) rounded out the Greyhound golfers with a score of 88.

Moravian was in second place of 14 schools at the 2004 Middle Atlantic Conference Championships at the Shawnee Country Club. The Greyhounds had a team score of 463 after 27 of 54 holes, trailing defending champion Susquehanna University by nine strokes. Moravian is 17 strokes ahead of third place Elizabethtown College. **Bergstol** was in third place with a 27-hole total of 113 on the par-72 course while **McCormick** was fourth, also with a total of 113 among the 69 golfers. **Licausi** stood in 11th place with a 117 while **Kurylo** was tied for 18th at 120. **Solecitto** rounded out the Moravian golfers with a score of 129, which is tied for 42nd.

The Greyhounds finished second of 14 schools at the 2004 MAC Championships. Moravian posted a team score of 775 in the tournament, which was shortened from 54 holes to 45 holes due to rain. The Greyhounds trailed champion Susquehanna University by 25 strokes while Moravian finished 14 strokes ahead of third place Elizabethtown College. **Bergstol** earned All-Conference First Team accolades with a second place finish with a 45-hole total of 186 on the par-72 course. **Bergstol** fired a 73 on the second day of the tournament. **McCormick** and **Licausi** earned spots on the All-Conference Second Team by placing in the second ten. **McCormick** was 12th with a score of 194 while **Licausi** was 18th at 198. Both players had rounds of 81 on Sunday. **Kurylo** tied for 21st with a 45-hole total of 200 after a second day score of 80 while **Solecitto** was tied for 35th with a two-day total of 207 after a 78 on the second day of competition.

Moravian fell to Widener University, the defending Middle Atlantic Conference Champion, 23-3, in a conference match. The Greyhounds were held scoreless until the third quarter, and Moravian scored twice in the fourth quarter. Moravian dropped its final home match of the season to Widener University, 14-6 in a Middle Atlantic Conference match. The Greyhounds were held scoreless in the first half but would cut the Pioneers lead to 9-6 with just under five minutes remaining in the match. However, Widener scored five unanswered goals to close out the contest. Freshman attack Lindsay Lustrino (Spring Lake, NJ/Manasquan HS) netted three goals for the Greyhounds while sophomore midfielder Jess Cordani (Point Pleasant, NJ/Point Pleasant Boro HS) had two goals to go with eight caused turnovers.
