Women's Volleyball – 4-0 (Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 0-0)

Last Week – Defeated \$York (PA) College, 3-0; Defeated \$Washington (MD) College, 3-0; \$Defeated Frostburg State (MD) University, 3-0; Defeated \$Ithaca College, 3-0. \$First Annual Greyhound Premiere Invitational

The Greyhounds opened the 2003 season with a 30-17, 30-20, 30-26 victory over York (PA) College in the first round of the 1st Annual Greyhound Premiere Invitational in the Timothy Breidegam Fieldhouse. Senior outside hitter **Kim Zipf** (Wyomissing, PA/Holy Name HS) led Moravian with 15 kills, eight digs and three service aces while sophomore middle hitter **Lindsay Siracusa** (Yardley, PA/Pennsbury HS) had seven kills, four digs, two blocks and three service aces. Senior setter **Amy Lawrence** (Gettysburg, PA/Delone Catholic HS) ran the Greyhound offense with 34 assists, and **Lawrence** contributed seven digs and three kills. Senior right-side hitter **Sara Hollenbacher** (Reading, PA/Reading Central Catholic HS) and senior middle hitter **Shannon McNeil** (Reading, PA/Reading Central Catholic HS) each had five kills in the match while junior outside hitter **Christina Wallace** (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) contributed four kills, five service aces and seven digs. Senior defensive specialist **Andrea Frankenfield** (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS) added seven digs.

Moravian moved into the championship bracket of the 1st Annual Greyhound Premiere Invitational with a 30-2, 30-16, 30-16 victory over Washington (MD) College in the Greyhounds' second match of the first round. In the first game of the contest, Moravian senior right-side hitter **Mary Kate Cordisco** (Bethlehem, PA/Notre Dame HS) broke the school record for service aces in a match with 15 of her school record 18 service aces in the first game. The previous school record was nine service aces for an entire match. **Cordisco**, who also had two kills and five digs in the match, also set the NCAA Division III record for consecutive points served in a game, serving 25 straight points from a 1-1 tie to a 26-1 Moravian lead. **Wallace** and **Siracusa** each had nine kills in the contest while **Hollenbacher** added seven kills. **Frankenfield**, **Zipf** and freshman defensive specialist **Ashley Hugo** (Bath, PA/Northampton HS) each had three service aces in the match as the Greyhounds total 30 service aces as a team. **Zipf** contributed six digs and four kills while **Lawrence** had 32 assists and eight digs.

The Greyhounds won their opening match in the championship bracket of the Greyhound Premiere Invitational, defeating Frostburg State (MD) University, 32-30, 30-16, 30-17. **Siracusa** led Moravian with 14 kills and three blocks in the victory, and she added five digs. **Zipf** added 13 kills and seven digs while **Lawrence** had 36 assists, 17 digs and four service aces. **Wallace** contributed seven kills, six service aces and five digs while **McNeil** added seven kills for the Hounds. Senior libero **Alissa Bucsi** (Bethlehem, PA/Bethlehem Catholic HS) had 14 digs in the victory while **Frankenfield** added five digs and three service aces.

Moravian won the championship bracket of the First Annual Greyhound Premiere Invitational with a 30-28, 30-28, 30-22 victory over Ithaca College in the final match of the tournament. The Greyhounds completed the invitational with a 4-0 record. **Zipf** earned a spot on the All-Tournament team after leading Moravian with 16 kills and seven digs versus Ithaca. **Siracusa** had seven kills, four service aces and five blocks while **McNeil** contributed seven kills. **Lawrence** ran the Greyhound offense with 36 assists, and she added eight digs and four kills. **Wallace** had 15 digs, four kills and two service aces while **Bucsi** added seven digs. **Hollenbacher** added four kills in the victory while senior **Cordisco** had three kills.

The Greyhounds opened the 2003 season with a 0-0 double overtime tie at Drew University. Moravian out shot the host Rangers 7-5 but neither team was able to find the back of the net. The Greyhounds had the best chance to score in the second ten-minute overtime session when sophomore forward **Lindsay Pohl (West Lawn, PA/Wilson West Lawn HS)** was awarded a penalty kick with five minutes remaining. However, Drew keeper Danielle Vento came up with save to preserve the tie. Moravian goalie junior **Jill Vaccaro (South Salem, NY/John Jay HS)** made three saves in the contest. Drew also had an advantage on corner kicks, 4-2.

The Greyhounds opened their 2003 season with a 4-1 loss to host Drew University at the Drew Fall Festival. The Rangers scored the first four goals of the match including two in the first ten minutes of play. The Greyhounds lone goal of the game came in the 79th minute when junior midfielder **Jim Feimster (East Stroudsburg, PA/East Stroudsburg HS)** drove home a pass from freshman midfielder **Josh Sheetz (Kutztown, PA/Kutztown HS)**. Moravian had one player red carded just before Drew's third goal of the contest and another Greyhound player was red carded in the 65th minute, leaving Moravian with just nine players on the field to finish the game. Drew held an 18-9 advantage in shots and a 6-1 edge in corner kicks. Moravian senior goalie **Vinny Nasuta (Mount Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley Regional HS)** made eight stops.

Moravian dropped its second straight match to open the 2003 season, falling to Ramapo College of New Jersey, 2-0, in the second day of the Drew University Fall Festival. The Greyhounds did have a 5-3 advantage in shots but were unable to find the back of the net. Moravian sophomore goalie **Ian Andrew Nuno (Middletown, DE/Caravel Academy HS)** played the first half of the match while freshman keeper **Kyle Keller (Coopersburg, PA/Southern Lehigh HS)** played the second half and made one save.

Moravian opened its 2003 cross country season with a second place finish of 64 points at the Marywood University Invitational in Scranton. The University of Scranton won the eight-team race with 59 points and Muhlenberg College was third with 70 points. For the Greyhounds, junior **Chelsea Mullins (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS)** led the squad with a time of 20:12 on the 5,000-meter course, good enough for fifth place in the 82-competitor race. Junior **Heather McGarvie (Medford, NJ/Shawnee HS)** placed seventh in a time of 20:21 while sophomore **Lauren Bahnatka (West Chester, PA/Henderson HS)** was 11th in 21:11. Rounding out the Moravian top five were junior **Kim Bushner (Allentown, PA/Louis E. Dieruff HS)** in 20th place with a time of 21:57 and junior **Alison Stoyko (Reading, PA/Governor Mifflin HS)** in 23rd place in 22:08.

Other runners for Moravian included senior **Jen Brief (Clark, NJ/Arthur L. Johnson HS)** in 30th place at 22:27, freshman **Ashley McCuen (Horsham, PA/Hatboro-Horsham HS)** at 34th in 22:58, sophomore **Alexis Vergalla (Glen Gardner, NJ/Voorhees HS)** at 35th in 22:58, junior **Kellie Smith (Perkasie, PA/Pennridge HS)** at 36th in 22:59, freshman **Jennifer Connelly (Manchester, NJ/Manchester West HS)** in 42nd place with a time of 23:35, sophomore **Julie Leiby (Lehigh, PA/Lehigh HS)** at 43rd in 23:37, junior **Eileen Weber (Emmaus, PA/Emmaus HS)** at 76th with a time of 27:59 and sophomore **Alicia Hernandez (Jim Thorpe, PA/Jim Thorpe HS)** in 80th at 29:03.

The Moravian men's cross country team took third of eight schools at the Marywood University Invitational to open the 2003 season. The Greyhounds had a team score of 68 points, just one point behind second place Muhlenberg College. The University of Scranton won the meet with a total of 38 points. Senior **Sean McDonnell (Scranton, PA/Scranton Prep HS)** led the Greyhounds on the 8,000-meter course with a time of 28:20, good enough for tenth place in the 83-competitor race. Junior **Pat Grogan (Nazareth, PA/Notre Dame HS)** placed 11th in a time of 28:21 while sophomores **William Shimer (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** and **Greg Rarick (Drums, PA/Hazleton HS)** placed 14th and 15th with a time of 28:39. Senior **Joe Grady (Nanticoke, PA/Nanticoke HS)** rounded out the Moravian top five in 18th place with a time of 28:44.

Other runners for the Greyhounds included senior **Marty Miller (Bethlehem, PA/Liberty HS)** in 34th place with a time of 29:50, freshman **Jared Casciole (Easton, PA/Notre Dame HS)** 35th in 29:55, sophomore **Russell Zaleski (Hillsborough, NJ/Hillsborough HS)** 38th in 30:22, freshman **Ryan Brodhead (Bethlehem, PA/Freedom HS)** in 60th place with a time of 31:46 and junior **Anthony Bisti (Haddonfield, NJ/Haddon Heights HS)** in 65th place at 32:27.
