Women's Basketball – 7-3 (1-2 MAC Commonwealth League, 2-2 MAC Overall)

The Lady Greyhounds extended their winning streak to three games and have won six of their last seven games after non-conference victories over Alvernia, 73-58, and arch-rival Muhlenberg, 64-49, last week. Moravian's last five opponents, against which the Lady 'Hounds have a 4-1 record, have combined for 19 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances in the 1990s. Moravian's only loss during the stretch was to Trinity (TX) University, 53-52, at the buzzer in the first round of the Next Level Desert Classic before Christmas.

Moravian opened the week with the victory over Alvernia behind 16 points from junior forward **LaJona Johnson (Easton/Easton HS)** and 13 points by senior guard **Jessie Coughlin (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS)**. Johnson connected on six of nine field goal attempts and four of six foul shots in the game.

Senior forward Lynne Grzywacz (Blue Bell/Wissahickon HS) led the squad with eight rebounds in the game while senior center Leahn Agnew (Lancaster/Conestoga Valley HS) played her first 10 minutes of the season after returning from an off-season knee injury. Agnew scored seven points. Moravian made 55 percent of its field goal attempts in the contest.

At Muhlenberg, the Lady Greyhounds suffered through a tough night in the field, making just 24 percent of their field goals in the first half and 37 percent for the game. However, led by senior guard **Gina Sebastionelli's (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** 11 for 12 performance at the foul line, Moravian connected on 23 of 29 free throws on the way to the victory. Sebastionelli led all scorers with 16 points and she added four assists and three steals while Coughlin (14 points) and Grzywacz (10 points) also scored in double figures.

Senior forward **Stephanie Rickards** (Lansdowne/Upper Darby HS) contributed a team high seven rebounds and added eight points. Senior forward Jen Page (New Cumberland/Red Land HS) also grabbed seven rebounds and four points. Senior forward Cathy Huegler (Reading/Temple HS) has five points and five rebounds in the contest.

Behind the unprecedented fourth consecutive Most Valuable Player Award for senior forward **Jason Moran (Scranton/West Scranton HS)**, the Greyhounds captured their fourth straight Greyhound Reebok Classic title and won all three contests last week. Moran had 24 points, 16 rebounds and 11 assists in the tournament which included victories over Ramapo, 64-46, and Muhlenberg, 70-66, for the Greyhounds. He finished the week with 16 points, nine rebounds and three assists in a win against Delaware Valley, 56-53.

Sophomore guard **David Jordan** (**Point Pleasant, NJ/Point Pleasant HS**) was also named to the All-Tournament Team at the Greyhound Reebok Classic after scoring 24 points and grabbing seven rebounds in the tournament.

Senior forward **Jim Coyle** (**Center Valley/Southern Lehigh HS**) led Moravian in scoring in the victory against Ramapo with 18 points and added five rebounds and two blocked shots. He had six rebounds and eight points the second night against Muhlenberg. Coyle contributed nine points and six rebounds at Delaware Valley. Senior center **Scott Reslow** (**East Greenwich, RI/East Greenwich HS**) swatted a career best three blocked shots at Delaware Valley.

Senior guard **Matt Getter (Broomall/Marple Newtown HS)** led all scorers against Muhlenberg with 18 points including four three-pointers. Getter missed most of the second half against Delaware Valley with a sprained ankle. Sophomore guard. **Curt DeFillippo (Toms River, NJ/Toms River East HS)** had nine points versus Ramapo, his highest total this season.

Junior guard **Rich Whalen** (**East Brunswick**, **NJ/East Brunswick HS**) had a career day against Delaware Valley, scoring a career high 16 points and tying career bests in rebounds with four and steals with six. During the Greyhound Reebok Classic, Whalen netted 13 points, dished out eight assists and made five steals in the two games.
