Football – 3-6 (2-3 MAC Commonwealth League, 3-6 MAC Overall)

Last Week – Lost to #Wilkes, 40-21. #MAC game

The Greyhounds had their streak of 11 straight non-losing seasons, all under current head coach **Scot Dapp**, snapped last weekend in a 40-21 loss to Wilkes University in Middle Atlantic Conference non-league action. The loss dropped Moravian's road record to 1-4 for the season and 3-6 overall.

The 'Hounds scored first on Saturday on a five yard run by sophomore **P.J. Jankowicz (Belle Mead, NJ/Hillsborough HS)** to end a 12 play, 66 yard drive with five and a half minutes remaining in the first quarter. Jankowicz gained 78 yards on 24 carries on the afternoon to raise his season total to 582 yards and needs just 75 yards to surpass his total from last year. Sophomore **Kevin Smith's (Collegeville/Methacton HS)** kick bounced off the left upright to keep the score 6-0.

Wilkes took the lead on a 34 yard pass from Neil Rine to Ryan James and the extra-point kick by Matt Diltz. The Greyhounds were able to regain the lead before halftime on a 22-yard field goal by Smith with 3:02 remaining on the clock. Moravian senior **Todd Korlesky** (**Milford, NJ/Delaware Valley HS**) ended the first half with a 61-yard interception return.

The Colonels gained the lead for good three minutes into the second half on a 22 yard pass from Rine to Phillips. Moravian was driving to regain its lead when a pass attempt by junior quarterback **Rob Petrosky** (**North Catasauqua/Catasauqua HS**) was deflected at the line of scrimmage and intercepted by Chris Shannon, who returned the ball 67 yards for a touchdown. On Moravian's next possession, Petrosky, who completed 10 of 23 passes for 203 yards, was intercepted for the second time in Wilkes territory.

Wilkes would extend the lead to 26-9 before Moravian scored again on a one yard run by Jankowicz. Petrosky's two-point attempt was dropped in the endzone. Petrosky, who was sacked nine times during the game, connected with senior **Vance Szabo** (**Nazareth/Northampton HS**) for six receptions for 137 yards.

The Colonels Mike Hankins, who had run for nearly 500 yards the past two seasons against the Greyhounds, scored Wilkes' final two touchdowns on a 63 yard screen pass from Rine and on a 29 yard scamper. He had just 58 yards this season on 17 carries.

Moravian scored the final six points of the game on a 55 yard pass from sophomore quarterback **Jed Moyer (Dresher/Upper Dublin HS)** to classmate **Corey Pickel (Lititz/Warwick HS)**. Moyer's only other pass attempt was also to Pickel for a completion of 22 yards.

The Moravian defense was led by junior strong safety **Jason Goldan (Neshanic, NJ/Hillsborough HS)** with 12 tackles, ten of them solo, and two pass break-ups. Junior linebacker **Josh Wren (Magna, UT/Cypress HS)**, the Greyhounds leading tackler, had seven stops while junior linebacker **Matt Selverian (Cherry Hill, NJ/Cherry Hill East HS)** had five tackles with one sack and forced two fumbles.

The Greyhounds will try to earn one of the regions three berths to the NCAA Division III National Championships on November 21st at this weekend's Mideast Regional hosted by Allentown College. The meet will be run on the same course which the Greyhounds won their sixth straight MAC title last weekend.

The Lady Greyhounds, which tied the school record with 27 victories this season, has qualified for the NCAA Division III Tournament for the second consecutive season. Moravian is ranked second in the Mid-Atlantic Region and will have a first round bye at the regional tournament this week at Juniata College.

On Thursday, November 12th third seeded Gettysburg College will battle the sixth seed, Salisbury State University. The other first round match will have fourth seeded Lycoming College facing fifth seed Franklin & Marshall College. In Friday's first match, the Lady Greyhounds will play the winner of the Gettysburg versus Salisbury State match. The nation's top ranked team awaits the winner of the Lycoming and Franklin & Marshall match. The regional championship will be played on Saturday.

Moravian remained second in the region by posting a 3-1 record last week including a 2-1 mark in the Middle Atlantic Conference playoffs. The Lady Greyhounds defeated the University of Scranton, 15-9, 15-6, 9-15, 15-9 to end the regular season. Moravian, which had a first round bye, opened the MAC playoffs in the second round with a 15-12, 15-5, 15-4 victory over Susquehanna University. In the semifinals, the Lady 'Hounds defeated Lycoming 15-11, 16-14, 15-12 before falling to Juniata 15-7, 15-13, 15-12 in the championship match. The title was Juniata's 18th straight.

Junior outside hitter **Amy Sandt (Allentown/William Allen HS)** led Moravian last week with 49 kills and 48 digs. Sandt, who surpass the 1,000 career kill milestone against Scranton, also had 11 service aces and a .282 hitting percentage. Senior middle hitter **Stephanie Rickards (Lansdowne/Upper Darby HS)** contributed 46 kills, 36 digs, 11 blocks and a .324 hitting percentage.

Junior setter Kaitie Kramer (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS) ran the Moravian offense with an average of 9.92 assists per game. She also added 41 digs. Sophomore Natalie Balaziuk (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS) led Moravian with 13 service aces and added 30 digs while classmate Rebecca Falk (Allentown/Dieruff HS) topped the Lady Greyhounds with 13 blocks. Falk also contributed 18 kills.

Freshman **Krystol Kessack** (Bethlehem/Liberty HS), who has been inserted into the starting line-up due to an injury to sophomore **Sara Young** (Tunkhannock/Tunkhannock HS), had 28 kills and 36 digs. Senior **Teresa Hahn** (Whitehall/Whitehall HS) contributed nine blocks and eight kills while sophomore **Emily Shonk** (**Ligonier/Ligonier HS**) had 27 digs last week.

The Lady Greyhounds will look for their sixth straight berth in the NCAA Division III National Championship meet, which will be held on Saturday, November 21st at Dickinson College in Carlisle, PA, this weekend in the Mideast Regional at Allentown College in Center Valley, PA. The top four teams at the regional will advance to the national Championships. The Lady Greyhounds, which had won six straight Middle Atlantic Conference Championships and placed in the top ten nationally four of the last five years, will be running on the same course which they won the MAC title on two weeks ago.
