This Week – Fri.-Mon., May 12th –15th at NCAA Division III East Regional, at King's College, Wilkes-Barre, PA – Friday, May 12th, #4 Moravian vs. #5 John Jay (NY) College, TBA.

The Greyhounds, the 2000 Commonwealth Conference Champions, will be competing at the 2000 NCAA Division III East Regional at King's College in Wilkes-Barre. Moravian is seeded fourth in the tournament and will play fifth seeded John Jay College of New York in Friday's first game. The other three teams in the region are top-seed The College of New Jersey, second-seed King's and third seeded Western Connecticut State University.

Moravian is making its third straight appearance in the NCAA Division III Tournament. The Greyhounds finished fourth in the regional in 1998 and the squad was third last season.

The Greyhounds had six players named to the 2000 Commonwealth Conference All-Star Teams last week and head coach John Byrne was named the Commonwealth Conference Coach of the Year. Seniors Zan Azzolino (Lodi, NJ/Immaculate Heart Academy) and pitcher Becky Stroup (Palmerton/Palmerton Area HS) were named to the all-star first team while sophomores catcher Stacy Matuczinski (Bethlehem/Liberty HS) and designated player Deb Noble (Cranford, NJ/Cranford HS). Sophomore pitcher Rachel Mowrey (Hellertown/Saucon Valley HS) and sophomore outfielder Sarah Leiby (Fleetwood/Fleetwood HS) were honored with second team selections.

Women's Track & Field 0-0 (MAC Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 0-0)

Last Week – 1st of 11 schools at Middle Atlantic Conference Championships, Widener University, Chester, PA This Week – Fri., May 12th at Last Chance Meet at Haverford College

The Lady Greyhounds won their eighth straight Middle Atlantic Conference Outdoor Championship behind the efforts of the sophomore class. Sophomore **Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic/Riverside HS)** was named the Most Outstanding Performer after winning three individual championships. Wolfsberger won the 800 meters in 2:17.73, the 1,500 meters in 4:44.02 and the 3,000 meters in 10:18.58.

Moravian's other individual champions included sophomore **Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown/Lower Dauphin HS)** capturing the 5,000 meters in 18:34.00 and the 10,000 meters with a time of 40:26.52, sophomore **Steph Horne (Sinking Spring/Wilson West Lawn HS)** winning the 100-meter high hurdles in 15.87 seconds and sophomore **Carrie McCaffery (Lebanon/Annville-Cleona HS)** winning the javelin with a NCAA Division III provisional qualifying distance of 128 feet and capturing the hammer throw with a MAC record of 123 feet, seven inches.

Horne also placed eighth in the 100 meters at 13.53 seconds and she was seventh in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles in 1:10.14. Freshman Jen Ketz (Canadensis/Pocono Mountain HS) was fifth in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles at 1:07.15. Horne and Ketz combined with sophomore Jen Burkholder (Chalfont/Gwynedd Mercy HS) and freshman Ann Corless (Plainsville, CT/Plainsville HS) for a fifth place finish in the 4x100-meter relay in 52.60 seconds. Burkholder teamed up with sophomores Erin Boyle (Philadelphia/Nazareth Academy) and Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem/Freedom HS) and freshman Jen Wagner (Wilson/Riegelsville HS) for a fifth place showing in the 4x400-meter relay with a time of 4:13.52.

Corless placed eighth in the 400 meters in 1:03.50 and she was fourth in the long jump with a leap of 16 feet, 3/4 inches. Burkholder ran to a third place finish in the 800 meters in 2:22.90. Boyle placed fifth in the 800 meters at 2:23.46 and she was sixth in the 1,500 meters in 4:59.55. Catalino placed ninth in the 800 meters in 2:27.553 and she placed tenth in the 1,500 meters at 5:09.87. Wagner was sixth in the 800 meters with a time of 2:27.00.

Junior Hannah Wood (Palm/Upper Perkiomen HS) placed fourth in the 800 meters at 2:23.45, third in the 1,500 meters with a time of 4:56.07 and fourth in the 5,000 meters in 11:03.97. Sophomore Kim Jaick (Bethlehem/Southern Lehigh HS) placed sixth in the 3,000 meters with a time of 11:26.65 while freshman Jessica Giampolo (Hebron, CT/Rham HS) was seventh in the 3,000 meters at 11:07.51. Senior Maria Grabowski (Churchville/Villa Joseph Marie HS) placed fifth in the 5,000 meters in 20:07.41 and second in the 10,000 meters at 41:19.44. Junior Kate Westerman (Milford, CT/Lauralton Hall) placed seventh in the 10,000 meters with a time of 47:18.24.

In addition to her two championships, McCaffery was fourth in the shot put at 35 feet, 6 ¾ inches and fourth in the discus with a distance of 116 feet, six inches. Sophomore **Sarah Shaneberger (Coopersburg/Southern Lehigh HS)** placed third in the shot put with a toss of 39 feet, 1 ¼ inches. Shaneberger also placed third in the discus with a distance of 120 feet, nine inches, and second in the hammer throw at 122 feet, three inches. Sophomore **Jennifer Lohn (Media/Penncrest HS)** placed second in the javelin at 125 feet, one inch while junior **Katie Warren (Farmington, CT/Farmington HS)** was fourth with a distance of 113 feet, 11 inches. Sophomore **Melissa Webber (Barnegat, NJ/Monsignor Donovan HS)** was fifth in the discus at 116 feet, three inches. Freshman **Brooke Dawson (Emmaus/Emmaus HS)** and senior **Erica Landes (Reading/Muhlenberg HS)** tied for sixth place in the high jump while clearing height of four feet, ten inches.

Men's Track & Field 0-0 (MAC Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 0-0)

Last Week – 4th of 11 schools at Middle Atlantic Conference Championships, Widener University, Chester, PA

This Week – Fri., May 12th at Last Chance Meet at Haverford College

The Greyhounds placed fourth of 11 schools at the 2000 Middle Atlantic Conference Outdoor Championships hosted by Widener University. Senior **Tim Pfluger (Slatington/Northern Lehigh HS)** won the 1,500 meters in a time of 3:57. Pfluger's win was his fourth straight in the MAC outdoor championships and his seventh overall in the MAC indoor and outdoor meets.

Junior **Damon Rutherford (Reading/Exeter HS)** placed second in the 3,000-meter steeplechase with a time of 9:52.13. Rutherford was also fourth in the 1,500 meters in 4:03.16 and fifth in the 5,000 meters with a time of 16:06.68. Freshman **George Wacker (Honesdale/Honesdale HS)** placed fourth in the 800 meters at 1:56.97 followed by sophomore **Josh Heebner (Lansdale/North Penn HS)** in fifth in 1:57.39. Freshman **Wes Zimmerman (Boyertown/Boyertown HS)** was ninth in the 10,000 meters at 35:35.60 while sophomore **Chris DeWalt (Easton/Easton HS)** was ninth in the 3,000-meter steeplechase with a time of 10:40.24. Sophomore **Kevin Bush (Stroudsburg/Stroudsburg HS)** was third in the 200 meters in 22.36 seconds and he placed in the 100 meters in 11.38 seconds.

Wacker, Heebner and Bush teamed up with sophomore Chris Colley (Easton/Easton HS) to place fourth in the 4x400-meter relay with a time of 3:25.31. Bush and Colley were part of the 4x100-meter relay with seniors Dan Oliynik (Dover, NJ/Morris Knolls HS) and Jason Goldan (Neshanic, NJ/Hillsborough HS) that placed fifth in 44.44 seconds. Oliynik earned a third place finish in the 110-meter high hurdles in 15.53 seconds while senior Jim O'Rourke (Park Ridge, NJ/Park Ridge HS) was ninth in the 110-meter high hurdles at 16.50 seconds.

Junior Anthony Rediger (Sellersville/Pennridge HS) was second in the triple jump at 44 feet, 4 ¼ inches and he tied for third in the high jump at six feet. Rediger placed ninth in the long jump with a leap of 20 feet, 1 ¾ inches. O'Rourke also cleared six feet in the high jump but he was tied for sixth based on the number of jumps. Freshman John Stanko (Lansford/Panther Valley HS) placed fifth in the triple jump at 43 feet, five inches.

Junior Bill Schmidt (Basking Ridge, NJ/Ridge HS) was fourth in the shot put with a toss of 45 feet, 5 ½ inches. Senior Josh Tirado (Weatherly/Weatherly HS) placed sixth in the hammer throw with a distance of 115 feet, six inches and he was seventh in the discus with a toss of 128 feet, three inches.
