Women's Soccer – 1-1 (MAC Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 0-0)

Last Week – Lost to West Chester, 5-0; Defeated Alvernia, 8-0

The women's soccer team opened the 1999 season with a 1-1 week under new head coach **Eric Lambinus**. Moravian lost its season opener to NCAA Division II West Chester University of Pennsylvania, 5-0, but bounced back to defeat Alvernia College, 8-0, Friday. The match with Alvernia was ended after 70 minutes of play by mutual agreement of both coaches.

Senior **Carli Miller (Wyomissing/Wilson West Lawn HS)**, the only women's soccer player in school history to score over 100 points, netted a hat trick in the first half of the victory at Alvernia. Junior **Marisa Confuorto (Neshanic Station, NJ/Hillsborough HS)** also scored two first half goals to give the Lady Greyhounds a 5-0 halftime lead. Juniors **Brook Maslowski (Newton, JN/Newton HS)** and **Becky Roe (Worcester, NY/Worcester Central HS)** and freshman **Allison Kranchalk (Point Pleasant, NJ/Point Pleasant HS)** each netted goals in the second half. Roe, the starting goalie for Moravian, played the first half of the game in goal while Carli's younger sister **Neali Miller (Wyomissing/Wilson West Lawn HS)** played the final 25 minutes in goal.

Kranchalk had one of Moravian's seven assists in the match at Alvernia. Senior **Jen Polaha (West Seattle, WA/Holy Name {PA} HS)** and sophomore **Becky Caulwell (Chester, NJ/Mt. Olive HS)** each had two assists in the match. Junior **Becky Matijasich (Alpharetta, GA/Wilson West Lawn {PA} HS)** and freshman **Alexandra Camarano (Allentown/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** also had assists.

The Moravian men's cross country team posted a fifth place out of nine schools finish in the season opening Kutztown University Maroon & Gold Invitational last weekend. The Greyhounds were second among the NCAA Division III teams in the meet.

Leading Moravian on the course was junior **Damon Rutherford (Reading/Exeter HS)** with a 15th place finish out of 96 runners. Rutherford's time over the 8,000-meter course was 28:20. The Greyhounds had two other runners in the top 35. Senior **Tim Pfluger (Slatington/Northern Lehigh HS)** was 23rd in 28:41 while freshman **George Wacker (Honesdale/Honesdale HS)** was 35th with a time of 29:23. Rounding out Moravian's top five were sophomores **Chris DeWalt (Easton/Easton HS)** and **Tim McDade (Bechtelsville/Boyertown HS)**. DeWalt was 54th in 30:27 while McDade was 62nd in 30:48.

The Moravian women's cross country team opened up with a disappointing sixth place finish of ten schools at the Kutztown University Maroon & Gold Invitational. Despite the disappointing team finish, which was due to several Moravian runners being disqualified for making a wrong turn on the course, the Lady Greyhounds did have a pair of top ten finishers. Moravian was the top NCAA Division III team.

Sophomores **Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic/Riverside HS)** and **Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown/Lower Dauphin HS)** picked up where they left off at the end of the 1998 season. Wolfsberger placed 4th in the 6,000 meter race in a time of 23:31. Shertzer was sixth overall in 24:07. Rounding out the top five for Moravian were sophomore **Erin Boyle (Philadelphia/Nazareth Academy)** in 21st place in a time of 25:38, senior **Maria Grabowski (Churchville/Villa Joseph Marie HS)** in 26th position in 26:05 and sophomore **Tiffany Catalino (Bethlehem/Freedom HS)** in 39th with a time of 27:05. Moravian had the next two finishers after Catalino, junior **Kate Westermann (Milford, CT/Lauralton Hall)** and freshman **Jennifer Wagner (Riegelsville/Wilson HS)**, with times of 27:06.
