#### Women's Volleyball – 26-8 (MAC Commonwealth Conference 6-1, MAC 11-3)

Last Week – Defeated ^ Franklin & Marshall, 3-1; Lost to ^Juniata, 3-0. ^NCAA Div. III Mid-Atlantic Regional Season Complete

The women's volleyball team, ranked second in the NCAA Division III Mid-Atlantic Regional Poll last week, earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Division III Tournament, the Lady Greyhounds third straight bid. At the Mid-Atlantic Regional hosted by Juniata College, Moravian earned its first victory in the NCAA Tournament, defeating Franklin & Marshall, 10-15, 15-11, 15-12, 15-12 before falling in the regional championship match to Juniata, 12-15, 4-15, 3-15.

Senior outside hitter **Amy Sandt (Allentown/William Allen HS)** had 22 kills, 22 digs, two blocks and three service aces to lead the team. Senior setter **Kaitie Kramer (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** had 63 assists in the match to break her own single season record of 1,149. After the match, in which Kramer also had 24 digs and five kills, Kramer had 1,212 assists for the year. Junior middle hitters **Becky Falk (Allentown/Dieruff HS)** and **Sara Young (Tunkhannock/Tunkhannock HS)** each had 16 kills in the match. Young added two blocks while sophomore opposite hitter **Sara Walkiewicz (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** had 21 digs, nine kills, seven assists and four service aces. Junior defensive specialist **Emily Shonk (Ligonier/Ligonier HS)** had 23 digs and three service aces while sophomore outside hitter **Krystol Kessack (Bethlehem/Liberty HS)** had six kills and 15 digs. Junior defensive specialist **Natalie Balaziuk (Bethlehem/Bethlehem Catholic HS)** had ten digs and four service aces.

In the final match of the season against Juniata, Sandt had nine kills and nine digs to lead the Lady Greyhounds. Kramer added 21 assists and nine digs while Walkiewicz had nine digs. Junior outside hitter **Kendra Insley (Ridgewood, NJ/Ridgewood HS)** had five kills and five digs and Falk had four kills.

*Women's Cross Country 0-0 (MAC Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 0-0)* Last Week – 2<sup>nd</sup> of 32 at NCAA Division III Mideast Regional at Frostburg State University, Frostburg, MD This Week –

The Moravian College women's cross country team, ranked 19<sup>th</sup> in the nation, qualified for the NCAA Division III National Championships for the seventh straight season after a second place finish at the NCAA Division III Mideast Regional at Frostburg State University last weekend. Moravian scored 117 points in the 32-team field.

Sophomore **Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown/Lower Dauphin HS)** paced the Lady Greyhounds with a third place individual finish in a time of 18:47.70 over the 5,000-meter course. There were 235 competitors in the race. Sophomore **Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic/Riverside HS)** also placed in the top five with a fifth place showing with a time of 18:54.20. Junior **Hannah Wood (Palm/Upper Perkiomen HS)** finished 15<sup>th</sup> in 19:33.10 while sophomore **Kim Jaick (Coopersburg/Southern Lehigh HS)** was 30<sup>th</sup> in 19:52.10. The quartet earned All-Mideast All-Region honors for placing in the top 35.

Moravian's other runners at the NCAA Mideast Regional were sophomore **Erin Boyle (Philadelphia**/ **Nazareth Academy HS)** at 64<sup>th</sup> with a time of 20:33.50, freshman **Jen Wagner (Riegelsville/Wilson HS)** in 73<sup>rd</sup> at 20:45.60 and senior **Maria Grabowski (Churchville/Villa Joseph Maria HS)** at 87<sup>th</sup> in a time of 21:01.90.

#### Football – 2-8 (MAC Commonwealth League 1-4, MAC 2-7)

Last Week – Lost to Muhlenberg, 52-26. Season Complete

The football team suffered a tough 52-26 loss to rival Muhlenberg in the final game of the 1999 season to finish the year with a 2-8 record. The record for Moravian is only the second losing season of the 1990s and the worst record at the school since a 0-8-1 in 1981. The Greyhounds trailed 42-13 at halftime in Saturday's game.

On offense, senior quarterback **Rob Petrosky (North Catasauqua/Catasauqua HS)** completed 13 of 30 passes for 241 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Petrosky's touchdown pass was to sophomore **Mike Buscio (Philadelphia/Triton Regional HS)** from 29 yards out on a fourth and six play and let Petrosky tie the school record for touchdown passes in a career with 48. Freshman wide receiver **Jarod Rhinehart** (Washington, NJ/Warren Hills Regional HS) caught four passes for 98 yards while sophomore wideout Michael Abbate (South Plainfield, NJ/ Bishop Ahr HS) had four receptions for 67 yards.

Freshman tailback **Josh Fick (Emmaus/Emmaus HS)** led the Greyhounds rushing attack with 85 yards on five carries. Fick had two touchdown carries of 19 and 55 yards. Fick finished the 1999 season with six rushing touchdowns; the Greyhounds had 11 as a team. Three of Fick's touchdown runs were over 50 yards in length. Junior tailback **P.J. Jankowicz (Belle Mead, NJ/Hillsborough HS)** had 74 yards on 23 carries while Petrosky gained 23 yards on three carries and one touchdown. Fick had five kickoff returns for 79 yards while Abbate had four returns for 60 yards.

On defense, the Greyhounds had a pair of players reach the century mark in tackles for the season in the loss at Muhlenberg. Senior free safety **Steve DiRenzo (Netcong, NJ/Lenape Valley Regional HS)** was named the Moravian Most Valuable Player of the Game and led the Moravian defense with 14 tackles and two pass break-ups. DiRenzo finishes the 1999 season with 106 tackles. Senior strong safety **Jason Goldan (Neshanic, NJ/ Hillsborough HS)** had five tackles to finish the year with 102 tackles. Junior linebacker **J.D. Rhinehart** (**Washington, NJ/Warren Hills Regional HS)** made ten tackles with one sack and one tackle for loss. Rhinehart also had one interception and one pass break-up. Senior linebacker **Josh Wren (Milford, UT/Cyprus HS)** had seven tackles in his final collegiate game.

*Men's Cross Country – 0-0 (MAC Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 0-0)* Last Week – 16<sup>th</sup> of 32 at NCAA Division III Mideast Regional at Frostburg State University, Frostburg, MD Season Complete

Senior **Tim Pfluger (Slatington/Northern Lehigh HS)** placed 35<sup>th</sup> at the NCAA Division III Mideast Regional to lead the Greyhounds to a 16<sup>th</sup> place finish of 32 schools. Pfluger, who earned All-Mideast Region Honors with the top 35 finish, completed the 8,000-meter race in 27:12.40. There were 229 runners in the race.

Junior **Damon Rutherford (Reading/Exeter HS)** crossed the finish line second for Moravian at 50<sup>th</sup> in 27:29.20. Freshman **George Wacker (Honesdale/Honesdale HS)** earned Freshman All-Mideast Region Honors as one of the top 35 freshman in the race. Wacker placed 75<sup>th</sup> overall in a time of 27:56.00. Sophomore **Tim McDade (Bechtelsville/Boyertown HS)** was 137<sup>th</sup> in 29:15.70 while freshman **Justin Arnold (Basking Ridge, NJ/Ridge HS)** was 157<sup>th</sup> in 29:43.40. Rounding out the Greyhound runners were senior **Michael Keysock (Bethlehem/Freedom HS)** in 167<sup>th</sup> with a time of 20:09.60 and sophomore **Chris DeWalt (Easton/Easton HS)** at 190<sup>th</sup> in 30:57.90.
