Women's Cross Country 0-0 (MAC Commonwealth Conference 0-0, MAC 0-0)

Last Week – 20th of 24 at NCAA Division III Championships at University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh

Season Complete

The Moravian College women's cross country team, ranked 22nd in the nation last week, placed 20th of 24 teams at the 1999 NCAA Division III National Championships over the weekend. It was the seventh straight year that the Lady Greyhounds have competed in the championships meet. Moravian was the first of three teams from the Mideast Region to finish, Dickinson, which beat Moravian at the regional championship, was 22nd while Messiah College placed 24th. The University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh hosted the 1999 NCAA Championship.

Sophomore **Heidi Wolfsberger (Moosic/Riverside HS)** placed 28th individually in a time of 17:37.1 on the 5,000-meter course to earn All-American accolades. The top 35 runners out of the field of 213 at the NCAA Championships are named All-Americans. Sophomore **Emily Shertzer (Hummelstown/Lower Dauphin HS)** placed second for the Lady Greyhounds and 58th overall in a time of 17:56.6. Junior **Hannah Wood (Palm/Upper Perkiomen HS)** placed third for Moravian, finishing 107th in a time of 18:21.7.

Rounding out Moravian's runners were sophomore **Kim Jaick (Coopersburg/Southern Lehigh HS)** in 201st at 19:32.9, senior **Maria Grabowski (Churchville/Villa Joseph Maria HS)** at 205th in 19:41.5, sophomore **Erin Boyle (Philadelphia/Nazareth Academy)** at 207th in a time of 19:51.2 and freshman **Jennifer Wagner (Riegelsville/Wilson HS)** in 210th at 20:01.4. Each of the Lady Greyhound runners achieved a season best time at the race with most of them improving by almost a minute from their times at the Mideast Regional.

Moravian opened the 1999 season with a win and a loss at the 18th Annual Scotty Wood Tournament hosted by Muhlenberg College last weekend. The Lady Greyhounds, who are starting a senior, a junior, a sophomore and two freshmen, opened the tournament with a 69-49 victory over SUNY Oswego before falling to Muhlenberg in the championship game, 66-57.

In the victory over SUNY Oswego, senior guard **Jen Polaha (Seattle, WA/Holy Name {PA} HS)** scored a career high 17 points and added four assists and two rebounds. Polaha was one of four Moravian players to reach double figures in the game. Senior forward **LaJona Johnson (Easton/Easton HS)**, who returned to the team last Monday, added a double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds. Freshman guard **Tara Wozniak (Roseland, NJ/West Essex Regional HS)** added 11 points, three rebounds, three steals and two blocked shots in her first collegiate game while freshman forward **Kelly McLean (Allentown/Salisbury HS)** had ten points and seven rebounds for the Lady Greyhounds. Sophomore forward **Mary Morgans (Center Valley/Allentown Central Catholic HS)** had a team high 12 rebounds and added six points while junior guard **Jill Kenny (East Brunswick, NJ/East Brunswick HS)** had four assists and three points. Moravian led the game, 27-24, at halftime and put the contest away in the second half by outscoring SUNY Oswego, 42-25.

In the loss to Muhlenberg, the Lady Greyhounds trailed just 23-19 at halftime but couldn't get anything going in the second half to loss 66-57. Moravian shot just 30.2 percent from the floor in the game and had a free throw and six three-pointers at the half and no two-point field goals. Wozniak, who was named to the All-Tournament Team, led the way for Moravian with 19 points, including a 10-for-12 performance at the foul line, and six rebounds. Junior guard **Jan Golden (Dunmore/Dunmore HS)** added 14 points in the game and connected on three three-pointers. Johnson added eight points, four rebounds and two blocked shots while Morgans had seven points and three boards. Polaha, who was Moravian's other representative on the All-Tournament Team, had three points and three rebounds.

The 'Hounds opened the 1999 season with a 1-1 record at the 18th Annual Scotty Wood Tournament at Muhlenberg College last weekend. Moravian defeated the University of Dallas (TX), 83-62, in the opening round before falling to Muhlenberg, 78-73, in the championship game.

The Greyhounds used a balanced scoring attack in the win over the University of Dallas. Sophomore guard **Doug Spadt (Emmaus/Emmaus HS)** led a quartet of players in double-figures with 16 points. Spadt had four three-pointers, three assists, five rebounds, two steals and a blocked shot in the game. Junior guard **David Jordan (Point Pleasant, NJ/Point Pleasant HS)** added 15 points, three rebounds and three steals in the game. Jordan also connected on four three pointers in the contest. Junior forward **Chris Hayn (Whitehall/Whitehall HS)** had 12 points, tying his career high set at the Scotty Wood Tournament two years ago, and a pair of three-pointers while senior center **Jim O'Rourke (Park Ridge, NJ/Park Ridge HS)** had ten points and two blocked shots.

Senior guard **Rich Whalen (East Brunswick, NJ/East Brunswick HS)** added nine points in the victory over the University of Dallas and had a team high four assists. Senior guard **Justin Potts (Sparta, NJ/Sparta HS)** had eight points. Freshman forward **Ken Greb (Mt. Holly, NJ/Rancocas Valley HS)** had a team high seven rebounds to go along with five points in his first collegiate game. Moravian had an outstanding night as a team from the floor, connecting on 52.7 percent of its field goals and 52.2 percent of its three pointers.

In the loss to Muhlenberg, Moravian tied the game at 33-33 just before halftime on a jumper by Jordan. However, the Greyhounds were outscored 45-40 in the second half. Jordan, who was named to the All-Tournament Team, scored a career high 26 points to led Moravian, which again had four players in double-figures. Jordan connected on five three-pointers in the game to tie the Scotty Wood Tournament record of nine three pointers in the two games. He also led Moravian with seven rebounds in the contest. Greb and Spadt each had 11 points against Muhlenberg with Spadt adding four rebounds and Greb had three boards. Spadt was also named to the All-Tournament Team for Moravian. Whalen hit double figures in the game with ten points and a team leading five assists while Hayn had six points and five rebounds.
